COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

STATE OF VICTORIA.

LIQUOR CONTROL ORDER.

WHEREAS by Regulation 45 of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in the law of any State, where the Premier of the State is of opinion that it is in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the effectual prosecution of the war that the limitations or restrictions on the sale, supply, disposal, possession or use of intoxicating liquor in the State, additional to, or different from, the limitations and restrictions prescribed by the laws of the State, should be imposed, may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State, prohibit, restrict, control or regulate the sale, supply, disposal, possession or use of intoxicating liquor in the State:

Now therefore I, John Cain, Premier of the State of Victoria, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7; the Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 8; and the Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 9 are hereby revoked.
