LEVEE AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE, MELBOURNE.

IN honour of the birthday of His Majesty King George VI., His Excellency the Governor, Major General Sir Winston Dugan, G.C.M.G., C.B., D.S.O., will hold a Levee at Parliament House, Spring-street, Melbourne, from 11.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Thursday, the 12th June, 1947.

On the occasion of the celebration of the King's birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible.

In accordance with the custom followed at levees held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of services and all public bodies group themselves together for presentation as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so, but His Excellency will be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

Private entree cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at 11.30 a.m. All other citizens will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance before 12.30 p.m.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed or typed in capitals, or written in block letters, their styles of address for presentation, in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act—save and except sub-section (4) of section one hundred and sixty-three and section five hundred and thirty-five thereof—shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday, the seventeenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, as the day upon which the said *Local Government Act 1946*—save and except sub-section (4) of section one hundred and sixty-three and section five hundred and thirty-five thereof—shall come into operation in the State of Victoria.

## PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 14 (2) of the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof: And whereas the Councils of the municipalities of the Shires of Barrabool, Deakin, and Phillip Island have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* to the municipal districts of the Shires of Barrabool, Deakin, and Phillip Island: And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal districts of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the fourth day of August, 1947.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 17 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, acting on a petition signed by not less than twenty-five (25) ratepayers resident in portion of the Shire of Rodney and with the consent of the Council of the said Shire, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Township of Tatura to those hereinafter set forth and described:—

## BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TATURA.

Commencing at a point on a 1-chain road at the south-west angle of allotment 8, section 14, Township of Tatura, Parish of Toolamba West, County of Rodney; thence west for a distance of 5 chains 86.5 links; thence by a line bearing N. 0 deg. 16 min. E. for a distance of 40 chains 73 links; thence by a line bearing W. 0 deg. 2 min. N. for a distance of 14 chains 27 links; thence by a line bearing N. 0 deg. 2 min. E. for a distance of 12 chains 15 links; thence by a line bearing E. 0 deg. 2 min. S. for a distance of 12 chains; thence by a line bearing N. 0 deg. 6 min. W. for a distance of 11 chains 79.2 links; thence by a line bearing E. 0 deg. 49 min. N. for a distance of 8 chains; thence by a line bearing N. 0 deg. 6 min. W. for a distance of 11 chains 67 links; thence by a line bearing E. 0 deg. 6 min. N. for a distance of 42 chains 90 links; thence by a line bearing S. 0 deg. 8 min. E. for a distance of 16 chains 50 links; thence by a line bearing E. 0 deg. 7 min. N. for a distance of 7 chains; thence by a line bearing S. 0 deg. 7 min. E. for a distance of 7 chains; thence by a line bearing E. 0 deg. 2 min. N. for a distance of 30 chains 58 links; thence south by a 2-chain road to the south-east angle of allotment 5, section 22; thence west by a 11-chain road to the point of commencement.

**Duties.**—Under the direction of the Principal, to take charge of, and be responsible for the management of the Dairying Branch of the college; to deliver lectures and give demonstrations in accordance with the syllabus of the college in dairying, and such other staff duties as the Principal may require.

**Qualifications.**—To possess sound training and experience in dairying, together with a knowledge of the manufacture of butter and cheese; ability to lecture and to demonstrate to students. *Duties.*—To relieve the matron and perform other duties as required. Under the Matron to have charge of the hospital and also the office at the Female Prison.

*Qualifications.*—To be a State registered nurse and to have had experience in clerical work and in the institutional care of females.

**Engine Driver of Launches, Ports and Harbours Branch, Department of Public Works.**

*Duties.*—To have charge of the engine room of the diesel engine tug boats used for the towage of explosives lighters, &c., and to assist at the Dredging Depot, Williamstown.

*Qualifications.*—To possess a Marine Engine Driver's Certificate, Class "D" (Diesel), to have had experience with all classes of marine motor engines, and to be familiar with floating plant used for the handling of explosives.

