PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MOORABBIN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereinafter described and situated within the City of Moorabbin aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

CITY OF MOORABBIN.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

Oak-street Extension.

Commencing at a point on the north-west corner of lot 23 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 8334; thence north 55 min. west for a distance of 43 ft. 0½ in.; thence south 87 deg. 15 min. west for a distance of 1 ft. 2 in.; thence south 79 deg. 58 min. west for a distance of 44 ft. 3½ in.; thence for a distance of 6 ft. 1 in. at bearing south 55 deg. 26 min. west; thence south 55 min. east for a distance of 57 ft. 4 in.; thence north 50 deg. 2 min. east for a distance of 37 ft. 3 in.; thence north 85 deg. 39 min. east for a distance of 21 ft. 1 in. to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the twelfth day of May One Thousand nine hundred and forty-seven the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such Resolution shall be main roads: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS UNDER THE
COUNTRY ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRES OF
BANNOCKBURN, &c.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the nineteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such Resolution shall be main roads: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

*Resolution Declaring Main Roads under the Country
Roads Act.*

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

8. *Geelong-Ballan road* (1308).—Commencing at the eastern angle of allotment 61F, Parish of Durdidwarrah; thence north-westerly, northerly, and again north-westerly along the boundary between the Shires of Bannockburn and Corio to the north-western angle of section 1, Township of Moreep; thence continuing north-westerly and north-easterly to the northern boundary of the Shire at a point on the southern boundary of the Parish of Ballark, distant 270 deg. 0 min. 25 chains, more or less, from the south-eastern angle of the parish last named.

7. *Fyansford-Gheringhap road* (1307).—Commencing at its junction with the Geelong-Hamilton road at a point in section 6, Parish of Gheringhap, distant 180 deg. 0 min. 532 links, 270 deg. 0 min. 2,278 links, and 330 deg. 22 min. 1,415 links, more or less, from the north-western angle of the Township of Fyansford in the said parish; thence north-westerly to its junction with the Midland Highway at a point in section 19 of the said parish, distant 89 deg. 47 min. 6,455 links, and 312 deg. 0 min. 6,534 links from the south-western angle of the said section 19.

9. *Meredith-Mt. Mercer road* (1309).—Commencing at its junction with the Midland Highway at the north-eastern angle of allotment 8, section 6, Town and Parish of Meredith; thence westerly to the western boundary of the said town; thence south-westerly and westerly to the south-western angle of allotment 159B of the said parish; thence north-westerly, westerly, and south-westerly to the south-western angle of allotment 22B1, Parish of Cargerie; thence north-westerly to the northern boundary of the shire at the north-western angle of allotment 31 of the parish last named; thence northerly, westerly, and north-westerly along the boundary between the Shires of Bannockburn and Buninyong to and across the bridge over the Yarrowee River (Leigh Grand Junction Bridge) near the southern angle of allotment 50M, Parish of Enfield.

5. *Ballan-Meredith road* (1305).—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 72A, Parish of Meredith, on the northern boundary of the Shire; thence south-easterly, south-westerly, and generally southerly to its junction with the Midland Highway at the south-eastern angle of allotment 9, section 1, Town of Meredith.

The above description of the Ballan-Meredith road is in lieu of the description of the Gordon-Meredith road published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th July, 1915, on page 2336.

Shire of Buninyong.

4. *Elaine-Mt. Mercer road* (3004).—Commencing at its junction with the Midland Highway at the north-eastern angle of allotment 200, Parish of Meredith; thence south-westerly and westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 65A, Parish of Cargerie; thence southerly, westerly, and again southerly to its junction with the Meredith-Mt. 10. *Old Melbourne-road* (3010).—Commencing at its junction with the Western Highway at the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 3, Parish of Warrenheip, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence south-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 3, section 5, and generally north-easterly (including S.P. 3886), and easterly to the Lal Lal Creek near the south-western angle of allotment 3B, section 9, of the said parish; thence continuing easterly and generally south-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 2A, section 4, Parish of Kerri Bareet, and generally north-easterly (including S.P. 3328), to the south-western angle of allotment 12C, section 11, of the parish last named on the eastern boundary of the shire.

Shire of Deakin.

8. *Tongala North-road* (4508).—Commencing at its junction with the Kyabram-Tongala road at the Tongala Railway Station on the western boundary of the Township of Tongala; thence northerly to its junction with the Murray Valley Highway at the north-western angle of allotment 2A, Parish of Tongala.

9. *Rushworth-Girgarre road* (4509).—Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 54, Parish of Girgaree, on the southern boundary of the shire; thence northerly to a point on the western boundary of allotment 100 of section B of the said parish, distant 179 deg. 56 min. 2 chains, or thereabouts, from the south-western angle of allotment 101 of the said section; thence north-easterly through the said allotments 100 and 101 to the northern boundary of the allotment last named; thence northerly and north-westerly to and through allotment 78, Parish of Kyabram, to the western boundary of that allotment; thence northerly to its junction with the Rochester-Kyabram road at the north-eastern angle of allotment 64, Parish of Kyabram.

