## The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS REGARDING THE  
USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act* 1928 (No. 3683), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the afore-mentioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act* 1928, do by this my Proclamation—

1. Revoke the Proclamations made the thirteenth day of December, 1937, and the thirteenth day of September, 1944, and published in the *Government Gazettes* of the fifteenth day of December, 1937, and the twentieth day of September, 1944, respecting the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay.

2. Prohibit in the waters of Port Phillip Bay or of any river or creek flowing into such bay at any time during the period from the first day of November in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive) any person having in his possession any long line in or upon the said waters or within 200 yards thereof, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of a long line and the method of fishing known as "long lining";
- (b) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat with a long line on board or attached thereto on to any of the said waters; permitting a long line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within 200 hundred yards thereof.

3. Prohibit during the period in any year from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) any person having in his possession more than one long line in or upon the said waters or within 200 yards thereof or a long line having attached thereto more than 500 hooks, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached thereto;
- (b) permitting more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on such waters;
- (c) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat having thereon or attached thereto more than one long line or a long line with more than 500 hooks attached on to the said waters, or allowing such a boat to be on the said waters;

provided that during the period in any year from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted in Corio Bay westward of an imaginary line running north 8 deg. west (magnetic) from the shore end of Drysdale Jetty through "Arthur the Great" Buoy and thence to a point on the northern shore of Corio Bay (approximately a quarter of a mile westward of Kirk Point) subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) The line to be used shall be that known as five-ply bagging or sewing twine;
- (b) each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 3/0;
- (c) no bait other than raw beef shall be used;
- (d) not more than 800 hooks shall be used at the same time by any one person;
- (e) not more than one long line or a line with more than 800 hooks shall be used by any person or persons in any boat.

4. Prohibit any person using, assisting in the use of, or having a long line in possession in or on the waters of Swan Bay during the whole of each year.

## TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers' Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 9 of the Teaching Service (Teachers' Tribunal) Regulations, made on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1946, in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. Revoke clause 13 and substitute therefor the following new clause:—

“13. A student teacher shall be qualified for the First Grade provided that he—

(a) has passed the matriculation examination of the Melbourne University or holds an approved equivalent or higher qualification;

or

(b) (i) has completed a year as a student teacher of the second grade, and has received satisfactory annual reports from a district inspector and satisfactory half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which he is employed;

(ii) has passed in the subjects in the annual examinations prescribed for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, or holds an approved equivalent or higher qualification;

and

(iii) has after passing the examinations specified in sub-clause (b) (ii) of this clause, passed an approved test in Practice of Teaching.”

2. To sub-clause 14 (a) after the expression “of the First Grade” there shall be added the following expression:—

“except in the case of student teachers entering the Teaching Service with the qualification of matriculation or approved equivalent who shall be required to serve at least two years in the First Grade and present for the examinations prescribed for other student teachers in their respective years of training.”

3. In sub-clause 14 (b) for the expression “During such year” substitute the expression “During the final year.”

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## REGULATION No. 90.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications for appointment to a permanent office in the Railway Service of any person who immediately before such appointment is in the temporary employment of the Commissioners:—

No person shall be eligible for permanent appointment unless—

(a) he is certified by the Railways Medical Officer as being up to the required medical standard; and

(b) the Commissioners are of opinion that such person has a satisfactory record of service, is of good character, and is qualified and efficient.

Any person who has been dismissed from the Railways Department, or the Public Service, for misconduct, or who has been convicted of a felony or infamous offence, shall not be eligible for permanent employment in the service of the Commissioners.

- (c) Maintaining all school furniture in a serviceable condition;
- (d) Keeping chimneys clean;
- (e) Keeping all locks, latches, stoppers to basins, keys and handles to doors and cupboards, glass in windows and doors in proper repair;
- (f) Keeping all spouting, down-pipes, roof gutters, valleys, and tanks free from dirt;
- (g) Keeping all drains clean and free from stoppages;
- (h) Effecting minor repairs to school buildings, including outbuildings, tanks and stands, furniture, boundary fences and grounds, to prevent damage or dilapidation to school property, or to prevent accidents to pupils and teachers;
- (i) Effecting minor repairs to school residences;
- (j) Paying sanitary rates and charges."

Insert a new clause 18B as follows:—

"18B. (a) The expenditure shall not exceed the amount of the allowances placed at the disposal of the advisory council.

(b) A detailed record of the expenditure of these allowances, together with receipts for all payments, shall be kept at the school by the head teacher, and shall be available for inspection by the District Inspector or other authorized officer; and a statement showing the amounts received and expended shall be forwarded by the head teacher to the Department in the month of July in each year."

Rescind clauses 20 and 21.

