Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Geologist, Class "C2," Rivers and Streams Branch, Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£592, minimum; £644, maximum.

Duties.—To make comprehensive surveys of underground water resources and to prepare reports for publication; to investigate subsoil conditions affecting drainage problems in irrigation districts, and to carry out geological examination of sites for water supply and other engineering projects.

Qualifications.—To possess a University Degree in Science specializing in Geology or other approved geological qualification, and to have had experience in geological surveys, particularly in connexion with underground water resources.

Assistant (Female), Class "D" or Class "E," National Museum Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—Class "D"—£312, minimum; £364, maximum.

Class "E"—£143, minimum; £286, maximum.

Duties.—To assist and understudy senior scientific officers to maintain collections in good order, to register specimens, and to assist in the general work of the museum.

Qualifications.—To possess the school leaving certificate, including biology, or to have attained an approved equivalent standard of education, and to have had experience in a biological laboratory. Some experience in the mounting and display of natural history specimens is desirable.

Assistant (Male or Female), Class "D," Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

TECHNICAL AND GENERAL DIVISION.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers' Tribunal in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946* doth hereby amend the Teaching Service (Teachers' Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October 1946 in the manner following, that is to say:—

After Regulation 4 thereof there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—

"REGULATION 4A.

Appeals.

A. Professional Officers.

1. The Director shall furnish the Tribunal with a requisition for the making of an appointment to any vacancy which occurs for a professional officer in the Education Department and shall attach thereto a summary of the duties and of the appropriate qualifications for such position.

2. The Tribunal may alter, vary, or amend such duties and qualifications and shall cause the position to be advertised in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

3. Applications will close with the Tribunal on the date named for such purpose in such advertisement which date shall be not less than fourteen days after the date upon which the advertisement is published in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*. Any application received after the closing date will not be considered.

4. Applications will be listed by the Tribunal in lexicographical order and forwarded forthwith to the Director.

5. The Director shall, within fourteen days after the date on which the applications are received by him, notify the Tribunal of the name of the applicant recommended by the special committee and submit to the Tribunal such information as the special committee deems desirable. The Director shall at the same time notify in writing all applicants of the name of the recommended applicant, and indicate whether the recommended applicant claims to be a discharged serviceman.

6. An applicant who feels aggrieved by the failure of the special committee to recommend him for appointment may appeal, in writing, to the Tribunal within fourteen days of the notification to him by the Director of the name of the recommended applicant. The appellant shall state—

- (a) the grounds of his appeal; and
- (b) whether he desires to appear in person before the Tribunal.

7. Subject to clause 14 of this Regulation any appellant shall be entitled to appear in person before the Tribunal to support his appeal.

B. Position on the Classified Roll in the Primary, Secondary and Technical Schools' Divisions.

8. (1) Every appeal by a teacher who feels aggrieved at the decision of any committee of classifiers—

- (a) with respect to the sub-class in which he is placed on any revision of the classified roll; or
- (b) with respect to any revision of his classification by which his classification is reduced—

shall be made in writing, shall set forth fully the grounds of the appeal and whether or not the appellant desires to appear in person on the hearing of the appeal and shall be delivered to the Tribunal on or before the expiration of fourteen days after the day on which he was notified by the classifiers of the decision against which the appeal is made.

(2) A teacher shall be deemed to have been notified of a decision of a committee of classifiers affecting his classification on the day on which there is published a copy of the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* or any supplement thereto in which there appears notification of such decision.

C. Promotions in the Secondary and Technical Schools Divisions.

9. The provisions of clause 8 of this Regulation with such adaptations as are necessary shall apply to every appeal to the Tribunal by an applicant against an appointment where a vacancy in the Secondary Schools Division or the Technical Schools Division is filled by way of promotion and in particular so that the time within which every such appeal shall be delivered to the Tribunal shall be on or before the expiration of fourteen days after the publication in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* or any supplement thereto of notice of the appointment.

D. Promotion List for the Primary Schools Division.

10. The provisions of clause 8 of this Regulation with such adaptations as are necessary shall apply to every appeal to the Tribunal by a teacher in the first sub-class of his class who is not placed in an annual promotion list and in particular so that the time within which every such appeal shall be delivered to the Tribunal shall be on or before the expiration of fourteen days after the publication in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* or any supplement thereto of the annual promotion list in question.

E. General.

11. Any appellant who claims to be a discharged serviceman within the meaning of the *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act* 1943 should state this fact in his written appeal and indicate whether, in the event of his appeal being disallowed by the Tribunal, he desires to be regarded as an appellant to the Discharged Servicemen's Employment Board.

12. Where an appeal is allowed the Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of train fares and reasonable personal expenses to a successful appellant who is required to travel to Melbourne to support his appeal.

