PUBLIC SERVICE OF VICTORIA.—VACANCIES.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Chief Librarian, Public Library, Class "A," Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£820, minimum; £970, maximum.

Duties.—To have charge of the administration of the Public Library of Victoria.

Qualifications.—To have had extensive experience as a Librarian and to possess proved administrative ability and an intimate knowledge of the activities of the Public Library. An appropriate University degree is essential.

Chief Technical Officer, Classes "B" and "A," Department of State Forests.

Yearly Salary.—£722, minimum; £820 maximum.

Duties.—To be responsible for—

- (a) the direction and supervision of current and long-term forest management plans; and
- (b) the general supervision and co-ordination of work of technical sections of forest administration.

Qualifications.—To possess a University degree in Forestry, or the Diploma of an institution recognized as giving advanced training in Forestry, and to have had extensive field experience of forest administration.

Senior Entomologist, Classes "C" and "B," Department of Agriculture.

Yearly Salary.—£553, minimum; £696, maximum.

Duties.—Under the Biologist, to supervise the agricultural entomological research work and advisory activities of the entomology staff of the Department; to prepare reports on entomological matters, and to deliver lectures and conduct field demonstrations on the control of insect pests.

Qualifications.—To possess a degree in Agricultural Science of the Melbourne University (or its equivalent), and proved experience in the conduct of original research into agricultural entomological problems and their control as evidenced by published work.

Cool Storage Research Officer, Classes "C" and "B," Department of Agriculture.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £618, maximum.

Duties.—To initiate and carry out research work on the cool storage and transportation of fruit and vegetables.

Qualifications.—To possess the Degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science, Melbourne University (or its equivalent). Experience in the above duties is desirable.

District Tobacco Instructor, Classes "D" and "C," Department of Agriculture.

Yearly Salary.—£397, minimum; £501, maximum.

Duties.—To undertake advisory services and tuition to growers in the growing, harvesting, curing, and grading of tobacco; to carry out tobacco experimental work as required, and to furnish regular reports as to the condition of tobacco crops.

Qualifications.—To possess a knowledge of the soils, climatic conditions, manurial and cultivation treatment suitable for the growing of tobacco in Victoria, and of the raising of seedlings and the treatment of crop during growth, and to have had experience in the growing, curing, and grading of tobacco.

Assistant District Officer, Boort, Classes "D" and "C," Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£384, minimum; £475, maximum.

Duties.—To assist the District Engineer or District Officer in carrying out construction and maintenance of water supply works and distribution of water throughout the district; to carry out surveys in connexion with the location and maintenance of channels and the layout of irrigation farms, and to prepare plans, estimates, and reports in regard to water supply matters.

Qualifications.—To have had practical experience in the construction of water supply works and distribution of water. The possession of a Technical School Diploma in Civil Engineering or other recognized civil engineering qualification is desirable.

Draughtsman, Class "D," Department of Lands and Survey. (Four vacancies.)

Yearly Salary.—£351, minimum; £436, maximum.

Positions Nos. 1, 2, and 3—

Duties.—To compile plans for reproduction, and to draw plans from surveyors' field notes and miscellaneous draughting work, including the required computations.

Qualifications.—To have passed Grade III, Land Surveying, at a Technical School, or other approved examinations, and the School Leaving examination, including two of the following subjects:—Mathematics II, III, and IV, and to be a competent survey draughtsman, thoroughly conversant with survey computations and the compilation of plans for reproduction.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATION XV. (A).—STUDENTSHIPS AND COURSES AT THE TEACHERS' COLLEGE.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 124 and 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928* and of all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XV. (A).—Studentships and Courses at the Teachers' College—in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. In clause 2 for the expression "and (g) below" there shall be substituted the expression "(g) and (h) below."

2. In clause 4 for the expression—
"and

(g) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director and approved by the Minister." there shall be substituted the expression—

(g) Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate—two years; and

(h) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director and approved by the Minister."

3. In sub-clause (c) of clause 7 after the words "Trained Special Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "or for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate."

4. In clause 8 for the words "and the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate" there shall be substituted the words "the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate and the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate."

5. In paragraph (i) of sub-clause (a) of clause 22 for the words "at least eighteen years of age" there shall be substituted the words "at least seventeen years of age."

6. After sub-clause (c) of clause 22 there shall be added the following sub-clauses:—

(d) The first two years of the course shall be taken at an approved technical school or other school approved for the purpose, and the third year at a teachers' college.

(c) Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or third year of the course may, on being awarded studentships, be admitted by the Director to the year for which they are qualified."

7. Clause 23 shall be rescinded and a new clause made as follows:—

"23. (a) Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the subjects of the course for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate shall be as indicated below:—

First Year.

For Men and Women Students.—Geometrical Drawing (Art); Perspective, Grade I.; Lettering, Grade I.; Drawing from Models and Objects, Grade I.; Drawing Plant Forms from Nature, Grade I.; General Design, Grade I.; Modelling, Grade I.; Architecture, Grade I.

For Men Students.—Cabinet making, Grade I.; Sheetmetal-work, Grade I.

