PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF FERNTREE GULLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Ferntree Gully has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved by the said Council for the purpose of making streets, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situated within the Shire of Ferntree Gully aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Tyner-road.—All that piece of land known as Tyner-road, being part of Crown allotment 43, Parish of Scoresby, County of Mornington, commencing at a point on the south side of Burwood-road at a point distant 2,108.4 links south-east from the intersection of the south side of Burwood-road with the east side of a Government road (being a continuation of Stud-road); thence from such commencing point in a line bearing south 67 deg. 37 min. east 81 9/10 links; thence in a line bearing due south 3,772 1/10 links to a point on the north side of High-street; thence in a line bearing west 75 7/10 links; thence in a line bearing due north 3,803 3/10 links to the commencing point. -

High-street.—All that piece of land known as High-street, being part of Crown allotment 43, Parish of Scoresby, County of Mornington, commencing at a point on the east side of a Government road called Stud-road, at a point distant 4,605 5/10 links southerly from the north-western corner of the said Crown allotment 43; thence from such commencing point in a line bearing east 3,004 6/10 links; thence in a line

bearing south 75 7/10 links; thence in a line bearing west 3,004 6/10 links; thence in a line bearing north 75 7/10 links to the commencing point.

GENERAL ORDER.

GENERAL ORDER MADE PURSUANT TO THE SUPREME COURT ACT 1928.

WHEREAS, the Honorable Wilfred Kelsham Fullagar, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Victoria nominated by the Chief Justice thereof, Eric Smith Vance, Master in Equity under the *Supreme Court Act 1928*, Edgar Henry Trebilco, Taxing Master under the said Act, two persons nominated by the Governor in Council, Francis Plumley Derham and Alan John Moir, two members of the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria nominated by the said Council, and being the five persons authorized in that behalf do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the powers by the *Supreme Court Act 1928*, conferred upon us order and direct in manner following:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Solicitors' Remuneration Order 1945, and shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1946, but shall not affect the rights of a solicitor or client in respect of matters pending on the said date.

2. Remuneration of solicitors supplemental to that prescribed by the Solicitors' Remuneration Order 1929, as amended by the Solicitors' Remuneration Order 1930 and the Solicitors' Remuneration Order 1930 (No. 2), is hereby prescribed and regulated as follows, and the said Order is hereby added to as follows:—

3. After clause 2 of the said Order as amended there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—

2A. Where it is necessary to obtain the consent of any Government or Authority in respect of business transacted and performed and for which remuneration is prescribed by this Order a solicitor shall be entitled, in addition to the remuneration so prescribed, to charge item remuneration for all business necessarily transacted in connexion with the obtaining of such consent.

4. After clause 4 of the said Order as amended there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—

4A. The remuneration prescribed by this Order as amended shall, except as regards Part G and Part H of the Third Schedule hereto, be increased by Twenty per centum. Such percentage shall be calculated upon the total amount of such remuneration excluding all disbursements and payments.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR COMMENCING 1ST OCTOBER, 1945.

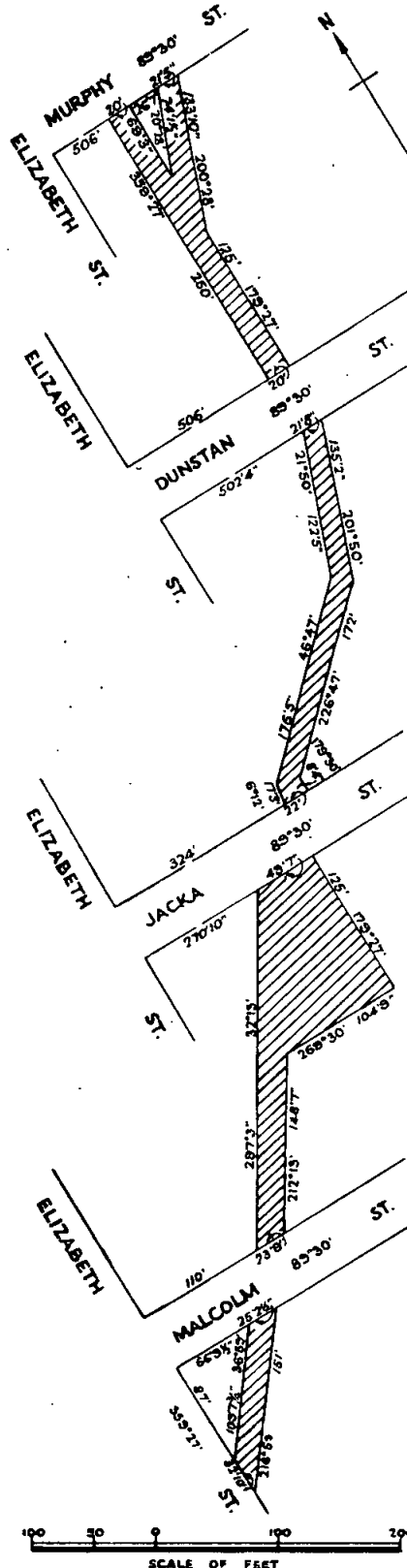

RE-SUBDIVISION OF THE SHIRE OF CHARLTON.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES AND PERMITS TO MINING MANAGERS, UNDER MANAGERS, AND DEPUTIES BY THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF MINING MANAGERS, ETC., UNDER THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACTS.

- (iii) he has had practical experience in a mine for at least twelve months and is the holder of a first class certificate of competency as mining manager issued by the Board of Examiners for Mining Managers constituted under the Mines Acts."
