Hand tools.
Electric motors.

(No. 4337).

POTATOES DECLARED A COMMODITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 6 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed—(a) where the number of producers of the product does not exceed Two hundred by at least Fifty per centum of the total number of such producers; or (b) where the number of producers of the product exceeds Two hundred by at least One hundred of such producers, plus Five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers exceeds Two hundred, may by Proclamation declare that such product or any specified variety of grade thereof shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act. And whereas the Governor in Council has been requested by a petition signed in accordance with the above-mentioned sub-section to declare that Potatoes shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act. And whereas the said petition sets forth the particulars required by the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of section 6 of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby declare that Potatoes shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT MOOLAP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the eighteenth day of March, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of March, 1941, respecting a Sanctuary for Native Game at Moolap and direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Parish of Moolap, County of Grant: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 13, Parish of Moolap; thence south-easterly by the western side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 13 and 14 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 18A; thence south-easterly and southerly by the western side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 18A, 19A, 19, 21, and 24, and south-westerly by the western side of the road forming the north-western boundary of portion 14 to the south-western angle of allotment 17A; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 18A and by the northern boundary of the road aforesaid to the junction of such road with the Geelong and Portarlington road; thence westerly by the northern side of the said Geelong and Portarlington road to the southerly angle of allotment 1A of section 5; thence north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 1A to the north-eastern angle thereof; thence south-easterly 5,300 links, more or less, in a direct line to a point being high-water mark on the southern shore of Corio Bay, at the western entrance to Stingaree Bay; thence easterly by a direct line to a point being high-water mark on the northern shore of Stingaree Bay, in line with the western boundary of allotment 24; thence northerly by high-water mark to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 13 aforesaid; and thence east by a direct line and the northern boundary of the said allotment 13 to the point of commencement.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT DROMANA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

Zoological Gardens Act 1936.

ZOOLOGICAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the *Zoological Gardens Act* 1936 it is enacted that the Zoological Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, may make regulations for or with respect to the matters set forth therein:

And whereas certain regulations were made by the said Board on the seventeenth day of June, 1938, approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fifth day of July, 1938, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of July, 1938:

And whereas the said Board amended clause eight of the said regulations on the thirty-first day of March, 1939, and the said amendment was approved by the Governor in Council on the third day of April, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of April, 1939:

Now therefore the Zoological Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth rescind clause eight of the regulations aforesaid, and in lieu thereof doth make the clause following (that is to say):—

"8. The charges for admission to the Gardens shall be as follows:—

- (i) For each person over the age of fourteen years—One shilling;
- (ii) For each child over the age of three years but not over the age of fourteen years—Three pence:

Provided that upon application to the Director of the Gardens parties of children attending secondary schools or Sunday schools may (except on Sundays and public holidays) be admitted on payment of one-half of the foregoing charge for a child and parties of children attending State schools or other primary schools and classes in natural history or children in the care of charitable institutions may (except on Sundays and public holidays) be admitted to the Gardens free of charge."

The foregoing amendment of Regulations was made by the Zoological Board of Victoria at a meeting of the said Board held on the twenty-sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-six.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and other powers hereunto enabling, the following Rules are made and shall take effect from the 30th day of July, 1946:—

RULES OF PROCEDURE IN DIVORCE AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES.

Rules 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, and 81 are deleted and the following rules substituted therefor:—

INTERVENTION, ETC., BY THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL AND OTHERS.

71. If in discharge of its or his duties under the Marriage Act the Court or a Judge requests the assistance of the Attorney-General, the Attorney-General may apply *ex parte* to the Judge hearing the petition for directions as to what part the Attorney-General shall take in the further hearing of the petition, and upon such application the Court or Judge may direct what notices shall be given to the parties or any of them and may generally give such directions as may be just, necessary, or convenient with relation to the further hearing of the petition.

72. The Court may make such order for the costs incurred by the Attorney-General, pursuant to such request as to it seems just, including an order that his costs be paid by any party to the petition.