13. Where a recommended applicant is appointed to a vacant office the Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of train fares and reasonable personal expenses to him if he is required to travel to Melbourne to support his application and the Tribunal may, in special circumstances, authorize such reimbursement to a recommended applicant who is not appointed to a vacant office.

14. An appellant who is not a member of the teaching service shall not have the right of personal appearance before the Tribunal but may be granted permission by the Tribunal to make such personal appearance.

15. An appeal should not be made unless the appellant is satisfied that he has good reasons for submitting an appeal and also possesses the required efficiency rating and qualifications.

16. All appeals should be terse, relevant to the question at issue, and devoid of extraneous matters."

- No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage.

CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 76.

A BY-LAW of the City of Coburg, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered seventy-six (76), for requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land within any area within the municipal district set forth in the By-law, and declared therein to be a populous or residential area in cases where, in the opinion of the Council, such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitute a fire menace to neighbouring property, and enabling the Council in the event of default by the owner or occupier and for other purposes, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—

1. The area set forth in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a populous area.

2. (a) Where, in the opinion of the Council, any undergrowth, weeds, or grass upon any land within the area set out in the Schedule hereto constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of such land a notice, in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk, requiring such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time limited in such notice, not being less than seven days from the service thereof.

(b) If such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect, within the time limited in such notice, to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from the said land, the Council may by its officers, servants, or agents, at any time thereafter, enter upon such land and remove therefrom such undergrowth, weeds, or grass, and may recover the cost thereof in any court of competent jurisdiction from the owner or occupier.

SCHEDULE HEREIN REFERRED TO.

CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the City of Coburg, made under sub-section 1 (XXXVIII.) (b) of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 75, for the purpose of requiring that vacant land within any area within the municipal district declared to be a populous or residential area shall be enclosed with a substantial fence.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Coburg, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946 and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

- The area within the municipal district of Coburg, as set forth in the First Schedule of this By-law, is hereby declared to be a populous or residential area.

2. The owner of every vacant allotment of land within the area prescribed in the First Schedule to this By-law shall enclose the same with a substantial fence constructed of such material and in such manner as is prescribed in the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the municipal district of Coburg prescribed in the First Schedule of this By-law.

4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Populous or Residential Area.

All that part of the municipal district of Coburg included in an area bounded by a line commencing at a point which is the intersection of the centre line of the Merri Creek and the centre line of Moreland-road; thence by the centre line of Moreland-road in a westerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Coonan's-road; thence by the said centre line of Coonan's-road in a north and north-easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Reynards-road; thence by the said centre line of Reynards-road in a westerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Mitchell-parade; thence by the said centre line of Mitchell-parade in a north and north-westerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Bell-street; thence by the said centre line of Bell-street in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Anderson-street; thence by the said centre line of Anderson-street in a northerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of O'Hea-street; thence by the said centre line of O'Hea-street in a westerly direction to the east boundary of the Melbourne-Broadmeadows railway reserve; thence by the said eastern boundary of the Melbourne-Broadmeadows railway reserve in a southerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of the Moonee Ponds Creek; thence by the said centre line of the Moonee Ponds Creek in a north-westerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Gaffney-street; thence by the centre line of Gaffney-street in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Northumberland-road; thence by the said centre line of Northumberland-road in a northerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Essex-street; thence by the centre line of Essex-street in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Zenith-street; thence by the centre line of Zenith-street in a northerly, north-easterly, easterly, and northerly direction to a point which is the end of the said street, distant 360 feet from Essex-street and 150 feet from Alpine-grove; thence by a line in a north-easterly direction to a point which is the intersection of the centre lines of north and east branches of Cornwall-road; thence by the centre line of the north branch of Cornwall-road in a northerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Kent-road; thence by the said centre line of Kent-road in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Cumberland-road; thence by the said centre line of Cumberland-road in a southerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Essex-street; thence by the said centre line of Essex-street in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Sussex-street; thence by the said centre line of Sussex-street in a northerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Kent-road; thence by the said centre line of Kent-road in a westerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Derby-street; thence by the said centre line of Derby-street in a northerly direction to the northern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg; thence by the said northern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg in an easterly direction to the centre line of the Merri Creek; thence by the said centre line of the Merri Creek in a southerly direction to the intersection of the centre line of McMahon's-road; thence by the said centre line of McMahon's-road in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Newlands-road and Summit-avenue; thence by the said centre line of Summit-avenue in a north-easterly and easterly direction by a line which is the prolongation of the centre line of Summit-avenue in an easterly direction to the intersection of the centre line of Edgar's Creek; thence by the centre line of Edgar's Creek in a northerly direction to the northern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg; thence by the northern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg in an easterly direction to the eastern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg; thence by the eastern municipal boundary of the City of Coburg, which consists of a line, the centre line of James-street, the centre line of Bell-street, and the centre line of the Merri Creek, in a general southerly direction to the starting point.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Materials and Construction of Fence.