4. *Echuca-Kyabram road* (4504).—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 23, Parish of Echuca North, on the northern boundary of the shire; thence southerly and south-easterly to the northern angle of allotment 31, Parish of Echuca South; thence south-easterly to the southern angle of allotment 4A, section 35, Parish of Koyuga; thence easterly to its junction with the Kyabram-Tongala road near the south-western angle of allotment 87, section C, Parish of Tongala.

NOTE.—The route of the portion of this road between the Shire of Deakin and the Borough of Echuca is set out in the description of the road route in the Borough of Echuca, and portion of the above description is in lieu of the description of the Echuca-Cornella road, published in the *Government Gazette* of 24th March, 1915, on page 1099.

1. *Echuca-Nathalia road* (4501).—Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 8, Parish of Echuca North, on the western boundary of the shire; thence south-easterly, north-easterly, and easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 9, section A, Parish of Kanyapella; thence easterly, north-easterly, and north-westerly to and across the bridge (Stewart's) over the Goulburn River near the eastern angle of allotment 1, section C, of the parish last named, on the northern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The above description is in lieu of the description of the Echuca-Piccola road, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th March, 1915, on page 1099, and amended in the *Government Gazette* of: 25th July, 1923, on page 1940.

Borough of Echuca.

1. *Echuca-Kyabram road* (5501).—Commencing at its junction with the Murray Valley Highway at the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 4, Parish of Echuca North; thence southerly to the south-eastern angle of suburban allotment 19 of the said parish; thence southerly along the boundary between the Borough of Echuca and the Shire of Deakin to the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 23, Parish of Echuca North, on the southern boundary of the shire.

NOTE.—The above description is in lieu of the description of the Cornella-Echuca road, published in the *Government Gazette* of 10th December, 1919, on page 2879, and portion of the description of the Echuca-Cornella road, published in the *Government Gazette* of 23rd March, 1927, on page 1396.

5. *Echuca-Nathalia road* (5505).—Commencing at its junction with the Northern Highway at the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 22, Township of Echuca, Parish of Echuca North; thence north-easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 19, section 37, of the said township; thence south-easterly to the north-western angle of allotment 8, Parish of Echuca North, on the eastern boundary of the borough.

NOTE.—The above description is in lieu of the description of the Echuca-Picola road, published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th April, 1946, on pages 1325 and 1326.

Shire of Towong.

7. *Tallangatta Creek-road* (16307).—Commencing at its junction with the Murray Valley Highway at the most western angle of allotment 84, Parish of Wagra; thence south-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 108 of the said parish; thence south-easterly and easterly through allotments 102 and 107 of the parish aforesaid (S.P. 4295), and further south-easterly to the southern angle of allotment 109, Parish of Wagra; thence south-easterly to and through the Township of Wyeebo, Parish of Wyeebo, and further south-easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 17, section 6; thence south-easterly to and through allotments 18, 19, 20, and 21, all of section 6, parish aforesaid (S.P. 1555), and further south-easterly through allotments 2, 3a, and 3A, all of section 16, Parish of Wyeebo, to the south-western angle of a water reserve in that parish; thence south-easterly to and through portion of allotment 15, Parish of Keelange (S.P. 1529), to the south-eastern angle of allotment 31A of that parish; thence south-easterly to and through allotments 31 and 11A, Parish of Keelange (S.P.'s 1113 and 1114), to the south-eastern angle of allotment 11 of last-named parish; thence south-easterly to the south-western angle of allotment 44c, Parish of Keelange; thence generally north-easterly to the north-western angle of the Township of Cravensville, Parish of Keelange, at the south-western angle of allotment 21A of the parish last named.

8. *Shelley-Jingellic road* (16308).—Commencing at the railway crossing at the north-eastern end of Shelley Railway Station Grounds, in allotment 2, section 1, Parish of Berrigama; thence northerly through that allotment to a point on the northern boundary of said allotment 2, distant 270 deg. 0 min. 110 links from the north-eastern angle thereof; thence further northerly to its junction with the Tallangatta-Corryong road, at the north-western angle of allotment 38A, Parish of Berrigama (S.P.'s 403 and 440).

through allotment 1, section 3 (S.P. 1229), and northerly to its junction with the Murray Valley Highway, at the north-western angle of allotment 7, section 4, Parish of Walwa.

Also, commencing at its junction with the Murray Valley Highway at a point distant 62 deg. 11 min. 1,100 links (approximately) from the south-western angle of a water reserve adjoining allotment 3a, section 1, Parish of Walwa; thence north-westerly through said water reserve to the Jingellic Bridge over the Murray River, near the north-western angle of that reserve, on the northern boundary of the shire.

