Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby increase the area of Crown lands comprised in Class 8 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing herein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the commons hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION

By-LAW No. 4397.

*For the Sale and Distribution of Water for Irrigation—
Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District.*

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof, and shall come into operation on the 1st September, 1948.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. (a) If it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be inaccurate or not registering shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out hereunder in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied, and the quantity so computed shall be deemed to be the quantity supplied during the said period.

Classification.	Volume per Acre. Acre-feet.
Swamp land	1.0
Ungraded land—	
Pastures (native or introduced)	0.5
Cereals, annual fodder crops	0.5
Graded land—	
Pastures, lucerne	0.5
Annual fodder crops	0.5

For the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge, a watering means the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be the volume of water set out in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water is supplied. Graded land means land which in the opinion of the Commission has been effectively laid out for the purpose of irrigation on the border, check, or contour system.

(b) In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out in paragraph (a) of this clause of this By-law over any area watered according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied.

5. For the purposes of this By-law, the term "irrigation season" shall apply to the period from the first day of September in every year (commencing with the year 1948) to the thirtieth day of April in the next succeeding year, and the term "non-irrigation season" shall apply to the period from the first day of May in every year (commencing with the year 1949) to the thirty-first day of August in the same year.

6. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such period; and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as water rights.

7. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned as water rights.

8. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during the non-irrigation season in every year (beginning with the year 1949) shall be—

For stored water—at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned as water right.

For unstored water—6s. for each and every acre-foot of water supplied.

9. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law, and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

10. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

11. Charges for water supplied for irrigation other than water supplied under water right shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commission at Bacchus Marsh.

12. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

13. All persons taking the water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission or its authorized officers may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

14. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith, shall be guilty of an offence.

15. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-LAW No. 4398.

*For the Sale and Distribution of Water for Irrigation—
Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District.*

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof, and shall come into operation on the 1st September, 1948.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. (a) If it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be inaccurate or not registering shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out hereunder in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied, and the quantity so computed shall be deemed to be the quantity supplied during the said period.

Swamp land	1.0
Ungraded land—	
Pastures (native or introduced) ..	0.5
Cereals, annual fodder crops ..	0.5
Graded land—	
Pastures, lucerne	0.25
Annual fodder crops	0.4

For the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge, a watering means the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be the volume of water set out in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water is supplied. Graded land means land which in the opinion of the Commission has been effectively laid out for the purpose of irrigation on the border, check, or contour system.

(b) In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out in paragraph (a) of this clause of this By-law over any area watered according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied.

5. For the purposes of this By-law, the term "irrigation season" shall apply to the period from the first day of September in every year (commencing with the year 1948) to the thirtieth day of April in the next succeeding year, and the term "non-irrigation season" shall apply to the period from the first day of May in every year (commencing with the year 1949) to the thirty-first day of August in the same year.

6. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such season; and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during such season the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as water rights.

7. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned as water rights.

8. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands during the non-irrigation season in every year (beginning with the year 1949) shall be—

For stored water—at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned as water right.

For unstored water—6s. for each and every acre-foot of water supplied.

9. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law, and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

10. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

11. Charges for water supplied for irrigation other than water supplied under water right shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commission at Werribee.

12. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

13. All persons taking the water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission or its authorized officers may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

14. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith, shall be guilty of an offence.

15. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

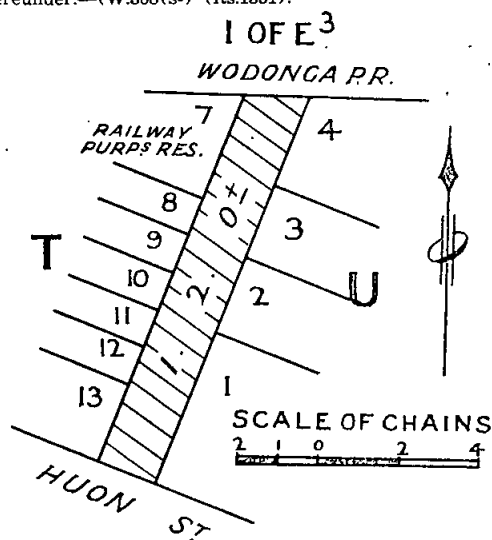

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot ———," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Tuesday, 31st August, 1948, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified, and holds a duly signed authority to commence operations.
2. Notification that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded, in writing, to the officer in charge within 48 hours from the date thereof.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and if so directed by him the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty prior to removal of the bark.
5. No trees shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort, all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of the officer in charge. The burning under this provision must be carried out in accordance with the written conditions specified by the District Forester.
7. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.
8. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.
9. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision of the officer in charge in accordance with his instructions and to his satisfaction.
10. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
11. No bark shall be removed without the express permission, in writing, of the officer in charge, and it must be properly bundled, securely tied, carted from the forest, and weighed at the weighbridge named, not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark.
12. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
13. No live tree, other than wattle, shall be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.
14. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of signing this contract, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall become the property of the Crown.
15. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Forests Commission being made known.

16. No offer will necessarily be accepted.

17. The deposit specified in schedule must accompany each offer.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Petrol Pumps.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 25, for altering By-law No. 6 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 6 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham (hereinafter called the Principal By-law) shall be altered as follows:—

- (a) In clause 1 of the Principal By-law there shall be inserted immediately after the definition of "Petrol Pump" the following definition, namely:—

"Petrol pump. pillar" shall mean the framework and/or pillar supporting surrounding, and/or enclosing one or more petrol pumps, not being a portable petrol pump or portable petrol pumps.

- (b) Paragraphs 1, 2, 3, and 4 of sub-clause (a) of clause 4 of the Principal By-law are hereby repealed, and the following paragraphs substituted therefor:—

Per Licence.

(1) For one petrol pump .. £3 0 0

(2) For each additional petrol pump contained in the same petrol pump pillar .. £1 1 0

- (c) In sub-clause (b) of clause 4 of the Principal By-law, for the expression "One pound one shilling (£1 1s.)", there shall be substituted the expression "Two pounds (£2)."

- (d) After clause 5 of the Principal By-law there shall be inserted the following new clauses:—

5. (a) No person shall place, fix, or maintain more than two petrol pump pillars in or on any footway in front of any premises.

5. (b) No person shall fix or maintain any petrol pump or petrol pump pillar in or on any footway—

(a) at a lesser distance than 15 feet from any other petrol pump or petrol pump pillar, or

(b) at a lesser distance than 10 feet from the intersection of the street in which it is placed with any other street.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

PETROL PUMPS BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Chiltern, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 27, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
(1) for the granting or renewal of a licence,
(2) for the transfer of a licence;

- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
 (f) insurances by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Chiltern order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Chiltern.

"Licence" shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

"Licensee" shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

"Municipality" shall mean the Municipality of the Shire of Chiltern.

"Petrol Pump" shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

"Petrol Pump Pillar" shall mean the framework and/or pillar supporting surrounding and/or enclosing one or more petrol pumps not being a portable petrol pump or portable petrol pumps.

"Portable Petrol Pump" shall include a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels, and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

"Regulations" shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed, or to be placed, in, on or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of Chiltern, used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on, or to be carried on, by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule of this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule of this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage, and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

- (a) The following fees shall be paid to the Council in respect of licences for petrol pumps, including portable petrol pumps in or on any footway:—

	Per Licence.
(1) For a single pump	£1 1 0
(2) For each additional pump, whether or not contained in the same framework or pillar	1 1 0

- (b) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such cases has first been paid.

6. No person shall place, fix, or maintain more than two petrol pump pillars in or on any footway in front of any premises.

7. No person shall place, fix, or maintain any petrol pump pillar in or on any footway nearer than 15 feet from any other petrol pump pillar.

8. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule in this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

9. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

10. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed, or proposed to be placed, in front of premises occupied, or to be occupied, by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

11. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions. The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application, in writing, to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licences, in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of ten shillings.

12. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

13. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence, and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company or office of good repute against all damage and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance and the receipt of the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

14. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

15. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* shall, within seven days after such expiry or cancellation, remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith, on and under the footway.

16. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

17. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole municipal district of the Shire of Chiltern.
