PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereingter of the described order street with the Schies of Tullare. Marine Act 1928.

THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Act 1928 (section 91) the Bilet Surveyor 1 1928 (section 91), the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendment of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations (that is to say):-

- 1. Short title.-These Regulations may be cited as the Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1948.
- 2. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1938, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st of July, 1947.
- 3. Pensions.-Schedule I. and Schedule II. to the principal Regulations are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:-

^{8.} Lump sum in lieu of pensions.—(a) Any pilot on becoming entitled to a pension under these Regulations may, if he thinks fit, elect to receive payment thereof in the form of a lump sum instead of as a pension, whereupon he shall be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £96 16s. 11d. for the first completed year of service, £98 6s. 8d.

for the second completed year of service, and so on, such rate increasing by £1 9s. 9d. for each additional completed year of service thereafter, up to and including thirty-five years' service.

- (b) Where any pilot who has elected under paragraph (a) hereof retires in any year prior to the anniversary of the date upon which his service as a pilot first commenced, he shall be entitled, in addition to the sum referred to in the said paragraph to an additional amount for each completed month's service in the incompleted year equal to one-twelfth of the lump sum to which he would have been entitled for that year had he not retired before the completion thereof.
- (c) No pension, capitation or other allowance shall be payable under these Regulations to the widow or in respect to the child of any pilot who dies after having accepted, pursuant to paragraph (a) of this Regulation, a lump sum in lieu of any pension to which he was entitled under these Regulations.
- 9. Dependant's benefits.—(a) Widow's benefits—on the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a pilot licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule II. hereto.

Where the widow of a pilot is entitled to a pension under Schedule II. hereto, and such pilot had served, in addition to the completed years of service, a further period of less than one year, her pension at the rate prescribed in the aforesaid Schedule, according to the number of such completed years of service, shall be increased by an amount for each completed month of such additional service equal to one-twelfth of the sum representing the difference between the amount of the said pension and that which would have been payable according to the aforesaid Schedule if such additional service amounted to a full year.

Subject to the proviso that the pension payable to the widow of a pilot shall in no case exceed £89 7s. 11d. per annum unless she shall have been married to him for ten years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, nor more than £119 3s. 11d. per annum unless she shall have been married to him fifteen years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened.

- If, after these Regulations come into force, a pilot marries, subsequent to being placed on the superannuation list, neither his widow nor the children of such marriage shall be eligible for a pension, capitation or any other allowance from the fund.
- (b) Children's benefits—on the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a pilot licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, leaving a widow or child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance of £74 9s. 11d. per annum for each child shall be made until the child attains the age of sixteen (16) years. On the death of a pilot's widow leaving any child or children of the pilot under the age of eighteen (18) years, the capitation allowance, if there is but one child, shall be increased to £89 7s. 11d. per annum, and shall continue to be paid until such child attains the age of eighteen (18) years. If, however, the said widow leaves more than one (1) child under the age of eighteen years her surviving, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are children under the age of eighteen years, and each part shall be added to the capitation allowance of each child payable as aforesaid, and shall likewise continue to be payable until each such child attains the age of eighteen (18) years, but without the benefit of survivorship between the children, and provided that no child shall in any case receive a larger allowance (including the said capitation allowance) than £89 7s. 11d. per annum.
- (c) On the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a pilot licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list leaving a child or children under the age of eighteen (18) years him surviving, but no widow him surviving, the allowance payable in respect of each child shall be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow him surviving for a period of twenty-four hours.

(d) The Board may, in its discretion, pay the allowance to which any child is entitled under this Regulation, to the widow or guardian, or to such other person as to it seems proper, and the receipt of such widow, guardian or other person shall be good and sufficient discharge to the Board.

Note: -Adopted child. -- Under the foregoing Regulations (b), (c), and (d), a child adopted by a pilot, under the Adoption of Children Act 1928, shall be deemed to be the child of the pilot if, in the opinion of the Board, such child was totally or mainly dependent

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board held this 4th day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES REGULATIONS 1941.

 - "(3) Where not less than two serum swabs taken from the vagina of the patient at intervals of not less than twenty-four hours have been submitted to the bacteriologist of the Public Health Laboratory at the University of Melbourne or other laboratory approved for the purpose in writing by the Commission and have been certified by such bacteriologist to be free from Streptococcus Haemolyticus A. and from Staphylococcus Pyogenes, then the provisions of sub-regulation (1) and (2) hereof shall not apply in the case of such patient."

