Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 4 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

ADDITIONS TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE "POISONS ACT 1928."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 38 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by section 5 of the *Poisons Act 1930*, power is conferred on the Governor in Council by Proclamation on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria to add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* the name of any substance or preparation the name of which is not included in paragraph (1) of the said Schedule, but which is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects of such nature as to make it expedient in the opinion of the Board to add the name thereof to the said paragraph (2); and to declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the said *Poisons Act* shall apply to the said substance or preparation in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2):—

And whereas the name of the substance or preparation known as penicillin and all preparations of penicillin and its salts and compounds of penicillin and its salts is not included in paragraph (1) of the said Schedule, but is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects of such a nature as to make it expedient in the opinion of the said Board to add the name thereof to the said paragraph (2) of the said Sixth Schedule.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* the name of penicillin and all preparations of penicillin and its salts and compounds of penicillin and its salts.

And declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928* shall apply to the said substance or preparation namely to—penicillin and all preparations of penicillin and its salts—in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

Route 96A (Thornbury-Crowton).—Under the heading "Sections on Route," insert "(5) Overlapping section, between Thornbury Railway Station and Newcastle-street."

Under the heading "Maximum Number of Motor Omnibuses which may be Licensed on Route," amend "2" to read "3."

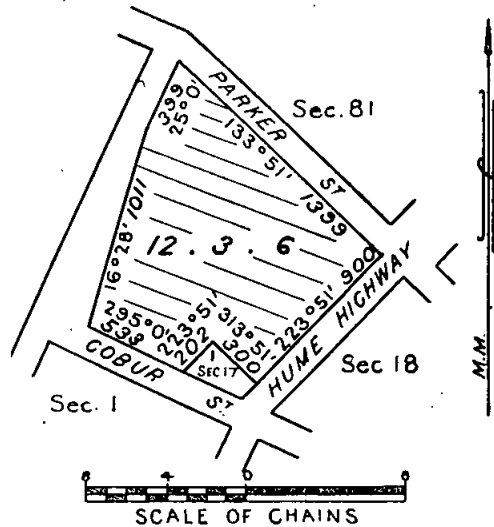

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1946 (No. 3).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1946 (No. 3), and shall be read and construed as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1931, 1932, 1934, 1945, 1946, and 1946 (No. 2).

2. At the end of Regulation 31 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930, as amended by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1932, add the following additional proviso, namely:—

Provided also that a registered dentist may write a prescription for penicillin for dental treatment.

3. Regulation 33 and Regulation 34 (2) and (4) of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 (as amended by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1932 and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1945) shall not apply to a prescription for penicillin or any preparation thereof.

4. A veterinary surgeon or other person shall not prescribe or order or sell, supply, or dispense penicillin for the treatment of animals other than penicillin manufactured for veterinary use and packed in containers bearing a label indicating that it is manufactured for veterinary use.

5. The following Regulations shall apply to penicillin manufactured for veterinary use, namely:—

1. It shall be supplied only on the written prescription of a registered veterinary surgeon or on the certificate of an officer (duly authorized in that behalf) of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Victoria or of the Department of Commerce and Agriculture of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the Department of Health of the Commonwealth of Australia.

2. It shall be prescribed and used only for the treatment of bovine mastitis.

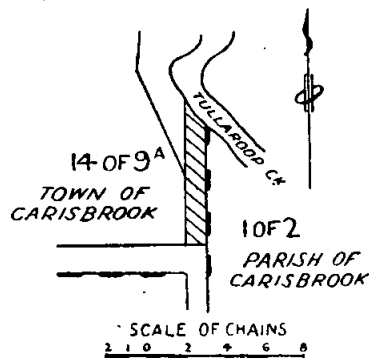

(ii) the digging of clay incidental to the manufacture of the above-mentioned articles.

(b) Adjust the powers of the Roofing Tiles Board and of the Pottery Board by depriving the said Pottery Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

(i) the process, trade, or business of making accessories for roofing tiles other than roofing tiles made of cement; air vents, chimney pots, agricultural pipes, terra cotta lumber, and flower pots.

(ii) the digging of clay incidental to the manufacture of the above-mentioned articles; and conferring such power exclusively on the said Roofing Tiles Board.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE "MANDURANG RECREATION
RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council of 21st August, 1945, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Mandurang, and known as the "Mandurang Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as the same may be set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, or other sports, shows, or fêtes, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged for the admission of every adult to the said Reserve, and an additional One shilling for the admission of every adult to any stand, pavilion, or enclosure therein.
2. No person who offends or may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve.
3. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate, or stick any bills thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.
5. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper.
6. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee.
7. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of any game or amusement or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.
9. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall walk upon any flower-bed or enter any plot therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve on Sunday, Anzac Day, or Good Friday.
13. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee thereof.
14. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained.
15. No person shall camp in the Reserve.
16. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play cricket, hockey, football, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other organized game in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

17. No person other than players and officials connected with any game, and competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such game or sport.

18. No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, or any other organized game in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee, unless such person is at the time a playing member of any club which is duly authorized by the Committee to play therein.

19. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee or any club, association, or person authorized to issue such ticket of admission, or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

20. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

21. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, coursing, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

22. No male person other than a boy under the age of seven years shall enter or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females.

23. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WOORINEN NORTH RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the provisions of the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council of 5th March, 1940, as a Site for Public Recreation purposes in the Parish of Tyntynder West, known as the "Woorinen North Recreation Reserve," and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no male person shall enter or remain in any structure, enclosure, or portion of the Reserve set apart for females.

3. No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, flowers, or any structures in the Reserve, nor light any fires therein except in such places as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

4. No person shall put any stock on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

5. No person shall bet in the Reserve.

6. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in such places or receptacles as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

7. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall erect any booth or other structure on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

2. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet.
