PROCLAMATION.

By the Lieutenant Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part 1., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes 7 and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the Government Gazette, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the commons hereinafter mentioned, viz.:—

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thorough-fare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Towong has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired for a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land acquired for a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Towong aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.: said Act, viz.:-

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies) he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or any case or package which has contained fruit and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

(b) prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of-

- (c) prohibit the removal from any place in the pro-claimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or any case or package which has contained fruit:
- (d) require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to take the following action within the time specified in a notice given by an inspector to such occupier or owner—
 - (1) to remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—Apples, apricots, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, sweet melons, cucumbers, pumpkins, and edible fruits of all trees and plants, and
 - (2) to dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes or burning or burying under at least eighteen (18) inches of earth,

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 354.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:-

- 1. A person shall not remove from any part of a shed, platform, or yard any goods which are in any railway goods yards at which a pass-out docket is issued, unless he has previously obtained from the authorized employee controlling the delivery thereof a pass-out docket containing a complete and accurate record of the said goods.
- 2. A person who takes delivery of any goods within the said goods yards and, before departing therefrom, consigns the same for outwards despatch by rail shall, at the time of making the said consignment, deliver to the employee receiving the goods a pass-out docket containing a complete and accurate record of the goods.
- 3. A person departing or attempting to depart from the said goods vards shall—
 - (i) permit the employee at an exit gate therefrom to inspect any goods in his possession, including the contents of any case, bag, receptacle, or other container;
 - (ii) deliver to the said employee a pass-out docket issued in respect of the goods being removed by him;
 - (iii) be in possession of only such goods as are specified on the said pass-out docket, unless he proves that any goods in his possession which are not specified on the said pass-out docket have not been removed from any part of the said goods yards.
- 4. The driver of a road vehicle departing or attempting to depart from the said goods yards shall-
 - (i) permit the employee at an exit gate therefrom to inspect any part of the said vehicle and the goods in or on the said vehicle, including the contents of any case, bag, receptacle or other container;
 - (ii) deliver to the said employee a pass-out docket issued in respect of the goods purported to be in or on the said vehicle:
 - (iii) have in or on the said vehicle only such goods as are specified on the said pass-out docket.
- 5. An offence shall be committed for any failure to comply strictly with the requirements of this By-law, whether such failure was caused or occasioned intentionally, by mistake, inadvertently, or otherwise howsoever.
- 6. The expression "goods" in this By-law shall include any animal, article, package, or thing.
