## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Sandringham has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Sandringham aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

All that piece and parcel of land between South-road and Ludstone-street and known as Olive-street, Hampton, as shown on plan of subdivision No. 2203, being part of Crown allotment 16, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke.

## MIRBOO NORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW No. 1.

*Standing Orders for Regulating and Appointing the Place and Hour of Meetings of the Mirboo North Waterworks Trust and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat, and for other purposes.*

THE Mirboo North Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. *General Conduct of Business.*—In all cases not provided for by the Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Place and Hour of Meetings.*—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically on the third Tuesday in the month, at 8 o'clock p.m., at the Shire Hall, Mirboo North. Upon notice of motion the time, day, and hour of the meeting may be altered by a majority of the Commissioners.

3. *Meetings, Notice of.*—A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual address of Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day on which such intended meeting is to be held.

4. *Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

5. *Business, &c., Order of, Minutes.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.

6. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
- (2) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
- (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- (6) Payments.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
- (8) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

7. *Titles, Official.*—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman, or Commissioner, as the case may require.

8. *Who to Speak.*—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is entitled to priority.

9. *Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting.*—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.

10. *Commissioners Not to Speak Twice on Same Question.*—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

11. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

12. *Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.*—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-

matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

13. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

14. *Persons not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.*—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.

15. *Call of the Commissioners.*—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

16. *Documents to be Produced.*—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

17. *Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.*—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of meeting of the Commissioners; or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day upon which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

18. *No Motion without Notice.*—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

19. *Motions and Petitions.*—No motion except that for the receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.

20. *Motions to be Moved in Order.*—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

21. *Motions Not to be Proceeded With in the Absence of the Mover.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

22. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

23. *Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.*—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

24. *Nature of Motion to be Stated.*—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

25. *Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

26. *Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussions.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

27. *Mover and Not the Seconder held to have Spoken.*—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken, thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

28. *Motions to be in Writing.*—At every meeting of the Commissioners all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

29. *Amendments.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. *Amendment to Become the Question.*—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.

31. *Second Amendment may be Moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.

32. *Right of Mover to Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

33. *Adjournment, Motion for.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

34. *Protest, Commissioners May.*—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reason for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.

35. *Lapsed Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

36. *Order of the Day to be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

37. *Voting.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from so doing.

38. *Questions to be Put.*—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

39. *Contents of Petitions.*—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.

40. *Name at Beginning of Petition.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

41. *Petition to be in Writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.

42. *How Signed.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

43. *No Letters, &c., to be Attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

44. *Presentation of Petitions.*—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

45. *Deputations.*—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition or otherwise must send in an application, in writing, to the Trust Secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

46. *Cheques to be Signed.*—That all cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners and countersigned by the Secretary.

47. *Appointments to Permanent Office.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Township of Mirboo North inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.

48. *Salaries to be Fixed.*—The salary or allowances attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

49. *Commissioners, &c., not to be Surety.*—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or

auditor shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.

50. *Contracts.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

51. *Plans, &c.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.

52. *Secretary to Expend Moneys.*—It shall be lawful for the Trust Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purpose of the clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasions, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners, the sum of Ten pounds.

53. *Addresses to the Governor, &c.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

54. *Suspension of Regulations.*—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a certain purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

55. *Penalty.*—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

56. *Common Seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary be present.

#### CHILTERN WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1946.

THE Chiltern Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Chiltern Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is a building) be less than Two pounds, and in respect of land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and six pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing 1st January and ending 31st December, 1946, and shall be payable on the 21st day of August, 1946, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied for the year, without further charge to any property rated by the Trust, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Two shillings and four pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings and four pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings and four pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Chiltern.

**REGULATIONS.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Building Operations and Building Materials Control Act 1946* His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Building Operations and Building Materials Control Regulations (No. 1) and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“ Person ” includes a corporation.

“ Minister ” means the Minister of Housing.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females, words in the singular shall include the plural and words in the plural shall include the singular.

3. (a) Every person who is a sawmiller wholly or partly engaged in the business of sawing any species of timber of the genus *Eucalyptus* other than Red Gum, except when specially exempted in writing by the Minister, shall produce during each calendar month sawn timber suitable for the manufacture of flooring and weatherboards in accordance with the specification set out in the Schedule hereto and to the extent therein specified of his total monthly output of sawn timber.

(b) Every such person shall furnish to the Controller of Timber at 125 Queen-street, Melbourne, within seven days after the expiration of each calendar month a true and correct return setting out, in respect of the preceding calendar month, the quantity of sawn timber produced in accordance with the specifications set out in the said Schedule.

4. Every person who owns any kiln-dried and dressed hardwood flooring shall use such flooring only for construction of floors in houses, or for such other purposes as the Minister may approve in writing.

5. Any person who—

(a) contravenes;

(b) fails to comply with; or

(c) commits a breach of

any of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds (£100).