9. *Yabba-road* (16309).—Commencing at the southern boundary of the Township of Tallangatta at the north-eastern angle of allotment 7b, section 1, Parish of Wagra; thence south-easterly and generally southerly to and through the Wagra P.R.'s (allotments 1 and 2, section A), a river reserve, and allotment 7, section 8, all of the said parish (S.P.'s 845, 665, and 3304), to the north-eastern angle of allotment 1, section 13, of that parish; thence generally southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 2, section 21, Parish of Wagra; thence south-easterly through allotment 4, section 21, of the said parish, to the eastern boundary of that allotment (S.P. 3958), and south-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 6, section 21, Parish of Wagra; thence south-westerly and south-easterly through allotments 9 and 8, section 21, of that parish, to the south-eastern angle of said allotment 9; thence easterly and south-easterly through allotment A, Yabba P.R., Parish of Yabba, to the eastern boundary of the said P.R.; thence generally south-easterly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 8, section 1, of the last-named parish; thence southerly and south-easterly through allotments 4 and 5A of section 4, and 6 and 7 of section 7, all of the Parish of Yabba, to the north-eastern angle of allotment 4, section 7, of that parish (S.P. 4259); thence southerly and south-westerly through allotments 8, 4, and 10c, section 7, Parish of Yabba, to the southern angle of the allotment last named; thence generally south-westerly through allotments 10 and 10A, section 7; 6, 1A, 1, 4, and 79, section 10; and 5A and 5, section 14, all of the Parish of Yabba, to the southern angle of allotment 4A of the last-named section and parish (S.P.'s 1369 and 1702); thence south-westerly and north-westerly through allotments 4 and 3, section 14; and 4, 3c, 3b, 3, and 3A, section 13, all of the Parish of Yabba, to its junction with the Omeo Highway, at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 3, section 13, Parish of Yabba, distant 73 deg. 44 min. 157 links from the north-western angle of that allotment (S.P.'s 1369 and 2435).

Shire of Yea.

9. *King Parrot Creek-road* (19109).—Commencing at its junction with Whittlesea-Yea road at the south-eastern angle of the western portion of allotment 29, Parish of Flowerdale; thence north-easterly, north-westerly, and westerly to and across the bridge over King Parrot Creek to a point approximately north 1,800 links from the south-eastern angle of allotment 24A, section A, of the said parish, on the western boundary of the shire.

Also, commencing at the bridge over King Parrot Creek near the south-eastern angle of allotment 81, Parish of Windham, on the western boundary of the shire; thence easterly, north-easterly, and easterly to the south-eastern angle of a school reserve; thence north-easterly through allotment 54A of the said parish, to the south-eastern angle of allotment 42B, Parish of Windham; thence generally north-easterly to and through allotments 42A, 42i, 42H, 41b, 41, a river reserve and public park, allotments 20, 20A, 20B, and 19, all of the parish last named, to the north-western boundary of the said allotment 19; thence north-easterly to its junction with Upper Goulburn-road, at the north-eastern angle of allotment 10, Parish of Windham.

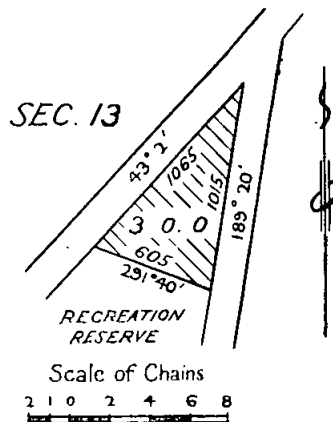

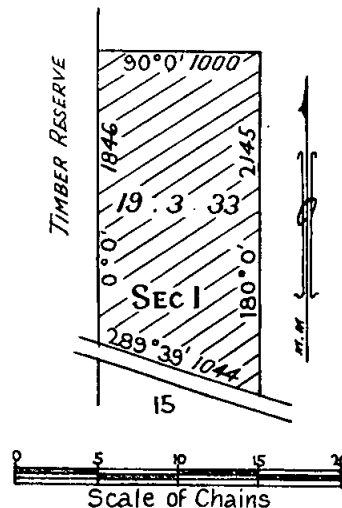

REGULATIONS RELATING TO MEAT SUPERVISION.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the “Meat Supervision Regulations 1947,” shall come into force upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, where applicable shall have operation throughout the State, and are divided into parts as follows:—

- Part I.—Introductory.
- Part II.—Meat Inspection.
- Part III.—Abattoirs.
- Part IV.—Meat Inspection Depots.
- Part V.—Export and Imported Meat.
- Part VI.—Slaughtering and Dressing.
- Part VII.—Brands.
- Part VIII.—Transport of Carcasses and Meat.
- Part IX.—Miscellaneous.
- Part X.—Supplementary.
- Part XI.—Schedules.

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

2. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Abattoir” or “slaughter-house” includes premises commonly known as abattoirs or slaughter-houses or slaughter-yards, and also all premises whatsoever used for any trade or purpose whatsoever in connexion with an abattoir or slaughter-house (including yards, buildings, erections, or enclosures in which animals intended for slaughter are kept or drafted, and premises required for carcasses of animals or meat in or conveyed to an abattoir or slaughter-house, and all appliances for dealing at an abattoir or slaughter-house with offal, manure, or condemned meat).

“Animal” means, bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, kid, or swine.

“Appliances” includes utensils, machinery, instruments, and apparatus.

“Approved” means approved in writing and “approval” has a corresponding interpretation.

“Brand” means any brand prescribed by these Regulations.

“Carcass” includes each and every part of the carcass of an animal.

“Commission” means the Commission of Public Health constituted under the *Health Act 1928*.