1. A fence, substantially constructed in a workmanlike manner, 5 ft. 6 in. in height from the ground surface to the top of the fence, consisting of 5 in. by 3 in. jarrah or red gum posts, with jarrah or red gum posts with jarrah or red gum sole plates of 3 in. by 2 in. and angle struts of 3 in. by 2 in. Angle rails of hardwood (two out of 4 in. by 4 in.) or rectangular rails 3 in. by 2 in. checked into posts. Jarrah, red gum, or hardwood plinth, 6 in. by 1 in., with central supporting post of 4 in. by 3 in. jarrah or red gum. Posts to be spaced not more than 9 feet centres, with three rails covered with 26-gauge galvanized iron. Jarrah or hardwood pickets, spaced not more than 2 inches, or sawn or split palings.

2. A properly-constructed wire fence having vertical wires, spaced not more than 4 inches, and horizontal wires, spaced not more than 6 inches, or approved chain wire of not less than 3-in. mesh.

3. A properly-constructed masonry or concrete wall not less than 9 inches thick, or 4½ inches thick properly-constructed piers are erected not more than 9 feet apart.

4. A combination of any of the above-named fences.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend the Regulations made by the Council on the 21st day of April, 1941, to amend and consolidate the Regulations made by the Council for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with the Regulations (hereinafter called "the Principal Regulations") made by the Council on the 21st day of April, 1941, intituled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend and consolidate the Regulations made by the Council for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof", and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Clause 11 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following clause is substituted therefor:—

"11. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car or a vehicle standing in a parking area, or a licensed motor car or hackney carriage standing on any stand duly fixed or appointed by the Council under any By-law), shall not leave such vehicle (whether unattended or not) standing except in obedience to the direction or signal of a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or a traffic control signal—

(1) on any day at any time in any of the following places:—

- (a) Within 30 feet of an intersection,
- (b) Within 30 feet of any tramway notice "Cars Stop Here" or "Hail Cars Here",
- (c) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway, or within 20 feet of a point on the kerb immediately opposite either end of a safety zone,
- (d) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant,
- (e) within 15 feet of a postal pillar-box,
- (f) within 15 feet of a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street, except whilst actually engaged in delivering or taking in petrol,
- (g) in front of a private driveway,
- (h) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction;

(2) on any day at any time in any street in such manner or under such conditions as to leave less than 10 feet of the width of the carriage way of such street available for the free movement of traffic or in such a position notwithstanding that a greater width of carriage way than 10 feet is so left, as to constitute an obstruction to traffic;

(3) on any day except Saturday and Sunday—

(a) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 6 p.m. in the area bounded as follows, viz.:—

On the south by the south side of Flinders-street, on the west by the west side of Queen-street, on the north by the centre of Lonsdale-street, and on the east by the east side of Russell-street (excluding therefrom during the whole period both sides of Swanston-street between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street and between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. the north side of Flinders-street between Elizabeth-street and Russell-street) except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,

(b) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street (excluding therefrom between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. the west side between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street and between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. the east side between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street) except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,

(c) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. on the west side of Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street and the north side of Collins-street between Queen-street and a point opposite the western building alignment of Market-street except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,

(f) between the hours of 6 p.m. and 12 midnight in Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Batman-avenue except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers;

(4) on Saturdays—

(a) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11.30 a.m. in Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street (excluding therefrom between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. the west side between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street) except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicles,

(b) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. on the west side of Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street and the north side of Collins-street between Queen-street and a point opposite the western building alignment of Market-street except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,

(c) between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. in the area bounded as follows, viz., on the south by the south side of Flinders-street, on the west by the west side of Queen-

street, on the north by the centre of Lonsdale-street and on the east by the east side of Russell-street (excluding therefrom between the hours of 11.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. both sides of Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street) except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,

(d) between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on the north side of Flinders-street between Elizabeth-street and Russell-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,

(e) between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 12 midnight in Swanston-street between Latrobe-street and Batman-avenue except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers;

(5) on any day at any time in any street, but subject to the limitations with respect to specific days times and places hereinbefore provided, except for a few minutes only.

Provided that the person next driving or taking charge of any such vehicle shall until the contrary is proved be deemed to be the driver of such vehicle within the meaning of this clause."

3. Clause 22 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the word "unattended" in the third line thereof and substituting therefor the word "standing."

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 285, to amend By-law No. 250.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946 and by every other Act and power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with By-law No. 250, intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 250, to amend and consolidate the By-laws with reference to street traffic and for suppressing nuisances."

