WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943, the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, did on the 19th day of February, 1946, make a Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of the 20th February, 1946, proclaiming certain roads described in a Schedule attached to the said Proclamation to be Forest Roads for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it has been deemed advisable by the above-mentioned authorities to amend the said Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, do hereby amend the said Proclamation by deleting from that portion of the Schedule appearing in the paragraph headed "Shire of McIvor-Warrowitue Road" the words and figures "western angle of allotment 20, Parish of Heathcote; thence north-easterly," and substituting therefor the words and figures "southern angle of allotment 12, Parish of Heathcote; thence north-easterly to the eastern angle of allotment 11, of the said parish; thence south-easterly,"

REGULATION XXIX.—SCHOOL ENTERTAINMENTS.

--Efforts for School Funds."

Rescind clauses 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6, and substitute the following clauses:—

- 1. Entertainments or other local efforts, including those organized by mothers' clubs and other parents' associations, having as their object the establishment or augmentation of school funds may be arranged provided the joint approval of the head teacher and the school committee is first obtained.
- 2. The head teacher and the school committee shall co-operate in making arrangements to raise funds and in carrying out such arrangements.
- 3. If disagreement arises as to the arrangements made for the raising or disposal of school funds the matter shall be referred to the Education Department for decision.
- (a) Within fourteen days of the holding of any ntertainment or local effort for school funds the entertainment or head teacher shall-
- (i) obtain from the school committee or mothers' club or other body responsible for the arranging of the entertainment or local effort a balance-sheet showing the receipts and expenditure of the entertainment or effort;

 (ii) file the balance-sheet at the school for a period of twelve months from the date on which the entertainment or effort took place.
- (b) The balance-sheet in connexion with any entertainment or effort held to raise school funds shall be made available by the head teacher when required for inspection by the District Inspector or by any person authorized by the Department or the school committee.'

In sub-clause (b) of clause 4 for the expression "clause 2" there shall be substituted "clause 1."

THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act* 1928 and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XXXII.—Use of School Buildings, in the manner following, that is to say:-

Rescind sub-clause (b) of clause 4 and substitute the following sub-clause:-

"(b) Except as provided in clause 10 (b) the guarantee form, when completed, shall be forwarded immediately by the head teacher to the Education Department.'

Rescind clause 5 and substitute the following clause:-

escind clause 5 and substitute the following clause:—
"5. When a school building is used by a school organization with the approval of the Minister for purposes other than those specified in clause 10 (a) the guarantee form may be signed by the chairman or correspondent on behalf of a school committee, or by the president or honorary secretary on behalf of a mothers' club or other organization, provided that a resolution is passed by the body concerned, and is included in the minutes of its proceedings, indicating clearly that the responsibility is shared by all members."

In clause 6 for the words "in the circumstances" there shall be substituted "except in the cases provided for in clause 10."

Rescind clause 10 and substitute the following clause:-

"10. (a) No application and no guarantee shall be required and no charge shall be made for the use of school rooms for meetings of school committees or meetings of parents held for the nomination of school committees or for the business meetings of mothers' clubs or of decoration and equipment committees or of such other school organizations as may be approved by the Minister, or for entertainments or efforts in aid of school funds arranged with the joint approval of the head teacher and the school committee.

(b) With the joint approval of the head teacher and the school committee school rooms may be used without charge for meetings of ex-pupils' organizations connected with and working for a school provided that the guarantee form is completed and signed and lodged with the head teacher, who shall retain the form for a period of twelve months.

(c) Seven clear days' notice of the desire to use the school building for any such purpose shall be given by the organization concerned to the head teacher." "10. (a) No application and no guarantee shall be

Rescind clause 14 and substitute the following clause:-

- $^{\prime\prime}$ 14. Except in special cases and under special conditions approved by the Minister—
 - (a) a school building shall not be used during a school vacation for any purpose other than for meetings of the school committee or for religious services;
 - (b) a school building or ground shall not be used on a Sunday for any purpose other than for religious services."

And the Honorable Alexander Henry Dennett, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDMENT OF PRINTING TRADES REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say)—

- 1. The Printing Trades Regulations (No. 1) made by the Governor in Council on the 12th day of March, 1929, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 13th day of March, 1929, and Printing Trades Regulations (No. 2) made by the Governor in Council on the 15th day of July, 1929, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 17th day of July, 1929, shall be and the same are hereby rescinded as from the 1st day of September, 1948.
- 2. Such rescission shall not effect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulations before the commencement of these Regulations.
- 3. For the said rescinded Regulations the following Regulations shall be substituted:—

Short Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Printing and Allied Trades Regulations." $\,$

Interpretation.

