SOLICITORS (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE)
RULES 1948.

WHEREAS by section forty-three of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria is empowered to make rules regulating in respect of any matter the professional duties practice conduct and discipline of practitioners whether engaged in practice as principals on their own account or employed by other practitioners or by persons not practitioners:

Now therefore the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria in pursuance of section forty-three of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* and all other powers thereto enabling hereby makes the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the "Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948" and, save as otherwise hereinafter declared, shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. (1) A solicitor shall not do or permit in the carrying on of his business any act or thing which can reasonably be regarded as touting or as calculated to attract business unfairly.

(2) A solicitor shall, whenever he becomes aware that any person is doing any act or thing which could reasonably be regarded as touting for or as calculated to attract business unfairly to that solicitor, immediately take all reasonable steps to prevent that person continuing to do such act or thing.

(3) A solicitor shall not insert or cause or permit to be inserted on his behalf any advertisement in any newspaper or other publication provided that—

(a) a solicitor may permit his name to be inserted in a law list or similar publication intended primarily for circulation amongst members of the legal profession, if such insertion contains no more than the name of the solicitor (or, in the case of a firm, the name of the firm and the names of the partners in such firm), his degrees (if any), his place of business, his telegraphic and cable address, his telephone number, the date of admission to practice of himself and his partners (if any), the fact that he is a commissioner for affidavits or notary public, and the names and addresses of his legal agents;

(b) where a solicitor—

- (i) has commenced or intends to commence practice in any district, or
- (ii) has changed or intends to change his place of practice in any district, or
- (iii) has entered or intends to enter into partnership with one or more other solicitors, or

where there has occurred or is about to occur any alteration in the name or constitution of any firm of solicitors engaged in practice in any district, such solicitor or (where the alteration in the constitution of the firm was due to the death or retirement of a member or members) the surviving member or members of the firm may, during a period of not more than one month before and three months after the date of the commencement of practice, change of address, entering into partnership or alteration in the constitution or the name of the firm (as the case may be) insert in a newspaper published in and circulating principally in that district an advertisement containing not more than brief particulars of the occurrence or intended occurrence, the name and telephone number of himself or the partnership or firm and the address at which he or the partnership or firm carries on or intends to carry on practice in that district;

- (c) a solicitor who periodically visits a place situated outside a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne in which he has not a permanent office may advertise in any newspaper circulating principally in that place and the neighbourhood thereof the date or dates on which and the place at which he may be interviewed and his telephone number thereat and the address and telephone number of his principal place of business; and
- (d) a solicitor who is acting for a client in any particular matter may permit his name and address and the fact that he acts for such client to be included in any advertisement in connexion with that matter whenever and to the extent to which it is customary among solicitors for such details to be included.

(4) A solicitor shall not hold himself out or allow himself to be held out directly or indirectly as being willing to perform work for a fee less than that fixed by the appropriate scale of costs for that work.

3. A solicitor shall at all times use his best endeavours to complete any work on behalf of his client as soon as is reasonably possible.

4. (1) A solicitor shall not carry on practice in any place, whether the same be his main practice or a branch thereof, unless he or some other solicitor entitled to practise in Victoria is in charge at that place and gives substantial attendance thereat during the normal business hours of his practice at that place: Provided that a solicitor may send a clerk who is not a solicitor to a branch office for the purpose only of receiving instructions for the preparation of income tax returns.

(2) Every solicitor who carries on practice under a business name within the meaning of the *Business Names Act 1928* shall have mentioned in legible characters on all letters written by him or any of his clerks in the course of or in connexion with his practice the business name and the name or names of all persons so registered or required to be registered under the said Act.

(3) The provisions of the last preceding sub-rule shall not come into operation until the first day of January, 1949.

