PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), sections 518 and 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mornington has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the Shire of Mornington aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation to provide as follows:—

AMENDMENT OF REGULATION XLVI.—QUALIFICATIONS OF FEMALE TEACHERS IN THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS DIVISION.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928* and of all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XLVI.—Qualifications of Female Teachers in the Primary Schools Division—in the manner following, that is to say:—

Clause 1 of Regulation XLVI. is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For sub-clause (a) there shall be submitted the following sub-clause:—

“(a) For promotion to Class IIA.—

- (i) Classification in First Class Honours,
or
- (ii) To be certificated and to hold a degree of the University of Melbourne, and to have passed the prescribed examination in Education for First Class Honours,
or
- (iii) The Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and either the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate or the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, and in addition to have passed the prescribed examination in Education for First Class Honours,
or
- (iv) The Infant Teacher's Certificate, First Class, and a pass in the prescribed examinations in English A and in Education for Second Class Honours, together with one of the following certificates:—
The Certificate of Competency or the Trained Teacher's Certificate or the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class.
- (v) Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding paragraphs of this sub-clause, teachers who, on the first day of January, 1946, were in Class II. or Class III. and who under the regulations in force prior to the first day of June, 1945, were qualified for appointment or promotion to Class IIA. shall continue to be so qualified.”

(b) After sub-clause (a), there shall be inserted the following sub-clause:—

“(b) For promotion to Class II.—

- (i) Classification in Second Class Honours,
or
- (ii) To be certificated and to hold a degree of the University of Melbourne, and to have passed the prescribed examination in Education for Second Class Honours,
or
- (iii) Either the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate or the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate,
or
- (iv) The Infant Teacher's Certificate, First Class, together with one of the following certificates:—
The Certificate of Competency or the Trained Teacher's Certificate or the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class.”

(c) At the end of sub-clause (c) there shall be inserted the following proviso:—

EXPLOSIVES MAGAZINE RESERVE AT TRUGANINA.—BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Powder Magazines Act 1896* and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following By-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina, and for other purposes referred to in the Act first aforementioned (that is to say):—

BY-LAWS.

1. In the following By-laws the term “lessee” shall include person, corporation, or firm, and the successors, executors, administrators, or assigns (as the case may be) of the same.
2. Sites for private magazines may be let or leased from time to time by the Board of Land and Works upon such conditions as are prescribed by the regulations, for the time being in force, made under the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*.
3. The right of any person to become the lessee of a site of a magazine for the storage of explosives shall be conditional on his satisfying the Chief Inspector of Explosives that he is a fit and proper person to become such lessee.
4. The rent to be charged for each site shall be Twenty shillings per annum, and shall be payable in advance, on the first day of each year, to the the Collector of Imposts, at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Melbourne.
5. Charges, to include the cost of necessary handling and transport between the Powder Anchorages and the Truganina Explosives Reserve, but not to include the cost of any unusual or special service in handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosives, shall be paid on all explosives (other than those belonging to His Majesty's Government) received upon the jetty or tramway at the following rates:—
Explosives, other than detonators—1s. 3d. for every 25-lb. weight or fractional part thereof.
Detonators, ordinary—2s. for every case containing not more than 5,000 in number; 5s. for every case containing more than 5,000 in number.
Detonators, electric—
With wire leads not exceeding 96 inches in length—
2s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof;
With wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length—
3s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof.
6. No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall go alongside the jetty belonging to the Truganina Explosives Reserve without the consent of the officer in charge of the Reserve.
7. No goods of any description, other than explosives authorized by Order in Council to be manufactured or imported, shall be landed on or delivered from the jetty, or conveyed over the tramway, without the consent of the Chief Inspector of Explosives or of the officer in charge of the Reserve.
8. No explosives shall be allowed to remain on the jetty, but must forthwith be placed in trucks or in the Government receiving magazine, or loaded into powder lighters.
9. The loading or unloading of explosives on or from the jetty shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*, or any amendment thereof and regulations thereunder, and the Ports and Harbors Regulations for the time being in force.
10. Any powder lighter having explosive on board shall not, without reasonable excuse, approach within 300 yards of the jetty, except for the purpose of the immediate unloading of the explosive.
11. Any powder lighter, after completing the loading or unloading of explosive cargo, shall leave the jetty without unnecessary delay.
12. The Government accepts no responsibility for loss by accident, fire, or explosion, but will take all reasonable precautions to insure protection to life and property.
13. These By-laws shall come into force on the first day of July, 1945, and on the commencement of these By-laws all By-laws previously made shall be and are hereby revoked.

1. Rescission of previous Regulations.—On and after the nineteenth day of June, 1945, the Regulations made by the Governor in Council under the powers conferred by the *Cattle Compensation Act* 1924, and of other powers enabling him in that behalf shall be and the same are hereby rescinded, but such rescission shall not affect any act, matter or thing done, suffered or required to be done or commenced under such Regulations.

2. The form of application for compensation under the Act for cattle destroyed by or by order of an Inspector of Stock, Dairy Supervisor or Registered Veterinary Surgeon approved by the Minister and the certificate to accompany same shall be in the form of Schedule A and such application shall be verified by the statutory declaration printed thereon.

3. The form of application for compensation under the Act for a carcass or portion of a carcass condemned by a Meat Inspector, Registered Veterinary Surgeon or Medical Officer of Health appointed under section 22 of the *Health Act* 1928 shall be in the form of Schedule B, and such application shall be verified by the statutory declaration printed thereon.

