ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR BANK HOLIDAY (KING'S BIRTHDAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

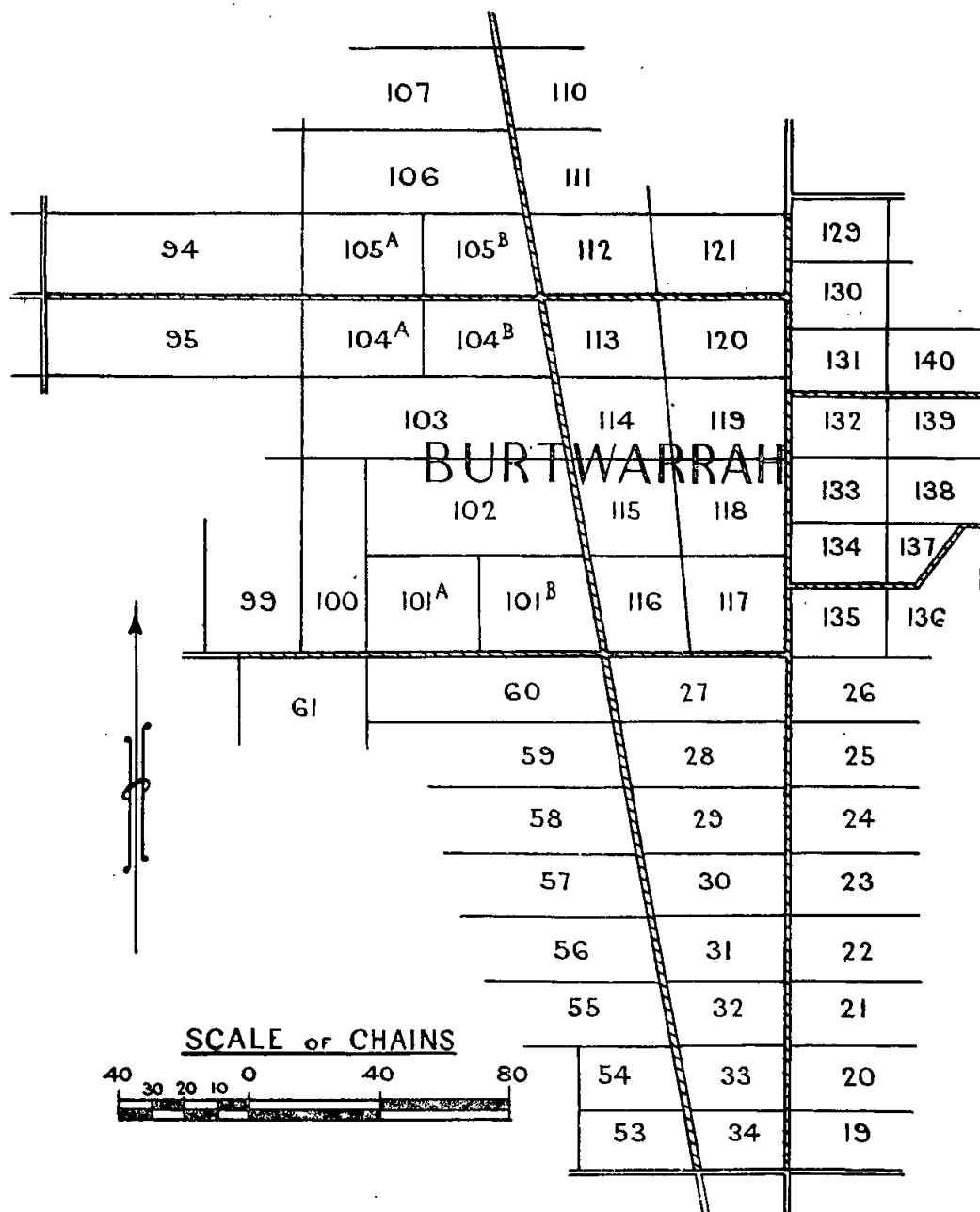
UNUSED AND UNMADE ROADS CLOSED—PARISH OF BURTWARRAH.

*Local Government Act 1946.*PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the Regulations was extended to part of the municipality of the Shire of Ballarat by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the fourth day of September 1946:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Ballarat has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to a further part of the Shire of Ballarat, as follows:—

Crown allotment 6, section XI., Parish of Cardigan, County of Grenville, being the area bounded on the north by the Western Highway, on the east by Learmonth-street, on the south by Cuthbert's-road, and on the west by Railway Reserve.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district of the said municipality on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the sixteenth day of August, 1948.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a

public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Nunawading aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

O'Hara-street.

All that land commencing at a point situated on the western boundary of Williams-road and distant 40 ft. 0½ in. by a line bearing 359 deg. 10 min. from the intersection of the western boundary of Williams-road and the southern boundary of lot 8, shown on plan of subdivision No. 13167 lodged at the Office of Titles, Melbourne, and bounded by a line bearing 312 deg. 44 min. for a distance of 13 ft. 9½ in.; thence by a line bearing 266 deg. 18 min. for a distance of 288 ft. 3 in.; thence by a curved line being part of the northern boundary of lot 18 and the northern boundary of lot 17 and the southern boundary of lot 26 and part of the southern boundary of lot 25 extending for a distance of 185 ft. 9½ in., and shown on plan of subdivision No. 13167 lodged at the Office of Titles, Melbourne; thence by a line bearing 86 deg. 18 min. for a distance of 290 ft. 9 in.; thence by a line bearing 42 deg. 44 min. for a distance of 14 ft. 6 in.; thence by a line being the western boundary of Williams-road bearing 179 deg. 10 min. and extending for a distance of 70 ft. 1 in. to the commencing point.