- "Condemned room" means room or compartment in an abattoir specially set apart for the temporary reception of condemned carcasses, meat, or viscera.
- "Health Acts" includes the *Health Act* 1928, the *Health Act* 1931, and any other Act amending the same.
- "Imported meat" means any carcass or meat imported from any place outside Victoria.
- "Kosher" meat means meat passed by the Shouchet as suitable for consumption by persons of the Jewish faith.
- "Lamb" means a sheep up to but not including the stage of growth known as "two-toothed".
- "Large cattle" includes bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, and calf.
- "Meat" means any edible part of an animal, and includes edible offal and small goods.
- "Meat inspection depot" or "depot" means any place provided in a meat area by a Council, and approved by the Commission under Part XIII. of the *Health Act* 1928, or any corresponding previous enactment, for the reception of carcasses or meat from outside a meat area for the purpose of examination and branding by or under the direction of a meat inspector, and includes auctioneers' premises so approved, and any place being an "appointed place" under any previous Act.
- "Meat Inspector" means meat inspector appointed under Part XIII. of the *Health Act* 1928, or any corresponding previous enactment, and, where applicable, includes shouchet.
- "Owner" includes any council; and where used in reference to an abattoir or slaughter-house, meat inspection depot, market, shop, house, place, or building, means council or person erecting, establishing, providing, owning, occupying, or managing the same.
- "Pluck" includes heart, liver, and lungs, with associated lymph glands.
- "Shechita Board" means the Melbourne United Shechita Board, or similar Board approved by the Commission for the purposes of these Regulations.
- "Shouchet" means an inspector certified by the Shechita Board, or other approved Board, as being competent to carry out the duties of a shouchet, and includes every person acting as a shouchet immediately prior to the gazettal of these Regulations.
- "Small cattle" includes ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, and kid.

PART II.—MEAT INSPECTION.

4. No person shall be eligible to be a meat inspector unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Commission that he possesses competent skill and experience for the performance of the duties of a meat inspector.
5. Every meat inspector shall have and may exercise such powers, and shall perform such duties as are conferred or imposed on meat inspectors by or under the Health Acts, or as the Council requires.
6. Every meat inspector—
 - (a) may at any hour during the day or night enter any abattoir or meat inspection depot for which he is appointed;
 - (b) may inspect the same, and all appurtenances thereto, or appliances therein;
 - (c) shall examine or direct the examination of all animals intended for slaughter in any such abattoir, and of carcasses and viscera of all animals after slaughter, and of meat at any such depot; and may for any such purpose cut into or direct the cutting into any part of any carcass or meat;
 - (d) shall, as required by or under the Health Acts, brand or direct the branding of carcasses or meat, or otherwise deal with the same; and
 - (e) for the purpose of carrying out any of his powers and duties, shall have all the powers of officers under the Health Acts with regard to examining and seizing animals and things.
7. The meat inspector shall examine or direct the examination of all animals intended for slaughter before they are driven into the slaughtering pen, and shall mark, or cause to be marked, all such animals showing signs or symptoms of any of the diseases specified in Division 1 of the First Schedule hereto in some easily distinguishable manner, and shall take such action as is necessary to separate same from healthy animals.

8. Where in the progress of an examination the hands of a meat inspector or any other person have come in contact with the diseased part of any carcass (including the viscera), such inspector or person shall, before touching any other part of such carcass, or the viscera, or any other carcass, thoroughly cleanse and disinfect his hands.

9. No meat inspector shall pass judgment in respect of any animal, carcass, or meat as a result of examination in artificial light unless the kind of light installed or used has been approved by the Commission.

10. The meat inspector shall, as soon as practicable after the slaughtering of the animal, examine the carcass and all the viscera, giving special attention to the glandular system.

11. The meat inspector shall pass or condemn carcasses or meat for human consumption in accordance with the conditions prescribed in Division 2 and Division 3 of the First Schedule hereto.

12. The meat inspector shall cause all condemned carcasses (including the viscera), and all condemned meat, to be removed to the condemned room, and there immediately slashed or otherwise mutilated in such manner as to render all edible portions unfit for sale, and then sprayed, sprinkled, or drenched, with kerosene, phenyle, or other liquid of equal efficacy, so as to render them unfit for human consumption.

13. Where no adequate provision is made at an abattoir for the destruction or boiling down of condemned carcasses, meat, and viscera, the meat inspector may permit such carcasses, meat, or viscera, after being rendered unfit for human consumption, to be removed for the purpose of being destroyed or boiled down to a destructor or boiling-down establishment approved by the Commission for such purpose.

14. The proprietor of the destructor or boiling-down establishment shall cause the destruction or boiling-down of condemned carcasses, meat, and viscera, to be carried out to the satisfaction of the meat inspector, and in such a manner that there is no possibility of any parts of such carcasses, meat, or viscera, or the fat derived from the same, being used for human consumption.

15. The meat inspector shall—

- (1) in the case of any animal suffering from anthrax take such action as is necessary to secure that such animal is slaughtered with as little loss of blood as possible, and that the carcass, including hide, horns, and hoofs, is destroyed by fire;
- (2) where anthrax is discovered after slaughter cause the carcass, including the viscera, hide, horns, and hoofs, to be destroyed by fire; and
- (3) cause the pen or other place where the animal was slaughtered, all instruments and appliances used, and all clothing and things contaminated, to be disinfected and cleansed forthwith after slaughter.

16. (1) Every meat inspector or other person shall use a clean disinfected knife or other instrument in making an examination of any carcass, meat, or viscera.

