## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Public Service Act 1946* (10 Geo. VI. No. 5124), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

#### Public Holidays:-

TUESDAY, 16TH MARCH, 1948, throughout that portion of the Shire of Gordon lying west of the Loddon River, and including the Township of Durham Ox.  
WEDNESDAY, 17TH MARCH, 1948, throughout the Shire of Upper Murray and the North Riding of the Shire of Orbst.

#### Public Half-Holidays from the Hour of Twelve o'clock noon:-

WEDNESDAY, 3RD MARCH, 1948, throughout the Shire of Grenville.  
THURSDAY, 4TH MARCH, 1948, throughout the Townships of Terang, Noorat, Glenormiston, and that part of Kolora which is embraced within the Shire of Hampden.  
TUESDAY, 16TH MARCH, 1948, throughout the Shire of Kilmore.  
WEDNESDAY, 17TH MARCH, 1948, throughout the Shire of Lowan and the Kyneton Riding of the Shire of Kyneton.  
WEDNESDAY, 24TH MARCH, 1948, throughout the West Riding of the Shire of Ararat.  
THURSDAY, 8TH APRIL, 1948, throughout the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

## BANK HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:-

#### Bank Holiday:-

SATURDAY, 6TH MARCH, 1948, at Wodonga.

Bank Half-Holidays from the Hour of Twelve o'clock noon:-

WEDNESDAY, 3RD MARCH, 1948, at Ballarat and Walwa.  
THURSDAY, 18TH MARCH, 1948, at Terang.

### Country Fire Authority Acts.

EXTENSION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified

part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by Proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazettes* of 26th November, 1947, 10th December, 1947, 17th December, 1947, and 23rd December, 1947, different summer periods expiring on the 29th day of February, 1948, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, it is deemed necessary that a further period be proclaimed as the summer period throughout certain parts of the said country area:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the first day of March, 1948, and ending on the fifteenth day of March, 1948, to be the summer period throughout the country area of Victoria excluding the municipal districts of the municipalities named in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. The Shires of Borung, Dunmunkle, Dimboola, Lawloit, Lowan, and Wimmera (being part of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region).
2. The City of Mildura; and the Shires of Birchip, Karkaroc, Mildura, Walpeup, and Wycheproof (being part of the Eighteenth Fire Control Region).
3. The Borough of Swan Hill; and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, and Swan Hill (being part of the Twentieth Fire Control Region).

*Banks and Currency Act 1928.*

ALTERATION WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN PARTS OF VICTORIA OF DAY APPOINTED FOR A BANK HOLIDAY (LABOR DAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Monday, the twenty-sixth day of April, 1948, is, by section 13 of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, appointed for a bank holiday:

And whereas it is made to appear to the Governor in Council expedient that the said day should not be a bank holiday throughout certain parts of the State of Victoria as set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a bank holiday throughout those parts of the said State as set forth in the Schedule hereto, and appoint—

MONDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF MARCH, 1948,  
to be a bank holiday throughout the said parts of the State of Victoria.

SCHEDULE.

The City of Bendigo; the Boroughs of Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Echuca, Inglewood, and Maryborough; and the Shires of Bet Bet, Deakin, East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Korong, Kyneton, McIvor, Maldon, Marong, Metcalf, Newstead and Mount Alexander, Rochester, Strathfieldsaye, Tullaroop, and Waranga.
