AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 3 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Duties.—To supervise staff and control all rural and urban water supplies, works, and expenditure within the Ouyen centre. To direct surveys and to prepare plans, specifications, estimates, and reports in regard to new works within the District, to supervise construction and maintenance of works, and to control water distribution within the centre.

Qualifications.—To possess a degree or technical school diploma in civil engineering or other engineering qualifications. To be competent to carry out surveys and supervise water distribution; to be well versed in modern engineering practice and in the design, construction, and maintenance of channels and structures and water supply works. To be conversant with the control of water and with land values and have a thorough knowledge of the provisions of the Water Acts. A knowledge of sand-drift prevention and protection of channels is essential.

Forest Economist, Class "C2," Department of State Forests.

Yearly Salary.—£592, minimum; £644, maximum.

Duties.—To undertake economic surveys in connexion with all forestry activities; to undertake stumpage appraisals; to investigate the economics of forest products other than timber, and to maintain liaison between the Forests Commission, the timber trade, and timber-using industries.

Qualifications.—To be the holder of a degree in forestry, or a graduate of a recognized school of forestry, preferably holding a forestry diploma, and in addition preferably to have undertaken a course in economics and statistics; to have had experience in timber assessment, and to have a sound knowledge of industrial forestry practice and the economics of industries connected with forest products in general; and to be thoroughly conversant with Victorian forestry practice and procedure.

Superintendent, Castlemaine Reformatory, Class "C1," Penal and Gaols Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To carry out the duties of Superintendent at Castlemaine Reformatory Prison.

Qualifications.—A sound education, with preferably a University degree in arts, education, law, or commerce. Some evidence of study and research in the problems of delinquency and psychology. A strong personality, with an understanding of men, initiative, quiet resourcefulness and patience in the handling of impetuous and wayward youths. Experience in institutional management.

Surveyor, Class "C1," Survey Branch, Office of Titles, Department of Law.

Duties.—To carry out surveys in connexion with Titles Office requirements, particularly in respect to the verification and marking of title boundaries and alignments, and to carry out surveys for other Departments when required. To assist in the correlation of surveys.

Duties.—To assist in the conduct of research into agricultural entomological problems of Victoria, to survey and report on insect pest outbreaks, to identify economic insect specimens, to deliver lectures, and to assist in the conduct of field demonstrations on the control of insect pests.

Qualifications.—To possess a degree in agricultural science or science, experience in the conduct of research in economic entomology, a knowledge of agricultural and horticultural practice, and capacity to lecture and to write reports.

Draughtsman, Class "D," Department of Public Works.

Duties.—To prepare preliminary sketches, contract plans, details, and specifications for modern buildings.

Qualifications.—To be fully qualified in building construction, and widely experienced in architectural draughtsmanship in connexion with the planning and detailing of major departmental structures or institutional buildings.

*Teaching Service Act 1946.***TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.**

THE Teachers' Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 1 of the Teaching Service (Teachers' Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October 1946 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October 1946 in the manner following, that is to say:—

Revoke clause 7 and substitute therefor the following clause:—

"7. No allowance, except such as may be granted by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director, shall be payable to a member who is absent from his headquarters when he leaves and returns the same day: Provided that the Director may authorize the payment of—

- (a) 3s. for breakfast where a member is required to leave before 7 a.m. and is unable to return until after 9.30 a.m.
- (b) 3s. for tea where a member is required to leave before 5 p.m. and is unable to return until after 7 p.m.
- (c) 3s. for lunch where a member is required to leave before 12 noon and is unable to return until after 3 p.m. and is absent for a period of at least seven hours."

SALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1928*, the Trustees of the Sale Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be hereby rescinded.

2. The charges for burying in, or otherwise using, the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker at least seven ordinary working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within ordinary working hours, as defined by the determination of the Cemetery Employees Board.

4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when brick graves or vaults are required then the excavations must be made, and the ground filled in or removed, under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

5. The hours fixed for interment are from 10 a.m. till 3.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. No interments may be made on Sundays or Saturdays, except with the approval of the Trustees, and then only on the written recommendation of the local Health Officer, or as the Trustees otherwise think fit.

6. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every inscription, must be submitted to the Trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.

7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone or iron.

8. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before taken into the cemetery, and all such materials used and foundations made must meet with the approval of the Trustees.

9. Every stonemason or contractor doing work in the cemetery must clear away all debris within 48 hours of the completion of the work.

