All applications for such permission as aforesaid shall be made at the office of the trustees, and a certificate of any permission granted by the trustees in respect to any application shall be issued by the trustees on payment of the required fees and charges. The certificate so issued shall be conclusive evidence that the person named therein is the person entitled to keep each vault, grave, monument or tombstone as aforesaid.

- 5. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person desiring a brick grave or vault shall, upon permission by the trustees being granted, be responsible for the construction of same under the direction and control of the authorized officer of the trustees.
- 6. No interment shall be permitted by the trustees in any ordinary grave or vault except to the person in whose name the certificate as aforesaid has been issued, unless the consent, in writing, of the person in whose name the certificate has been issued or such person's heirs or successors has first been had and obtained.

  7. No vault, monument, tombstone, tablet, stone, pedestal, fence or any other form of structure or ornament, or any inscription shall be constructed, erected or placed upon any grave, vault or monument until the permission of the trustees has been applied for and obtained. Every application for permission shall be accompanied by a plan of the form and nature of the work desired to be performed, and the trustees shall, in their discretion, determine and fix the position of same and may vary the design and nature of same, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

8. No interment shall be permitted save and except as provided in these Rules and Regulations unless at least eight working hours previous notice has been given either to the sexton or to the office of the trustees, and the trustees have also had a reasonable opportunity for providing for such interment.

9. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral cortege arrives at the cemetery.

10. The hours fixed for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive. No funerals shall be permitted on a Sunday except in a case of urgent necessity.

11. The cemetery shall be open to the public throughout the year from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

12. The trustees may, in the manner and pursuant to section 50 of the *Cemeteries Act* 1928, permit any poor person to be buried free of any charge whatsoever upon an Order signed by a Justice.

13. No servant or person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity on the discharge thereof, or act as agent for any monumental masons, or engage in any private work within the cemetery without the consent of the trustees.

14. No trees, shrubs, plants or seeds shall be planted or set on any ground within the cemetery without the consent of the sexton.

15. All graves, vaults, monuments, tombstones, tablets, stones, pedestals, fences or other structures or ornaments, and all trees, shrubs or plants erected, placed, planted, set or appearing on any graves or vaults pursuant to the permission granted as herein provided shall be kept in good repair, order and condition at the expense of the person in whose name the certificate has been issued or such person's representatives. 15. All graves, vaults, monuments, tombstones, tablets,

16. No dogs shall be admitted within the grounds of the cemetery, and any dogs found within the grounds may be destroyed by the servants or employees of the trustees.

17. All cleaning required by any person to any grave, &c., shall be performed by the trustees in accordance with the Schedule of Charges.

- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1948, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1949, and shall be payable in two equal payments on the 17th day of September, 1948, and the 1st day of January, 1949.

- 3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.
- 4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipallity in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

#### PRICES REGULATIONS (VICTORIA) 1948.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the *Prices Regulation Act* 1948 and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### Citation and Interpretation.

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Prices Regulations (Victoria) 1948.
- (2) In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "Act" means the Prices Regulation Act 1948.

#### Prices Decontrol Advisory Committee.

- 2. (1) The advisory committee appointed for the purpose of inquiring into and investigating matters relating to the regulation and removal of control of prices and rates of goods and services and advising the Minister in relation thereto shall consist of not more than nine members.
  - (2) Of such members-
    - (a) one shall be appointed as chairman;
    - (b) one shall be appointed as representing manufacturers;
    - (c) one shall be appointed as representing wholesalers;
    - (d) one shall be appointed as representing retailers;
    - (e) two shall be appointed as representing the interests of the rural community; and
    - (f) three shall be appointed as representing the interests of consumers.
- (3) The members of the committee shall hold office for the term of six months and shall be eligible for re-appointment.
- (4) The office of any member of the committee shall become vacant—  $\,$ 
  - (a) at the expiration of his term of office;
  - (b) if he dies;
  - (c) if he is incapable of continuing as a member;
  - (d) if he resigns in writing under his hand addressed to the Minister;
  - (e) if without leave of the Minister he fails to attend three successive meetings of the committee;
  - (f) if he is removed from office by writing under the hand of the Minister.
  - (5) For each meeting of the committee attended by him-
    - (a) the chairman shall be entitled to receive a fee of Five guineas per sitting day or part thereof; and
    - (b) a member other than the chairman shall be entitled to receive a fee of Three guineas per sitting day or part thereof.
- (6) Every member of the committee shall, when travelling in the performance of his duties as a member of the committee, be entitled to receive the following travelling expenses, in addition to reimbursement of reasonable travelling expenses paid by him when so travelling:—
  - (a) During his absence from Melbourne outside the metropolitan area, every member whose usual place of residence is within fifty miles of the Elizabeth-street Post Office shall be entitled to an allowance of One pound for each full day and a proportionate amount for a part of a day.

