SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT THE PORT FAIRY WATERWORKS TRUST RESERVOIR AT ARINGA, IN THE PARISH OF BELFAST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

PART OF VICTORIA ABOVE REFERRED TO.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF ST. KILDA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of St. Kilda has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by

this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of St. Kilda aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

CITY OF ST. KILDA.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

All that piece of land situate in the Parish of Prahran, County of Bourke, being part of Crown portion 139A, commencing at a point on the north boundary of Argyle-street, distance south 88 deg. 51 min. east 217 ft. 9 in. from the eastern boundary of Chapel-street; thence by the western boundary of an existing road bearing north 1 deg. 1 min. west 370 ft. 4 in.; thence by a line bearing south 35 deg. 44 min. east 29 feet to a point on the southern boundary line of Grayling's-grove; thence by a line and the eastern boundary of the said existing road bearing generally south 346 ft. 4 in.; and thence along the northern boundary of Argyle-street bearing north 88 deg. 51 min. west 17 ft. 2 in. to the point of commencement.

MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that as on and from the date hereof that portion of the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be, and become an "Urban District" for the purpose of the said Acts, and shall be known as Narre Warren Urban District.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Narre Warren Urban District.

Commencing at the north-western angle of lot 20 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 1847, being part of allotment 12, Parish of Berwick, County of Mornington; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of that lot and by a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to the western boundary of allotment 13; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of a road to the south-western boundary of the Main Eastern Railway Reserve; thence north-westerly by the last-mentioned boundary to a point in line with the north-western boundary of the land described in certificate of title, volume 2265, folio 452999; thence north-easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the south-western boundary of Prince's Highway; thence south-easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 1847; thence northerly by a line and the western boundaries of lot 1 and lots 4 to 20 inclusive on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 1847 to the point of commencement.

COUNTRY ROADS (FOREST ROADS AND STOCK ROUTES) ACT 1943 (No. 4953).

PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROAD.

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a Forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby proclaim the said road to be a Forest road for the purposes of the said Act.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.
Shires of Ballan and Kyneton.

Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940.
PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 14 (2) of the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the municipalities of the Borough of Inglewood and the Shire of Werribee have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Bairnsdale and Creswick have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* to the municipal districts of the Borough of Inglewood and the Shire of Werribee, and parts of the Shires of Bairnsdale and Creswick, as follows:—

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

(a) Centre Riding.

(b) Township of Lucknow, in the Parish of Wy Yung, together with Crown allotments 27B, portion of Crown allotments 28 and 29B west of the 3-chain road, 29A, 30A, 30B, 30C, 30D, and 30E.

(c) Township of Lindenow, in the Parish of Coongulmerang.

(d) Crown allotments 131A, B, and C, 131D, 131E, 162, 162A, and 162B, in the Parish of Coongulmerang.

(e) All that piece of land commencing at the south-east corner of Crown allotment 138A, Parish of Bairnsdale, County of Tanjil; thence westerly along the northern boundary of a 1-chain road to the south-west corner; thence 359 deg. 20 min. 2.105 links, 89 deg. 20 min. 2.954 links to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 138B; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of a 1-chain Government road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 143A; thence by the coast generally in an easterly, southerly, and westerly direction to the point of commencement.

(f) The whole of the island known as Raymond Island within the Parish of Bairnsdale.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal districts and parts of the municipal districts of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the second day of June, 1947.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944* and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the City of Sandringham (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the service of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3 of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Schedule of land affected: All that piece of land bounded on the north by Bay-road, on the east by Reserve-road, on the west by Bluff-road, and on the south by Cheltenham-road.

REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

The "Workers' Compensation Board Regulations (No. 1)" are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Clauses eight and nine of the said Regulations are hereby revoked.

2. After clause seven of the said Regulations there shall be inserted the clauses following:—

"8. (1) The salary of the Chairman of the Workers' Compensation Board shall be, in addition to his salary as a Judge of County Courts, the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

(2) This clause shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of September, 1946.

9. (1) The salary of each member of the Workers' Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) shall be the sum of Eight hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

(2) This clause shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of February, 1947.

10. The remuneration of the deputy chairman of the Workers' Compensation Board while acting shall be, in addition to his salary as a Judge of County Courts, at the rate of Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

11. The remuneration of the deputy of each member of the Workers' Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) while acting shall be at the rate of Eight hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

12. The members of the Workers' Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) and, while acting, the deputies for any such member shall respectively receive travelling allowances at the rate and subject to the conditions prescribed from time to time by Regulations made by the Public Service Board relating generally to travelling allowances of officers of the Public Service.