73. When the Attorney-General intends to intervene to oppose the making of a decree *nisi* for dissolution of marriage he shall give to the petitioner written notice of such intention.

74. Application for leave to intervene by any person other than the Attorney-General to oppose the making of a decree *nisi* for dissolution of marriage on any ground involving adultery must be made to the Court or a Judge by motion supported by affidavit.

75. The Attorney-General shall within fourteen days after he has given notice of his intention to intervene, and any other person shall within fourteen days after he has obtained leave to intervene, enter an appearance and plead to the petition, which plea need not be verified by affidavit; and on the day after he files his plea in the prothonotary's office he shall deliver a copy thereof to the petitioner or to his solicitor.

76. All subsequent pleadings and proceedings in respect to such intervention of the Attorney-General or other person in a cause shall be filed and carried on in the same manner as before directed in respect of the pleadings and proceedings of the original parties to the cause.

SHOWING CAUSE AGAINST A DECREE.

77. Applications for leave to show cause why a decree *nisi* for dissolution or nullity of marriage should be reversed must be made to the Court or a Judge by motion supported by affidavit.

78. Within eight days after obtaining such leave the Attorney-General or other person desiring to show cause against a decree *nisi* for dissolution or nullity of marriage being made absolute shall enter an appearance in the cause in which such decree *nisi* has been pronounced and shall within eight days after appearance file in the prothonotary's office his plea setting forth the grounds upon which he desires to show cause as afore-said and on the day he files his plea he shall cause a copy thereof to be served on the party in whose favour the decree *nisi* has been pronounced.

79. The plea of the Attorney-General need not be verified by affidavit, but the plea of any other person shall be so verified.

80. All subsequent pleadings and proceedings in respect to such intervention to show cause shall be filed and carried on in the manner prescribed by these rules in respect of the pleadings and proceedings of the original parties to the suit.

81. The questions raised on such pleadings shall be heard and determined in the same manner as any other issue tried in the Court.

ENGINEERING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 4).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Engineering Trades Regulations (No. 1)," and apply to the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District and the Cities of Geelong and Geelong West, Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz:—

(a) Mechanical Engineering—

- (i) Patternmaking.
- (ii) Fitting and/or Turning.
- (iii) Machinist.

(b) Brassfinishing (except the making of parts by specialized processes and the assembling thereof).

(c) Smithing—

- (i) Blacksmithing (engineering).
- (ii) Copper and/or brass smithing.

APPLICANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATE.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

APPLICANTS MAY BE EXAMINED.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

Exemptions—

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

- (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the school Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with subsection (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

MINIMUM AGE FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

TERM OF APPRENTICESHIP.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be as follows:—

(a) In the case of persons entering the said trades under the age of seventeen years, a term of five years.

(b) In the case of persons entering the said trades at or above the age of seventeen years, a term of four or five years at the option of the contracting parties.

FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP—GENERAL FORM.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts with the following additions thereto:—

ADDITIONAL COVENANTS, ETC., TO GENERAL FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP.

Employer's Covenants.

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

(c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

(c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.

(f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.

(g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holiday without his consent.

(h) Not require the apprentice while under the age of eighteen years to work overtime unless he so desires.

(i) Provide the apprentice with the exception of an apprentice to the Patternmaking trade, with all tools necessary for carrying out his work, including micrometers and verniers, but excluding all other measuring and precision tools of less than 13 inches.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

(c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

Mutual Agreements.

3. At the end of paragraph (3) add the following proviso:—

Provided further—

(i) That where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or

(ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship, or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

10. That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay.

11. That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

FORM OF INDENTURES WHERE APPLICANT IS ADMITTED TO A YEAR OTHER THAN THE FIRST YEAR OF APPRENTICESHIP.

9. In cases, however, where an applicant for apprenticeship in the said trades has been permitted by the Commission, in pursuance of section 18 (1) of the Act, to be admitted to some year of the prescribed apprenticeship course other than the first year, paragraph (a) of the employer's covenant in the indentures of apprenticeship to be entered into shall read as follows:—

(a) Take, receive, and accept the apprentice as his apprentice for the full term of _____ years from the _____ day of _____, the first year of which term shall be deemed to be the _____ year of the _____ term of apprenticeship prescribed in respect of the under-mentioned trade.