- 2. In these Regulations-
- "Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.
- "Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.
- "Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.
- "Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.
- . "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

- 3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—
 - (i) Hand composition.
 - (ii) Hand and machine composition, with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines.
 - (iii) Stereotyping and/or electrotyping.
 - (iv) Bookbinding and/or guillotine machine operating.
 - (v) Bookbinding and/or edge gilding.
 - (vi) Paper ruling and/or guillotine machine operating.
 - (vii) Letterpress printing.
 - (viii) Lithographic art and/or lithographic camera operating.
 - (ix) Lithographic camera operating and/or lithographic plate making.
 - (x) Lithographic plate making and/or lithographic printing.
 - (xi) Linotype mechanic as carried on in daily newspaper offices.
 - (xii) Process engraving.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants May Be Examined—Applicants May Be Exemped if Possessing Certain Educational Qualifications.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at a time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from

such examination if he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

- (a) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (b) The satisfactory completion as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

Minimum Age for Entry Into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

Terms of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be six years, provided that where a person is sixteen years of age or over at the date of commencement of his apprenticeship the term shall be five years, in which case, for the purposes of determining his rate of pay, such person shall be deemed to have already served a period of one year.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.—General Form.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) with the following modifications, alterations, and additions thereto:—

Variations and Additions to Covenants, &c., in General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

Employer's Covenants.

In paragraph (c) (i) the words "or such other rates of wages as may for the time being be prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act in respect of the aforesaid trade" to be deleted, and the following words to be substituted therefor:—"or such rates of wages as are prescribed for the time being and applicable to the employer and apprentice in respect of the aforesaid trade."

In paragraph (c) (ii) the whole of sub-paragraph (ii) to be deleted and the following new sub-paragraph to be substituted therefor:—

- (ii) Pay to the apprentice such further rates for overtime worked and for proficiency as are prescribed for the time being and applicable to the employer and apprentice in respect of the aforesaid trade.
- In Paragraph (c) (iii) the following additional subparagraph to be inserted:—
 - (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

In paragraph (e) the whole of paragraph (e) to be deleted and the following new paragraph to be substituted

(e) In the event of the employer dying or ceasing to carry on his business or ceasing to employ such number of journeymen as is necessary to maintain the prescribed proportion of apprentices to journeymen, he, his executors, administrators, or assigns will within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer carrying on the same class of business within a radius of three miles from his or their place of business, but in the event of there being no such employer and of the apprentice so desiring he or they will find and provide, if possible, such an employer carrying on business beyond that radius, and will, subject to the approval of the Commission, and at his own expense and cost, assign this indenture of apprenticeship and transfer the apprentice to such employer upon and subject to the same or the like conditions and stipulations as are herein provided, and in such manner that the apprentice shall not be in any way prejudiced in so doing, and so that the aggregate of the periods served under each employer shall be regarded as one continuous term, and so that the new employer shall accept the apprentice at the position he occupied under this indenture at the date he is accepted by the new employer.

The following additional-covenants to be inserted,

- (f) not hold the apprentice responsible for any faulty work, or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or injury during the course of
- (g) not require the apprentice, except where employed in daily newspaper offices or on weekly newspapers connected therewith to work on any holiday or during other than ordinary working hours without his consent:
 - (h) not keep more than two days' pay in hand;
- (i) so arrange the apprentice's duties that as he progresses in his knowledge and skill during his apprenticeship his duties shall be varied, and he shall be placed on higher or more skilful work from time
- (j) not allow the apprentice to work overtime for more than six hours in any one week or for more than eighteen hours in any four consecutive weeks;
- (k) not require the apprentice to perform duties outside those connected with learning the said trade;
- (1) not permit the apprentice to be employed on night shift except in a daily newspaper office, where he may be so employed temporarily under such con-ditions as may be determined by the said Commission.

Mutual Agreements.

In clause (9) the words "be faithfully observed" to be deleted, and the following words to be substituted

"so far as applicable, be faithfully observed." The following additional clause to be inserted:-

(10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same (10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time required to be paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for conveyances and other matters, or where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1947 tion Act 1904-1947.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

- 9. (a) The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades (excepting the trade of Process Engraving) in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:-
 - (i) In respect to the term of apprenticeship of six vears-

lst year—at the rate of 27s. 6d. per week. 2nd year—at the rate of 37s. 6d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 48s. 6d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 65s. 6d. per week. 5th year—at the rate of 82s. 6d. per week.

6th year-at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week (ii) In respect to the term of apprenticeship of five

> 1st year-at the rate of 37s. 0d. per week 2nd year—at the rate of 48s. 6d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 65s. 6d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 82s. 6d. per week. 5th year—at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week.

- (b) The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the trade of Process Engraving in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—
 - (i) In respect to the term of apprenticeship of six

1st year—at the rate of 24s. 6d. per week. 2nd year—at the rate of 32s. 0d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 41s. 0d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 56s. 0d. per week. 5th year—at the rate of 70s. 6d. per week 6th year—at the rate of 99s. 0d. per week

(ii) In respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years-

ears—
1st year—at the rate of 32s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 41s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 56s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 70s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 99s. 0d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and Public Holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice, except where employed in daily newspaper offices or on weekly newspapers connected

therewith, shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rate (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to any journeymen who may be employed by him in the same trade.