10. The grounds will be open to the public daily from 8 a.m. till 5 p.m.

11. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground, or satisfying the Trustees that it has already been paid for.

12. Instructions for interments in ground previously purchased must be accompanied by documentary evidence of authority to issue such instructions.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Carriages Acts and the Motor Car Acts, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. BOROUGH OF ECHUCA.

BY-LAW No. 37.

A By-law of the Borough of Echuca, made under the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 37, for regulating traffic and processions, appointing and regulating standing places for motor and other vehicles, suppressing nuisances, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Echuca order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Definitions.

- In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—
"Borough" means the municipal district of the Borough of Echuca.
"Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat, swine species, respectively.
"Council" means the Council of the Borough of Echuca.
"Crossing" means a crossing (established by the Council) for pedestrians on streets, and includes the part or parts of any intersection used by pedestrians when crossing such intersection.
"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or a horse.
"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough habitually used by pedestrians and not vehicular traffic.
"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.
"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle, whether or not such streets cross.
"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.
"Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.
"Occupier" means and shall include the proprietor of any premises, and also the owner, the occupier, or any person apparently having the management or control thereof.
"Public place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare, or public convenience established by the Council, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property, and also any public park, garden, or reserve.
"Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough, other than a footway.
"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, and includes a motor car.
"Writing" includes printing, lithography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form. Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

Interference with Notice, &c.

3. No person, not being an authorized officer or employee of the Council, or otherwise authorized by the Council, shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the Council, pursuant to this By-law, upon any street, roadway, or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building.

Affixing Unauthorized Notices.

4. No person, not being an officer or employee of the Council, or otherwise authorized by the Council, shall affix any notice, sign, or other thing to any street or footway, or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, or other thing upon or into any street or footway.

Parking in Certain Streets.

5. Every person parking a vehicle or leaving a vehicle stationary in High-street, Echuca, within the sections thereof in which central plantations are situated, or in Hare-street, Echuca, between Pakenham-street and Heygarth-street, shall cause such vehicle to be drawn up with the left or near front wheel as close as practicable to the kerb on his left or near side of the street, and as near as practicable at an angle of 45 degrees with the street, and when parking such vehicle or leaving the same stationary in any portion or section of the aforesaid streets where parking lines have been painted or indicated, or are painted or indicated at such time upon the street surface by the Council, cause the said vehicle to be drawn up parallel to and within an adjacent pair of such parking lines.

6. A wagon, truck, motor truck (other than a utility truck of less capacity than 1½ ton), transport wagon, timber haulage wagon, hire car, taxi, or omnibus of any description, or any vehicle with a trailer of any description attached thereto, or any horse or horse-drawn vehicle, whether attended or not, shall not be left standing in any part of High-street or Hare-street mentioned in clause 5 of this By-law.

7. The last preceding clause shall not apply to any vehicle drawing up to a bowser for the service of petrol, oil, or air, or to any vehicle actually loading or unloading goods or merchandise, provided that a vehicle whilst actually loading or unloading goods or merchandise shall not remain in those parts of High and Hare streets mentioned in clause 5 of this By-law continuously for more than 30 minutes, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Omnibuses, Hire Cars, Taxis.

8. A vehicle used and licensed as a hire car, taxi, or omnibus, whether attended or not, shall not be left standing, and shall not stop in those parts of High-street and Hare-street mentioned in clause 5 of this By-law which are not expressly provided for the exclusive use of hire cars, taxis, or omnibuses, provided, however, that a hire car, taxi, or omnibus may stop for the express purpose of setting down or picking up passengers then and there ready to alight or board such hire car, taxi, or omnibus.

Not to Park Over Lines Painted Parallel with Kerb.

9. No person shall park a vehicle or leave the same stationary upon any section or portion of any street indicated as non-parking areas by means of lines painted upon the street surface parallel to and within 4 feet of the kerb.

Loading of Transports, &c., Forbidden in Certain Streets.

10. No person shall park, stop, stand, or leave a vehicle in any street (except for a period of less than 5 minutes, and except in such position as not to obstruct traffic) for the purpose of transferring goods from such vehicle to another vehicle, or for receiving goods from another vehicle, unless with the consent of the Council previously obtained.

11. No person shall park or leave a vehicle stationary opposite an omnibus or taxi cab stand on the same side of the street upon which the same is appointed.

Taxi and Omnibus Stands.