(d) Whenever a plantation is transferred under this clause the Minister shall appoint new trustees therefor, and in so appointing trustees shall have regard to the provisions of paragraph (b) of clause 3 of this regulation, and may if he sees fit appoint as a trustee any person who was a trustee of the plantation in respect of the school from which the plantation has been transferred.

(e) Upon the transfer of a plantation under this clause and the appointment of new trustees therefor, the persons formerly the trustees of the plantation shall transfer all moneys and other property held by them in trust on account of the plantation to the persons appointed to be the new trustees, and the receipt of such new trustees therefor shall be a sufficient discharge to the old trustees." sufficient discharge to the old trustees.'







- (e) The use of such land, within a residential area as is set forth in the Fourth Schedule of the By-law, for the purpose of a poultry farm.

- (f) The use of such land, within a residential area as is set forth in the Fifth Schedule to the By-law, for the purpose of a dairy farm.
- (g) The use of land, within a residential area, for the purposes of a school, private boardinghouse, church, barrister, solicitor, medical practitioner, dentist, teacher, accountant, architect, surveyor, nurse, or masseur, and for the use of such land for the purposes of a stable containing not more than four stalls.
- (h) Regulations for the conduct of a poultry farm.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made and passed under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 135, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating certain of the matters or things which are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of any Municipality under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda orders as follows:—

Brick Areas.

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas within the meaning of that term in regulation 813 (a) of the said Regulations.

Limit of Two Storeys.

2. The areas set out and described in the Second 2. The areas set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II, and III. Occupancy (as classified in the said Regulations) shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey, and clause 11 of Part III. and Schedule "F" of Ey-law No. 127 of the City of St. Kilda (re-enacting certain provisions of By-law No. 115 of the said City) are hereby repealed. are hereby repealed.

Distance from Street Alianment.

3. The minimum distance from the street alignment of the outer walls of any buildings of Classes I., II., and III. Occupancy (as classified in the said Regulations) hereafter to be erected on any land on the West side of St. Kilda-road shall be twenty-five feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

- 4. For the purposes of Regulation 813 (f) of the said Regulations, any person may with the approval of the
 - (a) construct a building of Class I. Occupancy on land having a lesser area depth or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in Column I. of Table 803 of the said Regulations; or
 - (b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy (as classified in the said Regulations) or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy (as classified in the said Regulations) is attached on land having an area depth or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the said Regulations. Regulations—

in any case where on the date of commencement of the said Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or was shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building other than in conformity with the foregoing requirements.

Fees.

- 6. The fees and deposits for matters in respect of which the Council is empowered to fix fees and deposits under Table 401 of the said Regulations are as follows—
 - (g) The deposit for constructing a temporary crossing shall be One pound.
 - (h) The fee shall be five shillings for opening a road. Where such road is constructed of other than wood blocks the deposit shall be One pound, but if the road is of wood block construction, the deposit shall be Five pounds.
 - (i) The fee for use of half the footpath and a similar area of roadway during building operations—for every 50 feet of frontage shall be five shillings, and the deposit Two pounds. The fee for erection of a staging over the whole footpath 9 feet clear of the path shall be ten shillings, and the deposit Two pounds.

Brick areas shall include the whole of the land within the boundaries of the Municipal District of St. Kilda, with

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

By-LAW No. 139.

- A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made under the powers conferred by Part VII. of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 139, for altering certain clauses of By-law No. 106 (Traffic Regulation, &c.) and By-law No. 118 (Appointing in Streets and Roads Standing Places for Motor Cars), for regulating traffic and processions, and for prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in this By-law.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946 and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda orders as follows:—
- 1. In this By-law, unless repugnant to or inconsistent with the context or subject matter— $\,$
 - "Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power or drawn or propelled by human, animal or mechani-cal process and used or intended for use on any street or road and includes a motor car, motor car trailer and motor bicycle but does not include a perambulator, go-cart or invalid chair.
- 2. The "Local Rules" contained in By-law No. 106 (clauses 19-24 inclusive) shall be altered so as to omit therefrom the following sub-clauses of clause 19 thereof namely
 - (b) Carlisle-street.
 - (c) Chapel-street, (d) Dickens-street

 - (e) Mozart-street, (f) Taylor-street-

and the whole of clause 20

- 3. The Schedule to By-law No. 118, shall be altered so as to omit thereof-
 - H-Lower Esplanade (south side).
- 4. No driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) shall leave such vehicle (whether unattended or not) standing or keep the same in one position for the space of five minutes or upwards-