RATES OF PAY OF APPRENTICES.

10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

Within 10 miles of G.P.O., Geelong and Warrnambool, and within Mtdura and Gippsland Districts.

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 21s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 45s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 74s. 0d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 93s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—at the rate of 25s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 44s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 74s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 93s. 6d. per week.

At Yallourn—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 23s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 32s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 48s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 79s. 0d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—at the rate of 26s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 47s. 6d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 79s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.

Other parts of Victoria where this Regulation applies.

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 21s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 29s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 43s. 6d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 71s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 90s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—at the rate of 24s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 43s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 71s. 6d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 90s. 6d. per week.

The sum of 2s. 6d. per week shall be added to the above rates where the apprentice is in the trade of Pattermaking.

RATES FOR OVERTIME WORKED.

11. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and Public Holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rates (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to journeymen employed by him in the same trade.

STANDARD OF PROFICIENCY.

12. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

INCREASED RATES OF PAY FOR PROFICIENCY.

13. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

- (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
- (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
- (c) for the third and/or fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

PROPORTION OF APPRENTICES TO JOURNEYMEN.

14. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen, or fraction of three journeymen, employed by such employer in such trade: Provided that the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer in the trades of turning and/or fitting and machinist shall not exceed in the total the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen of the total number of journeymen in such trades.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

APPRENTICESHIP COURSE.—CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.

15. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship courses for the said trades shall be as set out in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Schedules hereto (as the case may be), but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

STANDARD OF EDUCATION TO BE ATTAINED BY AN APPRENTICE.

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in each year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of

the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

TRADE EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OF AN APPRENTICE.

(c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be):—

Patternmaking.—All classes of patternmaking and all things incidental thereto for the reproduction of metal castings, including the correct methods of use of tools commonly used in the trade.

Fitting.—All classes of mechanical fitting and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of hand tools commonly used in the trade.

Turning.—All classes of turning and all things incidental thereto, including methods of setting up and of operating lathes.

Machinist.—All classes of machining and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of setting up and operating the following machines:—Boring machine, milling machine, planing machine, shaping machine, slotting machine, grinding machine.

Fitting and Turning.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Fitting and Machinist.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Turning and Machinist.—All classes of such trades as above described.

Brassfinishing.—All classes of fitting and of machining in non-ferrous metals and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of hand tools commonly used in the trade and the correct methods of setting up and operating all types of machines used in the trade.

Blacksmithing.—All classes of smithing and forging in iron, steel, and metals common to the engineering trades and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of all tools commonly used in the trade.

Copper and/or Brasssmithing.—All classes of smithing in non-ferrous metals and metals common to the trade and all things incidental thereto, including the correct methods of use of all tools used in the trade—

and the employer shall by the best means in his power teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the apprentice in the said processes.

ATTENDANCE AT CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.

16. (a) Every apprentice and applicant in the said trade shall attend the classes for instruction prescribed for his apprenticeship course at such times and at such place or places and on such occasions while the classes are open for instruction as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or applicant shall be required to attend shall not exceed two in any one week.

Where attendance at Technical School classes is impracticable every apprentice or applicant for the said trade shall enrol for and undertake a correspondence course for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations.

EMPLOYER TO PERMIT APPRENTICE OR APPLICANT TO ATTEND CLASSES.

(b) Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and applicants to attend for instruction at the school or schools and class or classes at the hours and on the occasions specified in such notice.

Where attendance at Technical School classes is impracticable every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations shall permit the apprentice or applicant, without deduction from his wages during ordinary working hours for four hours in any week during the period of two years within the first three years of his apprenticeship course, to perform on the employer's premises the theoretical or practical work of or incidental to the correspondence course.

APPRENTICE OR APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT HIMSELF FOR EXAMINATION.

(c) Every apprentice or applicant attending the aforesaid class or classes shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the Commission.