WESTERNPORT WATERWORKS TRUST  
CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Shire of Phillip Island and the Councillors of the Shire of Bass for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to carry out works for the supply of water to the townships of Cowes, Newhaven, San Remo, and Bass, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That three persons elected by the Council of the Shire of Phillip Island, two persons elected by the Council of the Shire of Bass, and one other person shall be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
3. That the amount of loan to be granted to such Trust shall be Ninety thousand pounds (£90,000).

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS UNDER THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN TRAMWAYS ACTS.

APPEAL BOARD.

WHEREAS by sections 17 (5) (e) and 112 of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1928* (No. 3732), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations prescribing all such things that are necessary or convenient to be prescribed as to the appointment of members of the Appeal Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board, and by its officers, servants, and employees, and for the execution of any matter or thing consistent with and not expressly provided for in the said Act, and for more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the said sections on the 29th day of January, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th February, 1935, in the manner following (that is to say):—

1. *Clause 4.*—In lieu of sub-clause (ii) read—

"(ii) All appeals by such officers, servants, and employees who are aggrieved by not being selected for promotion or by the promotion of another, or by promotions being unreasonably withheld, and in its determination the Appeal Board may refuse or allow any such appeal."

## 2. In lieu of clause 5, read—

## " APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS.

5. The members of the Appeal Board (other than the Chairman) shall be appointed in the following manner:—

*Tramways Board's Representative.*

(a) The Registrar shall from time to time whenever it may be necessary call upon the Tramways Board to nominate a person to represent it on the Appeal Board.

*Employees' Representative.*

(b) (i) The Registrar shall from time to time whenever it may be necessary publish concurrently in the *Government Gazette* and in one of the daily newspapers circulating in the City of Melbourne a notice calling upon the employees within 21 days of the publication of such notice to nominate a person to represent them on the Appeal Board;

(ii) The Registrar shall post or deliver to the Tramways Board as many copies of such notice as may be required with a direction that the same shall be forthwith exhibited in a prominent position in each office, car depot, power house, converter station, car repair shop or factory, and all other places of employment of employees of the Tramways Board. The neglect or failure of the said Board to comply with such direction shall be deemed to be a breach of these Regulations."

## 3. In lieu of Clause 25, read—

## " FILLING CASUAL VACANCY.

25. Every casual vacancy shall be filled by the same appointing authority and as far as practicable in the same manner and subject to the same provisions as in the case of the vacating member, and the person so appointed shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of his appointment. Upon any vacancy being reported to the Registrar, he shall take such action as may be necessary in terms of clause 5 hereof to procure the appointment of another member to fill such vacancy."

4. In clause 27, after the words "every appellant," there shall be inserted the words "and shall immediately be given effect to by the said Tramways Board."

## 5. In lieu of clauses 30 and 31, read—

## " EVIDENCE.

30. All evidence submitted at the hearing of any appeal shall be given on oath or in such other manner as is permitted by law and a full record shall be taken of all such evidence. Any member of the Appeal Board may administer an oath to and examine upon oath any witness at such hearing. The Appeal Board may in its discretion accept or reject any evidence and may permit the Tramways Board or the appellant to be represented by a solicitor, counsel, or agent.

## RIGHT OF PUBLIC AND PRESS TO BE PRESENT DURING APPEAL.

31. The hearing of any appeal shall be open to the public and press unless by a unanimous decision the Appeal Board otherwise determines."

6. Clause 32.—At the end of sub-clause (e), add the words—

"and a copy of the evidence submitted at such appeal."

7. Clause 34.—In lieu of sub-clauses (a) and (b), read—

"(a) Every appeal shall be commenced by notice of appeal addressed to the Registrar of the Appeal Board, Old Treasury Buildings, Spring-street, Melbourne.

(b) Such notice of appeal shall be given within twenty-one days from the happening of the event appealed against."

8. Clause 39.—In lieu of the word and figures "Clause 32" appearing in the second line, read "Clause 34."

## 9. In lieu of Clause 40, read—

## " EXPENSES.

40. All expenses incurred by the Registrar or the Board in carrying out the provisions of these Regulations shall be paid and borne by the Tramways Board and the Registrar shall receive such remuneration for his services as the Minister shall from time to time determine."