Standard of Proficiency

11. Should the apprentice in any year other than the first year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examina-tions approved by the Commission to the subjects of trade theory and practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year: Provided that an apprentice to the trade of Hand Composition or Hand and Machine Composition with instruction in the mechanism of slugcosting or type-casting machines or letterpress printing shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency in any such year if he attains not less than an average of 70 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations aforesaid to the subjects of Theory and Practice.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

- 12. When an apprentice attains in any year (other than the first year) the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—
 - (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
 - (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
 - (c) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 7s, 6d, per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

- 13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in each of the said trades excepting the trades of Process Engraving and Linotype Mechanic shall in cases where the employer employs three or more journeymen in all, not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen permanently employed by such employer in such trade; but this paragraph shall not apply in respect to the trades set out hereunder as carried on in connexion with daily newspaper offices or weekly newspaper work with daily newspaper offices or weekly newspaper work connected therewith (that is to say);—
 - (i) Hand and Machine Composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines.
 - (ii) Letterpress printing (flat-bed machines).

Where an employer employs less than three journeymen in all, he may, upon satisfying the Commission that a proper vacancy for an apprentice exists, and with the approval of the said Commission, employ one apprentice. For the purpose of this paragraph only, an employer who works at any of the said trades for at least 75 per cent. of the time prescribed for an ordinary week's work in such trades may be deemed to be a journeyman. in such trades may be deemed to be a journeyman.

- 14. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Process Engraving shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen or fraction of three journeymen permanently employed by such employer in such trade, provided that eight shall be the maximum number of apprentices employed in the said trade in any one daily newspaper office. Provided that at any time within one year from the first day of March, 1948—
 - (a) in any daily newspaper office any employer may employ apprentices or additional apprentices in the trade of Process Engraving so that the total number of apprentices employed by such employer at such trade in such office shall not at any time exceed twelve;
 - (b) in all other places any employer may employ apprentices or additional apprentices in the trade of Process Engraving so that the proportion of apprentices to journeymen employed by him at any time shall not be in excess of one to every two journeymen or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade as at the first day of March, 1948.

Any apprentice employed pursuant to this proviso in excess of the proportion or number authorized to be employed by any other provision of these Regulations

shall at all times be disregarded in calculating the number of apprentices who may be employed pursuant to any other provision of these Regulations. Provided further that the number of apprentices employed in any one section of any employer's business (colour etching and half-tone etching being deemed to be one section) whether pursuant to this proviso or otherwise shall not be in excess of the proportion of one apprentice to one journeyman.

15. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Linotype Mechanic shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every six or fraction of six linotype mechanics permanently employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman.

- 16. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Hand and Machine Composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines as carried on in connexion with daily newspaper offices or weekly newspaper work connected therewith, shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every five or fraction of five linotype machines in any such office, irrespective of whether the office publishes a weekly newspaper or not, and provided that eight shall be the maximum number of apprentices employed in the said trade in any such office at one time.
- 17. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Letterpress Printing (flat-bed machines) as carried on in connexion with daily newspaper offices or weekly newspaper work connected therewith, shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen permanently employed by such employer, provided that two shall be the maximum number of apprentices employed in the said trade in any such office at one time. No employer shall take into his employ another apprentice within a period of three years from the time when he first employed an apprentice who is still employed by him at the time of the employment of that other apprentice.
- 18. For the purpose of ascertaining the proportion of apprentices to journeymen under the foregoing Regulations—
 - "Permanently employed" means continuously employed for a period of not less than six calendar months immediately preceding the date when an apprentice is accepted and "permanent employee" shall have a corresponding meaning.
 - "Stereotyping and/or electrotyping" shall be deemed to be one trade and "bookbinding and/or guillotine machine operating" shall be deemed to be one trade.
 - "Apprentices" includes applicants for apprenticeship employed on probation.
 - Apprenticeship Course.—Classes for Instruction.
- 19. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Schedules hereto, as the case may be, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said courses.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

- (b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—
 - (i) in the subjects of the first, second, third, or fourth years of his apprenticeship course, as the case may be, in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year; and
 - (ii) in the subjects of the final year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the final Certificate of the Commission,

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

- Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.
- (c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be)—
 - (i) Hand Composition.—All phases of hand composition and all things incidental thereto, including tabular and jobbing work, the latter to cover the principles of design, bookwork, the casting-off of copy, the making up of pages, the allotting of margins, the lay-out of pages, and locking up and registering of formes, proof-reading, and revising.
 - (ii) Hand and Machine Composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines.—All phases of hand composition and all things incidental thereto for the first three years and in addition machine composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines during the last three years of apprenticeship when the period of apprenticeship is six years and during the last two years when the period is five years.
 - (iii) Bookbinding.—Bookbinding and all phases of one at least of the following and all things incidental thereto—Finishing, marbling, blocking, indexing, and guillotine machine operating.
 - (iv) Paper Ruling.—All phases of paper ruling and all things incidental thereto, including making ready, setting pens or discs on machines, mixing inks, ruling proofs, and care of ruling machines, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines.
 - (v) Edge-gilding.—All phases of edge-gilding, bevelling and goffering, and all things incidental thereto, including the mixing and use of sizes.
 - (vi) Letterpress Printing.—All phases of letterpress printing and all things incidental thereto, including making ready, the mixing and use of inks, black and colour printing, and the care of cylinder and platen letterpress printing machines, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines.
 - the mechanism of such machines.