12. It shall be lawful for the Council by notice, in writing, under the hand or by direction of the Town Clerk, from time to time, as may be convenient or necessary, to fix or appoint in any street one or more public stands for omnibuses, taxi cabs, or other licensed vehicles plying for hire.

Abolishment of Taxi, &c., Stands.

13. Any such public stand so appointed under this By-law may be discontinued or abolished at any time by the discontinuance or the removal by the Council of the notice relating thereto.

14. No person shall park or leave stationary any vehicle, other than an omnibus, on any portion of any street set aside for the exclusive use of omnibuses.

15. No person shall park or leave stationary any vehicle, other than a taxi cab, on any portion of any street set aside for the exclusive use of taxi cabs.

16. No person shall park or leave stationary any omnibus in any portion of any street other than upon such portion as has been set aside for the exclusive use of omnibuses.

17. No person shall park or leave stationary any taxi cab on any portion of any street other than upon such portion as has been set aside for the exclusive use of taxi cabs.

Street Processions.

18. (1) No procession of persons or of vehicles shall, except for military or funeral purposes, parade or pass through any street, unless the following conditions have been complied with, that is to say:—

Notice, in Writing, to be Given to Town Clerk.

(a) Two weeks' notice, in writing, shall be previously given to the Town Clerk of the intention to hold such procession, specifying the proposed duration of such procession, the time and place of starting, the route proposed to be followed, and the time and place of completion thereof.

Notice to Police.

(b) Twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, at least, shall be given, with such particulars as aforesaid, to the Officer in Charge of Police, at Echuca.

Not more Than One on Each Day—Preference to First Received.

(2) Not more than one procession shall parade or pass through the Borough on any one day.

(3) Should two or more notices be given to the Town Clerk of intention to hold processions on the same day, only the notice first received by the Town Clerk shall be deemed to be validly given.

Crossings.

19. The Council may from time to time establish crossings for pedestrians on streets, and may from time to time dis-establish or discontinue crossings so established.

Obstructing Street or Footway.

20. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon, whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

Spitting or Expectoring on Footways or Streets.

21. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footway or on any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

Throwing of Fruit Skins on Footways.

22. No person shall put, throw, or allow to fall and remain upon any footway or street the skin or peel or stem of any fruit, or the leaves or any part of any vegetable, or any other refuse or rubbish.

Dust or Water Not to be Discharged on Streets or Footways.

23. No person shall, at any time between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the afternoon of any day, cause interruption or annoyance to passengers upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

Projections in Footways or Lanes.

24. No person who is the owner of or has the care or management of any lift or tackle shall permit such lift or tackle to project over any footway or lane in the Borough, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

Hoisting Goods Across Footways or Lanes.

25. No person shall, without the like permission, swing or hoist goods across or over any footway or lane in the Borough by means of any lift or tackle which so projects, or shall otherwise use such lift or tackle.

Placing Advertisements on Streets or Footways. Advertising Placards, &c. Employers or Persons Offending Also Liable.

26. No person shall place or leave on any street or footway any placard, board, or other thing by way of advertisement on any street or footway, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in or under the control of the Council.

27. The employer of any person contravening in any manner either of the two preceding clauses of this By-law shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

28. Every person who shall in any manner authorize any act or thing contrary to the provisions of clause 26 of this By-law shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

Handbills, &c., Must Not be Distributed or Littered on Streets or Footways.

29. No person, upon any street, footway, or other public place, shall give out or distribute to bystanders or passers-by any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers, but nothing here contained shall prohibit the issue, on election or polling days, of notices or papers known as How to Vote cards.

30. No person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

Depositing Rubbish.

31. No person shall place or deposit any refuse or rubbish in any street, road, or right of way, other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*.

Violent Outcry, Noise, &c.

32. No person, upon any street or footway, shall make or cause to be made any loud or violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway, or in any premises abutting thereon or adjacent thereto.

Play upon Musical Instrument, &c.

33. No person, upon any street or footway, shall—

- (a) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument; or
- (b) sing or harangue so as to cause annoyance or obstruction to, or so as to be calculated to cause such annoyance or obstruction, to any other person upon such street or footway, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

34. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the Borough shall, within the hearing of any person being upon any street or footway, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto, make or cause or permit or suffer to be made upon such first-mentioned land or premises (whether by means of any electrical wireless set, loud speaker, gramophone, piano player, or otherwise) any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

Owner or Occupier Not to Make or Permit Loud Outcry, &c.

