QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

EXTENSION AND REDESCRIPTION OF METROPOLITAN
MOTOR OMNIBUS ROUTE No. 105A (YARRAVILLE-
SOUTH KINGSVILLE).

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Omnibus Act 1928 (No. 3742) and having regard to certain directions issued by the Directorate of Emergency Road Transport (Victoria) under date of sixteenth day of March, 1944, to Mr. G. F. Palmer, of 28 Murray-street, Yarraville, W.13, doth, by this Order, extend and re-describe a route, viz., No. 105A, within the metropolitan area, along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire, as set out hereunder:—

Description of Route, including Commencing and Terminal Points.—Commencing in Birmingham-street, Yarraville, adjacent to Yarraville Railway Station, thence via Birmingham, Anderson, Fehon, and Francis streets, Williamstown, Melbourne and Hudson roads, Stephenson-street, Railway-place, Brunel and Vernon streets, and Blackshaw-road, to the corner of Blackshaw-road and Saltley-street.

On return trip, the route shall be via Saltley and Brunel streets, Railway-place, &c., and from Fehon-street to the commencing point at Yarraville Railway Station, shall be via Canterbury and Birmingham streets.

AMENDMENT OF BUTCHERING AND/OR SMALL GOODS MAKING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636), the Governor in Council did, on the 20th day of February, 1940, make Regulations entitled the *Butchering and/or Small Goods Making Trades Regulations (No. 1)*: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Acts* and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 21s. 9d. per week.

2nd year—at the rate of 36s. 6d. per week.

3rd year—at the rate of 53s. 6d. per week.

4th year—at the rate of 82s. 9d. per week.

5th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—at the rate of 27s. 6d. per week.

2nd year—at the rate of 46s. 0d. per week.

3rd year—at the rate of 76s. 3d. per week.

4th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.

6. No person shall exercise or train for sporting purposes any dog in or upon any Public Reserve.

7. No person shall bathe, swim, or wash in any portion of the Lake situated in Edwardes Park Reserve or foul or pollute the water therein.

(b) In clause 6 of the said By-law number 17 for the words "One o'clock p.m." there shall be substituted the words "One-thirty o'clock p.m."