For Women Students.—Plain Needlework, Grade I.; Decorative Needlework, Grade I.; Dressmaking, Grade I.

Second Year.

For Men and Women Students.—Drawing from Models and Objects, Grade II.; Modelling Ornament from a Cast; Drawing Plant Forms from Nature, Grade II.; General Design, Grade II., or Modelled Design, Grade II.; Historic Ornament, Grade I.

For Men Students.—Cabinet making, Grade II.; Light or Repoussé Metalwork, Grade I.

For Women Students.—Plain Needlework, Grade II.; Decorative Needlework, Grade II.; Dressmaking, Grade II.

Third Year.

For Men and Women Students.—Speech Training; Principles of Education; Special Methods; Psychology; Practice of Teaching; First Aid and Physical Education.

For Men Students.—Blacksmithing, Grade I.

For Women Students.—Millinery, Grade I.

(b) In addition to passing in the subjects mentioned in sub-clause (a) of this clause, candidates shall submit satisfactory specimens of work as hereunder:—

(i) Specimens of craft work in any three of the following crafts:—

Printed Decorations; Weaving; Bookmaking; Manuscript Lettering and Illustration; Leatherwork; Etching and Engraving; Pottery.

(ii) Specimens of work in the subject Rendering Simple Objects and Flowers in Colour.

(iii) A note-book of library and museum studies.

(iv) A drawing in light and shade from any two simple models arranged as a group, to be executed in pencil, chalk, charcoal, or monochrome water colour.

(v) A drawing from nature of any freely growing plant, to be executed with a pen or a brush on a half imperial sheet.

(vi) A study from nature of a flowering plant in water colour, with two designs from it to fill decoratively such simple shapes as a lozenge, a square, a circle, or a lunette, one design to be in monochrome and one in two or more colours, and the study and the designs to be mounted on an imperial sheet.

(vii) A sheet of lettering to consist of a sentence or a motto in Roman characters executed in one colour on a coloured ground on a quarter imperial sheet and displayed on a mount fifteen inches by twenty-two inches in size.

(c) Each of the specimens of work mentioned in sub-clause (b) of this clause shall be executed at a technical school, in which case each specimen shall be certified by the senior art teacher as the unaided work of the candidate, or at some other school approved for the purpose, in which case each specimen shall be certified by the head master as the unaided work of the candidate; and shall be retained by the Education Department until the candidate has qualified for the certificate.

(d) Each of the specimens of work mentioned in paragraphs (iv), (v), and (vi), of sub-clause (b) of this clause shall be displayed on a grey or black mount thirty inches by twenty-two inches in size."

8. After clause 24 there shall be inserted the following heading and clauses:—

"Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate.

24A. (a) The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate shall be as follows:—

(i) Applicants shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.

(ii) They shall have passed the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification, and shall have completed an approved commercial course.

(iii) They shall have had at least one year's experience as teachers in approved schools and be recommended for studentships by an inspector of schools.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, studentships may be awarded to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

24B. (a) Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the subjects of the course of training for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate shall be—

First Year.

Theory and Practice of Teaching; Shorthand and Typewriting; Commercial Law, Part I.; Accountancy, Part I.; Economic Geography.

Second Year.

Theory and Practice of Teaching; Shorthand and Typewriting, or Economics, Part I.; Commercial Law, Part II.; Accountancy, Part II.; Economic History, Part I.

(b) Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second year of the course for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate may, on being awarded a studentship, be admitted by the Director to the second year of the course."

9. In sub-clause (d) of clause 27 after the words "Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "or for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate."

10. After sub-clause (f) of clause 27 there shall be added a new sub-clause (g) as follows:—

"(g) The holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate who, prior to the award of his studentship, did not satisfy the requirement mentioned in sub-clause (d) of this clause and who failed to complete successfully the final year of his course of training shall be placed two subdivisions lower than the subdivision he would have been placed in if he had satisfied both such requirements and shall be paid the corresponding initial salary."

(A) of Regulations made under the Public Service Acts and dated the _____ day of _____ 19____ as amended by any Regulation or Regulations made under the said Acts the student has been awarded a studentship in a course of training at the Teachers' College at _____ in the said State: And whereas it is provided by clause 33 of the said Regulation that the holder of such a studentship may in certain circumstances have h _____ studentship extended: And whereas it is provided by the said Regulation that every student awarded a studentship shall be required as a condition of such studentship to enter into an agreement by himself and a surety approved by the Minister in the form therein prescribed: And whereas the Minister has approved of the party hereto of the second part as such surety as aforesaid: And whereas the student and the surety have requested the Minister to pay on behalf of the student the tuition fees (if any) that may become payable during the currency of the said studentship or of any extension thereof as aforesaid and to make to the student the allowances and advances (if any) to which _____ he may be or may become entitled under the provisions of the aforesaid Regulation or any amendment thereof in connexion with h _____ studentship or any extension thereof: And whereas the Minister has agreed to pay such fees and to make such allowances and advances as aforesaid: Now these presents witness that in consideration of the premises the student and the surety do hereby for themselves their executors and administrators and also as separate covenants each of them doth hereby for h _____ self h _____ executors and administrators covenant with the Minister in manner following, that is to say:—

1. That the student will observe the conditions of tenure of h _____ studentship or any extension thereof as provided by the Regulation relating thereto or any amendment thereof for the time being in force.