5. A solicitor shall within a reasonable time after being so requested in writing by a client render to the client a bill of costs covering all work performed for that client to which such request relates and for which he has not already rendered a bill of costs or been paid. If he fails or neglects to render such bill of costs within one month after receiving such request or within such further period as the client in writing allows or as may in the circumstances be reasonable he shall forthwith pay to the client all moneys and deliver to the client all documents which he is holding on behalf of that client, notwithstanding that he might otherwise be entitled to a lien upon those moneys or documents for payment of his bill of costs.

*Legal Profession Practice Act 1946.*SOLICITORS (AUDIT AND PRACTISING CERTIFICATES)
RULES 1948.

PURSUANT to section forty-three of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* and all other provisions in that behalf enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria doth hereby make the following rules of the Institute (that is to say):—

1. (1) These rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1948.

(2) The Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 19 are in these rules referred to as the Principal Rules.

(3) The Principal Rules as amended by these rules may be cited the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules.

2. These rules shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. Rule 4 of the Principal Rules is amended by inserting after subparagraph (d) the words "and the legal representative of every solicitor who dies whilst still engaged in practice on his own behalf and not in partnership with any other solicitor."

4. After rule 4 of the Principal Rules the following rules are inserted:—

"4A. Every solicitor who takes over or acquires the practice or a branch of the practice of any other solicitor shall within fourteen days of such taking over or acquisition give notice thereof to the Council.

"4B. Every solicitor shall, within fourteen days after commencing practice or a branch of his practice and thereafter annually at the time of making application for a practising certificate, give to the Council notice of the address at which he carries on practice or a branch of his practice and shall notify the Council within fourteen days of any alteration of such address."

5. Rule 11 of the Principal Rules is amended by inserting after sub-rule (1) the following sub-rule:—

"(1A) The provisions of the last preceding sub-rule shall not apply where the auditor dies or retires from practice or ceases to be qualified to audit the solicitor's trust account."

6. Rule 12 of the Principal Rules is amended by inserting after the words "Every solicitor" the words "who does not lodge within the prescribed time a statutory declaration pursuant to rule 22."

7. Rule 17 of the Principal Rules is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-rule:—

"(3) Where a solicitor engages in practice in partnership with one or more other solicitors the auditor shall lodge with the secretary a separate report in respect of each member of the partnership, which report shall cover not merely the trust accounts of the partnership but all the trust account within the definition contained in section 3 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* of the solicitor concerned."

8. Rule 19 of the Principal Rules is amended by deleting from paragraph (b) the words "as had not" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "as appear from the register as not having."

9. Rule 22 of the Principal Rules is repealed and the following rule inserted in lieu thereof:—

"22. A solicitor (not being merely the employee of another solicitor) who at the commencement of any year ending on the 30th day of June did not hold any money which had been received by him in the course of or in connexion with his practice for or on behalf of any other person or persons and who has not during the course of that year received any such money shall within twenty-one days after the 30th day of June in that year deliver to the secretary a statutory declaration made by him stating those facts."

10. After rule 22 of the Principal Rules the following rule is inserted:—

“22A. Within one month after any solicitor ceases to carry on his practice or the dissolution of any partnership such solicitor or the respective partners (as the case may be) and the legal representative of any deceased solicitor shall cause the trust accounts of the solicitor or solicitors concerned to be audited and reported upon pursuant to the Act and these rules for the period from the previous first day of July up to the date of such cessation or dissolution and in such case all the relevant provisions of the Act and these Rules shall, as far as possible, apply to such audit and report save that the date of the cessation or dissolution shall be substituted for the thirtieth day of June.”

11. Rule 24 of the Principal Rules is amended—

(a) by inserting after the figures “24” the figure “(1)”;

(b) by adding at the end of the rule the following sub-rules:—

“(2) Where a solicitor receives trust account moneys and forthwith pays them to the credit of a non-trust account or forthwith transmits or hands over to the person due to receive the same any cheque drawn on a non-trust account and in every such case duly makes proper records of such receipts and disbursements in separate books of account kept in respect of such account, the auditor shall for the purposes of this rule accept the entries in those books as if they were entries in the trust accounts of the solicitor and no entries in respect thereof in the solicitor’s trust accounts shall be necessary.

