

- 3. The holiday record relating to any worker shall be made available by the employer at all reasonable times for inspection by such worker.



EXPLOSIVES ACT 1928.

SALE OF EXPLOSIVES ORDER.

WHEREAS by section 56 of the Explosives Act 1928, it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order prohibit either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation, conveyance, and sale or any of them of any explosives when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order.

And whereas the explosives to which this Order applies are of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make this Order, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Order respecting the sale of explosives, that is to say:—

1. This Order applies to the following explosives:—

Nitro-compounds for blasting, and

Detonators.

2. No person shall sell any explosive to which this Order applies unless he complies with the following conditions:—

(a) He shall satisfy himself that the person desiring to purchase the explosive is a licensed dealer in explosives or if not a licensed dealer is in possession of a written permit; such permit may be issued by an authorized member of the Police Force to a fit and proper person to purchase the explosive.

(b) He shall require to be delivered to him such written WHEREAS by section 56 of the Explosives Act 1928, it is

explosive.

(b) He shall require to be delivered to him such written permit before the explosive is sold to a person who is not a licensed dealer.

(c) He shall keep a record of all sales as prescribed by section 3! of the Explosives Act 1928, and shall on demand show such record together with the written permits to any Government Inspector or member of the Police Force.

3. Nothing in this Order in regard to permits shall apply to any explosive to be purchased on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or the Government of Victoria.

4. Authorized member of the Police Force is any morehor.

4. Authorized member of the Police Force is any member of the Police Force duly authorized in writing by a Super-intendent or Inspector of Police.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES KNOWN AS THE "WYPERFELD NATIONAL PARK."

WYPERFELD NATIONAL PARK."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as renacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in Trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands reserved by Orders in Council dated 13th September, 1921, 9th February, 1922, 1st July, 1930, 5th December, 1938, and 6th May, 1941, as sites for a National Park in the Parishes of Ginap, Wyperfeld, Baring, and Yallum, and in the County of Weeah, and known as the Wyperfeld National Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Park."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person while in the Park shall have in his possession any gun, net, trap, gin, snare, or any other instrument used for the capture or destruction of birds or animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first
- 2. No person shall disfigure, damage, injure, or destroy in any way, or take into or remove from the Park, or have in his possession while therein any trees, shrubs, flowers, ferns, or vegetation or parts thereof.

- 3. No person shall light, or cause or permit a fire to be used in the Park, save in fireplaces provided for such purpose.
- 4. No person shall remove any dead vegetation, or material, or earth from the Park.
- 5. No person shall commit a nuisance in the Park or in and on any part of any building therein.
- 6. No person shall camp in the Park for more than one day unless the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management is first obtained.
- 7. No person shall put or cause to be put into the Park any dog or cat, or any noxious creature or vegetation.
- 8. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, sheep, or other like animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any liailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom. may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BOARDING SCHOOL EMPLOYEES BOARD.

Note: -This Determination applies to the whole of the State.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at domestic work in or in connexion with sub-primary, primary, or secondary boarding schools, has made the following Determination, namely:—

I. This Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after 1st January, 1946.

2. The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 46.

Times of Beginning and Ending Work.

4. The times of beginning and ending work shall be between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 7.30 p.m.

OVERTIME.

- 5. The following rates shall be paid for all work done:-
 - (a) Within the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 8 hours per day or in excess of 46 hours per week—Time and a half.
 - (b) Outside the times of beginning and ending work—Double time.

DAY OFF EACH WEEK.

6. Each employee shall have at least one full day off in each week. The full day shall operate as from the finishing time of work on the day immediately proceding the day off and until the starting time of the day immediately succeeding the day off.

The day off shall be rostered and shall not be altered except by mutual agreement between the employer and the employee.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.

7. All employees (other than casual employees) shall be engaged by the week and shall be paid either on Thursday or Friday of each week. Except in the case of misconduct by either employer or employee, one week's notice shall be given by the employer or forfeited by the employee. When notice of termination of service has been given, employees shall be paid within 24 hours from the expiry of

CASUAL LABOUR.

8. (a) Casual employees i.e., persons employed for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid as follows.—

For the first 23 hours Time and a half. .. Time and a third. Thereafter • •

Provided that the earnings of a casual employee shall not exceed the ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof, if a casual employee works on any holiday as prescribed in Clause 9 he or she shall receive double time for all time worked on such day.
 - (c) Casual employees shall receive a minimum of four hours' work at casual rates on each day so employed.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

9. All employees (other than casual employees) shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay, viz., New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Show Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of these holidays, employees shall be entitled to the days so substituted.

Provided that if any employee works on any of such holidays or such holiday occurs on his or her rostered day off or during his or her period of annual leave or sick leave, he or she shall be given:—

- (a) within four weeks following the date on which such holiday occurred.
 - (i) one extra day's pay, or
 - (ii) equal time off in lieu thereof, or
- (b) one day shall be added to his or her annual leave.

ANNUAL LEAVE.

10. Each employee (other than a casual employee) shall receive two week's leave annually without deduction of pay. Provided that any employee who has completed three but less than twolve months' service shall, if employment is terminated, receive a proportionate allowance in money that the period of service bears to one year.

SICK LEAVE.

11. Any employee (other than a casual employee) who has been in the service of an employer for not less than three months shall be entitled to twelve working days' sick leave of absence with full pay during each subsequent twelve months' service, provided he or she produces, within 24 hours, evidence satisfactory to his or her employer that such absence was caused by ill-health or by accident.

FARES.

12. Casual employees shall be entitled to all fares exceeding 3d. per day necessarily incurred.

UNIFORMS.

13. Where any female employee is required by the employer to wear a uniform, such uniform shall be provided and laundered by the employer free of cost to the employee. A uniform shall mean and be deemed to be a coat, skirt, apron, cuffs, or any other special articles of clothing.

RIGHT OF ENTRY.

14. Any representative of employees on the Boarding School Employees Wages Board, authorized in writing by the Chairman of the Board, shall have the right to enter any establishment or premises covered by this Determination in order to inspect time sheets and to interview employees on any matter connected with their employment. Such accredited official before entering such establishment or premises shall produce the authority in writing on a demand by the employer or his representative for such production.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

15. The wages rates of adult males set out in clause 2 (b) are based upon the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, the Board hereby determines that such rate shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time, as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of adult females, apprentices, and improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage rates shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 16.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

16. (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1946, the amounts of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 15.

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a May, an August, a November, or a February, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

- (1) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of or near a quarter for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.
- (4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such successive period plus the additional constant loading as prescribed in clause 13.