## APPOINTMENT OF A HOSPITAL EXECUTIVES BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM ATTENDANTS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

(1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as a hospital executive officer (including a secretary, an assistant secretary, a chief clerk, or an accountant).

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as a hospital executive officer (including a secretary, an assistant secretary, a chief clerk, or an accountant). Also that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding, be described for all purposes as the Hospital Executives Board, and that the area or locality within which the determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

(3) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Hospital Executives Board and the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board may lawfully exercise, deprive the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as a hospital executive officer (including a secretary, an assistant secretary, a chief clerk, or an accountant), and confer such power exclusively on the Hospital Executives Board.

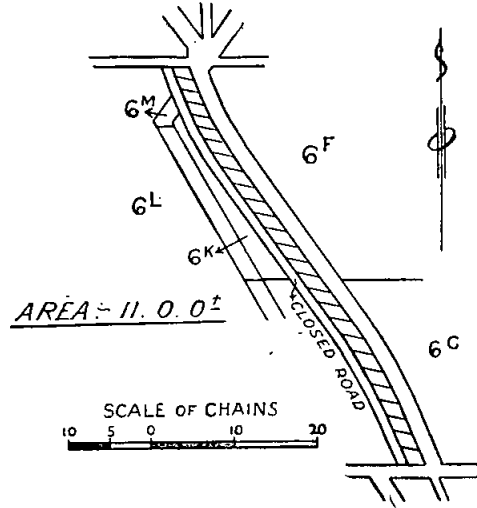

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders may be accepted for each schedule separately. Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The rates tendered cover all charges, including labour, bags, hire of cranes or other appliances, and weighbridge charges required in the performance of the service. Bags must be removed by the contractor when empty, and if not removed within a reasonable time or within the time named by the officer requiring the service, no claim will be entertained for cost of same.

2. No subletting shall be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and every person engaged in the cartage tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such labour conditions as are or may be determined by any Federal Arbitration Court award or any State Wages Board determination, and a copy of such labour conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. Accounts in all cases shall be rendered *monthly* to the Department requiring the service, and must be supported by weighbridge tickets or railway consignment notes, and in the case of coal, the mine consignment notes. In the event of a weighbridge ticket or consignment notes not being available or obtainable, the weight vouched for by the Department requiring the delivery shall be accepted by the contractor as the weight of the particular consignment. Accounts shall be subject to any deductions for goods lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the contractor.

4. In the event of material forwarded by rail or steamer not being unloaded within reasonable time, and in accordance with the Railway Department or Harbor Trust Regulations relating to same, the contractor shall be held liable for such charges, including cost of demurrage, as may accrue, the amount thereof to be deducted as provided in clause 2.

5. The contractor shall take and make delivery within ordinary working hours. No claims for detention shall be entertained, but should the contractor be subjected to unreasonable delay, the cause of delay, if reported, shall be investigated.

6. The contractor must have an office connected by telephone and within a radius of 6 miles of the Melbourne (Elizabeth-street) Post Office.

7. Four hours will be deemed sufficient notice, and in the event of the contractor failing to perform the service when ordered, and to the satisfaction of the officer requiring same, such service will be performed at his risk and expense, and any extra expense incurred shall be deducted as provided in clause 2. No services performed under this contract shall be deemed to be of a special nature, provided that the contractor be given four hours' notice that his services shall be required, and no increase in the contract rates shall be allowed.

8. The vehicles in which the material is carried must be in thorough working order, and, if required, provided with good waterproof covers. Horses to be perfectly sound, and subject to the approval of the officer requiring the service.

9. The contract shall not be considered broken, infringed, or vitiated by the Government performing the service or arranging for the carrying out of the same otherwise than by the contractor in the event of urgency or emergency.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity or delay in delivering the material when required, or failure to produce weighbridge tickets or consignment notes on delivery in accordance with clause 3, or any breach of Railway or Harbor Trust Regulations, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 2. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

13. In the event of any dispute arising as to matters or things contained in the contract or schedule the same shall be settled by the Tender Board, and the Board's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive.
