## Water Acts.

NORTH SHEPPARTON IRRIGATION AND WATER  
SUPPLY DISTRICT.

PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DIVISION."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that as on and from the date hereof that portion of the North Shepparton Irrigation and Water Supply District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become an "Urban Division" for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be known as Tallygaroopna Urban Division.

## SCHEDULE.

*Boundaries of Tallygaroopna Urban Division.*

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 20A, section A, Parish of Congupna, County of Moira; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 20A and 22 and by a line in continuation of those boundaries to the western boundary of the Seymour and Tocumwal Railway Reserve; thence generally northerly by the last-mentioned

'boundary to a point in line with the northern boundary of North-street on lodged plan of subdivision No. 2198, being part of allotment 13, section D; thence by a line bearing north 89 deg. 58 min. east to the eastern boundary of the said Railway Reserve; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary a distance of 207 ft. 6 in. to the north-western angle of the land described in certificate of title, volume 2681, folio 536115; thence easterly and southerly by the northern and eastern boundaries of the land described in that certificate of title to a point in line with the northern boundary of lot 13, block A, on lodged plan of subdivision No. 2198; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of lots 13, 14, 15, 16, and 7, all in said block A, and by a line in continuation of those boundaries to the eastern boundary of Fowler-street; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the north-western angle of lot 1, block B, in said lodged plan of subdivision No. 2198; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 1, 2, and 3, all in said block B, and by a line in continuation of those boundaries to the western boundary of the land described in certificate of title, volume 4248, folio 849408; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the land described in the last-mentioned certificate of title to the north-eastern angle thereof; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundary of the land described in certificate of title, volume 3287, folio 657250, and by a line in continuation of that boundary a distance of 2 chains 68 links from the eastern boundary of the land described in the last-mentioned certificate of title; thence south by a line to the northern boundary of Victoria-street; thence easterly by that boundary to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 20A, section A; thence southerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

The boundaries set out and described in the foregoing Schedule are shown on a plan approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, 100-110 Exhibition-street, Melbourne.—(45/18169.)

## The Fisheries Acts.

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM PORTION OF THE YARRA RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES FROM 1st MAY TO 31st AUGUST IN EACH YEAR.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-sixth day of May, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of May, 1936, respecting prohibition of fishing in the Yarra River and its tributaries, and prohibit all fishing in, or the taking of fish from the Yarra River and its tributaries (other than the Little Yarra River, the Woori Yallock and Cockatoo Creeks and their tributaries) above or upstream from the Melbourne-Glen Waverley Railway Bridge over the said river near Heyington, from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year.

NOTE.—All fishing in, or the taking of fish from the Little Yarra River, the Woori Yallock and Cockatoo Creeks and their tributaries is prohibited from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of December in each year.

## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO VARY THE PROCLAMATIONS RESPECTING LONG LINES IN WESTERN PORT BAY.

(a) Using a long line or lines with a total of more than 1,500 hooks attached thereto;

(b) permitting a long line or lines with a total of more than 1,500 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on such waters;

(c) taking a boat having thereon or attached thereto a long line or lines with a total of more than 1,500 hooks attached on to the said waters; or allowing such a boat to be on the said waters.

## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st October, 1942, approved by the Governor in Council on 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendments thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. In Regulation 187 of the Principal Regulations the following amendments are made:—

(1) In paragraph (a) the words "The number of passengers to be carried by any passenger boat shall not exceed the number which can be seated, allowing 18 inches of the sitting accommodation provided in the same vessel for every adult passenger, two children under twelve years of age being reckoned as one adult" are deleted, and the following words substituted therefor—

"The number of passengers, to be carried by any passenger boat shall not exceed the number which can be seated, allowing 18 inches of the sitting accommodation provided in the same vessel for every person on board (whether crew or passengers) but for the purpose of computing the number of passengers which may be carried three children under twelve years of age carried as passengers may be reckoned as two passengers."

(2) The three following paragraphs shall be added after paragraph (b):—

"(c) Children under twelve years of age shall not be carried by any passenger boat unless there is at least one adult for every ten children on board such boat.