“(3) In this rule ‘non-trust account’ means an account in a bank, the moneys to the credit of which are not solely or exclusively under the control of a solicitor or solicitors.”

12. Rule 39 of the Principal Rules is amended by adding at the end thereof the following paragraphs:—

“(f) A draft, postal note, money order or not negotiable crossed cheque payable to any person or persons other than the solicitor (either in his own name or any business name under which he is registered pursuant to the *Business Names Act 1928* as carrying on business) or any firm of which the solicitor is a member;

(g) a cheque or warrant payable to the solicitor or his client where the drawer requests that the payee acknowledge receipt on the cheque or warrant or on some special form of receipt sent by the drawer with the cheque.”

13. Rule 40 of the Principal Rules is amended by deleting the words “and (e)” and inserting in lieu thereof the words “(e) and (g).”

14. Rule 46 of the Principal Rules is amended by adding at the end thereof the following words:—

“provided further that a solicitor who engages in practice in the State of Victoria and in some adjoining State (which latter State is hereinafter referred to as the home State) and whose place or principal place of practice is situated in the home State shall not in respect of any year be required to pay as contribution to the Solicitors Guarantee Fund a sum in excess of Five pounds if he satisfies the secretary that he has already paid his contribution to the corresponding fund in the home State for the same or substantially the same period.”

15. After rule 47 of the Principal Rules the following rule is inserted:—

“47A. Every solicitor who engages in practice as a solicitor on his own account or in partnership with another practitioner or upon terms of sharing with another practitioner remuneration for any business and who applies for a practising certificate for the ensuing year shall lodge with his application a statutory declaration in or to the effect of Form 5A of the Schedule to these rules.”

16. Rule 49 of the Principal Rules is repealed and the following rule inserted in lieu thereof:—

“ 49. (1) Every practising certificate issued pursuant to the Act to a solicitor who intends to engage in practice as a solicitor on his own account or in partnership with another solicitor or upon terms of sharing with another practitioner remuneration for any business shall be in or to the effect of Form 7A of the Schedule to these rules.

(2) Every practising certificate issued pursuant to the Act to a solicitor who intends to practice as an employee and not otherwise shall be in or to the effect of Form 7B of the Schedule to these rules.”

17. Form 2 of the Schedule to the Principal Rules is repealed and the following form inserted in lieu thereof:—

REMOVAL OF ELECTORAL REGISTRARS AND DEPUTY ELECTORAL REGISTRARS FOR DIVISIONS OF ELECTORAL PROVINCES.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 70 (1) of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928*, as amended by section 5 of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, doth, by an Order made on the 26th day of July, 1948, hereby remove from their respective offices, on and from the 31st day of July, 1948, all persons who, on the said date, held any office as Electoral Registrar or Deputy Electoral Registrar for any Division of an electoral province.

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A FIRE-FIGHTERS BOARD TO BE APPOINTED.

- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than fire brigade officers, and other than persons subject to the Determination of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) employed as permanent firemen, or (within the Metropolitan Fire District constituted by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*) as partially-paid firemen engaged in—

- (a) the prevention or suppression of fires,
(b) the protection or salvage of persons, property, or goods endangered by fire or as a result thereof.

Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding, be described for all purposes as the Fire-fighters Board, and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

And the Honorable Herbert John Thornhill Hyland, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 129.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 129, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, for prescribing areas within municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of the such residential areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or vacant land for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

Ballarat-road, north side, from Maddock to Wearing streets; south side, from Coral-avenue to Eleanor-street; south side, from 85 ft. 6 in. east of Gordon-street to Commercial-road.

Barkly-street, north side, from Ashley to Palmerston streets; north side, from Summerhill-road to Gordon-street; south side, from Ashley to First streets; south side, from Clarke-street to Warleigh-road; south side, from Hocking to Batman streets.

Droop-street, north-east side, from Geelong-road to a point opposite the building line of the south-east side of Hugh-street.

