## PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependen-cies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Braybrook has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said Council within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Licutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Braybrook aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO CAMPS.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Licutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Camping Regulations 1946," and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.
  - 2. The Camping Regulations 1943 are hereby repealed.
- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
  - "Closet" includes water-closet, pan-closet, and pit closet.
  - "Council" means Council of a municipality; and "the Council" means the Council of the municipality to the municipal district of which the provision in which the term is used applies.
  - "Health Acts" means the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697), the Health Act 1931 (No. 4010), the Health Act 1935 (No. 4333), the Health Act 1941 (No. 4867) and any amendments thereof.
  - "Person in charge" includes any person having or sharing in the control or management of a camp.
  - "Proprietor" of any land includes the owner or lessee or any person having the management or control thereof, and also includes any corporation or public body under whose control such land is placed.
  - "Refuse" includes waste food and all discarded matter from any camp.
  - "Source of water supply" includes river, creek, stream, watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh, spring, reservoir, or well
    if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for
    drinking purposes by man or for domestic purposes, or for
    any purpose in connexion with the preparation, manufacture,
    or sale of food or in connexion with a dairy-farm or dairy.

## GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 4. (a) No person shall establish, occupy, or maintain any camp in Protection any place where it is liable to cause pollution of a source of water supplies. supply.
- (b) In any case where a camp is established or is being or is about to be established in any place where (in the opinion of the authorized officer of the Council) a source of water supply is liable to be polluted such officer may order the removal or forbid the establishment of such camp.
- (c) Any person who fails to remove a camp when ordered to do so or who establishes a camp after being forbidden to do so under the foregoing clause shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.
  - 5. The person in charge of a camp shall-
    - (a) maintain such camp in a clean and sanitary state;
    - (b) on vacating the camp site leave it in a clean and sanitary condition.

- 6. The person in charge of any camp shall-
  - (a) provide sanitary conveniences satisfactory to the Council or its authorized officer in number, kind, construction and
  - (b) dispose of all nightsoil, refuse, offensive matter, and rubbish in a manner approved or directed by the Council or its authorized officer or if no such approval or direction has been given by burial or burning.
- 7. No person shall throw or deposit any refuse or rubbish from any camp into any watercourse, ditch or drain, or into any stream or body of water or on any street or road nor permit such refuse to remain exposed on the surface of the ground.

8. The Council of every Municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for the purpose.

Penalties.

9. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.



- "Omnibus" means any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power (including any trailer, fore-car, side-car, or other vehicle or device attached thereto) used or intended for use on any public highway and used or intended to be used for carrying passengers for reward and designed to carry more than seven necessary necessary. seven passengers.
- "Motor truck" means any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power (including any trailer, fore-car, side-car, or other vehicle or device attached thereto) used or intended for use on any public highway and used or intended to be used for carrying goods for hire or reward or in the course of trade or constructed primarily to carry goods of any kind.
- 2. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) any omnibus or motor truck standing in any of the streets and roads (or parts thereof) in the Township of Torquay specified in the next succeeding clause of this By-law, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers or goods and for such time as is reasonably necessary for that purpose.
- 3. The preceding clause of this By-law shall apply to the following streets and roads (or part thereof) in the Township of Torquay:-

    (a) All that part of Zeally Bay-road, which is east of a southerly continuation across Zeally Bay-road of the west boundary of Fisher-street.
