*Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).*  
DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE  
PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same.

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 5th day of May, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 2nd November, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to maize and assigned to such Board the name of "The Maize Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of

Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, all maize shall, subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable the Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such maize shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to the Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as the Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulation made under the said Act.

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Oakleigh has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Oakleigh aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

*Eduard-street.*

All that land, being part of Crown portion 7, Parish of Mulgrave, County of Bourke, enclosed by the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of Crown portion 7, Parish of Mulgrave, at a distance of 1,805 ft. 4 in. southerly from the north-eastern corner of the said portion; thence by a line bearing N. 89 deg. 37 min. W. for a distance of 1,136 feet; thence S. 0 deg. 23 min. W. for a distance of 50 ft. 3 in.; thence by a line bearing N. 89 deg. 58 min. E. for a distance of 1,135 ft. 8½ in.; thence by a line bearing N. 0 deg. 19 min. E. for a distance of 40 feet back to the commencing point.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Medical Act 1928*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), with the approval of the Governor in Council, is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or rescind Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: And whereas the Board is desirous, subject to such approval, of rescinding Regulation No. 43 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1931 and Regulation No. 43A of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, and subject to such approval is desirous of making, under the powers so conferred, the Regulations following: Now therefore the Board doth make Regulations as set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

(1) These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1945" and shall be read and construed as one with The Pharmacy Regulations 1930, 1931, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1939, and 1944, which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Pharmacy Regulations.

(2) Regulation No. 43 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1931 and Regulation No. 43A of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944 are hereby rescinded.

(3) For the said Regulations Nos. 43 and 43A the following Regulations shall be substituted, namely:—After Regulation 42 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 there shall be inserted the following Regulations, namely:—

43. *Exemption*.—Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the Board may exempt from passing the preliminary examination any person who produces a certificate of having passed—

- (a) the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne; or
- (b) the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne in at least *five* subjects, including—
  - (i) English;
  - (ii) at least one subject from the Languages and Humanities group, as set out in the Handbook of Public Examinations of the University of Melbourne;
  - (iii) at least one subject from the Science and Mathematics group, as set out in the Handbook of Public Examinations of the University of Melbourne—

provided that for the purpose of such exemption music may count only as one subject; or

- (c) some other examination which, in the opinion of the Board, is substantially equivalent to the requirements set out in sub-sections (a) or (b) of this Regulation and/or is of sufficient merit to justify exemption from the preliminary examination.

43. (a) The Board may, in its absolute discretion, exempt either partially or in full from the requirements of the next preceding Regulation any person who has served in or with the Defence Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any of the Women's Services or bodies auxiliary to any of those forces during the war, which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and who possesses educational qualifications which, in the opinion of the Board, are sufficient to enable him to enter upon the course.

43. (b) The Technical Intermediate Examination of the Victorian Education Department may be accepted in lieu of the subjects of English, algebra, arithmetic, physical science, and British history of the preliminary examination. And if in addition a candidate has passed in Latin at the preliminary examination, or in a language other than English at the School Intermediate or Leaving Examination, he may be granted full exemption from passing the aforesaid preliminary examination.

The preceding Regulations were made at a meeting of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria held at Melbourne on Thursday, the fifteenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as provided in the schedule. *Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender.

Security will be required, as provided in the tender form, either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, bank deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

*Rates tendered must include T.T. exchange ruling at time of tendering.*

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words, "Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender Box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1945, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1946. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 10.

10. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange, which may affect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

14. The contractor shall not insure the material against war risk. Provided the material is consigned on a separate bill of lading to the Government of Victoria, any loss or damage in transit occasioned by any war risks to which the material may be subject whilst on board ship shall be to Victorian Government account, subject to the production by the contractor of documentary evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board.

15. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.

16. Every account shall be in prescribed form, setting out the contract and item numbers, and shall furnish full details of how it is made up.
