## Masseurs Acts.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE TRAINING,  
EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION OF MASSEURS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Masseurs Acts and all other other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Masseurs Registration Board of Victoria doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

## DIVISION 1.—INTRODUCTORY.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Masseurs Regulations 1945," shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be divided as follows:—

- Division 1.—Introductory.
- Division 2.—Registration of masseurs.
- Division 3.—Training and examinations.
- Division 4.—Fees.
- Schedule 1.—Curriculum.
- Schedule 2.—Forms.

2. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- "Act" means the *Masseurs Act* 1928 (No. 3728).
- "Approved" means approved by the Board.
- "Board" means the Masseurs Registration Board of Victoria.
- "Registrar" means the person appointed by the Board pursuant to section 5 (2) of the Act to be registrar.
- "Student" means a person undergoing the course of training pursuant to Regulation 14 hereof.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include the feminine.

4. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted as follows:—

- (1) *Meetings*.—The Board shall meet for the transaction of business from time to time on such days and at such hours as the Board shall appoint, and the registrar shall convene a meeting at any time when so directed by the chairman.
- (2) *Notice*.—Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to any member of the Board, directed to such address as he may from time to time furnish to the registrar.
- (3) *Order of Business*.—The order of business shall be as follows:—
  - (a) Minutes of preceding meeting;
  - (b) Correspondence;
  - (c) Consideration of applications for registration;
  - (d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of examiners;
  - (e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any time vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

- (4) *Conduct of Business*.—Business shall be conducted in the manner provided for Councils in Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act* 1928, so far as such provisions are applicable.
- (5) *Cheques*.—Cheques shall be signed by the registrar and a member of the Board appointed for the purpose by the Board.

## DIVISION 2.—REGISTRATION OF MASSEURS.

5. Every person claiming to be entitled to be registered shall make application to the Board in the prescribed form (Form A).

6. No person shall be registered unless he—

- (a) is at least 21 years of age;
- (b) has paid the prescribed fee for registration and (if he has been a student) all fees in connexion with the course;
- (c) has produced two certificates of good character satisfactory to the Board.

Provided that in the case of any person who at the 18th day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three was a member of either of the associations then known respectively as the Victorian Massage Association and the Victorian Branch of the Australasian Massage Association, such certificates of good character shall not be required.

7. Every applicant for registration under the provisions of section 7 (a) or section 8 (d) of the Act shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has complied with all relevant provisions of the Masseurs Acts and these Regulations.

8. In the case of a person applying for registration under the provisions of section 8 (a) (ii) of the Act a certificate of bona fide practice, signed by the President and Secretary of either of the Associations known respectively as the Victorian Massage and Physiotherapy Association and the Victorian Branch of the Australian Physiotherapy Association shall be sufficient evidence of such practice.

9. Every person applying for registration under the provisions of section 8 (b) of the Act shall lodge with his application evidence of bona fide practice. This shall include two certificates from medical practitioners.

10. Every applicant for registration under the provisions of section 18 (1) (d) of the Act who before the eighteenth day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three was being or had been trained in the practice of massage shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he completed a course of training substantially equivalent to the course prescribed in these Regulations and passed the necessary examinations: Provided that in any case in which it thinks fit the Board may require such applicant to be examined and pass in any of the subjects prescribed before granting registration.

11. Every blind person who is an applicant for registration shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has completed the prescribed special course of training and passed the prescribed special examinations.

12. Every person who is entitled to be registered and has complied with the requirements of these Regulations shall receive a certificate of registration in the prescribed form and his name shall be entered in the register.

13. The register shall contain the particulars hereunder set forth in respect of every person registered:—

- (a) Number of certificate of registration;
- (b) Date of registration;
- (c) Name in full;
- (d) Address;
- (e) Qualifications, i.e.—provision of Act under which registered;
- (f) Remarks.

## DIVISION 3.—TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS.

14. The course of training for persons desiring to be registered under the provisions of section 7 (a) of the Act shall be of not less than three years' duration, shall be conducted by or under the direction of lecturers appointed by the Board, and shall comprise the curriculum set out in Schedule 1 to these Regulations.

15. The Board may arrange with the University of Melbourne, the University Extension Board or any other suitable institution to teach any of the subjects included in the curriculum, and if any such arrangement is made the lecturers or persons appointed by the University, the Extension Board or other institution to carry out such teaching shall be deemed to be appointed by the Board pursuant to Regulation 14.