(2) Where during the course of examination such knife or other instrument comes in contact with any diseased tissue the meat inspector or other person using the same shall not again use such knife or other instrument until it has been disinfected and cleaned.

17. (1) Every meat inspector shall furnish on or before the 31st day of January in each year returns in the form or forms applicable prescribed by the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) Every meat inspector who becomes aware that any animal is suffering from or that any carcass is affected with anthrax, blackleg, contagious pleuro-pneumonia in cattle, foot and mouth disease, infectious necrotic enteritis of swine, Johne's disease, swine fever, or swine plague, shall forthwith report the circumstances to the Chief Veterinary Inspector, Department of Agriculture.

PART III.—ABATTOIRS.

18. The owner of every abattoir shall keep or cause to be kept a record-book, and shall enter or cause to be entered therein the following particulars in respect of every animal slaughtered thereat:—

- (a) date of slaughter;
- (b) number and kind slaughtered;
- (c) locality or district (if known) from which diseased animals were brought.

19. The owner of every abattoir shall cause—

- (a) all blood, offal, garbage, refuse, and manure to be removed and disposed of daily in such a manner as to prevent nuisance;
- (b) all appliances used by any person in the slaughtering of animals, or in the dressing of carcasses, to be kept clean;
- (c) the abattoir and its appurtenances to be kept clean and orderly, and all walls, floors, and drains to be thoroughly hosed or flushed daily with clean water immediately after the cessation of work;
- (d) an adequate and wholesome supply of water to be provided;
- (e) the abattoir to be kept free from rats, mice, and other vermin;
- (f) all carcasses and meat therein to be kept so as to prevent any contamination of same;
- (g) adequate and proper sanitary conveniences to be provided for the use of all persons employed at the abattoir; and
- (h) proper and sufficient means to be provided for personal ablution.

20. The owner of every abattoir shall provide a condemned room where all condemned carcasses, meat, and viscera shall be placed pending boiling down or destruction on the premises, or removal for the same purpose.

21. Where any animal is suffering from anthrax, blackleg, foot and mouth disease, swine fever or swine plague, or where there is any reasonable ground for believing that an animal is suffering from any such disease, the owner of the abattoir shall cause such animal to be slaughtered in a special killing pen provided for the purpose, or where no such pen is provided, in an ordinary killing pen; and shall cause the pen so used to be disinfected and cleansed to the approval of the meat inspector forthwith after slaughter.

PART IV.—MEAT INSPECTION DEPOTS.

22. Every Council may provide, subject to the approval of the Commission, one or more places as meat inspection depots, and shall cause any carcass or meat brought thereto to be examined and branded by or under the direction of a meat inspector, or otherwise dealt with as prescribed.

23. No person may bring or send, or cause to be brought or sent, to a meat inspection depot any carcass, or part of a carcass, unless the animal from which such carcass, or part, was derived, was slaughtered on the premises (not being a butcher's premises) of such person, nor unless he has obtained the consent in writing of the Council to such slaughtering, nor unless such animal has been reared on the premises of such person.

24. No person shall bring or send, or cause to be brought or sent, to a meat inspection depot—

- (a) in the case of large cattle, less than one-quarter;
- (b) in the case of small cattle and swine, less than the whole carcass, including the head and the lungs attached by the windpipe.

25. The meat inspector shall examine every carcass, and all meat brought to a meat inspection depot, and shall brand same, (if passed as fit for human consumption) in accordance with the Regulations, provided that such carcass or meat complies with the requirements as prescribed by Division 3 of the First Schedule hereto.

26. Where the meat inspector is satisfied that any carcass, or meat, by reason of disease or otherwise, is unfit for human consumption, he shall condemn same, and subject it to the treatment prescribed by Regulation 12.

27. Where the meat inspector is not satisfied that any carcass or meat complies with the provisions of Regulation 23, he shall not brand same until satisfactory evidence is produced that such carcass or meat does so comply.

28. The person bringing, sending, or causing to be brought or sent to a meat inspection depot any carcass or meat, shall attach, or cause to be attached, to such carcass or meat, a tag on which shall be legibly

and durably printed, written, or stencilled, his full name and address, and no person shall remove such tag before the carcass or meat is examined by the meat inspector and branded.

29. The owner of any meat inspection depot shall not keep any dog or cat in, or permit or suffer any dog or cat to be in such depot whilst any carcass or meat is stored therein.

30. The owner of every meat inspection depot shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record-book, and shall enter, or cause to be entered therein, the particulars prescribed hereunder in respect of all carcasses and meat received at such depot

- (a) name and address of the owner or consignor;
- (b) date when carcasses or meat received;
- (c) number and description of carcasses, and whether large or small cattle, or swine;
- (d) quantity and description of meat;
- (e) number and description of carcasses, and quantity of meat condemned, and the reasons for condemnation;
- (f) how condemned carcasses and meat were disposed of; and
- (g) name and address of each person to whom the carcass or meat was delivered.

PART V.—EXPORT AND IMPORTED MEAT.

31. Any carcass or meat of any animal which has been examined ante-mortem and post-mortem by a meat inspector employed by the Commonwealth Government, and which has been slaughtered at an abattoir appointed by the Commonwealth Government as an export abattoir, and passed in accordance with the regulations under the Commonwealth Commerce Act for the time being in force, by the said Commonwealth meat inspector as suitable for export, may, for the purpose of such export, be removed from any such abattoir or brought into any meat area without being branded.