PENALTIES FOR NON-ATTENDANCE, MISBEHAVIOUR, ETC.

(d) Any apprentice or applicant who—

(i) fails to attend any Technical School or classes which he is required to attend or fails to enrol for and undertake any correspondence course, punctually, at the time appointed for commencement thereto, or, without the permission of the Instructor, leaves the same before the time appointed for leaving; or

(ii) fails to be diligent or behaves in an indecorous manner while in such school or class; or

(iii) destroys or fails to take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in such school or class; or

(iv) without good and satisfactory reason, in the opinion of the Commission, fails to secure in each year a record of 80 per cent. of attendances in the day classes and in the evening classes prescribed for his apprenticeship course—

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, or, alternatively, to cancellation of his indentures by the Commission.

In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course, the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.

APPRENTICE OR APPLICANT TO PROVIDE BOOKS, MATERIALS, ETC.

(e) Every apprentice or applicant shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments, and materials required at the classes for instruction, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES.

17. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.

INCORPORATION OF GENERAL REGULATIONS.

18. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

1. Regulation 7 of the Boilermaking and/or Steel Construction Trades Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1946.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person, or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation, before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

"7. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1946, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 21s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 45s. 0d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 74s. 0d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 93s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 25s. 0d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 44s. 6d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 74s. 0d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 93s. 6d. per week."

AMENDMENT OF BUTCHERING AND/OR SMALL GOODS
MAKING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

WHEREAS in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636), the Governor in Council did, on the 20th day of February, 1940, make Regulations entitled the *Butchering and/or Small Goods Making Trades Regulations* (No. 1): Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Acts* and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

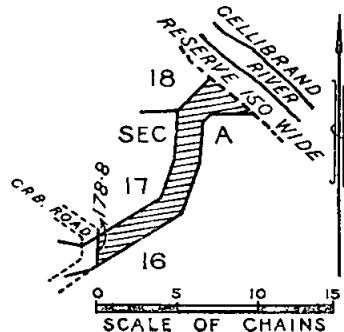

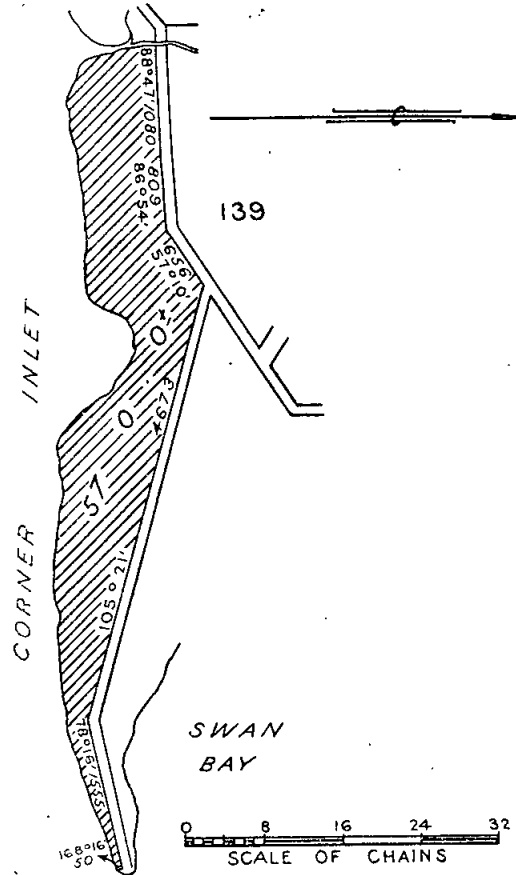

EXPLOSIVES MAGAZINE RESERVE AT TRUGANINA.—
BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Powder Magazines Act 1896* and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following By-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina, and for other purposes referred to in the act first aforementioned (that is to say):—

BY-LAWS.