4. The amount payable for portion of any carcass shall be—

- (1) if the forequarters only are condemned one-third of the agreed value of the whole of the carcass.
- (2) if the hindquarters only are condemned two-thirds of the agreed value of the whole of the carcass.

5. The form of certificate to be issued by a Meat Inspector, Registered Veterinary Surgeon or Medical Officer of Health in respect of the condemnation of any diseased carcass or portion of a carcass and the particulars to be set forth in such certificate shall be in the form of Schedule C.

6. Every statement written out by the owner of cattle or his agent upon the sale thereof, pursuant to section 12 of the *Cattle Compensation Act* as amended and given or transmitted to the purchaser of such cattle shall be retained by the purchaser for a period of at least three years.

7. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than twenty pounds (£20).

CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

BY-LAW No. 83.

A By-law of the City of Mordialloc (hereinafter referred to as the municipality) made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 83, for the purpose of prescribing areas within the municipality as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such residential areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of all classes of trade industries, manufactures, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

Part 1.

The areas within the boundaries set out in Schedules 1 and 2 hereof within the municipality are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

The use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements is hereby prohibited within the residential areas set out in Schedule No. 1 hereto.

The use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses other than businesses of a class or nature usually carried on in a shop, is hereby prohibited within the residential areas set out in Schedule No. 2 hereto.

Provided the Council, by resolution, may sanction the carrying on of a business or industry in any dwelling house by a single worker without mechanical motive power or public exhibition or display of any trade sign, or any commodity or service indicative of such business or industry.

Nothing hereinbefore contained shall preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any buildings for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involves the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, or for such other purposes as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

SCHEDULE No. 1.

Prescribes the area in which the use of any land or building for the purpose of all classes of trades, &c. is prohibited.

SCHEDULE No. 2.

Prescribes the area in which the use of any land or building for the purpose of all classes of trade, &c. other than businesses of a class or nature usually carried on in a shop is prohibited.

A resolution adopting the foregoing By-law was passed by the Council of the City of Mordialloc on the 12th day of February, 1945, and confirmed on the 26th day of March, 1945.

The title of the By-law and a summary of the contents are as follows:—

A By-law of the Borough of Swan Hill made under and in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the Acts amending the same, and numbered 2, for—

- Repealing By-law 36 of the Shire of Swan Hill in so far as it is applicable to the Borough of Swan Hill;
- regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, use, occupation, conversion, and alteration of, and every addition to buildings, erections, residential flats, and regulating, restraining, or prohibiting the erection and construction of hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road;
- requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road, and requiring the demolition and removal of the remains of buildings which have been wholly or partly burnt down or demolished;

- (d) authorizing the Council to pull down and demolish and remove buildings, erections, residential flats, hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down, demolished, or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, demolishing, and removing such buildings, erections, residential flats, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof. For the purpose of this paragraph and paragraphs (b) and (c) "hoardings" means structures used for the exhibition of advertisements and includes sky signs;
- (e) regulating and restraining the erection and re-erection of removed buildings;
- (f) appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council;
- (g) prescribing the minimum area and minimum depth and width of frontage of land on which any dwelling house or any shop or any dwelling house and shop combined may be erected;
- (h) prescribing the area of open land which any dwelling house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof;
- (i) prescribing the space to be provided between buildings;
- (j) regulating the size of dwelling rooms and dwelling houses;
- (k) requiring any work or thing to be executed or done, of such materials, within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council;
- (l) prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such residential area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law;
- (m) regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and the mode of enclosing same;
- (n) leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case;
- (o) for other purposes provided for in the said Acts.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

BY-LAW RELATING TO THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHT-SOIL.

By-law No. 18.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928 and of any power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Alexandra, in the name and on behalf of the President and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution, within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Thornton, within the following area in the Parish of Thornton, County of Anglesey: Commencing at the south angle of Crown allotment 34A; thence north-easterly 11 deg. 33 min. for 2,000 links; thence south-easterly, 101 deg. 33 min. for 2,000 links; thence north-easterly 11 deg. 33 min. for 1,200 links to the south bank of the Goulburn River; thence easterly along the south bank of the Goulburn River to the Government-road; thence easterly across the Government-road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 32A; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 32A to the north-east corner of the said allotment; thence south-easterly 169 degrees for 2,054 links to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 32A; thence north-westerly 124 deg. 2 min. for 900 links; thence south-westerly across the Government-road to the angle of Crown allotment 32B; thence south-westerly 13 deg. 54 min. for 700 links; thence north-westerly 103 deg. 54 min. for 900 links; thence south-easterly 156 deg. 43 min. for 1,800 links; thence south-westerly 66 deg. 43 min. for 700 links to the Government-road; thence westerly across the Government-road to the east boundary of Crown allotment 35B; thence south-westerly 66 deg. 43 min. for 700 links; thence north-westerly 156 deg. 43 min. for 2,500 links; thence south-westerly 77 deg. 20 min. for 2,600 links to the west boundary of Crown allotment 34B; thence along the western boundary of Crown allotment 34B north-westerly 169 degrees for 700 links to the angle of Crown allotment 34B; thence north-easterly across the Government-road to the commencing point, and, unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents, and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22-gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, saw-dust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause, or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

- (a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and
- (b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal, and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto, that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council, with its contents, from the premises, and another pan, thoroughly cleansed and in good order, shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall, immediately on being emptied, be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall, on every such occasion, be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water, subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60-lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steamtight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, kero, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