2. Clause 13 of By-law No. 250 is hereby repealed, and the following clause is substituted therefor:—

"13. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car or a vehicle standing in a parking area, or a licensed motor car or hackney carriage standing on any stand duly fixed or appointed by the Council under any By-law) shall not leave such vehicle (whether unattended or not) standing, except in obedience to the direction or signal of a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or a traffic control signal—

(1) on any day at any time in any of the following places:—

(a) Within 30 feet of an intersection,

(b) within 30 feet of any tramway notice "Cars Stop Here" or "Hail Cars Here,"

(c) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway, or within 20 feet of a point on the kerb immediately opposite either end of a safety zone,

(d) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant,

(e) within 15 feet of a postal pillar-box,

(f) within 15 feet of a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street, except whilst actually engaged in delivering or taking in petrol,

(g) in front of a private driveway,

(h) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction;

(2) on any day at any time in any street in such manner or under such conditions as to leave less than 10 feet of the width of the carriage-way of such street available for the free movement of traffic, or in such a position, notwithstanding that a greater width of carriage-way than 10 feet is so left, as to constitute an obstruction to traffic;

- (3) on any day, except Saturday and Sunday—
- (a) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 6 p.m., in the area bounded as follows, viz.:—On the south by the south side of Flinders-street, on the west by the west side of Queen-street, on the north by the centre of Lonsdale-street, and on the east by the east side of Russell-street (excluding therefrom, during the whole period, both sides of Swanston-street, between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street, and between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. the north side of Flinders-street, between Elizabeth-street and Russell-street), except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers, or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,
- (b) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street (excluding therefrom, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m., the west side between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street, and between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m., the east side between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street), except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers, or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,
- (c) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m., on the west side of Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street, and the north side of Collins-street, between Queen-street and a point opposite the western building alignment of Market-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,
- (d) between the hours of 2 p.m. and 6 p.m., on the north side of Lonsdale-street, between Queen-street and Russell-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers, or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,
- (e) between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m., on the east side of Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Batman-avenue, and the north side of Flinders-street, between Elizabeth-street and Russell-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,
- (f) between the hours of 6 p.m. and 12 midnight, in Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Batman-avenue, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers;
- (4) on Saturdays—
- (a) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11.30 a.m., in Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street (excluding therefrom, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m., the west side between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street), except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers, or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicles,
- (b) between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m., on the west side of Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street, and the north side of Collins-street between Queen-street and a point opposite the western building alignment of Market-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,
- (c) between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m., in the area bounded as follows, viz.:—On the south by the south side of Flinders-street, on the west by the west side of Queen-street, on the north by the centre of Lonsdale-street, and on the east by the east side of Russell-street (excluding therefrom, between the hours of 11.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m., both sides of Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street), except whilst actually engaged in putting down or

- taking up passengers, or (if such vehicle be a vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance in the course of business of goods) whilst actually engaged in loading goods on to or unloading goods from such vehicle,
- (d) between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m., on the north side of Flinders-street, between Elizabeth-street and Russell-street, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers,
- (e) between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 12 midnight, in Swanston-street, between Latrobe-street and Batman-avenue, except whilst actually engaged in putting down or taking up passengers;
- (5) on any day at any time in any street, but subject to the limitations with respect to specific days, times, and places hereinbefore provided, except for a few minutes only.

Provided that the person next driving or taking charge of any such vehicle shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver of such vehicle within the meaning of this clause."

3. Clause 24 of By-law No. 250 is amended by deleting the word "unattended" in the third line thereof, and substituting therefor the word "standing."

4. Clause 26 of By-law No. 250 is repealed.

"Public place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property, and also any public park, garden, or reserve.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough, other than a footway.

2. No person, upon any street or footway, shall make or cause to be made any loud or violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway, or in any premises abutting thereon or adjacent thereto.

3. No person, upon any street or footway, shall—

- (a) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or
- (b) sing or harangue,

so as to cause annoyance or obstruction to or so as to be calculated to cause such annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

4. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the Borough shall, within the hearing of any person, being upon any street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto, make or cause or permit or suffer to be made upon such first-mentioned land or premises (whether by means of any electrical wireless set, gramophone, piano player, or otherwise), any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

5. (1) No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the Borough shall, upon such land or premises, within the hearing of any person upon any street or footway, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto—

- (a) make any loud outcry or noise or sound, or play upon any musical instrument, or cause or permit or suffer any person so to do, or
- (b) cause or permit or suffer any sound or noise to be emitted from any electrical wireless set, gramophone, piano player, or other instrument so as to cause annoyance to or as to be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

(2) Any person other than such owner or occupier operating such wireless set, gramophone, piano player, or other instrument as aforesaid, or otherwise concerned in the making of such outcry, noise, or sound as aforesaid, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. No person, upon any street or footway shall, after being required by any member of the Police Force, or by any officer of the Council, or by any inmate of any house within 50 yards of such person, to desist—

- (a) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or
- (b) sing or harangue.

7. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

8. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