- In the following By-laws the terms—
“Lessee” shall include person, corporation, or firm, and the successors, executors, administrators, or assigns (as the case may be) of the same.
“Reserve” shall mean the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina.
“Jetty” shall mean the jetty and any extension thereof belonging to the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina.
- Sites for private magazines may be let or leased from time to time by the Board of Land and Works upon such conditions as are prescribed by the regulations, for the time being in force, made under the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*.
- The right of any person to become the lessee of a site of a magazine for the storage of explosives shall be conditional on his satisfying the Chief Inspector of Explosives that he is a fit and proper person to become such lessee.
- The rent to be charged for each site shall be Twenty shillings per annum, and shall be payable in advance, on the first day of each year, to the Collector of Imposts, at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Melbourne.
- Charges, to include the cost of necessary handling and transport between the Powder Anchorages and the Reserve, but not to include the cost of any unusual or special service in handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosives, shall be paid on all explosives (other than those belonging to His Majesty's Government) received upon the jetty or tramway at the following rates:—
Explosives, other than detonators—1s. 3d. for every 25lb. weight or fractional part thereof.
Detonators, other than electric—2s. for every case containing not more than 5,000 in number; 5s. for every case containing more than 5,000 in number.
Detonators, electric—
With wire leads not exceeding 96 inches in length—
2s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof.
With wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length—
3s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof.
- No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall go alongside the jetty without the consent of the officer in charge of the Reserve.
- No person shall be upon or under any portion of the jetty, or shall enter or be upon any building on or connected with such jetty without the consent of the officer in charge of the Reserve.
- No goods of any description, other than explosives authorized by Order in Council to be manufactured or imported, shall be landed on or delivered from the jetty, or conveyed over the tramway, without the consent of the Chief Inspector of Explosives or of the officer in charge of the Reserve.
- No explosives shall be allowed to remain on the jetty, but must forthwith be placed in trucks or in the Government receiving magazine, or loaded into powder lighters.
- The loading or unloading of explosives on or from the jetty shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1928*, or any amendment thereof and regulations thereunder, and the Ports and Harbors Regulations for the time being in force.
- Any powder lighter having explosive on board shall not, without reasonable excuse, approach within 300 yards of the jetty, except for the purpose of the immediate loading or unloading of explosive.
- Any powder lighter, after completing the loading or unloading of explosive cargo or having ceased loading or unloading of explosive cargo for the day, shall leave the jetty without unnecessary delay.

13. The Government accepts no responsibility for loss by accident, fire, or explosion, but will take all reasonable precautions for the protection of life and property.

14. These By-laws shall come into force on the seventeenth day of August, 1946, and on the commencement of these By-laws all By-laws previously made shall be and are hereby revoked.

In clause 1, at the end of the paragraph reading "On the occasion of football or cricket matches when a charge is made for admission to the grounds, the revenue derived shall be dealt with in accordance with the rules of the league, association, or other organization under which the clubs in such matches play," there shall be added the following words:—

"But this provision shall not apply to matches of the Hawthorn Football Club to be held at the sports ground during the year 1946, the revenue from which matches, after paying ground management expenses and administration charges, shall be divided between the Hawthorn Football Club and the visiting clubs by paying to the visiting clubs the amount to which such clubs would ordinarily be entitled and paying to the Hawthorn Football Club the remainder of such revenue, less the amount payable to the Outerground Improvement Fund, and an amount equal to 1s. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the sports ground and 50 per cent. of the balance of the amount which, but for the provisions of this By-law would have been payable to the Council, the sum so deducted as representing the amount payable to the Outerground Improvement Fund and 1s. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the sports ground, and 50 per cent. of the balance of the proportion payable under the rules of the Victorian Football League to the Council, as the Grounds Management Committee, to be retained by the Council, and in the event of the amount payable to the Hawthorn Football Club during the year 1946 under the provisions hereof reaching an amount of £200 in excess of the amount to which the Hawthorn Football Club would ordinarily be entitled under the rules of the Victorian Football League, then the arrangement for the division of revenue from matches of the Hawthorn Football Club at the sports ground hereunder shall cease, and such revenue shall thereafter be divided in accordance with the rules of the Victorian Football League."
