WHEREAS by section 64 of the *Education Act 1928* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any State school to be a district high school: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the under-mentioned State Schools to be District High Schools, from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1945—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a road by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Northcote aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

All that piece of land, being part of Crown portion 106, Parish of Joka Joka, County of Bourke:—Commencing at a point 110 feet north of Mitchell-street, on the west side of Boothby-street; proceed 133 ft. 2 in. bearing south 89 deg. 24 min. west; thence 505 ft. 9 in. bearing north 0 deg. 41 min. east; thence 127 ft. 2 in. bearing north 89 deg. 24 min. east to the west building line of Boothby-street; thence 10 ft. 9 in. due south; thence 97 ft. 9 in. bearing south 89 deg. 24 min. west; thence south 44 deg. 24 min. west a distance of 5 ft. 8 in.; thence by a line bearing south 0 deg. 41 min. west a distance of 477 feet; thence south 44 deg. 19 min. east a distance of 5 ft. 8 in.; thence by a line bearing north 89 deg. 24 min. east a distance of 103 ft. 10½ in. to the west building line of Boothby-street; and thence southerly 10 feet to the commencing point.

BY-LAW NO. 4.—PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied by the Trust within its district.

1. For the purposes of this By-law, the district supplied with water by the Trust is divided into a northern area and a southern area by a line commencing at a point on the western

boundary of the said district situate due west of the centre of Baillie-street west, at its westerly end; and running thence in a due easterly direction to the centre of Baillie-street west, at its westerly end; and thence along the centre of Baillie-street west, Baillie-street, and Baillie-street east, to the eastern end of Baillie-street east; and thence in a due easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the said district.

2. During the period commencing at Three o'clock in the morning of the day following the day on which this By-law shall be published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, and ending at midnight on the thirtieth day of June, 1945 (hereinafter called "the said period"), no person shall:—

- (a) Water any garden or lawn in the said areas supplied by the Trust other than by means of a hose held in the hand, or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.
- (b) Water any garden or lawn in the said northern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Tuesday, a Thursday, or a Saturday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday.
- (c) Water any garden or lawn in the said southern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Monday, a Wednesday, or a Friday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 6.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday.

3. No person shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

4. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, may at all reasonable times—

- (a) Enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting, or may inspect any private service, or any part thereof, or any watering of gardens or lawns in course of execution therein or thereon, and/or
- (b) Enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the watering of any gardens or lawns in the course of execution therein or thereon, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises, or any person engaged in executing such watering, any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with, the execution of such watering.

5. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, resists, or opposes or refuses admission to any premises, or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given him by any person duly authorized in that behalf, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or permits, or causes anything to be done in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

- (5) Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

At the foot of the Schedule add the following:—"This Certificate expires fourteen days after the date of endorsement by a Government Veterinary Surgeon or Inspector of Stock."

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of section 11 of the *Farm Water Supplies Advances Act 1944*, hereby make the following Regulations, which shall be deemed to have come into operation as from the first day of January, 1945:—

1. Every application for an advance under the provisions of the *Farm Water Supplies Advances Act 1944* (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act") shall be made in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be verified by statutory declaration as prescribed by the *Evidence Act 1928*.

2. Every such application shall be forwarded to the Secretary for Lands, and the Board of Land and Works may, after due inquiry and investigation, thereupon approve or refuse the same. Where any such application is approved, the Board may make the advance by payment in cash or by the issue of an authority to purchase order.

3. Any order authorizing a farmer to purchase such articles as are indicated therein, and the statutory declaration to be made by the supplier, shall be in accordance with the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be forwarded to the Secretary for Lands when the articles have been supplied, so that payment may be made.

4. The consent of a mortgagee or encumbrancer—

(a) to the making of an advance; and

(b) to the instrument or deed of mortgage to be executed pursuant to the said Act taking priority over any other mortgage or encumbrance affecting the land or Crown lease to which such instrument or deed applies shall be in accordance with the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. Every instrument or deed of mortgage to be executed pursuant to the said Act shall be in accordance with the form set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

6. The following fees shall be payable for the preparation of documents necessary for the purposes of the said Act:—

ELECTION BY GROUPS OF COUNCILS OF MEMBERS OF MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1944* (No. 5057) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for or with respect to the times for and manner of conducting elections (including provisions for preferential voting) by groups of councils of members of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works under the said Act and the appointment and duties of Returning Officers: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

2. The councils of the municipalities of Bulla, Keilor, Werribee, Whittlesea shall be known as the Western Group.

3. The councils of the municipalities of Dandenong, Doncaster and Templestowe, Eltham, Mulgrave shall be known as the Eastern Group.

4. Every election held under these Regulations shall be under the direction of a returning officer appointed for such purpose by the Governor in Council.

5. On or before the first Monday in February in the year 1945 and on or before the first Monday in February in every third year thereafter the council of each of the municipalities comprising the Western Group and the Eastern Group (as the case may be) may nominate a member of a council of a municipality in the group to be a representative of such group on the Board.

6. The name of the councillor nominated by the council of any municipality as aforesaid shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer so as to reach him not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the Thursday next following the aforesaid Monday.

7. If by the hour fixed in clause 6 hereof only one candidate is nominated by the councils of a group the Returning Officer shall declare such candidate so nominated to be the representative member of such group.

8. If by the hour fixed in clause 6 hereof more than one candidate has been so nominated for a group the Returning Officer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared containing the names of all councillors so nominated for such group and shall forthwith send one of such ballot-papers to the council of each and every municipality comprising such group.

9. The municipal clerk of the council shall in accordance with a resolution passed by the council mark the ballot-paper forwarded to such council in the same manner as a ballot-paper is required to be marked in elections of councillors for a municipality, and the municipal clerk shall then return the ballot-paper so as to reach the Returning Officer not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the fourth Thursday in the same month of February.

10. The Returning Officer shall in respect only of such ballot-papers as have reached him within the prescribed time proceed in the manner provided for the election of councillors of municipalities to count the votes given for each candidate in a group, and after having ascertained the result of the election he shall declare the candidate who has received an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary) to be the representative member of such group.

11. When the seat of any member of the Board representing a group becomes vacant owing to the death disqualification resignation election as chairman of the Board ouster by the Supreme Court or absence of such member or from any cause whatever other than the retirement of such member at the expiration of the period for which he was elected, such shall be deemed to be an "extraordinary vacancy."

When any extraordinary vacancy occurs in the representation of a group, the Returning Officer shall forthwith notify the council of each and every municipality comprising such group of the vacancy, and, having regard to the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, a day and time by which nominations may be lodged with him, and if more than one nomination is received the day and time by which a ballot-paper containing the names of the candidates forwarded by him shall be marked and returned to him, and such days and times shall take effect as if prescribed in these Regulations.

Subject to the variations herein the foregoing clauses of these Regulations shall apply to any extraordinary election. A member elected to fill an extraordinary vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the period for which the person whose place he fills was elected and no longer.

12. If before election day a candidate dies, he shall be considered as not having been nominated, and action shall be taken by the Returning Officer to declare the remaining candidate elected or (as the case may be) erase the name of the deceased candidate and the number placed opposite such name from the ballot-papers. Every such ballot-paper shall be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were (when necessary) altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voter's order of preference in respect of such remaining candidates.