2. That the student will not relinquish or discontinue h _____ course of training and study under or in connexion with the said studentship or any extension thereof without the permission in writing of the Minister first had and obtained.

3. That the student will for and throughout the period of three and one-half years next after the termination of h _____ said course of training and study teach in any school to which _____ he may be appointed by the Minister or under and in pursuance of any Act or Regulations for the time being in force governing or relating to the appointment of

State school teachers: Provided that the beginning of such period of three and one-half years may be deferred by the Minister for such reason and for such time as he may think fit: And provided also that in computing the said period of three and one-half years any leave of absence granted to the student at any time or times after the commencement of such period shall not be reckoned as part thereof.

4. That all moneys advanced to the student shall be repaid to the Minister by the student and the surety or either of them within two years next after the completion of the said studentship or any extension thereof by such instalments and at such times as the Minister may in his discretion determine.

5. That in the event of—

(a) the cancellation by the Minister of the said studentship or any extension thereof;

(b) the termination of the services of the student as a teacher after the expiration of the studentship and any extension thereof but before the expiration of the period of three and one-half years aforesaid by any cause whatever other than death; or

(c) any breach of non-observance by the student of any term other than clause 4 of this agreement—

the student and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay or cause to be paid to the Minister an amount of Thirty pounds in respect of each year or portion of a year of the student's tenure of h _____ studentship or any extension thereof, and will in addition pay or cause to be paid to the Minister an amount equal to the total amount of all outstanding advances which the student has received, and of all allowances other than allowances made under clauses 25A, 26, and 26A of the said Regulation which the student has received, and of all tuition fees the benefit of which the student has received, during and by virtue of h _____ tenure of h _____ studentship and any extension thereof.

Provided, however, that if the matters referred to in paragraph (b) or (c) arise the total amount payable by the student to the Minister under this clause other than the amount of any advances may with the approval of the Minister be proportionately reduced in consideration of each completed period of three months' service as a teacher, and if the student is a female who after commencing service as a teacher resigns or retires in order to marry she shall if the Minister so directs be deemed for the purpose of this provision to have completed an additional period of six months' service as a teacher: And provided further that if the student is a female who either before the expiration of the studentship or after the expiration thereof but before commencing service as a teacher resigns or retires in order to marry the sum other than the amount of any advances payable by such student to the Minister under this clause shall if the Minister so directs be reduced by an amount equal to one-seventh part of such sum.

6. That the liability of the surety h _____ executors or administrators hereunder shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of any time or other indulgence which the Minister may in his absolute discretion grant to the student whereby the time or mode of payment by the student of the whole or any portion of the moneys referred to in clauses 4 and 5 of this agreement may be extended or altered.

7. That the liability of the student and the surety their executors or administrators shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of the acceptance by the Governor in Council of the resignation of the student from h _____ position as a teacher at any time during the period for which he is required by this agreement to serve as a teacher.

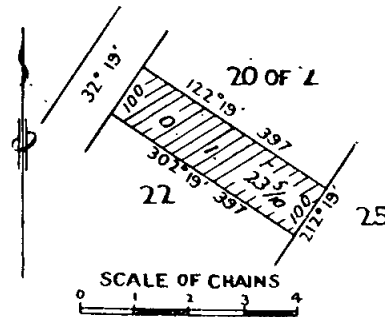

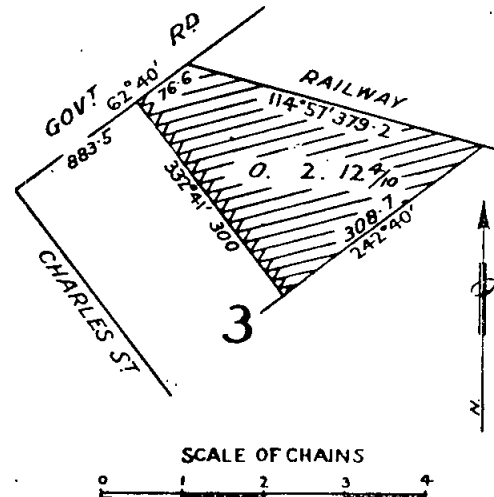

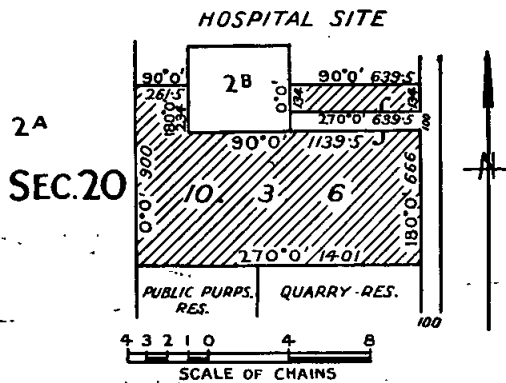