Gamon-street, east side, from Somerville-road to a point opposite the north building line of Little Smith-street; west side, from Station-road to Hood-street.

Gordon-street, west side, from Naismith to Barkly streets.

Shepherd-street, north side, from Gordon to Creswick streets; south side, from Gordon to Creswick streets.

Somerville-road, north side, from Williamstown-road to Hamilton-street; south side, from Fehon to Birmingham streets.

Summerhill-road, west side, from Essex-street north for 4 chains.

Sunbury-road (now Sunshine-road), from Aliwal to Cala streets.

Victoria-street, west side, from Barkly-street to the railway; east side, from Paisley to Pickett streets.

Williamstown-road, east side, from Pilgrim to Charles streets; east side, from Somerville-road to 193 feet north of Francis-street; east side, from Stone to Thomas streets.

(2) In so far as the said clause 2 (a) of By-law No. 74 is inconsistent with or repugnant to this By-law, it is hereby expressly repealed.

(3) This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement where the same was used for any of the said purposes (whether of the same character or not) immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involves the use of any adjoining land which, immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, was in the same ownership.

CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

BY-LAW No. 88.

Building Regulations.

A By-law of the City of Mordialloc (hereinafter referred to as the municipality), made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and Part V. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1946*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered No. 88, for regulating the erection of buildings, tents, hoardings, &c., and of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road, and certain other purposes provided for in the said section and Part.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and any other Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:—

PART 1.

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipality.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, By-laws 60, 66, 74, 76, and 81 of the City of Mordialloc shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

PART 2.

AREAS, FRONTAGES, SITES, DRAINAGE, ETC.

Dwelling-houses.

1. No dwelling-house shall hereafter be erected or built unless such dwelling-house has for its whole width a clear frontage to a street at least 50 feet wide, and no dwelling-house intended for separate use and occupation shall be built so as to deprive and leave without a clear frontage any dwelling-house which shall have previously been built.

2. No dwelling-house shall consist of a total area of less than 600 square feet.

Tents, Bungalows, and Sleep-outs.

3. No tent, bungalow, sleep-out, or detached room shall be erected on any allotment on which there is less than 3,000 square feet of space, exclusive of buildings, and not more than one tent, bungalow, or detached room for every 1,000 square feet of space in excess of 3,000 square feet, nor more than two such buildings in all, provided that no tent, bungalow, sleep-out, or detached room shall be erected on any allotment where such building, if erected, would reduce the area of such allotment, exclusive of buildings, to less than 50 per cent. of the total area thereof, and every tent, bungalow, or sleep-out divided into two rooms shall be classed as two structures when interpreting this clause.

4. No bungalow or sleep-out shall be erected closer to the street alignment than the house to which it is appurtenant.

5. No bungalow or sleep-out shall exceed 150 square feet in area.

6. No tent, bungalow, sleep-out, or detached room erected in pursuance of the provisions of this By-law shall be leased or sub-leased, except in conjunction with the dwelling-house erected on the same allotment, and shall not be used save for the accommodation of an inmate or inmates of the household of the occupier of such dwelling-house.

Fowl-houses.

7. Fowl-houses with a superficial area exceeding 100 square feet are only permitted in the areas described in Schedule III. of By-law No. 84.

Prevention of Water Falling on to Public Way.

8. Roofs and gutters and flashings of any building or erection, and of any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop front, must be so arranged and constructed and supplied with gutters and pipes which must be maintained so as to prevent the water therefrom dropping or running over any public way.

Drainage to be Satisfactory.

9. The Council may refuse permission to build or erect any building, erection, or tent, or addition, unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building, erection, or tent, or addition, and the site and curtilage thereof, can be properly drained.

PART 3.

REMOVED BUILDINGS.

1. In this clause the word "building" means wooden building, and includes any erection.

Removed Buildings to Comply with By-laws.

(a) No person shall remove or cause to be removed into the City of Mordialloc, or from any one part of the city to another part of the same, and erect and permit to remain for any longer period than seven days, any building which does not comply with the provisions of the by-laws and regulations of the said city.