35. Any person, other than such owner or occupier, operating such wireless set, loud speaker, gramophone, piano player, or other instrument as aforesaid, or otherwise concerned in the making of such outcry, noise, or sound as aforesaid, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Free Use of Streets, Safety Zones, and Footways Not to be Obstructed.

35A. No person in any street or footway shall—

- (a) Sell or offer for sale or place thereon any goods or articles in manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway.
- (b) Occupy thereon any fixed stand, whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise, without the written permission of the Council.
- (c) Allow any goods or articles in his possession or custody, or under his control (whether he be the owner thereof or not), to remain thereon, without the written permission of the Council.

36. The employer of any person contravening in any manner the provisions of the last preceding clause hereof shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and every person who shall in any manner authorize or purport to authorize any act or thing contrary to the provisions of such clause shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Overhanging Branches of Trees, &c.

37. (1) No owner or occupier of any land upon which is growing or standing any tree, hedge, vine, shrub, creeper, or other plant of any kind whatsoever shall permit any branch, or part thereof, to overhang any street or road so as to be likely to cause inconvenience or annoyance to any person using such street or road.

Seedlings and Suckers of Trees.

38. (2) Every such owner or occupier shall keep all streets and roads clear from all seedlings, suckers, and other offsets from such trees, hedges, vines, shrubs, creepers, and plants as aforesaid.

Power of Council to Remove Same in Default of Owners.

39. (3) In the event of seedlings, suckers, or offsets from any such tree, hedge, vine, shrub, creeper, or other plant as aforesaid growing upon, or of any branch thereof, overhanging any street or road, the Borough Engineer or other officer of the Council may cause a written notice to be served on the owner or occupier requiring him to remove the same within fourteen days, and in default may cause the same to be removed, and such owner or occupier shall, in addition to any penalty which may be imposed upon him for breach of this By-law, be liable to pay the expenses of such removal.

Trees, &c., at Junction of Streets.

40. Where—

- (a) Any tree, shrub, or hedge is growing on private property situate at the junction of streets or roads, and such tree, shrub, or hedge abuts on any such street or road within 10 feet of such junction; or
- (b) Any fence, or part of fence, exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. in height is situated (whether before or after the coming into operation of this By-law) within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads,

the Borough Engineer or other officer of the Council may cause a written notice to be served on the owner or occupier requiring him, within fourteen days, to remove or lop such tree, shrub, or hedge, or reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of such fence, and in default may cause such tree, shrub, or hedge to be removed or lopped or such portion of fence to be reduced in height, and such owner or occupier shall, in addition to any penalty which may be imposed on him for any breach of this By-law, be liable to pay the expenses of such removal, lopping, or reduction in height.

Erection or Use of Tents, &c., for Sale of Goods.

41. No person shall—

- (a) Erect or use on any land within the Borough tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom.
- (b) Sell or offer for sale goods in or from such tents, structures, or buildings.

Sale of Goods from Stalls, &c., on Vacant Land.

- (c) Sell or offer for sale goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicles, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles, standing or placed on land on which no permanent buildings are erected (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the Council, or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*) within the Borough.

Penalty.

42. Every person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

Application of By-law.

43. Except where otherwise herein provided, this By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Echuca.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Borough of Echuca on the 23rd day of February, 1948, and confirmed on the 22nd day of March, 1948.

BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.

BY-LAW No. 16.

A By-law of the Borough of Ringwood, made under the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 16, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential areas the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified herein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ringwood orders as follows:—

1. The areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

2. No person shall, within any of the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement.

3. No person shall, within any of the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any trade, industry, manufacture, or business carried on in a factory, or any noxious or offensive trade as set out in the Third Schedule.

The First Schedule Hereinbefore Referred to.