 (vii) Lithographic Plate Making.—All phases of lithographic plate making and all things incidental thereto, including one or more of the following operations, viz.:—stone polishing and/or plate graining; manual, mechanical, and/or photo mechanical (i.e., printing down and/or step and repeat) transferring; plate coating (i.e., whirling), sensitizing, developing, deep-etching, processing, rolling up, proving and preparing lithographic metal plates for lithographic printing, and including where the facilities exist, such instruction in lithographic printing or lithographic camera operating as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of lithographic plate making.
 - (vili) Lithographic Camera Operating.—All phases of lithographic camera operating and all things incidental thereto, including one or more of the following operations, viz.:—making line, continuous tone and/or screen wet plate, dry plate, film and/or paper negatives and/or positives; photo litho transfers; making single or multiple contact negatives or positives; projection enlarging on glass, film or lithographic metal plate; masking; and including where the facilities exist, such instruction in lithographic plate making or lithographic art as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of lithographic camera operating.
 - camera operating.

 (ix) Lithographic Art.—All phases of one or more of the following, viz.:—designing, sketching, drawing, aerographing tracing, keying, reproducing, retouching and colouring photographs, stripping, imposing, opaquing, staging, dot reducing, retouching, colour correcting negatives and positives, and all things incidental thereto, including where the facilities exist such instruction in lithographic camera operating as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of lithographic art.

 (x) Lithographic Printing.—All phases of lithographic camera operating as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of lithographic art.
 - (x) Lithographic Printing.—All phases of lithographic printing and all things incidental thereto, including the mixing and use of inks, the care of lithographic printing machines, and automatic feeders, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines, and including where the facilities exist such instruction in lithographic plate-making as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of lithographic printing.

 (xi) Stereotyming—All phases of stereotyming—and
- (xi) Stereotyping.—All phases of stereotyping and all things incidental thereto, including the making of composition, metal, and flong; moulding, packing, and repairing moulds; casting, trimming, cutting, routing, mounting, and planing (metal and/or wood), and all bench work.

(xii) Linotype Mechanic.—All phases of the mechanism of linotype machines, including attention, adjustment, and repairs, as the mechanical equipment of the employer's business will permit.

(xiii) Electrotyping.—All phases of electrotyping and all things incidental thereto, including preparing wax, moulding, building-up, black-leading, stepping-out, oxidizing, attending bath, lifting shells, backing-up, slabbing-up, sweating, anchoring, mounting, and planing (wood and/or metal), and all bench work.

(xiv) Process Engraving.—All phases of one at least of the following and all things incidental thereto:—operating or half-tone etching or line etching or printing or colour etching or finishing, which includes proofing, routing, mounting, and engraving. An apprentice to operating shall be given colour work during his apprenticeship whenever colour work is done on the employer's premises—

and the employer shall by the best means in his power teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

20. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid-percentage; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident and in that case if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage.

Incorporation of General Regulations.

The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1) made by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2) made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3) made by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4) made by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 30th day of December, 1931.

AMENDMENT OF ELECTRICAL TRADES REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprentice-ship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say)-

- following Regulations (that is to say)—

 1. Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 1) made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of August, 1929, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 28th day of August, 1929; Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 2) made by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of October, 1929, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 23rd day of October, 1929; Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 3) made by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of January, 1930, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 15th day of January, 1930; and the Electrical Mechanic Trade Regulations (No. 1) made by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of March, 1945, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the 14th day of March, 1945, shall be and the same are hereby rescinded as from the 1st day of September, 1948.
- 2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulations before the commencement of these Regulations.
- 3. For the said rescinded Regulations the following Regulations shall be substituted:-

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 1)".

Interpretation.

- 2. In these Regulations-
- "Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.
 "Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.
 "Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission
- of Victoria.
 "Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.
 "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

Armature Winder. Electrical Fitter. Electrical Fitter and Armature Winder. Electrical Mechanic.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desirous to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants may be Examined.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination, at a time and place determined by the Commission, to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

Exemptions.

- (α) If he possesses any one of the following educa-tional qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof—
 - (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School

- Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Com-
- (ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section 18 (2) of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the pre-paratory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship—General Form.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) with the following additions:

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

Employer's Covenants

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission at wages proportionate to those which he is required under the provisions of this paragraph to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month.