Notice to be Given and Permit to be Obtained.

(b) Before any building intended to be so erected is removed into the city, or from one part of the city to another part, the owner or the person carrying out the removal shall give to the surveyor not less than ten clear days' notice, in writing, of his intention to remove and re-erect such building in the city, and shall accompany such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (1) Particulars of situation of building;
- (2) Particulars of situation of land;
- (3) Plan of dimensions;
- (4) A specification, &c.;
- (5) Further particulars;

and shall at the same time produce to the surveyor such information as will enable him to satisfy himself whether or not such building has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice, plans, specifications, particulars, and information, and the proper fee, the surveyor shall inspect such building before removal, and shall report to the Council whether, in his opinion, such building, when removed and re-erected, will be in compliance with the by-laws and regulations of the city or not. If the surveyor reports that such building, when removed and re-erected, will be in accordance with the by-laws and regulations, then the Council shall grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the city, but not otherwise.

Condemned Buildings.

(c) No building that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed and re-erected within the city, unless the requirements of sub-section (d) be complied with.

Infectious Disease and Fumigation.

(d) No building in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred, and which is intended to be wholly or partly used as a dwelling-house, shall be removed into and erected within the city, or removed from one part of the city to another, unless the same shall have been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of a duly-qualified medical practitioner or of the health inspector of any municipal council, as testified by a certificate signed by either or both such authorities and produced to and retained by the surveyor.

No Permit until Building is Made to Comply with By-law.

2. No written permission shall be given unless such removed building, when erected or re-erected, shall comply with the provisions of this By-law, as applicable to new buildings.

Certificate of Surveyor.

3. No removed building shall be occupied until the surveyor shall have certified, in writing, that all the provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

Alteration of Position of Building on Same Allotment

4. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply in all respects with this By-law.

PART 4.

VERANDAHS, PROJECTIONS, SIGNS, HOARDINGS, AND FENCES.

Verandahs.

1. Every verandah of all new brick buildings constructed over the footway of any street shall be of the cantilever type prescribed by the Uniform Building Regulations.

Hoardings, &c.

2. No hoardings shall be erected on land fronting to or abutting on the north side of Beach-road, from Cromer-road to Main-street, by a depth of 150 feet, nor on land fronting to or abutting on both sides of Nepean-highway, from Oak-avenue and Latrobe-street to the Mordialloc Creek Bridge, by a depth of 150 feet.

Hoardings, Signs.

3. Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall alter or add to any hoarding, signboard, or erection for advertising purposes without first obtaining the consent of the Council, and unless such hoarding, signboard, or erection is erected, built or constructed, altered or added to in accordance with the plan and specification prepared by such person, and previously approved of by the Council.

4. No hoarding, signboard, or erection shall be within a distance from the building line of any street or road equal to the greatest height of such hoarding, signboard, or erection, and the lowest part of such hoarding, other than the main supports thereof, shall not be less than 3 feet from the level of the land.

5. No hoarding shall exceed 20 feet in height.

6. No hoarding shall be erected over any building or in front of any dwelling-house.

Signboard, Hanging Lamp, &c.

7. No signboard, hanging lamp, or similar fixture shall be erected on or attached to any building or verandah, unless the permission, in writing, of the Council be first obtained. Each signboard, hanging lamp, or similar fixture shall be of material, construction, and design approved by the surveyor, and shall be in no part less than 8 ft. 6 in. above the level of the footpath. No signboard shall exceed in depth 3 feet nor, unless attached to a verandah, project over the footpath.

Sign as Disfigurement to.

8. No person shall exhibit any advertisements in any place in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or disfigure the natural beauty of any landscape, within the municipal district of Mordialloc.

Fences.

9. No paling fences and no close fence of iron or other material exceeding 4 feet in height above the footpath level shall be erected abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road, except that in the case of a corner allotment this clause shall apply only to the fence abutting on one of the streets and the first 30 feet of the other fence, measured from the intersection of the building lines of the two streets.