Provided that where the Chief Secretary is satisfied that the actual and necessary expense incurred by any such member of the Board when travelling exceeds the allowance hereinbefore prescribed, such additional allowance may be granted as the Chief Secretary may determine."

And the Honorable William Slater, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MOOROOPNA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Rodney Shire Council for the proclamation of a Sewerage District, and for the constitution of a Sewerage

Authority to carry out works for the sewerage of Mooroopna in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts; and doth hereby appoint as follows:—

(a) That the amount of loan moneys which may be borrowed by such Sewerage Authority shall be Fifty thousand pounds (£50,000), and the amount which may be borrowed by way of overdraft shall be Two thousand pounds (£2,000).

(b) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation and branch sewers, main sewers, pumping station, rising main, treatment works, and effluent disposal farm.

(c) That the limits of the land within which the said Sewerage Authority shall have authority be those comprised within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point being the north-western angle of Crown allotment 25b, Parish of Toolamba, County of Rodney; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said Crown allotment 25b to its most easterly angle; thence northerly by a line across Main-street to the south-eastern angle of a race-course and recreation reserve in the Parish of Mooroopna; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the race-course and recreation reserve to its north-eastern angle; thence westerly along its northern boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of lot 7 on lodged plan of subdivision number 12577; thence northerly by a line across lot 5 on lodged plan of subdivision number 3112, and along the western boundaries of the said lot 7 and the lots 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 to the north-western angle of the said lot 1; thence by a line, being a continuation thereof, across lot 3 on the lodged plan of subdivision of 3112, and across a road to a point on its northern boundary; thence easterly along the said northern boundary of the road to its point of intersection with the western boundary of a road from Murchison to Echuca; thence generally northerly and north-westerly along the western boundary of the road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Crown allotment 59b; thence north-easterly by a line across a road and along the south-eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 59b and 59a to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of William-street; thence south-easterly by a line across a road and across Crown allotments 8 and 4, and across Suffolk-street to the point of intersection of the north-eastern boundary of William-street and the south-eastern boundary of Suffolk-street; thence continuing south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of William-street to its point of intersection with the north-western boundary of Finborough-street; thence by a line across Finborough-street to the most northerly angle of lot 5, section A, Town of Mooroopna; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said lot 5 to its most southerly angle; thence by a line being a continuation thereof across a reserve to a point on the western bank of the Goulburn River; thence generally south-westerly, southerly, and south-easterly and southerly along the said western boundary to its point of intersection with the centre line of the Seymour and Tocumwal railway reserve; thence generally westerly and south-westerly along the said centre line of the Seymour and Tocumwal railway reserve to a point in line with the southern boundary of Crown allotment 25, Parish of Toolamba; thence by a line across a railway reserve to a point on the south-eastern boundary of Murchison-road; thence generally southerly along the said south-eastern boundary of Murchison-road for a distance of about 600 links; thence westerly about 450 links by a line across Murchison-road, across a channel easement, and across Crown allotment 25A, Parish of Toolamba; thence north-easterly across the said Crown allotment 25A to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 25; thence northerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotment 25 and 25c to the north-western angle of the said Crown allotment 25c; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 25c to a point distant from Murchison-road about 350 links; thence northerly by a line across Crown allotment 25b, parallel to the north-western boundary of Murchison-road to a point on the western boundary of Crown allotment 25b, Parish of Toolamba; thence northerly along the said western boundary of Crown allotment 25b to the point of commencement—all of which boundaries are shown upon a plan approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.

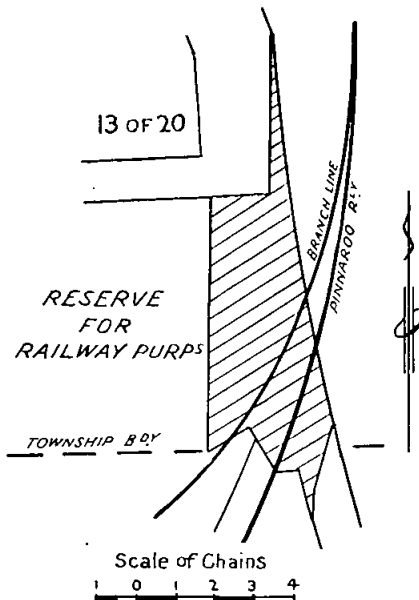

The prices tendered must not include sales tax. Security.—Five per cent. of total amount of tender accepted, but in no case will security of less than £3 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

In all cases the total cost of each item must be extended in the columns provided.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid and the tenders

addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purpose of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the

schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case, he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.

16. *Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 8.*

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

18. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

19. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements

made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical, High, or Higher Elementary Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. *Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