- (b) During the absence from his place of residence of any member whose usual place of residence is more than fifty miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, such member shall be entitled to an allowance of One pound for each full day and a proportionate amount for a part of a day.
- (c) During his absence in another State, every member shall be entitled to an allowance of Thirty shillings for each full day and a proportionate amount for a part of a day.
- (7) In the immediately preceding sub-clause, "metropolitan area" means the area within a distance of fifteen miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, Melbourne.
- (8) Any member of the committee who uses his own motor car on the business of the committee shall, with the approval of the Minister, be paid a mileage rate in accordance with the scale prescribed by the Regulations for the time being in force under the *Public Service Act* 1946
- (9) The functions of the committee shall be to consider and advise the Minister in relation to—
  - (a) the progressive removal of the control of prices and rates for goods and services;
  - (b) the regulation of prices and rates for goods and services;
  - (c) such matters of policy, procedure or administration as may be referred to it by the Minister;
  - (d) any matter or thing which in the opinion of the committee should be brought under the notice of the Minister as giving or tending to give effect to the administrative policy of the Act.
- (10) The committee shall meet as often as the Minister or the chairman deems necessary.
- (11) The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the committee and in his absence such member of the committee as is chosen by the members present to be chairman of the meeting shall preside.
  - (12) A quorum of the committee shall consist of four members.
- (13) In the case of an equality of votes at any meeting of the committee the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
- (14) At every meeting of the committee, minutes shall be taken and recorded in the minute-book by some person appointed by the chairman of the meeting.
- (15) Subject to these Regulations, the committee may regulate its own procedure.

# Land Transactions Advisory Committee.

- 3. (1) An advisory committee appointed for the purpose of inquiring into and investigating matters relating to the valuations of and transactions in land and advising the Minister in relation thereto shall consist of not more than five members.
  - (2) Of such members-
    - (a) one shall be appointed as chairman;
    - (b) one shall be a valuer in the employ of either the Public Service of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Victoria;
    - (c) not more than three shall be valuers in private practice who are approved valuers under the Act.
- (3) The Minister may appoint some person, being a valuer in private practice and an approved valuer under the Act, to be a deputy member of a committee and whenever any member of a committee is by reason of illness or absence or inability or unwillingness, unable to act as a member or in the case of an extraordinary vacancy occurring on the committee in respect of which such person been appointed a deputy member, such person may perform the duties and exercise the powers of such member during such illness, absence, inability or unwillingness or until such vacancy is filled (as the case may be).
- (4) The members of a committee (including a deputy member) shall hold office for the term of six months and shall be eligible for re-appointment.
- - (a) at the expiration of his term of office; .
  - (b) if he dies;
  - (c) if he is incapable of continuing as a member;

- (d) if he resigns in writing under his hand addressed to the Minister;
- (e) if without leave of the Minister he fails to attend three successive meetings of the committee;
- (f) if he is removed from office by writing under the hand of the Minister.
- (6) For each meeting of a committee attended by him, a member (including a deputy member) who is a valuer in private practice shall be entitled to receive a fee of Five guineas per sitting day or part thereof.
- (7) Every member of a committee (including a deputy member) who is a valuer in private practice shall, when travelling in the performance of his duties as a member of the committee, be entitled to receive the following travelling expenses, in addition to reimbursement of reasonable travelling expenses paid by him when so travelling:—
  - (a) During his absence from Melbourne outside the metropolitan area, every such member shall be entitled to an allowance of One pound for each full day and a proportionate amount for a part of a day.
  - (b) During his absence in another State, every such member shall be entitled to an allowance of Thirty shillings for each full day and a proportionate amount for a part of a day.
- (8) In the immediately preceding sub-clause "metropolitan area" means the area within a distance of fifteen miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, Melbourne.
- (9) Any member of a committee (including a deputy member) who uses his own motor car on the business of the committee may, with the approval of the Minister, be paid a mileage rate in accordance with the scale prescribed by the Regulations for the time being in force under the *Public Service Act* 1946.
- (10) The functions of a committee shall be to consider and advise the Minister in relation to—  $\,$ 
  - (a) appeals from decisions of the Minister's delegates;
  - (b) such matters of policy, procedure or administration as may be referred to it by the Minister.
- (11) A committee shall meet as often as the Minister or the chairman deems necessary.
- (12) The chairman shall preside at all meetings of a committee and in his absence such member of the committee as is chosen by the members present to be chairman of the meeting shall preside.
- (13) Where not more than three members have been appointed to a committee a quorum of such committee shall consist of two members and where more than three members have been appointed to a committee a quorum of such committee shall consist of three members.
- (14) In the case of an equality of votes at any meeting of a committee the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
- (15) At every meeting of a committee, minutes shall be taken and recorded in the minute-book by some person appointed by the chairman of the meeting.
- (16) Subject to these Regulations, a committee may regulate its own procedure.

  3. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

  4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

or subject-matter—
"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person

and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

or premises. 6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet and shall he so constructed as to be

than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one

man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when the price is being denoted therein or displanted there. such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged there-from), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be, from time to time, introduced therein when neces-sary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall any person deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council,

- 12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the convenient of tractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.
- 13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment, where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.
- 14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

- 15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.
- 16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.
- 17. Such vehicle shall, as far as practicable, be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar, or by other suitable and effective
- 18. Such vehicle, when full, shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission, and in such manner as not to creat a puisance. to creat a nuisance.
- 19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair. proper state of repair.
- 20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.
- 21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.
- 22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
