SURVEYORS BOARD.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AS MINING SURVEYORS.— EXAMINATION REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall be eligible to enter for this examination until such time as he has obtained a Certificate of Competency as a Land Surveyor issued by any of the reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand.

2. Applications, accompanied by the required fee, must reach the secretary to the Surveyors Board, Lands Department, Melbourne, at least one month prior to the date of examination.

3. Candidates must also satisfy the Surveyors Board that—

(a) He has served during not less than four months under some authorized mining surveyor in obtaining practical experience in the conduct of underground surveys; or that he has been engaged for not less than twelve months in the conduct of such surveys.

(b) He has acquired a knowledge of the methods and appliances used in mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined and required to pass in each of the four subjects as follow, viz.:—

(a) *Mining Surveying*.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to the datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) *Practical Mining*.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry; construction and management of pumping, winding, and other mining machinery.

(c) *Hydraulic Engineering*.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels; estimation of sources of water supply; dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels; construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) *Geology*.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. Candidates who have taken a degree in Mining Engineering at the University of Melbourne, or in some University whose degrees in Engineering are recognized by that University and whose engineering graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*, or who have taken a like degree in Civil Engineering and have passed the University examination in Mining Surveying and Practical Mining, will be exempt from the whole of the examinations prescribed by Regulation No. 4.

ADOPTION OF A GENERAL SCHEME PROVIDING FOR THE PASTEURIZATION AND BOTTLING OF ALL MILK FOR CONSUMPTION IN THE METROPOLIS.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1943*, it is provided that the functions of the Milk Pasteurization Committee constituted under the said Act shall be—

- to survey the existing facilities for the pasteurization and bottling of milk for consumption in the metropolis;
- to consider what additional facilities for the pasteurization and bottling of milk are required to make adequate provision for the metropolis;
- to submit to the Minister a general scheme providing for the pasteurization and bottling of all milk for consumption in the metropolis:

And whereas the Committee, after surveying the existing facilities for the pasteurization and bottling of milk for consumption in the metropolis and considering what additional facilities for the pasteurization and bottling of milk are required to make adequate provision for the metropolis, submitted to the Minister of Agriculture (being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act) on the 6th July, 1945, a general scheme providing for the pasteurization and bottling of all milk for consumption in the metropolis: And whereas the said scheme provided that the municipalities set out in the schedule to the Act should be divided into two groups, each of which would be required to establish a pasteurization depot: And whereas section 5 further provides that the Governor in Council may adopt with or without modification any general scheme submitted: And whereas the Governor in Council is of the opinion that the said scheme should be adopted subject to the modification that each of the two groups of municipalities mentioned therein should be subdivided into three groups: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby adopt, subject to the modification aforesaid, the general scheme submitted by the Milk Pasteurization Committee to such Minister on the sixth day of July, 1945, the scheme as so modified being—

That the municipalities set out in the schedule to the Act shall be divided into the following groups:—

- Group No. 1.—Preston, Heidelberg, Northcote, Coburg.
Group No. 2.—Brunswick, Essendon, Footscray, Williamstown.
Group No. 3.—Melbourne, Fitzroy, Collingwood, Port Melbourne, South Melbourne, Richmond.
Group No. 4.—Blackburn and Mitcham, Box Hill, Camberwell, Kew, Hawthorn.
Group No. 5.—Malvern, Prahran, Caulfield, Oakleigh, St. Kilda.
Group No. 6.—Brighton, Moorabbin, Sandringham, Mordialloc, Chelsea.

And that the councils of each group of municipalities shall be required to establish within the metropolis a pasteurization depot in such place and of such capacity, nature, and design as such Minister specifies.

And the Honorable Norman Angus Martin, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE "WEDDERBURNE PUBLIC
GARDENS AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 30th October, 1944, as a site for Public Gardens and Recreation in the Parish and Town of Wedderburne, and known as the "Wedderburne Public Gardens and Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for organized games, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings,

gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, or for organized games may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No intoxicating liquor shall be sold on the ground. The Council of the Shire of Korong has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF "HAMMON PARK," CRESWICK.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 25th January, 1864, and 17th January, 1876, as sites for Public Recreation in the Municipal District of Creswick, and known as "Hammon Park," Creswick.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall play, practise, take part, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without the written permission of the Committee of Management. For the purposes of this clause "organized game" or "organized sport" shall mean and include any game, match, play, or sport, whether played regularly, intermittently, or occasionally by any club, organization, institution, or other body or by any party of players.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any such damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by this Regulation, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. No person shall disturb the surface of or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other game, or foot racing, except in those portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

19. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

20. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), or any competitor or official at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games or sports.

The Council of the Shire of Creswick has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF "CAPE PATTERSON BEACH RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of that portion of the reserved Crown lands in the Parish of Wonthaggi, as indicated in red on plan marked W over 16.8.44 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.4057, and known as the "Cape Patterson Beach Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.

2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or any other vegetation in the Reserve, or burn any materials therein.

3. No person shall erect any building, tent, booth, or other structure in the Reserve, nor offer for sale any article therein without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall move or use any boat in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat-house in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed advisable by the Committee of Management.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power to order the removal by the owner thereof, within a fixed period, of any building or other structure which may have been erected in the Reserve in any of the following circumstances:—

- (a) Without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- (b) If the construction thereof be deemed unsatisfactory by the Committee of Management.
- (c) If the same shall not have been kept in good repair to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

Failing the removal of any such building or structure by the owner within the period set down for its removal, the Committee of Management may demolish and remove it forthwith.

7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management in the Reserve shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or take part in any entertainment of any kind in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No assemblies for fêtes or concerts, or for the purpose of public preaching, worship or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in the Reserve.

11. No person shall use or cause to be used any bathing-box, or boat house, or any building for residential purposes.

12. No person or persons shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, or bottles, or any litter, on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

13. No person or persons shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave therein anything that would injure any person.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or any enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may determine at any time not exceeding £10 by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, except in such places as may be set aside from time to time by the Committee of Management for such purpose.

16. Any person prior to entering any enclosure, building, or part of the Reserve where fêtes, concerts, or amusements are being conducted with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall pay such entrance fees, charges, &c., as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

17. No person shall wash any motor vehicle, water stock, or in any way waste, or cause to be wasted, any drinking water which may be provided by the Committee of Management.

18. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees and other charges for use thereof, and all persons occupying such area shall pay the necessary fees and observe such conditions as are deemed advisable by the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall ride, lead, swim, or bring any horse on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot ———," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Friday, 17th August, 1945, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified, and holds a duly signed authority on this form to commence operations.

2. Notification that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded, in writing, to the officer in charge within 48 hours from the date thereof.

3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

4. Satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty prior to removal of the bark.

5. No trees shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.

6. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of the officer in charge. The burning under this provision must be carried out in accordance with the written conditions specified by the District Forester.

7. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.

8. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

9. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision of the officer in charge in accordance with his instructions and to his satisfaction.

10. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

11. No bark shall be removed without the express permission, in writing, of the officer in charge, and it must be properly bundled, securely tied, carted from the forest, and weighed at the weighbridge named, not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark.

12. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

13. No live tree, other than wattle, shall be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

14. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of signing this contract, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall become the property of the Crown.

15. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Forests Commission being made known.

16. No offer will necessarily be accepted.

17. The deposit specified in schedule must accompany each offer.
