A candidate who has satisfied the Director as to his proficiency in the practical work allotted during the period of probation may be exempted from examination in (4).

 - (1) English. (As for Gardener, Grade III.—Junior.)
 - (2) Arithmetic. (As for Gardener, Grade III.—Junior.)
 - (3) General knowledge of the structure and functions of the various parts of the plant.

 - (4) Practical Work, such as pruning, budding, grafting, layering, seed collecting, and making cuttings.

 - (1) English. (As for Gardener, Grade III.—Junior.)

 - (3) A more detailed knowledge of the plant as specified for Gardener, Grade II. Detailed study of three Natural Orders. Culture, treatment, and propagation of selected plants. Cross fertilization and selection.
 - (4) Practical Work as specified for Gardener, Grade II. The identification of plants from Section on which engaged.

Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission from the Commission.

4. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any other remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.