Duties.—To assist the Chief Valuer with the administration of the Valuations Branch which values all lands acquired for water works under notices to treat, and conducts negotiations in regard to payment of compensation, and to supervise the making of valuations of rural properties for land acquisition and for rating purposes.

Qualifications.—To be a qualified valuer or to hold approved qualifications in civil engineering or surveying or agricultural science, and to have extensive knowledge of and experience in making valuations of lands and improvements thereon for rating purposes and for compensation in respect of lands acquired for the Commission's works.

Duties.—To undertake soil surveying, including control, under general direction, of survey parties. To carry out soil analyses and soil investigations in the field and laboratory.

Qualifications.—To hold a science degree with chemistry as a major subject, or equivalent qualifications, and to have had some experience preferably in soils work.

Mechanical Engineer, Grade III., Class "C1," Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—Supervision of installation and maintenance at pumping stations, and to supervise the detailed maintenance in the field of earth-moving and other mechanical plant.

Qualifications.—To have a degree or diploma in mechanical engineering, a First Class Engineer's Certificate issued by the Board of Trade, or other recognized qualification in mechanical engineering, with full experience in the operation of steam and internal combustion engine plants. An intimate knowledge of spare parts, &c., for earth-moving machinery will be an advantage.

Senior Draughtsman, Grade II., Class "C1," Estates Branch, Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To be a competent draughtsman; to be responsible for the custody, classification and recording of the Commission's plans, and the working of the Central Plan Room.

Qualifications.—To possess a good general knowledge of the organization and activities of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, and a detailed knowledge of methods of plan reproduction, production of aerial-photo maps and modern filing and indexing systems. A knowledge of surveying and the Survey Co-ordination Act is desirable.

Duties.—To inspect apiaries and examine bees, &c., for diseases; to lecture on the theory and practice of bee culture, the handling of bees, and the treatment of honey and beeswax; to give instruction regarding the rearing of queen bees, the construction of hives and frames, and the use of comb foundation; to answer correspondence and personal inquiries.

Qualifications.—A thorough knowledge of bees, their anatomy, the economy of the hive, and the Bees Act and Regulations thereunder; a knowledge of bee diseases and their treatment, and also of the botany of Victorian flora.

NOTE.—In addition to the salary rates quoted a cost of living adjustment (at present £60 a year for adult males, £40 a year for adult females, and £30 a year for minors), which varies in accordance with the rise or fall in the index numbers of the cost of living, is payable.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

BY-LAW No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within such areas the erection (including adaptation for use) of buildings and the use of land and buildings therein, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Alexandra makes the By-law and order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"The Council" means the Council of the Shire of Alexandra.

"Erect or construct" includes "adapt for use."

"Person" includes "person, company, and corporation."

"Residential area" means a part of the Shire of Alexandra duly prescribed by the Council as a residential area.

"Business premises" includes any shed, outhouse, hoarding, stable, workshop, garage, water-closet, underground tank, or excavation, and any other building or erection whatsoever, or any land wholly or partially used for or adapted to the use of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement of any kind whatsoever, other than the business of keeping a lodging-house, boarding-house, or flats, or the business of a library or book club.

"Shire Secretary" means every such Shire Secretary who is appointed by the Council, and includes any Deputy Shire Secretary appointed by the Council.

"In writing and written" includes writing, printing, typing, lithographing, and other substitutes for writing.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females, and the singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

2. From and after the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, those parts of the Shire of Alexandra comprised within the areas more particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become residential areas.

3. The use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building, for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements is hereby prohibited within the whole of such residential areas: Provided, however, that the Council, by resolution, may sanction the carrying on of a business or industry in any dwelling-house by a single worker without mechanical motive power or public exhibition or display of any trade sign or any commodity or service indicative of such business or industry.

4. Any officer of the Council may, for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of this By-law, enter and inspect any land or building within any residential area at all reasonable times, and do therein all such acts as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any person who shall in any manner interfere with or obstruct such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

5. Every person who by act or omission wilfully offends against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each day while such offence is continued after written notice from the Council in that behalf under the hand of the Shire Secretary.

6. Notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty under this By-law, if any business premises or other erection, after the passing of this By-law, be erected, constructed, altered, or repaired, or be adapted to use, or used, kept, continued, or suffered to remain wholly or partially contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, the Council may by notice, in writing, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, require the owner or the occupier, if the owner is unknown or cannot be found within a time to be limited in the notice, to put the business premises or other erection in a state or condition conformable to the provisions of this By-law, or else to pull down and remove the same.

7. If such owner or occupier do not, within the time limit of the said notice, make the business premises or erection conformable to the provisions of this By-law, or if no owner or occupier can be found on whom to serve such notice, the Shire Secretary shall report the matter to the Council, and the Council may thereupon cause all or so much of the business premises, or erection as in its opinion is not conformable to the provisions of this By-law to be taken down in such manner as may be requisite, and all expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner, and may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

8. If any business premises or other erection as aforesaid, or any part of the same, be taken down as aforesaid, the Council may sell the materials thereof, or so much of the same as has been taken down, and apply the proceeds of such sale in payment of the expenses incurred in respect of such business premises or other erection, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from the sale to the owner of the business premises or other erection, on demand.

9. If the occupier of any business premises or land, whether under lease or otherwise, prevents or in any manner obstructs the owner thereof from carrying into effect in respect of such business premises or land any of the provisions of this By-law, or otherwise complying therewith, such occupier shall, as from the date of expiration of such notice, be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall also be liable to the penalties prescribed for a continuing offence for every day such obstruction shall continue thereafter.