32. Every person who imports any carcass or meat into any meat area from any place outside of Victoria shall—

- (a) take, or cause to be taken, such carcass or meat to the Government Cool Stores, Victoria Dock, Melbourne, or to any other suitable place approved by the Minister for the purpose; and
- (b) furnish the Secretary of the Commission of Public Health with a certificate from an inspector appointed for the purpose by the Government of the State or country from which such carcass or meat has been exported that the carcass or meat is wholesome and free from disease.

33. The manager of the Government Cool Stores, and the owner of any approved place shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record-book, and shall enter, or cause to be entered, therein the particulars prescribed hereunder—

- (a) name of importer or consignee;
- (b) date when carcasses or meat received;
- (c) number and description of carcasses;
- (d) quantity and description of meat;
- (e) number and description of carcasses and the quantity and description of meat condemned, and the reasons for condemnation; and
- (f) how condemned carcasses and meat were disposed of.

34. The meat inspector shall examine all imported carcasses and meat, and, if he finds them fit for human consumption, shall brand same in accordance with the Regulations, but if he finds that they are unfit for human consumption he shall treat them in the manner prescribed by Regulation 12.

35. The meat inspector shall not brand any imported carcass or meat unless the certificate referred to in Regulation 32 is produced for his inspection, or he has reasonable grounds for believing that it is in the possession of the Secretary of the Commission of Public Health.

36. No person shall supply or remove from the Government Cool Stores or any approved place any imported carcass or meat unless it has been branded, or (in case of condemnation) treated in accordance with Regulation 12.

PART VI.—SLAUGHTERING AND DRESSING.

37. Every person, while engaged in the slaughtering of animals, or the dressing, cutting up, or handling of carcasses, shall—

- (a) begin operations with clean hands, knives, and appliances;
- (b) clean and disinfect hands, knives, and appliances immediately after contact of same with any diseased part of the animal, carcass, or viscera; and
- (c) wash his hands immediately after visiting a sanitary convenience.

38. No person shall bleed, or attempt to bleed, any large cattle or swine unless they have first been effectually stunned or pithed: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the slaughtering of animals for the purpose of providing "Kosher" meat.

39. No person shall perform the operation known as "stripping" of the pleura or peritoneum except the meat inspector or a person acting under his direction.

40. No person shall dress the carcass of any animal (other than that of a lamb) in the manner known as "back setting" or "caul fatting," or in any manner which might suggest that the carcass is that of lamb, and no inspector shall brand, nor any person remove from any abattoir or meat inspection depot any such carcass so dressed.

41. No person shall, at any abattoir for which a meat inspector is appointed, or at any meat inspection depot, cut off the head from any carcass purporting or alleged to be lamb until such carcass has been examined and branded by the meat inspector.

42. No person shall remove any carcass of mutton or lamb from any abattoir or meat inspection depot until the "trotters" have been severed from such carcass.

43. Where the meat inspector is not present at the evisceration of any carcass the slaughterman or other person performing the evisceration shall—

- (a) leave attached to the carcass by means of the trachea the pluck with lymph glands; and
- (b) retain the abdominal viscera in such a manner as to preserve its identity with the carcass to which it belongs—

until the meat inspector has completed his examination.

PART VII.—BRANDS.

44. (1) Carcasses or meat passed by a meat inspector as fit for human consumption shall be branded by him, or under his direction, or by the shouchet in the case of Kosher meat, as prescribed by the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) Brands shall be applied by means of ink approved by the Commission.

45. (1) The Commission shall allot to every Council and body authorized to brand carcasses and meat a brand, the form, character, and letters of which shall be as prescribed.

(2) The Commission may, in respect of any existing brand, alter the form and character thereof, or substitute therefor an entirely new brand.

(3) Notice of every such allotment, alteration, and substitution shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon such brand, altered brand, or substituted brand shall be deemed to be included in the Third Schedule hereto.

(4) The charge for each brand rented to a Council by the Commission shall be Seven shillings and sixpence for each calendar year or part thereof.

PART VIII.—TRANSPORT OF CARCASSES AND MEAT.

46. No person shall use any vehicle—

- (a) for retail delivery of meat, or for retail sale of meat from such vehicle, unless the compartment in which the meat is carried is sanitarily constructed and properly ventilated, and the meat is protected from flies, sun rays, and, as far as practicable, from dust; or
- (b) for the wholesale transport of carcasses or meat unless the vehicle is so constructed as to provide for proper ventilation of the carcasses or meat, and for the protection of same from flies, sun rays, and, as far as practicable, from dust.

47. Every person engaged in the retail delivery of meat, or retail sale of meat from any vehicle, shall keep the door of the compartment in which the meat is carried closed at all times except when removing meat for delivery, or serving customers.

48. The proprietor of every vehicle used for transport, sale, or delivery of carcasses or meat shall—

- (a) at the expiration of each day on which such vehicle has been used, remove any straw or other material which may have been used as a floor-covering, and thoroughly cleanse the interior and such parts of the exterior of the vehicle which may have been in contact with any carcass or meat; and
- (b) where straw or other material is used as a floor-covering furnish a clean, fresh supply daily.