Those areas comprised within the following bounds:—

1. Commencing at the intersection of the northern building line of Maroondah Highway with the western boundary of the Borough of Ringwood; thence northerly and easterly along the municipal boundary to the eastern boundary of the municipality; thence southerly along the eastern municipal boundary to its intersection with the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway; thence south-westerly along the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway to its intersection with the western building line of Oban-road; thence north-westerly along the western building line of Oban-road to its intersection with the southern building line of Mullum Mullum-road; thence south-westerly along the southern building line of Mullum Mullum-road to the western boundary of allotment 24 on lodged plan No. 3820, part of Crown allotment 33; thence southerly along the western boundary of allotment 24, Mullum Mullum-road, lodged plan No. 3820, part of Crown allotment 33, for a distance of 924 ft. 8 in.; thence south-easterly to the intersection with the north-eastern boundary, allotment 75, Leonard-street, on lodged plan No. 11019; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of allotments 75 to 89, Leonard-street, on lodged plan No. 11019, to the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway; thence westerly along the northern building line of Maroondah Highway to the western building line of Junction-street; thence northerly along the western building line of Junction-street for a distance of 300 feet; thence westerly along a line at all points parallel with and 300 feet distant from the northern building line of Maroondah Highway to the western building line of Ringwood-street; thence southerly along the western building line of Ringwood-street to the southern building line of Seymour-street; thence westerly to the intersection of the northern building line of Seymour-street and the southern building line of Charter-street; thence westerly along the southerly building line of Charter-street to the eastern boundary of allotment 67, Charter-street, on lodged plan No. 14044; thence north-westerly to a point on the northern building line of Charter-street 171 ft. 4 in. east of the eastern building line of New-street; thence northerly along a line 171 ft. 4 in. distant from the eastern building line of New-road to the southern building line of Bond-street; thence westerly along the southern building line of Bond-street and this line extended for a distance of 191 ft. 5 in. west of the western building line of New-road; thence southerly along a line parallel with and 191 ft. 5 in. distant from the western building line of New-road to the northern building line of Maroondah Highway; thence westerly along the northern building line of Maroondah Highway to the commencing point.

2. Commencing at a point on the southern building line of Maroondah Highway at the western boundary of the Borough of Ringwood; thence easterly along the southern building line of Maroondah Highway to a point 200 feet west of the western building line of New-road; thence southerly along a line parallel with and 200 feet west of the western building line of New-road for a distance of 300 feet; thence easterly along a line at all points parallel with and 300 feet distant from the southern building line of Maroondah Highway to its intersection with the western boundary of Ringwood Park; thence northerly along the western boundary of Ringwood Park to the northern build-

ing line of Maroondah Highway; thence easterly along the northern building line of Maroondah Highway to the eastern boundary of the municipality; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the municipality to the southern boundary of the municipality; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the municipality to its intersection with the western building line of Waterloo-street; thence northerly along the western building line of Waterloo-street to its intersection with the northern building line of Canterbury-road; thence westerly along the northern building line of Canterbury-road to a point 319 ft. 6 in. west of the western building line of Wantirna-road; thence northerly along a line bearing 359 deg. 50 min. for a distance of 367 ft. 2 in.; thence easterly along a line bearing 89 deg. 56 min. for a distance of 10 feet; thence northerly along a line bearing 359 deg. 50 min. for a distance of 1,071 ft. 10 in.; thence westerly along a line parallel with and 1,439 feet north of the northern building line of Canterbury-road to the western boundary of the municipality; thence northerly along the western boundary of the municipality to the commencing point.

The Second Schedule Hereinbefore Referred to.

All those areas comprised within the following bounds:—

1. Commencing at a point on the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway 200 feet west of the western building line of New-road; thence easterly along the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway to its intersection with the western building line of Ringwood-street; thence northerly along the western building line of Ringwood-street for a distance of 300 feet; thence easterly along a line at all points parallel with and 300 feet distant from the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway to its intersection with the western building line of Junction-street; thence southerly along the western building line of Junction-street to its intersection with the northern building line of the Maroondah Highway; thence westerly along the northern building line of Maroondah Highway for a distance of 850 feet; thence southerly to the southern building line of the Maroondah Highway at its intersection with the western boundary of Ringwood Park; thence southerly along the western boundary of Ringwood Park for a distance of 300 feet; thence westerly along a line at all points parallel with and 300 feet distant from the southern building line of the Maroondah Highway to a point 200 feet west of the western building line of New-road; thence northerly to the commencing point.

2. Commencing at a point on the southern building line of Oban-road 200 feet west of the western building line of Warrandyte-road; thence easterly along the southern building line of Oban-road to a point 200 feet east of the eastern building line of Warrandyte road; thence southerly along a line parallel with and 200 feet distant from the eastern building line of Warrandyte-road for a distance of 400 feet; thence easterly along a line parallel with and 400 feet distant from the southern building line of Oban-road to a point 200 feet west of the western building line of Warrandyte-road; thence northerly to the commencing point.