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.
- (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines or for the cancellation of the indentures. of the indentures.
 - (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.
 - (g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holi-day or during other than ordinary working hours without his consent.
 - (h) Not keep more than two days' pay in hand.
 - (i) Not allow the apprentice to work overtime for more than eighteen hours in any four con-
 - (j) Provide the apprentice during the first and second years of the said term with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.
 - (k) Not require the apprentice under the age of 18 years to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.
- (1) Not require the apprentice except in an emergency to work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by the Regulations.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenant.

(c) At all times, while in the employment of the employer, conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

Mutual Agreements.

- At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:-
 - (i) That where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or
 - any ordinary working week or month; or

 (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission the total period of time not served by an apprentice by reason of either of the abovementioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.
- (10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time required to be paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1947.
- (11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

- 9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:-
- Within Twenty Miles of G.P.O., Melbourne, within Ten Miles of G.P.O., Geelong, at Warrnambool, and within Mildura and Gippsland Districts.

1st year-at the rate of 28s. 6d. per week.

2nd year-at the rate of 38s. 6d. per week.

3rd year-at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week.

4th year-at the rate of 96s. 6d. per week.

5th year-at the rate of 122s. 0d. per week. At Yallourn.

1st year-at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.

2nd year-at the rate of 41s. 0d. per week.

3rd year-at the rate of 61s. 6d. per week.

4th year-at the rate of 102s. 0d. per week.

5th year-at the rate of 128s. 6d. per week. Other Parts of Victoria.

1st year—at the rate of 27s. 6d. per week.

2nd year-at the rate of 37s. 6d. per week.

3rd year-at the rate of 57s. 0d. per week.

4th year-at the rate of 94s. 0d. per week.

5th year-at the rate of 119s. 0d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and public holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half double time, or at such other rate (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to any journeymen who may be employed by him in the same trade.

Standard of Proficiency.

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

- 12. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—
 - (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
 - (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
 - (c) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage; and
 - (d) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen

- 13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall be-
 - Electrical Fitter and/or Armature Winder—One apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trades.
 - Electrical Mechanic—One apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

Apprenticeship Course-Classes for Instruction.

14. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of 14. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Schedules hereto (as the case may be), but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

- (b) (i) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice in the subjects of the first, second, and third years of his apprenticeship course, in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

 (ii) In order that an apprentice may qualify in respect
- deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

 (ii) In order that an apprentice may qualify in respect of education for the "final certificate" of the Commission, he shall, in addition to his attaining the standard set out in sub-paragraph (i) hereof in the subjects prescribed for the fourth year of the apprenticeship course, make satisfactory progress as approved by the Commission in the subjects prescribed for the fifth year of the said course until the date of completion of his term of apprenticeship.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

- (c) The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes (as the case may be)
 - y be)—

 (i) Electrical Mechanic.—All classes of electrical mechanics work and all things incidental thereto, including the affixing, placing, jointing, or running of electrical conductors of all kinds and for all purposes from the point of supply to the point of utilization; the fixing of all kinds of conduits, ducts, and other means of protecting and covering electrical conductors; meter fixing; the connecting up of generators, alternators, motors, transformers, electrical control gear, distribution boards, and of electrical instruments and electrical apparatus at the points of supply and utilization for power,

subjects

of the

lighting, heating, smelting, and safe working, or for any other purpose; the connecting up of radio apparatus, telephones, and bells; the erection, overhauling, and repairing of storage batteries; the installation of electrical plants, including the erection and connecting up of switchboards; and the effecting of repairs of an electrical nature to machines, installations, or appliances where it is necessary to carry out the work on the site of where such repairs are incidental to such work; the correct setting out of electrical wiring installations and the testing of electrical installations and electrical appliances. appliances.

(ii) Electrical Fitter.—All classes of electrical fitting and all things incidental thereto, including the following:-

> Correct methods of use of bench and machine tools commonly used in the trade.

The making, fitting, and repairing of electrical machines, instruments, and apparatus, including the necessary testing of such machines, instruments, and apparatus.

(iii) Armature Winder.-All classes of winding and all

rmature Winder.—All classes of winding and an things incidental thereto, including.—

The preparation, formation, and winding of all types of coils, including armature, field, rotor, stator, transformer, magneto, automobile generator, starter, and electrical control gear

The assembly and testing of windings for direct current and alternating current machines. including the testing of machines after

assembly.

The stripping of electrical machines, repairing and rewinding of coils, testing of re-wound machines.

(iv) Electrical Fitter and Armature Winder.classes of work for each trade as prescribed in paragraphs (ii) and (iii)—

and the employer shall by the best means in his power teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

15. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for 15. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction.

Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such periods, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident, and in that case if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage. (b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prepercentage.

In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course the working of 80 per cent. of the test papers shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of attendances.

BARLEY MARKETING ACT 1948.

REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Barley Marketing Act 1948 (No. 5320), the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Barley Marketing (Elections) Regulations 1948.
 - (2) In these Regulations-
 - "The Act" means the Barley Marketing Act 1948.
 - "Election" means any election held pursuant to the Act of a representative of growers of barley in Victoria on the Australian Barley Board.
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture.
 - "Returning Officer" means the Returning Officer appointed from time to time by the Minister for the purpose of these Regulations.
 - "Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.
- 2. For the purpose of every election, the Minister shall appoint a Returning Officer.
- 3. Every election shall be held by postal ballot as hereinafter provided.
- 4. The voting at every election shall close at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day appointed for holding the election.
- 5. (1) For the purpose of the first election held pursuant to the Act, every person who has delivered to the Australian Barley Board constituted under the National Security (Australian Barley Board) Regulations of the Commonwealth barley grown on not less than thirty acres in the season 1947-1948 shall be entitled to one vote.
- (2) At any subsequent election every person who has delivered to the Australian Barley Board constituted under the Act barley grown on not less than thirty acres in the season immediately preceding the day appointed for holding the election shall be entitled to one vote.
- 6. The Director of Agriculture shall for the purposes of every election prepare and supply to the Returning Officer a list containing the names of all persons entitled to vote as provided in Regulation 5 hereof. The persons whose names appear on the said list and no others shall be entitled to vote at such election.
- 7. (1) The Minister shall by notice published in the Government Gazette and in at least two newspapers circulating in Victoria appoint a day (not being less than thirty days after the publication thereof) for the holding of any election and shall in such notice appoint a day (hereinafter referred to as "nomination day") not being less than fourteen days before the day appointed for holding the election for nominations of candidates to be lodged with the Returning Officer.
- (2) Nominations for every election shall close at noon on nomination day.
- 8. (1) Nominations shall be in accordance with Form "A" of the Schedule and shall be signed by at least six persons entitled to vote at the election as well as by the person nominated in token of his consent to act as a member of the Barley Marketing Board if elected.
- (2) Any candidate for election may by written notice addressed to the Returning Officer withdraw his consent to his nomination at any time not later than noon on nomination day and such candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated. The Returning Officer shall thereupon omit the name of such candidate from the ballotpapers.

- (3) If before the day appointed for holding an election a candidate dies he shall be considered as not having been nominated and action shall be taken by the Returning Officer to report the remaining candidate elected or (as the case may be) erase the name of such candidate and the number placed opposite such name from the ballot-papers. Every such ballot-paper shall be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were (when necessary) altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voter's order of preference in respect of such remaining candidates.
- 9. If at any election, only one candidate is nominated, the Returning Officer shall report the name of such candidate to the Minister who shall by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare such candidate duly elected.
- 10. If at any election two or more candidates are nominated the Returning Officer shall—
 - (a) cause ballot-papers to be printed with the surnames and christian or other names in full of all the candidates at such election in alphabetical order of surnames in accordance with Form "B" of the Schedule;
 - (b) not less than fourteen days before the day appointed for holding the election initial or cause to be marked with his initials and transmit by post to every person whose name appears on the list prepared for the election pursuant to Regulation 6 hereof a ballot-paper;
 - (c) enclose with each ballot-paper an unsealed return envelope addressed to the Returning Officer with the declaration in accordance with Form "C" or (as the case requires) Form "D" of the Schedule printed on the face thereof for the return of the ballot-paper.
- 11. At any election every person to whom a ballot-paper has been sent who desires to vote shall mark his ballot-paper by placing the figure "1" opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the figures "2" "3" "4" (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference for such candidates.

Provided that where at any election there are only two candidates, the requirements of this Regulation shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked in any way which in the opinion of the Returning Officer indicates the voter's first preference only.

- 12. (1) When the voter has marked his vote on his ballot-paper, the ballot-paper shall be placed in the return envelope which envelope shall be sealed and posted or delivered to the Returning Officer.
- (2) Before posting or delivering the return envelope containing a ballot-paper, the voter shall complete the declaration printed on the face of such envelope.
- 13. Any person who at any election votes more than once or who makes a false declaration shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than two pounds.
- 14. Upon a person entitled to vote at any election making and transmitting to the Returning Officer a statutory declaration that he has not received a ballot-paper or that the ballot-paper received by him has been lost or spoilt or destroyed and that he has not already voted the Returning Officer may issue a duplicate ballot-paper to such person.
- 15. (1) The Returning Officer shall provide a ballot box with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the return envelopes containing ballot-papers. The ballot box shall be locked immediately the ballot-papers are posted in accordance with paragraph (b) of Regulation 10 hereof and shall remain locked until the time fixed for the close of the election.
- (2) The Returning Officer shall place in such ballot box all return envelopes containing ballot-papers received by him up to the time fixed for the close of the election.
- 16. At every election the method of counting the votes and ascertaining the result of the election shall be in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being prescribing the method of counting the votes and ascertaining the result of an election of a member of the Legislative Assembly of Victoria.