49. No person shall handle any carcass or meat unless he is wearing a clean washable overall, and no person shall carry any carcass or meat on his shoulder unless such carcass or meat is protected from coming in contact with his head by means of a cap, shoulder shield, or other efficient protective appliance.

PART IX.—MISCELLANEOUS.

50. (1) No person shall use in the manufacture of small goods any meat other than the wholesome edible parts of a healthy animal.

(2) No person shall manufacture or sell small goods in any meat area unless the meat used in the preparation of same has been examined and passed by a meat inspector.

51. No person shall sell for human consumption the carcass of a calf if such carcass (including the skin, but excluding the head, viscera, and feet) is less than 40 lb. weight, or if such calf is less than fourteen days old.

52. No person shall slaughter, or cause or permit any person to slaughter, any animal, or dress, or cause or permit any person to dress, any carcass except at a public abattoir or a registered abattoir:

Provided that nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to prohibit any person from slaughtering, or causing to be slaughtered any animals—

- (a) on any premises in a shire (whether within or outside a meat area) for consumption by persons on such premises, and not for sale;
- (b) on any premises (not being a butcher's premises) in a shire outside a meat area for the purpose of bringing carcasses or meat to a meat inspection depot, if he has obtained the consent in writing of the Council to such slaughtering, and if the animals have been reared on the premises of such person, or;
- (c) in a knacker's yard if the animals are not slaughtered for human consumption.

53. No person shall sell for human consumption any carcass or meat in any meat area, unless such carcass or meat has been examined by a meat inspector, and branded in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

54. No person shall—

- (a) bring into a meat area any carcass or meat not branded as required by these Regulations, except for the purpose of export or of bringing same to a meat inspection depot; or
- (b) have in his possession except for the purpose aforesaid, or in a depot, any such carcass or meat.

55. No person shall supply or remove from any abattoir in a meat area, or from any depot therein, any carcass or meat unless it has been branded, or (in the case of condemnation) treated in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 12.

56. Any person aggrieved by the refusal of a meat inspector to brand any carcass or meat as fit for human consumption may within 48 hours after such refusal, complain thereof to a justice, and such complaint may be heard and determined before any two justices who, after hearing the evidence, may confirm or disallow such refusal and order the meat inspector to brand such carcass or meat (as the case may be); and such meat inspector shall forthwith comply with such order.

PART X.—SUPPLEMENTARY.

57. The Council of every municipality shall superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and shall, at its own cost, do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for that purpose.

58. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations. Every person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and, in the case of continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than £5, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed £100; and all carcasses and meat in regard to which there has been any failure to comply with these Regulations shall be liable to seizure by any person authorized by the Commission, or by a Council, or by any meat inspector, or by any member of the police force.

PART XI.—SCHEDULES.**FIRST SCHEDULE.****INSPECTION OF ANIMALS AND EXAMINATION OF CARCASSES AND MEAT.****DIVISION 1.***Inspection of Animals.*

The meat inspector shall condemn as unfit for human consumption all animals suffering from any of the diseases or conditions hereunder specified:—

Anthrax;
Black leg;
Contagious pleuro-pneumonia in cattle;
Foot and mouth disease;
Swine fever and swine plague;
Emaciation (if marked).

DIVISION 2.*Inspection and Examination of Carcasses and Viscera at Abattoirs.*

The meat inspector shall, in respect of carcasses at abattoirs, take such action as is indicated hereunder in relation to the various diseases and conditions specified:—

Tuberculosis.

(1) The meat inspector shall condemn the whole carcass in any of the conditions hereunder specified—

- (a) If fine military tubercles be found uniformly distributed along the course of the capillaries of any important organ, such as the lungs, spleen, liver, or kidneys.
- (b) If tubercle be found in muscular tissue, or in the glands between the muscles, or in any of the glands receiving lymph from the muscles, e.g., the axillary, prescapular, inguinal, precural, iliac, or vertebral glands.
- (c) If tubercle exists in the peritoneum and the pleura.
- (d) If tubercle be found in any animal known to have been feverish or ailing at time of slaughter.
- (e) If tubercle exists in any degree in an emaciated animal.
- (f) If, in addition to a primary lesion in the respiratory or digestive tracts, tubercle is found in the spleen or kidneys, or bones or joints, or glands connected therewith.
- (g) If tubercle exists in two or more separate and distinct groups of glands.
- (h) If tubercle be extensive, non-capsulated, soft and caseous, or if pus be present and non-encysted.
- (i) If tubercle is found in any part of a pig, in addition to the head.

(2) The meat inspector shall condemn the parts indicated in any of the conditions specified hereunder—

- If purely localized, encysted, or calcified tubercular lesions be found in any one organ or part, such organ or part, together with the lymph glands receiving lymph from it, shall be condemned.
- If costal pleura only affected, or dorsal thoracic glands, the whole of the forepart of the carcass, including the diaphragm and thoracic wall, shall be condemned.
- If parietal peritoneum only affected or abdominal glands, other than the visceral glands, the whole carcass posterior to and including the diaphragm shall be condemned.
- If head, or lymph glands receiving lymph from it, only are affected, the whole head, together with such lymph glands, shall be condemned.
- If the lymph glands receiving lymph from any organ or part only are affected, the whole organ or part, together with such lymph glands, shall be condemned.