3. Commencing on the north-western building line of Warrandyte-road at its intersection with the southern building line of Derwent-street; thence south-westerly along the north-western building line of Warrandyte-road to its intersection with the northern building line of Loughnan-road; thence westerly along the northern building line of Loughnan-road for a distance of 517 ft. 9½ in.; thence northerly along a line bearing 0 deg. 22 min. for a distance of 200 feet; thence north-easterly along a line at all points parallel with and 200 feet distant from the northern building line of Loughnan-road and the western building line of Warrandyte-road to the southern building line of Derwent-street; thence easterly along the southern building line of Derwent-street to the commencing point.

4. Commencing on the western building line of Warrandyte-road at its intersection with the northern building line of Kennedy-avenue; thence westerly along the northern building line of Kennedy-avenue for a distance of 200 feet; thence northerly along a line parallel with and 200 feet distant from the western building line of Warrandyte-road to its intersection with the southern building line of Loughnan-road; thence easterly along the southern building line of Loughnan-road to its intersection with the western building line of Warrandyte-road; thence southerly along the western building line of Warrandyte-road to the commencing point.

5. Commencing on the north-western building line of Canterbury-road at its intersection with the eastern building line of Campbell-street; thence northerly along the eastern building line of Campbell-street to its intersection with the southern building line of Stoda-street; thence easterly along the southern building line of Stoda-street for a distance of 120 feet; thence southerly along a line parallel with and 120 feet distant from the eastern build-

ing line of Campbell-street for a distance of 190 feet; thence north-easterly along a line parallel with and 150 feet distant from the north-western building line of Canterbury-road for a distance of 242 ft. 7 in.; thence south-easterly along a line bearing 124 deg. 43 min. to its intersection with the north-western building line of Canterbury-road; thence south-westerly along the north-western building line of Canterbury-road to the commencing point.

6. Commencing on the south-eastern building line of Canterbury-road at its intersection with the western building line of Heathmont-road; thence south-easterly along the western building line of Heathmont-road for a distance of 140 ft. 3 in.; thence south-westerly along a line parallel with and 140 ft. 3 in. distant from the south-eastern building line of Canterbury-road for a distance of 192 feet; thence westerly along a line bearing 269 degrees to its intersection with the eastern building line of Dickason-road; thence northerly along the eastern building line of Dickason-road to its intersection with the south-eastern building line of Canterbury-road; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern building line of Canterbury-road to the commencing point.

The Third Schedule Hereinbefore Referred to.

In the area described in the Second Schedule land and buildings may be used for any purpose excepting the following:—

Abattoirs and slaughter-houses; arsenic-recovery works; animal by-products extraction or manufacture; boiler works; bottle or glass factory; burnt clay products manufacture; candle works; celluloid works; cement works and cement, bag, cleaning works; central mixing plant for constructional works or for street or other paving works, except on sites approved by the Council; coal gas manufacture; coke ovens, distillation of coal; cattle yards and saleyards as defined in the Health Act; creosote manufacture or its wholesale application to materials; chlorine, ammonia, or bleaching powder manufacture; dye-stuff manufacture; explosive manufacture; flock, shoddy, or mungo factories; fellmongery; glue, size, or gelatine manufacture; incineration or reduction of garbage, refuse, dead animals, or offal, except on sites approved by the Council; iron and steel foundries and rolling mills; knacker yards; lime, plaster-of-paris, or gypsum manufacture; manure or fertilizer works; oilcloths, linoleum, or india-rubber manufacture; paints, oils, shallac, turpentine, varnish, or enamel manufacture; paper or pulp manufacture; potash works; piggeries; refining of petroleum or the storage thereof in quantities exceeding 10,000 gallons; soap manufacture and soap boiling works; sugar refining; structural; steel works; smelting works or blast furnaces; sulphuric, nitric, or hydrochloric acid works; tanning or curing of raw hides or skins; timber mills, including sawmills, planing mills, and factories using wood-work machinery, providing that nothing herein contained shall prevent the operation of a power saw or hand saw for cutting firewood in a wood-ward or the establishment of a cabinet-making business or a joinery business or a furniture-making business; tar distillation or manufacture; tar of asphalt product manufacture; white lead manufacture; wool pulling or scouring or fellmongery works.

Every trade, business, manufacture, or undertaking which is for the time being an offensive trade within the meaning of the Health Act.