Unightly or Dangerous Fence.

10. When any fence abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road within the municipal district is in a dangerous or unsightly state, the Council may, by notice, in writing, to be served on the owner of such fence, require such owner forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such fence, as the case may require.

Every Fence to Have a Plinth.

11. Every fence to be hereafter erected abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road shall have affixed thereto a suitable base or plinth.

PART 5.

ENFORCEMENT OF BY-LAW AND PENALTIES.

The provisions of Chapter 3 of the Uniform Building Regulations relating to the penalties and enforcement of the regulations shall extend and apply to this By-law, and have full force and effect as if such provisions were specifically contained in this By-law.

A Resolution adopting the foregoing By-law was passed by the Council of the City of Mordialloc on the 8th day of March, 1948, and confirmed on the 15th day of June, 1948.

CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 140.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 140, for or with respect to—

- (a) Management of the city abattoirs.
- (b) Prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from abattoirs.
- (c) requiring persons engaged in tending and slaughtering animals and in dressing carcasses at abattoirs to be licensed and prescribing the conditions of licence.
- (d) Fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the abattoirs.
- (e) Prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at the abattoirs.
- (f) The feeding, watering, and tending and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in abattoirs, and the milking of milch animals at abattoirs.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other Act or power enabling it on that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

By-laws Repealed.

1. The By-laws set out in the First Schedule of this By-law to the extent to which the same are thereby expressed to be repealed are hereby repealed. Provided that notwithstanding such repeal all matters and things of a continuing nature existing at the coming into operation of this By-law by virtue of or under any of such repealed By-laws shall so far as their continuance is not inconsistent with this By-law be deemed to continue and to have full force and effect as if such first-mentioned By-laws had not been repealed, and such repeal shall not affect any prosecution in respect of any offence under any of such repealed By-laws.

2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

Abattoirs Site.

"Abattoirs" means the site for abattoirs and general municipal purposes at Richmond permanently reserved by Order of 30th June, 1890, published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on 4th July, 1890 (being the site temporarily reserved therefor by Order of the 13th May, 1890), together with all buildings and structures thereon, and appurtenances thereto and more particularly described as follows:—

Seven acres one rood and thirty-eight perches, County of Bourke, City of Richmond, being part of section 40:—Commencing at the intersection of the west side of Burnley-street and the north side of Berlin-street bounded thence by the last-mentioned street bearing N. 89 deg. 22 min. W. 10 chains 1 5/10 links; thence by allotments 3 and 4, and a line bearing north 7 chains 43 links; thence by a line and allotment bearing south 89 deg. 52 min. E. 10 chains 1 5/10 links; and thence by Burnley-street aforesaid bearing south 7 chains 52 links to the point of commencement. (Berlin-street name changed to Barkly-avenue by Council on 13th March, 1916, and published in *Government Gazette* of 22nd March, 1916.)

Definitions.

"Animal" means bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, ram, ewe, lamb, goat, kid, or swine.

"Acts" means the Health Acts and Regulations made thereunder.

"City" means the City of Richmond.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Richmond.

"Superintendent" means the Meat Inspector or any Assistant Meat Inspectors for the time being appointed by the Council for the enforcement of the Health Act, and the Regulations and By-laws made thereunder for the Council and management of the Abattoirs.

Superintendence.

3. The Abattoirs shall be under the charge, care, management, and direction of a Superintendent, with such assistants as the Council may appoint for that purpose.

Superintendent's Duties.

4. Along with such other duties as the Council shall assign to the Superintendent it shall be specially his duty to carry out and enforce the Regulations of the Council for the management of the Abattoirs as to cleanliness and otherwise.

Assistant Superintendent.

5. During absence of the Superintendent his duties shall devolve upon and be performed by the Assistant or other person in the service of the Council then in charge of the Abattoirs, and such Assistant or person shall for the time being have all the power, authority, and duty of the Superintendent.

Hours Abattoirs Open.