16. The prescribed special course of training for blind persons shall be the course of training for blind persons of St. Dunstan's Hostel for Blinded Soldiers and Sailors and the National Institute for the Blind, England, and/or the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy, England, and/or the Australian Physiotherapy Association.

17. No person shall be eligible to undertake the prescribed course of training (hereinafter referred to as "the course") unless he—

- (a) has attained the full age of eighteen years: Provided that for the duration of the present war the Board may exempt from this sub-clause any applicant who will attain the full age of eighteen years not later than the 31st day of August of the year in which such applicant proposes to commence the course;
- (b) has passed the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne or some other examination which is in the opinion of the Board substantially equivalent thereto;
- (c) has passed the subject General Science or Physical Science or the subjects Physics and Chemistry at the Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne or some other examination which is in the opinion of the Board substantially equivalent thereto;
- (d) is certified by a medical practitioner specially or generally appointed by the Board to be physically fit to satisfactorily carry out the professional duties of a masseur; and
- (e) has produced evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is of good character.

18. (1) Any person desirous of undertaking the course shall apply to the Board on the prescribed form (Form B) not later than the sixteenth day of January of the year in which such person proposes to commence the course, or such later day as the Board may from time to time appoint.

(2) The Board shall select the persons permitted to undertake the course.

(3) The persons so selected shall be those who after such enquiry and investigation as the Board deems necessary appear to the Board to be the most suitable applicants.

19. Every person who at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations is undergoing a course of training in massage by the body known as the Massage Curriculum Committee shall be accepted as a student and shall be entitled to continue his course as a student pursuant to these Regulations and shall be subject to all provisions of these Regulations so far as they are applicable to students.

20. The Board may if it thinks fit accept as a student any person who had at any time (within the ten years immediately prior to the coming into operation of these Regulations) been a student of the body known as the Massage Curriculum Committee and may permit such person to commence the course at the stage at which he had discontinued his study or at any other stage considered suitable by the Board.

21. Examinations (to be known as Annual Examinations) shall be held commencing not later than the month of October in each year in the following subjects:—

(a) For students in the first year of the course—

Junior Anatomy;  
Physiology;  
Educational Gymnastics;  
Bandaging and First Aid.

(b) For students in the second year of the course—

Senior Anatomy;  
Pathology;  
Medical Gymnastics.

(c) For students in the third year of the course—

Practice of Massage;  
Medical Electricity;  
Muscle Re-education.



22. (1) Supplementary examinations shall be held, commencing not later than the second week in December of each year, for students who have failed in one or more subjects in the immediately preceding annual examination and have been admitted by the Board after consideration of the examiners' recommendations to a supplementary examination.

(2) Any student who has been prevented by illness or other sufficient cause from sitting at an examination in any subject may, with the Board's approval, be admitted to a special examination in that subject. The cost of conducting any such special examination shall, if directed by the Board, be borne by the candidate.

(3) Except with the specific approval of the Board, no student shall be admitted to any supplementary examination in more than two subjects.

23. Each examination shall include such written, oral, and practical tests as the examiners think necessary or convenient in each subject.

24. (1) Application for permission to sit at any examination shall be made in the prescribed form (Form C).

(2) No person shall be permitted to sit for any examination unless the prescribed fee for examination and all fees due in respect of training of such student have been paid.

25. Unless exempted by the Board, every student shall attend regularly the lectures and demonstrations in all the prescribed subjects of the year in which he is studying. Any student whose attendance at lectures and/or demonstrations or practical work in any subject has been unsatisfactory may be refused permission to sit for the examination in that subject.

26. Except with the specific approval of the Board, no student shall be permitted to undertake the second or the third year of the course until he has passed examination in all subjects of the preceding year.

27. Every person who applies for permission to sit for examination under the provisions of section 8 (d) of the Act shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he—

(a) has been engaged on war service; and

(b) has complied with the requirements of section 8 (d) other than the passing of the examination prescribed by the Board.

28. The examination for applicants under Regulation 25 shall include all of the subjects prescribed in Regulation 19.

29. The prescribed special examinations for blind persons shall be the examinations of the authorities prescribed in Regulation 16.

#### PART IV.—FEES.

30. (1) The following fees shall be payable to the Board:—

(a) By any applicant for registration—One guinea.

(b) For any certificate of registration—Ten shillings and six pence.

(c) For medical examination for the purposes of Regulation 17 (d)—One guinea.

(2) Fees payable by students shall be payable not later than the second week of the term in respect of which the fee is due.

31. The remuneration to be paid to each examiner shall be such reasonable sum as may be determined by the Board after consideration of the circumstances of each examination.