- 17. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing under his hand one person to act as scrutineer on behalf of such candidate and every such scrutineer shall be entitled to be present at the scrutiny.
- 18. As soon as practicable after the time fixed for the close of an election and in the presence of such scrutineers as are present the Returning Officer shall-
 - (a) open the ballot box and produce unopened all envelopes containing ballot-papers received up to the time fixed for the close of the election;
 - (b) examine each envelope and if the declaration printed on the face thereof is properly completed accept the vote for further scrutiny;
 - (c) if such declaration is not properly completed reject the vote without opening the envelope and mark the envelope "rejected";
 - (d) place the unrejected envelopes on a table face downwards so that the signatures of the voters will not be visible;
 - (e) open each unrejected envelope withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein and without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so deposit the ballotpaper in the ballot box;
 - (f) when all unrejected envelopes have been opened and the ballot-papers withdrawn therefrom, open the ballot box and count the votes and ascertain the result.
- 19. Subject to the proviso to Regulation 11 hereof any ballot-paper which is not marked in accordance with the directions printed thereon shall be rejected as informal.
- 20. The Returning Officer is empowered in respect of any election under the Act to meet any contingency not provided for in these Regulations that may arise by taking any such action (consistent with the provisions or objects of the Act) in regard thereto as he deems reasonable and proper, and in all such cases shall be guided as far as possible by the practice followed at State parliamentary elections.
- 21. (1) At the conclusion of every election, the Returning Officer shall report the result to the Minister and such report shall contain-
 - (a) the names of all the candidates nominated;
 - (b) the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate;
 - (c) the details of the distribution of preference votes (if distributed);
 - (d) the number of informal votes:
 - (e) the name of the candidate elected;
- (2) The Minister shall thereupon by notice published in the Government Gazette declare the result of the election.
- 22. The Returning Officer shall retain all rolls ballot-papers and declarations in connexion with any election for a period of not less than one month after the date on which the election was held and at the expiration of such period he may cause the same to be destroyed.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE MEAT TRANSPORT VEHICLES REGULATIONS 1947.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1948 and shall be read and construed as one with the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. (1) The Amending Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 are hereby repealed.
- (2) Any licence certificate granted pursuant to the repealed Regulations and current at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations shall subject to the provisions of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 continue in force for the balance of the term for which it was issued and shall be deemed to be a licence certificate under the last-named Regulations.
- 3. The interpretation of "Meat" in Regulation 6 of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "Meat" does not include bacon and small goods.
- 4. Regulation 7 of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulation 1947 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "7. The proprietor of any vehicle used or intended to be used for the transport of meat in any Meat Area—
 - (a) shall make application for the licensing of such vehicle to the council of a municipality in the municipal district of which there is an establishment;
 - (b) shall take or cause to be taken such vehicle to the establishment at such time as the inspector directs for the purpose of having the vehicle inspected."
- 5. Regulation 8 of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 is hereby repealed.
- 6. Regulation 9 of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following subregulation:—
 - "(2) If the inspector decides after inspection that the vehicle is not suitable for licensing, he shall notify the proprietor accordingly and the proprietor shall not, within six months of receiving notification that his vehicle is unsuitable, apply to any other Council for the licensing of such vehicle."
- 7. Regulation 14 of the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1947 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "14. Notwithstanding any provision in these Regulations to the contrary, if an inspector be satisfied that any vehicle whatsoever in respect of which an application has been made for approval or for renewal of a licence for the year 1948 is suitable for the purpose of transporting meat without detriment to public health and without contravening the provisions of Part VIII. of the Cleanliness (Food) Regulations 1931, such inspector may approve of such vehicle or renew the licence but no such approval or renewal shall be granted for any period later than the 31st December, 1948."
- 8. No person shall use or cause or permit to be used any vehicle for the transport of meat in any Meat Area unless there is current in respect of such vehicle a licence certificate under these Regulations.

FORESTS (DUGOUTS) REGULATIONS 1948.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Forests Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Forests (Dugouts) Regulations 1948.
- 2. The Regulations made under the Forests Acts on the 23rd day of January, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st day of January, 1940, are hereby repealed.
 - In these Regulations—
 - "Forest Officer" means the Forest Officer in charge of the district in which the dugout is situated;
 - "the period that fires are likely to occur" means the period from the 1st day of November in each year to the 15th day of April in the succeeding year, both dates inclusive.
- 4. Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall construct such dugout in accordance with the plans designs and specifications specified in such notice and on a site approved in writing by the Inspector of Forests of the Division in which such dugout is to be situated: provided that no tunnelling or driving shall be undertaken in the construction of such dugout unless construction by that method has been first approved in writing by an Inspector of Mines, and if the dugout is so constructed it shall not be deemed to comply with these Regulations unless and until a certificate of the safety of the dugout has been obtained from an Inspector of Mines after the construction thereof and filed with the Forest Officer.
- 5. Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall prior to the commencement of the construction of such dugout—
 - (a) clear, of all timber, scrub, and other inflammable materials, the site and the surrounding area to a distance of at least a chain from any part of the proposed dugout and to such further distance as the Forest Officer shall direct in writing:
 - (b) at the request in writing of the Forest Officer remove any standing trees which are in such a position that, if they fell, they might fall on such dugout or block the entrance thereto, or which, if burning, might endanger any occupants of such dugout.
- 6. Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall— $\,$
 - (a) keep the site and surrounding area referred to in clause 5
 (a) hereof at all times clear of all timber, scrub, and other inflammable materials;
 - (b) display and keep displayed a sign bearing the word "Dugout" in block letters eight inches high on a yellow background in such a position as to indicate the location of such dugout and to be visible to persons living or working in the vicinity of such dugout;
 - (c) whenever it is decided to discontinue the use of such dugout notify the Forest Officer in writing that the use of such dugout is being discontinued and remove the sign bearing the word "Dugout";