6. The Abattoirs shall be open for the slaughtering of animals on week days (Mondays to Fridays inc.) from 7.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. and at such other times as permitted by the Council or the Superintendent, provided, however, that the Abattoirs shall not be open on Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, Eight Hours Day, or on such other public holidays as may be determined by the Council.

Payment of Fee for Use of Abattoirs.

7. Every person who shall pay the fees and dues hereinafter referred to shall be entitled to use such portion of the Abattoirs as are assigned to him by the Superintendent, and such portion of the Abattoirs shall only be used over the period and for the purpose for which it was assigned.

8. The following fees and dues shall be payable to the Council for the use of the Abattoirs or portion thereof:—

Amount of Fees.—Slaughtering.

- (a) For slaughtering any—
 - (i) Bull, cow, heifer, ox, or steer 2/- per head
 - (ii) Goat, kid, lamb, or sheep 2½d. per head
 - (iii) Swine 9d. per head
 - (iv) Calf of a weight not exceeding 130 lb. 6d. per head
 - (v) Calf of a weight over 130 lb. and not exceeding 200 lb. 1/3 per head

Examining and Branding.

- (b) For examining and branding any carcass of or meat derived from any—
 - (i) Bull, cow, heifer, ox, or steer 6d. per head
 - (ii) Goat, kid, lamb, or sheep ½d. per head
 - (iii) Swine 3d. per head
 - (iv) Calf of a weight not exceeding 130 lb. 3d. per head
 - (v) Calf of a weight over 130 lb. and not exceeding 200 lb. 3d. per head

Certificate.

- (c) For any certificate as to an examination made by the Superintendent or Meat Inspector of any animal 2/6

Council to have Lien and may take over and Sell Animals Under Certain Conditions.

9. The Council shall have a lien on all animals for the time being in the Abattoirs of any person indebted to the Council and if any person after demand shall make default for seven days in payment of any of the fees and dues herein prescribed, the Council may by its

authorized officers and without further notice sell by public auction or private contract all or any of such animals, and after deducting the fees and dues payable to the Council pay the surplus thereof to the owners of such animals.

Number and Description of Animals Brought to Abattoirs to be Supplied to Superintendent.

10. Every person who shall bring any animals to the Abattoirs shall forthwith inform the Superintendent of the number and description thereof and all other details required by or under any Act of Parliament or Regulations made thereunder or by the Commission of Public Health or the Council, and the Superintendent shall forthwith record such information in a book to be kept at the Abattoirs for that purpose.

11. The owner or every person who shall bring any animals to the Abattoirs shall—

Animals to be Placed in Such Part of Abattoirs as Directed by Superintendent.

(a) Place such animals in the portion or portions of the Abattoirs as directed by the Superintendent and not otherwise, and not place a greater number of animals in any such portion or portions of the Abattoirs than the Superintendent allows.

Sufficient Food and Water to be Provided.

(b) Provide the same with sufficient food and water and provide that all milch animals shall be duly milked.

Notice of Intention to Slaughter to be given Superintendent.

(c) Before commencing to slaughter the same, give notice of his intention so to do to the Superintendent.

12. No person shall—

Animals Not to be Ill-treated.

(a) Ill-treat, frighten, or irritate any animals or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animals at the Abattoirs.

Animals Not to be Removed Without Consent.

(b) Remove any animals from the Abattoirs without the consent of the Superintendent being first had and obtained.

Animals not to be in Abattoirs for more than 96 Hours.

(c) Leave any animals in the Abattoirs for a longer period than 96 hours except with special permission in writing from the Superintendent.

Persons Tending or Slaughtering to be Licensed.

13. Any person who proposes to engage in tending and slaughtering animals or dressing carcasses at the Abattoirs shall make application to the Superintendent for a licence to tend or slaughter animals or to dress carcasses therein as the case may require.

Application for a Licence must be a Master Butcher or Experienced Slaughterman.

