NATIONAL SECURITY (FOOD CONTROL) REGULATIONS.

OATS (VICTORIA) ORDER.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred on me by Clause 6 (1) of the Oats (Victoria) Order, I, Norman Angus Martin, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, do by this Notice require all persons included in the classes of persons set out in the First Schedule and holding or having under their control on the 1st May, 1945, any oats in the parts of Victoria set out in the Second Schedule to furnish to the Director of Agriculture, Public Offices, Melbourne, on or before 15th May, 1945, a return setting out—

- A. The quantity of oats held by them or under their control on the 1st May, 1945.
- B. The place or places where such oats is held or stored.
- C. The purpose or purposes for which such oats is to be used and the quantity of oats to be used for each such purpose.
- D. Where such oats is to be used for the feeding of live stock the number and kind of live stock to be fed.
- E. Where such oats is held or stored on behalf of any other person the name and address of such person or persons.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CLASSES OF PERSONS TO WHOM THIS NOTICE APPLIES.

1. All persons engaged in the training of horses including all trainers registered with the Victoria Racing Club or the Victorian Trotting and Racing Association.
2. All persons carrying on the business of receiving or selling or storing oats.
3. All other persons holding or having under their control more than 30 bushels of oats.

HAY, STRAW AND CHAFF (VICTORIA) ORDER.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred on me by Clause 10 (1) of the Hay, Straw and Chaff (Victoria) Order, I, Norman Angus Martin, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, do by this notice require all persons included in the classes of persons set out in the First Schedule and holding or having under their control on the 1st May, 1945, any-cereal hay or cereal chaff to furnish to the Director of Agriculture, Public Offices, Melbourne, on or before 15th May, 1945, a return setting out—

- A. The quantity of cereal hay and cereal chaff held by them or under their control on the 1st May, 1945.
- B. The place or places where such cereal hay or cereal chaff is held or stored.
- C. The purpose or purposes for which such cereal hay or cereal chaff is to be used and the quantity of cereal hay or cereal chaff to be used for each such purpose.
- D. Where such cereal hay or cereal chaff is to be used for the feeding of live stock the number and kind of live stock to be fed.
- E. Where such cereal hay or cereal chaff is held or stored on behalf of any other person the name and address of such person or persons.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

NOTICE REQUESTING RETURNS OF PASTURE HAY STOCKS.

IHUBERT ARTHUR MULLETT, Director, Department of Agriculture, Victoria, being a person authorized to act under Regulation 10 (2) of the National Security (Agricultural Aids) Regulations, do by this Notice require all persons included in the classes of persons set out in the First Schedule, and holding or having under their control on the 1st May, 1945, any pasture hay in the parts of Victoria set out in the Second Schedule to furnish to the Director of Agriculture, Public Offices, Melbourne, on or before 15th May, 1945, a return setting out—

- A. The quantity of pasture hay held by them or under their control on the 1st May, 1945.
- B. The place or places where such pasture hay is held or stored.
- C. The purpose or purposes for which such pasture hay is to be used and the quantity of pasture hay to be used for each such purpose.
- D. Where such pasture hay is to be used for the feeding of live stock the number and kind of live stock to be fed.
- E. Where such pasture hay is held or stored on behalf of any other person the name and address of such person or persons.

FIRST SCHEDULE.