**SCHEDULE.**

(a) (i) Not less than 10 per cent. of total monthly output of green sawn timber shall be in sizes 4 in. x 1 in. and/or 5 in. x 1 in. and/or 6 in. x 1 in. cut on the quarter and sawn full to size.

(ii) Not less than 5 per cent. of total monthly production of green sawn timber shall be in the sizes 6 in. x ¾ in. and/or 7 in. x ¾ in. cut on the quarter and sawn full to size.

(b) Lengths.—The lengths may vary from six (6) to twenty (20) feet with not more than ten per centum (10%) of the total number of pieces in six (6) seven (7) and eight (8) feet.

(c) Quality.—The timber shall be of a grade not lower than that of merchantable quality as defined by the Standard Association of Australia under Grading Rules Technical Standard No. 0.5.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "COHUNA RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved lands in the Parish of Cohuna, as indicated by red and blue tinting on plan marked C over 8.3.1946 with Lands Department Correspondence Rs.5312, and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The Committee of Management (hereinafter in these Regulations referred to as "the Committee") may set the Reserve aside for fêtes, agricultural shows, sports, concerts, band recitals, or public amusements and the like, for not more than 52 days in any year, on any of which days a sum not exceeding Three shillings (3s.) for the admission of every person, and not exceeding Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) for each conveyance, carriage, horse-drawn vehicle, or motor vehicle, exclusive of the driver or passengers, may be charged and taken, and no person shall be entitled to admission to the Reserve on such days unless he or she pays the proper fee.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no male person shall enter or remain in any lavatory, building, enclosure, or portion of the Reserve set apart for females.

4. No person shall enter into or remain in or on any room, building, structure, enclosure, or area set apart for players, performers, or competitors at any games, sports entertainments or competitions, or for any exhibits, exhibitors, or performers at any such shows, fêtes, entertainments, or competitions, and no person shall at any time enter into any building or structure set apart by the Committee for the use of any sporting body or other organization.

5. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

6. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

7. No person shall jump or climb over or pass under the fences or gates, in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or damage them in any way, or roll or throw stones, sticks, or other missiles in the Reserve.

8. No person shall climb on any building, room, gate, or structure in the Reserve, nor open nor force any door or window of such building, room, or structure, or in any way deface, damage, or injure any such building, room, or structure.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

10. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve except in the receptacles provided.

11. No person shall put into the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs without the consent or permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.

13. No person shall camp in the Reserve or in any room, building, or structure therein, without consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person erect therein any building, hut, or attachment without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. The Committee may issue a permit to camp upon payment of One shilling (1s.) per day or Five shillings (5s.) per week per party or vehicle.

14. No person shall buy, sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, wares, articles, or merchandise or stuff, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall take part in any public entertainment, meeting, or gathering in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition, within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day.

17. No person shall bet or wager in the Reserve.

18. No person shall expectorate or otherwise foul or commit any nuisance in any part of the Reserve, or any room, building, structure, or enclosure therein.

19. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, game, or competition except in the portions of the Reserve set apart by the Committee for that purpose, and such Committee may from time to time grant to any club, society, or association of clubs the use of the Reserve or any part so set apart, for the purpose of any lawful games, fêtes, sports, amusements, or entertainments and the like upon such terms, conditions, and the payment of such fees as the Committee deems reasonable.

20. No person shall obstruct, disturb, or interrupt or annoy any officer, employee, or authorized agent of the Committee or person permitted to use the Reserve.

21. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cycle, horse, carriage, cart, motor car, or any other vehicle except into such parts as may be set apart for the purpose.

22. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve, or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

(a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.

(b) Being under the influence of liquor.

(c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing ground area, enclosure or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.

(d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.

(e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.

(g) Interfering with, or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereof.

(h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

23. No persons except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

In respect of this Reserve, the Council of the Shire of Cohuna has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, and the long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood be obtained from a State Forest Timber Reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission. Messmate wood will not be accepted.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase elsewhere or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, provided that the contractor shall be given 48 hours' notice before purchases are made or the wood re-stacked at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Tender Board, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense incurred thereby, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. Accounts for firewood shall be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

2. The description of residential area No. 3 (Abbotsford), as so amended, shall form part of the Schedule of the said By-law in substitution for the former description of residential area No. 3 (Abbotsford) and the amended description shall be deemed to have been inserted on the coming into operation of such By-law No. 69 in the place and stead of the former description.

## CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

## BY-LAW No. 134.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 134, for the purpose of altering By-law No. 105 and repealing By-law No. 125.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

3A. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) a motor car or other vehicle standing in any part of Beach-road, in the City of Sandringham, from a line across such road which commences at Hampton at a point on the east boundary line of Beach-road, 30 feet north of the north building line of Small-street at its intersection with Beach-road and is perpendicular to the east building line of such road at that point to a line across Beach-road at Beaumaris which is the prolongation of the west building line of Cromer-road.

2. By-law number 125 is hereby repealed.  
Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council, the 7th day of May, 1946, and confirmed the 18th day of June, 1946.