## CURRICULUM REFERRED TO IN REGULATION 14.

## First Year.

(i) A course of lectures and demonstrations on Junior Anatomy, in accordance with details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

(ii) A course of practical dissections as prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

(iii) A course of lectures and demonstrations on Physiology as prescribed by the Professor of Physiology at the University of Melbourne.

(iv) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations of one hour each on Educational Gymnastics, including particularly posture work.

(v) A course of at least twelve demonstrations, each being at least of one hour's duration, on Bandaging. The student is required to attain proficiency in the application of the roller bandage and in the removal and replacement of splints.

(vi) A course of training in First Aid to be taught in conjunction with Bandaging.

## Second Year.

(vii) A course of lectures and demonstrations on Senior Anatomy, in accordance with details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

(viii) A course of practical dissections in accordance with details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

(ix) A course of at least fifteen lectures and demonstrations on Elementary Pathology and Therapeutics, comprising a description of the cause, pathology, symptoms and treatment of such diseases as are susceptible to treatment by massage and its allied arts.

(x) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on Medical Gymnastics, comprising definitions of terms, principles of movements, normal movements, and therapeutic application of movements in the treatment of disease.

(xi) A course of practical instruction on Practical Medical Gymnastics, of not less than 100 hours' duration, extending over a period of not less than six months.

## Second and Third Years.

(xii) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on the theory and practice of Massage, comprising instruction in the regional massage and practice on models, and requiring attendance for practical work for at least 300 hours.

(xiii) A course of at least fifteen lectures and demonstrations on Medical Electricity extending over a period of at least twelve months and comprising a description of electro-medical apparatus, its use, care and maintenance, and its application in cases of disease; and practical instruction covering a period of at least six months.

*Third Year.*

(xiv) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on Muscle Re-education, each of at least one hour's duration.

(xv) A course of at least seven lectures on general hospital practice.

(c) The owner of any vessel on which any such repairs, alterations, or renovations are made or on which any such apparatus is used shall pay to the Commissioners all expenses incurred by the Commissioners in taking any safety precautions which the Harbor Master may in any case consider necessary and in particular the expenses incident to the standing by of fire-fighting apparatus and personnel.

Provided always that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to His Majesty's ships of war.

ELECTRICAL MECHANIC TRADE REGULATIONS  
(No. 1).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

## SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "Electrical Mechanic Trade Regulations (No. 1)."

## INTERPRETATION.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

## APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trade, viz.:—

Electrical Mechanic, as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria, outside and excepting the metropolitan district.

## APPLICANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATE.

4. Applications by persons desirous to become apprentices in the said trade shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the said Acts.

## APPLICANTS MAY BE EXAMINED.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trade may be required to submit themselves for examination, at the time and place determined by the Commission, to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship, in such trade. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

## Exemptions.

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the elementary schools of the Education Department of Victoria or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with subsection 18 (2) of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trade.

## MINIMUM AGE FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trade as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

## TERM OF APPRENTICESHIP.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trade shall be five years.

## FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP—GENERAL FORM.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trade, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) with the following additions, thereto:—

## ADDITIONAL COVENANTS, ETC., TO GENERAL FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP.

*Employer's Covenants.*

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month he may, with the approval of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required under the provisions of this paragraph to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month.

(c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

(c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines or for the cancellation of the indentures.

(f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage due to carelessness.

(g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holiday or during other than ordinary working hours without his consent.

- (h) Not keep more than two days' pay in hand.  
 (i) Not allow the apprentice to work overtime for more than eighteen hours in any four consecutive weeks.  
 (j) Provide the apprentice during the first and second years of the said term with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

*Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenant.*

- (c) At all times, while in the employment of the employer, conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

*Mutual Agreements.*

At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

- (i) That where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or  
 (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission the total period of time not served by an apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.
- (10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay.
- (11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as heretofore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

*FORM OF INDENTURES WHERE APPLICANT ADMITTED TO A YEAR OTHER THAN THE FIRST YEAR OF APPRENTICESHIP.*

9. In cases, however, where an applicant for apprenticeship in the said trade has been permitted by the Commission, in pursuance of section 18 (1) of the Act, to be admitted to some year of the prescribed apprenticeship course other than the first year, paragraph (a) of the employer's covenant in the indentures of apprenticeship to be entered into shall be in the form provided in General Regulations (No. 3).

*RATES OF PAY OF APPRENTICES.*

10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 21s. 6d. per week.  
 2nd year—at the rate of 29s. 6d. per week.  
 3rd year—at the rate of 44s. 6d. per week.  
 4th year—at the rate of 73s. 0d. per week.  
 5th year—at the rate of 92s. 6d. per week.