Actinomycosis, Actinobacillosis, and Johne's Disease.

(3) The meat inspector shall, in respect of Actinomycosis, Actinobacillosis, and Johne's Disease, take action similar to that prescribed in relation to tuberculosis, in so far as such action is applicable.

Other Diseases and Conditions.

'The meat inspector shall, in the diseases and conditions indicated hereunder, take such action as is respectively specified—

Poorness—

If animal young, flesh sets well, and no disease .. Pass the carcass.
If animal old or diseased Condemn the carcass.

Emaciation.—Absence of kidney fat, flesh soft and watery, will not set, results of disease .. Condemn the carcass.

Degeneration—

Fatty—If free from disease .. Condemn the organs.
Cloudy swelling—If associated with disease .. Condemn the carcass.

Infiltrations—

Fatty—If organs cirrhotic Condemn the organs.
Melanotic Condemn organs and parts.

Post-mortem Discolouration—If marked .. Condemn the carcass.

Calcifications Condemn all affected parts.

Fevered Flesh Condemn the carcass.

Tumors—

Begnant, free in tissues Condemn the part.
Malignant, infiltrating tissues Condemn the carcass.

Wound, Fractures—

If recent and localized Condemn the part.
If extensive or suppurative Condemn the carcass.

Anaemia—If marked, or from disease Condemn the carcass.

Leucocythaemia—If spleen and lymphatic glands enlarged Condemn the carcass.

Red Water—with congestion of internal organs and paleness of flesh Condemn the carcass.

Hydraemia Condemn the carcass.

Jaundice—If marked Condemn the carcass.

Uraemia Condemn the carcass.

Pregnancy—If near parturition Condemn the carcass.

Parturition—Within ten days Condemn the carcass.

Caseous lymphadenitis—

If purely local Pass the carcass after cutting out the part.

If generalized Condemn the carcass.

Immaturity Condemn the carcass.*Broncho Pneumonia**Lobar Pneumonia**Pleurisy**Peritonitis**Contagious Pleuro**Pneumonia*

Pericarditis—If signs of inflammation, slight or old, no emaciation, no suppuration, and flesh sets well

Condemn organs only.

Pyæmia*Osteomyelitis**Navel Ill**Joint Ill**Septicaemia**Septic Mastitis**Septic Metritis**Septic Intestinal Diseases**Sapraemia**Anthrax**Foot and Mouth Disease**Swine Fever**Swine Erysipelas**Swine Plague**Necrotic Enteritis**Urticaria—*

If flesh is not fevered, and no other signs of disease Pass the carcass, but remove affected skin.

If flesh fevered, or disease present Condemn the carcass.

Pass the carcass after cutting out cyst.

(5) The meat inspector shall, in diseases and conditions not herein specified, be guided in his judgment by the principles herein laid down.

DIVISION 3.

Inspection at Meat Inspection Depots.

The meat inspector shall pass or condemn carcasses or meat brought to a meat inspection depot in accordance with the conditions indicated in Division 2, in so far as they are applicable.

The meat inspector shall condemn the carcass or meat where—

(a) the pleura or peritoneum has been stripped; or

(b) the lymph glands properly pertaining to the carcass or meat have been removed.

DIVISION 4.

Inspection of Imported Carcasses and Meat.

The meat inspector shall pass or condemn carcasses or meat examined at any place prescribed or approved for the examination of imported carcasses or meat in accordance with the conditions prescribed by Division 3, in so far as they are applicable.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

Brands.

1. (1) Every carcass and all meat, whether fresh, chilled, frozen, dried, or preserved, when examined and passed as fit for human consumption, shall, unless intended for export, be branded in a clear and legible manner by or under the direction of a meat inspector with the appropriate brand described hereunder.

(2) Each brand shall be in the form of an outline of a crown being not less than one inch and one-quarter of an inch in extreme height and extreme breadth, shall contain the symbol prescribed hereunder, and shall include letters in the form of Roman capitals not less than one-quarter of an inch in height indicating the Commission, or the municipal council or other body, under whose authority the carcass or meat was examined and passed: Provided that in the case of carcasses and meat for consumption by members of the Jewish faith, the brand shall be the word "Kosher" in Hebrew characters as shown in clause 6 of this schedule.

Indicating Letters.

(3) The letters indicating the several bodies under whose respective authorities the brands are applied shall be as shown hereunder:—

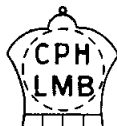

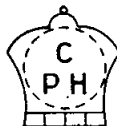
Modes of Branding.

2. Where the animal has been inspected before slaughter, and the carcass and viscera have been examined after slaughter, the brand shall contain the form of an interrupted circle:—

- In the planning, designing, or conducting of research, experimental, or routine investigations or analyses in connexion with chemical, biochemical, physical chemical, bacteriological, physics, physical testing, or metallurgical processes or in controlling the proper functioning of such processes whether carried on in laboratories or elsewhere.

- In assisting in the operations set out in paragraph (i) hereof by—

- the preparation or care of apparatus or materials,
- the recording or tabulating of results,
- any other means.
