PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare

any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Corio has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Corio aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CORIO.

All that piece of land, being part of lot 157 on plan of subdivision No. 1789, lodged in the Office of Titles, and being part of Crown portion 83, Parish of Moorpanyal, County of Grant: Commencing at the north-east corner of lot 158 on the said plan of subdivision, being a point on the northern boundary of the said Crown portion 83, distant 186 feet east from the north-west corner thereof; and proceeding thence south 1 deg. 38 min. east 334 ft. 11 in. east 66 feet, north 1 deg. 38 min. west 334 ft. 11 in. and west 66 feet to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

HEPBURN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1945.

THE Hepburn Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hepburn Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable in equal moieties on the 4th day of April, 1945, and the 1st day of July, 1945, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.

THE Kyabram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Kyabram Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1945, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons for the first 50,000 gallons of such excess, and then at the rate of Ten pence half-penny per 1,000 gallons thereafter.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

MOOROPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1945.

THE Mooropna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound of the municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Mooropna Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing on 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable on the 26th day of March, 1945.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Nine pence half-penny per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Nine pence half-penny per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Nine pence half-penny per 1,000 gallons, except in the case of water supplied by measure to the Mooropna Hospital, the charge for which is hereby fixed at Eight pence half-penny per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 20,000 gallons.

For every public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

TOWN OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1945.

THE Commissioners of the Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts:—

1. That the water rate for the year 1945 on all lands and tenements within the Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and three pence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the Town of Horsham for the year 1944-45, with a minimum of One pound (£1) upon all tenements valued at or under Sixteen pounds (£16), and upon which a building is erected, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the *Water Act* 1928.
2. (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.
(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Nine pence per 1,000 gallons.
(c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Nine pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 27,000 gallons.
(d) The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.
3. All water rates shall be payable on the 26th day of March, 1945, at the office of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.
4. Such officers as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said charges.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE COMPULSORY
ACQUISITION OF EASEMENTS.

Now therefore His Majesty the Governor of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth in the exercise of the authority so conferred make the following regulations that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of March, 1945.

2. Every application for an Order under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 13 of the *Water Act 1944* shall be made in or to the effect of the form contained in the First Schedule hereto and shall be lodged with the Secretary of the Commission together with the sum of Twenty-five pounds.

3. (a) (i) Every notice of any such application given by the Commission to the owner of the servient tenement pursuant to sub-section (2) of section 13 of the said Act shall be in or to the effect of the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

(ii) Every notice so given may be served upon the owner of the servient tenement by leaving it with him personally or by leaving the same for him at his usual place of abode or of business with some other person apparently an inmate thereof or employed thereat.

(b) (i) Every notice of any application to be given by the Commission to the owner of the servient tenement pursuant to sub-section (2) of section 13 of the said Act in any case where such owner cannot after reasonable inquiry be found shall be in or to the effect of the form contained in the Third Schedule hereto.

(ii) Every notice so given in every such case shall be given by the Commission causing such notice to be published as an advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper circulating generally in the district in which such servient tenement is situate.