*RATES FOR OVERTIME WORKED.*

11. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and public holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rate (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to journeymen employed by him in the same trade.

*STANDARD OF PROFICIENCY.*

12. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

*INCREASED RATES OF PAY FOR PROFICIENCY.*

13. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—

- (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;  
 (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;  
 (c) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage; and

- (d) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

*PROPORTION OF APPRENTICES TO JOURNEMEN.*

14. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trade shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

*APPRENTICESHIP COURSE—CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.*

15. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trade shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

*Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.*

(b) (i) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice in each year of his apprenticeship course, in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

(ii) In order that an apprentice may qualify in respect of education for the "final certificate" of the Commission, he shall, in addition to his attaining the standard set out in subparagraph (1) hereof in the subjects prescribed for the fourth year of the apprenticeship course, make satisfactory progress as approved by the Commission in the subjects prescribed for the fifth year of the said course until the date of completion of his term of apprenticeship.

*Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.*

(c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be):—

Electrical Mechanic.—All classes of the work of an Electrical Mechanic and all things incidental thereto, including—the affixing, placing, jointing, or running of electrical conductors of all kinds and for all purposes from the point of supply to the point of utilization; the fixing of all kinds of conduits, ducts, and other means of protecting and covering electrical conductors; meter fixing; the connecting up of generators, alternators, motors, transformers, electrical control gear, distribution boards, and of electrical instruments and electrical apparatus at the points of supply and utilization for power, lighting, heating, smelting, and safe working, or for any other purpose; the connecting up of radio apparatus, telephones, and bells; the erection, overhauling, and repairing of storage batteries; the installation of electrical plants, including the erection and connecting up of switchboards; the marking out and mounting of switchboards, and the effecting of repairs of an electrical nature to machines, installations, or appliances where it is necessary to carry out the work on the site or where such repairs are incidental to such work.

*ATTENDANCE AT CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.*

16. (a) Every apprentice and applicant in the said trade shall attend the classes for instruction prescribed for his apprenticeship course at such times and at such place or places and on such occasions while the classes are open for instruction as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts, provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or applicant shall be required to attend shall not exceed two in any one week.

Where attendance at Technical School classes is impracticable every apprentice and applicant for the said trade shall enrol for and undertake a correspondence course for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations.

*Employer to Permit Apprentice or Applicant to Attend Classes.*

(b) Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and applicants to attend for instruction at the school or schools and class or classes at the hours and on the occasions specified in such notice.

Where attendance at Technical School classes is impracticable every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations shall permit the apprentice or applicant, without deduction from his wages during ordinary working hours for four hours in any week during the period of two years within the first three years of his apprenticeship course, to perform on the employer's premises the theoretical or practical work of or incidental to the correspondence course.

*Apprentice or Applicant shall Submit Himself for Examination.*

(c) Every apprentice or applicant attending the aforesaid class or classes shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the Commission.

*Penalties for Non-attendance, Misbehaviour, &c.*

(d) Any apprentice or applicant who—

- (i) fails to attend any Technical School or class which he is required to attend or fails to enrol for and undertake any correspondence course punctually at the time appointed for the commencement thereof, or, without the permission of the instructor, leaves the same before the time appointed for leaving; or
- (ii) fails to be diligent or behaves in an indecorous manner while in such school or class; or
- (iii) destroys or fails to take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in such school or class; or
- (iv) without good and satisfactory reason, in the opinion of the Commission, fails to secure in each year a record of 80 per cent. of attendances in the day classes and in the evening classes prescribed for his apprenticeship course—

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, or, alternatively, to cancellation of his indentures by the Commission. (In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.)

*Apprentices or Applicant to Provide Books, Materials, &c.*

(e) Every apprentice or applicant shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments, and materials required at the classes for instruction, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

**PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES.**

17. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction.

Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage: provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice as proof of such illness or accident.

In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.

**INCORPORATION OF GENERAL REGULATIONS.**

18. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1), approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2), approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3), approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4), approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

General Regulations (No. 5), approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of January, 1933.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "SOVEREIGN HILL" RESERVE, BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council, dated the 24th January, 1944, as a site for Public Recreation in the City of Ballaarat, at Ballaarat East, and known as the "Sovereign Hill" Reserve, Ballaarat.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserves.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas and Anzac Days.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. No person shall remove any sand, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

The Council of the City of Ballaarat has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