In clause 22 insert a new sub-clause (d) as follows:—

"(d) Claims for payment shall, immediately on completion of the work, be submitted, on the form prescribed for the use of advisory councils, by the person to whom payment is due, and shall be certified to by the chairman or the secretary of the advisory council, provided that, when the advisory council has expended any sums, receipts for the expenditure shall accompany the claim, which shall be submitted by the secretary or treasurer of the advisory council and certified to by the chairman."

For clause 31 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"31. Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a pupil is unable to travel to a consolidated school or a group school by means of an approved transport service, a conveyance allowance of not more than One shilling for each day's attendance at a consolidated school or a group school may be granted."

For clause 33 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"33. Application for an allowance under the provisions of clause 31 shall be made on the prescribed form by the parent or guardian through the head teacher, and shall be forwarded in the year in respect of which the allowance is required. Where possible the application should be submitted before the end of February."



In clause 41 for the word "Minister" there shall be substituted the word "Director."

For clause 47 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"47. For the purpose of purchasing minor items of equipment, the head teacher of a consolidated school, and the head teacher of a group school, shall be permitted to incur from a petty cash account expenses, in the case of a consolidated school not exceeding Fifteen pounds per annum, and, in the case of a group school an amount per annum in accordance with a scale determined by the Director."

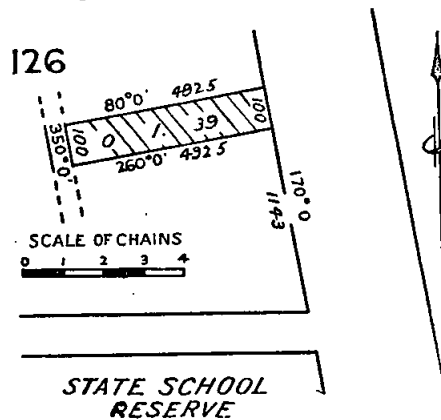

#### BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

##### BY-LAW No. 58.

A By-law of the Borough of Daylesford, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 58, for the purpose of regulating street traffic, and for all other purposes in this By-law mentioned, and for amending By-law No. 54.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every power it thereto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford order as follows:—

1. Clause 3 of the said By-law No. 54 is amended—

- (1) By inserting after the figure "3" the letter "(a)."
- (2) By inserting after sub-clause (a) the following sub-clause:—

"(b) A vehicle shall not be left standing (whether attended or not), in any part of Vincent-street which is set aside as a 'taxi stand' by these Regulations."

2. Clause 9 of the said By-law No. 54 is amended—

- (1) By inserting in sub-clause 9 (a), after the word "Road," the words "and continuing north."
- (2) By deleting from clause 9 (b)—
  - (a) the figures "353," and inserting in their stead the figures "343," and
  - (b) the figures "103," and inserting in their stead the figures "120."

(3) By inserting after sub-clause 9 (b) the following sub-clause:—

"(c) A place in Vincent-street on the west side thereof starting from a point 400 feet north from its intersection with Central Springs-road and continuing north for a distance of 56 feet."

3. Clause 10 of the said By-law No. 54 is amended—

- (1) By inserting after the figures "10," the letter "(a)."
- (2) By deleting the letter "A," and inserting in its stead the words "Except as is provided in sub-clause (b) of this clause, a."

(3) By deleting the words "two places mentioned in clause 9 hereof as 'no parking areas' but at no other place," and inserting in their stead the words "places mentioned in sub-clauses (b) and (c) of clause 9 but at no other place, provided further that the limit of time for which a vehicle used and licensed as a passenger bus as aforesaid may remain at either of the two places mentioned in this sub-clause shall be two minutes."

(4) By inserting after clause 10 (a) the following sub-clause:—

(b) A vehicle used and licensed as a hire car or taxi may be left standing in Vincent-street between Central Springs-road and Albert-street on either side of the three parking places marked as "taxi stands" immediately south of the no parking area on the west side of Vincent-street described in clause 9 (a) of this By-law.

4. Clause 12 of the said By-law No. 54 is hereby repealed, and the following clause inserted in its stead:—

12. (a) The parking areas for hire-passenger cars, taxis, and buses, are hereby defined as—

(i) that portion of Central Springs-road between Vincent-street and Duke-street;

(ii) that portion of Central Springs-road between Vincent-street and Bridport-street; and

(iii) that portion of Albert-street between Vincent-street and Bridport-street, provided however that no hire car, bus, truck, or vehicle of any description shall be parked in that portion of Albert-street mentioned in this sub-clause between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 9 p.m. daily.

(b) In addition to the parking areas mentioned in the last preceding sub-clause, a vehicle used and licensed as a passenger bus may be left standing in Vincent-street—