(d) On every passenger boat there shall be provided sufficient life belts or buoyancy equipment approved by the Harbor Master to provide support in the water for all persons on board (whether crew or passengers) and such life belts or buoyancy equipment shall be carried at all times and shall be stowed and carried in such a manner as to be readily accessible and detachable from the boat in the event of accident.

(e) In this regulation "Passengers" includes any persons (other than children under one year of age) carried on any passenger boat in any capacity whatsoever other than as members of the crew."

(3) The following sub-regulation shall be added to Regulation 300 of the Principal Regulations:—

"(11) The driver of a vehicle or the rider of an animal upon any road or wharf within the port shall—

(a) Immediately prior to his passing through any gateway halt such vehicle or animal not more than 30 feet nor less than 10 feet from the centre line of such gateway.

(b) Before passing out from any compound or fenced area stop at the gateway thereof and remain stationary until permission to proceed through the gateway is given by the Customs officer at the gate or (where there is no Customs Officer stationed at the gate) by the person acting under the authority of the Commissioners."

5. The secretary shall arrange and control the work of the officers, arrange for interviews with the Commission, have general supervision of inquiries regarding occupation and sale of soldier settlement land, and carry out the general administration of the Act.

6. The strictest secrecy shall be observed by all officers regarding properties under offer to the Commission and the Commission's affairs generally.

7. The common seal of the Commission shall be kept under lock and a key shall be kept by both the chairman and the secretary. The said seal shall not be affixed to any document unless a member of the Commission and the secretary be present. Any document so sealed shall be signed by the chairman or a member of the Commission and the secretary.

8. The Commission shall cause the books of account to be audited yearly.

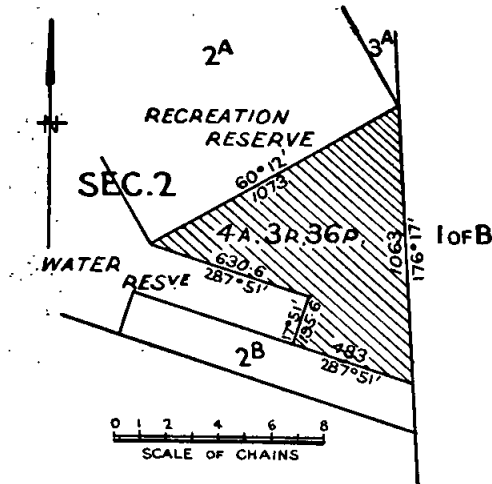

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

*Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.*

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor any of the articles specified in the schedule in the event of emergency due to the war.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Mont Park District will include the Mental Hospitals, Janefield Colony, and the Sanatorium, Gresswell; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, and Sunbury Districts will include the Mental Hospitals, Gaols, and Police Gaols at those places; and the Castlemaine District will include the Reformatory Prison. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible, after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. Where practicable, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the

whole or any part of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

### CITY OF COLLINGWOOD.

#### BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 75, for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said City of Collingwood under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and any and every other power thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood order as follows:—

#### Limit of Two Stories.

1. Any building of Classes II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two stories, including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area, construct a building of Class II. or III. occupancy to contain more than two stories, including the ground story.

#### Minimum Area Depth and Width of Frontage.

2. The minimum area depth and width of frontage specified in column 1 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area depth and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed.

#### Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—

- (a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area depth or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries, than those specified in column 1 of table 803 of the Regulations, or in clause 2 of this By-law; or
- (b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII. or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area depth or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations, in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.

#### Rear Access.

4. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

#### Restriction of Non-Fire Resisting Construction.

5. (a) Any building of Class II., III., IV., V., VI., VII., VIII. occupancy exceeding one story in height shall be of type 3 construction, as defined in the Regulations.

(b) No person shall erect any building otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of the said paragraph (a).

#### Operation of By-law.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City.

Woodmills; picture theatres; concert halls; dancing saloons; other theatres.

2. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
