DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

Provided that any apprentice who has passed Grade III. (Trade Theory and Practice) examination referred to in the regulations of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria and has also become entitled under the said regulations to an increased rate of pay for proficiency for such examination. shall have the amount of such increase paid to him each week beyond any period provided for in the said regulations until the completion of his apprenticeship together with the rate herein prescribed appropriate for the year of his apprenticeship.

employer stating the date when such employment began and date of its termination duly signed or otherwise authenticated by the employer. Such certificate shall be the property of the employee, and shall be returned to her by any subsequent employer within seven days of her engagement.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force except that in clause 1 of Schedule "A" the words "a pieceworker shall be paid 52s. if a day worker or 55s. if a night worker for each full week worked" shall be paid 57s. if a day worker or 60s. if a night worker for each full week worked".
