County Court Act 1928.

RULES OF COURT.

WE, the undersigned Judges of County Courts, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 87 of the *County Court Act* 1928, do hereby amend the County Court Rules 1930 as from the 1st day of February, 1947, by inserting in Rule 2 of Order 51 at the end of paragraph (d) thereof the words following:—