Every applicant for a licence must satisfy the Superintendent that he is a Master Butcher or that he is an experienced slaughterman, and with his application shall sign an undertaking to observe, obey, and comply with the Health Acts and the Regulations and By-laws made thereunder. The Superintendent may in his discretion grant or refuse to grant such licence. The name, residential address, and the place of business (if any) of every person to whom a licence is granted by the Superintendent shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen, and such register shall be kept by the Superintendent. The Superintendent may remove the name of any person from the Register of Slaughtermen upon breach by such person, of any requirements of the said Acts, Regulations, or By-laws.

Unregistered Persons not Permitted to Slaughter.

14. No person shall be permitted to engage in tending or slaughtering animals or in dressing carcasses unless his name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen to be kept by the Superintendent, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every of the rules of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen.

Person Responsible for the Observance of the Acts.

15. In every compartment of the Abattoirs in which slaughtering shall be carried on one of the slaughtermen shall be especially responsible for the observance of the Acts, the By-laws, and Regulations of the Abattoirs in such compartment. If the master butcher or employer be

working in the compartment he shall be the responsible person, and if not he must nominate and appoint one of the other slaughtermen who is to be responsible, and must notify such appointment to the Superintendent. Such appointment, however, shall not absolve any other slaughterman from the consequences of wilful disregard or breach of the Acts, the By-laws, or the Regulations.

Discovery of Diseased Animal to be Reported to Superintendent.

16. Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased the slaughterman responsible under the preceding section hereof shall immediately stop the work of dressing such animal for food, and forthwith report the fact to the Superintendent, and shall not proceed further with such dressing unless and until authorized by the Superintendent so to do.

Animals known to be Affected with Disease not to be Taken into Abattoirs.

17. No animals visibly or known to be affected with any infectious or contagious disease shall be taken or received into the Abattoirs.

Council Not Responsible for Injury to Animals.

18. (a) The Council will take all reasonable care of animals brought into the Abattoirs for slaughter, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any such animal.

Council Not Responsible for Loss or Damage to Carcasses.

(b) The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses while in the Abattoirs, but will not be responsible for any loss thereof or damage thereto.

19. No slaughterman or person licensed or authorized to tend or slaughter animals or to dress carcasses shall—

Intoxicating Liquor.

(a) Bring any intoxicating liquor into the Abattoirs or enter or remain therein whilst in a state of intoxication.

Unseemly Conduct.

(b) Behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, or offensive manner, or use any profane, indecent, or offensive language in the Abattoirs.

Injury to Fittings.

(c) Carelessly or negligently break, injure, or improperly interfere with any portion of the Abattoirs or fittings, conveniences, or equipment therein.

Obstructing Employees.

(d) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Abattoirs, or disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof.

Smoking.

(e) Smoke whilst slaughtering animals dressing carcasses or handling meat.

Direction of Superintendent to be Obeyed.

(f) Refuse or neglect to obey or comply with any lawful direction of the Superintendent.

Offal.

20. No person shall remove from the Abattoirs any refuse, manure, inedible offal, or dead animals unless written permission of the Council has been first obtained.

Dogs Excluded.

21. No dogs shall be brought upon or allowed to remain upon the premises other than for the purpose of droving or yarding of stock.

Trespass.

22. No person shall enter or remain in the Abattoirs unless such person shall have lawful business to transact thereat, and while so entering or remaining shall not offend against any of the requirements of section 19 hereof.

Vehicles not to Park.

23. No person shall be permitted to use any part of the Abattoirs premises for the parking of motor and other vehicles.

Locking Rooms, &c.

24. No person shall be permitted to lock or chain any room, yard, or compartment at the Abattoirs without the written permission of the Superintendent, and then only in accordance with the conditions set out in such permit.

Alterations to Building or Fittings.

25. No person shall make any alterations to any building or room at the Abattoirs or install any machinery or fixture therein without having first obtained the permission of the Council to do so.

Offence.

26. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

Penalty.

27. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

Application.

28. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout that portion of the City known as the Richmond Abattoirs.