 (d) maintain at all times such dugout in a safe and habitable condition and the timbers and other materials used in the construction thereof in a sound condition;

- (e) maintain at all times the earth covering of such dugout at the depth specified in the said plans designs and specifications.
- 7. Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall during the period that fires are likely to occur provide and maintain in such dugout----
 - (a) a supply of good drinking water amounting to not less than half a gallon for each person for whom the dugout has capacity, provided that in no case shall such supply be less than two gallons;
 - (b) an additional supply of water, amounting to not less than forty gallons, together with a dipper for the purpose of wetting down the curtains at the entrance of the dugout;
 - (c) an adequate supply of electric torches, spare batteries, and globes for the illumination of the dugout;
 - (d) if the capacity of the dugout does not exceed twelve persons a 14-in. sanitary pan placed behind a screen at the inner end of the dugout and effective deodorants;
 - (e) if the capacity of the dugout exceeds twelve persons two 14-in. sanitary pans separately screened for the use of male and female occupants at the inner end of the dugout and effective deodorants;
 - (f) such first aid equipment as the Commission in writing directs;
 - (g) blanket frames set in such a manner as will ensure a gas seal.
- 8. Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall during the period that fires are likely to occur maintain in a sound and effective condition all blankets curtains and other furnishings in such dugout.
- Every person required by the Commission by notice in writing to construct a dugout shall—
 - (a) nominate himself as, or appoint from those persons for whose protection such dugout is to be used, a competent person to take charge of such dugout whilst it is being occupied by persons sheltering from fire and appoint a deputy for such competent person;
 - (b) before the 1st November of each year give to the Forest Officer a written statement of the names of the competent person and the deputy so nominated or appointed, and written acknowledgments of their nominations or appointments (as the case may be) signed by such competent person and deputy.
- 10. (a) For the purpose of ensuring the safety of persons sheltering in the dugout the competent person shall perform the following duties whilst it is occupied:—
 - (i) He shall take charge of the dugout and its equipment, and have control of the persons sheltering therein.
 - (ii) He shall have sole control of the raising and lowering of the curtains of the dugout.
 - (iii) He shall have sole control of the water supply of the dugout.
 - '(iv) He shall give instructions to the persons sheltering in the dugout to ensure that—
 - (A) order is maintained;
 - (B) such persons remain seated as much as possible and so minimize the consumption of oxygen;
 - (C) the curtains are kept damp, when lowered;
 - (D) such other precautions as he considers necessary are observed.
- (b) In the absence of the competent person his duties shall be performed by the deputy.

- (c) All persons sheltering in the dugout shall obey the instructions given by the competent person or the deputy in the performance of their duties.
- (d) No person shall hinder or impede the competent person or the deputy in the performance of their duties.
 - (e) No person shall smoke whilst in occupation of the dugout.
- (f) No person shall kindle or use flame lights in any form in the dugout.
- 11. In addition to the lighting equpiment prescribed by clause 7 (c) hereof electric lighting from an internal storage battery or external source of supply may be provided in the dugout.
- 12. Timber shall not be stacked nor shall any building or other construction be erected within 100 feet of the entrance of the dugout.
- 13. No material substance or thing, except as prescribed in these Regulations or directed by the Commission by notice in writing, shall be deposited, stored, or permitted to remain within the dugout at any time.

- A By-law of the City of Chelsea, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946 and of every other power thereunto enabling it, and numbered 42, for prohibiting the sale of goods from—
 - (a) Stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the municipal dis-trict of the City of Chelsea.
 - (b) Stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicles, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land, or land under the care and management of the municipality, or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Oflences Act* 1928) within the municipal district of the City of Chelsea.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and of every other power thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Chelsea do hereby order as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. By-law No. 3 is hereby repealed.
- 2. The sale of any goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the whole of the municipal district of the City of Chelsea is hereby prohibited.
- 3. The sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicles, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the Police Offences Act 1928) within the whole of the municipal district of the City of Chelsea is hereby prohibited.

- 4. No person shall sell goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the municipal district of the City of Chelses. of the City of Chelsea.
- 5. No person shall sell goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicles, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act* 1928) within the municipal district of the City of Chelsea.
- 6. This By-law shall not apply to the sale of goods for charitable or sports purposes, written permission for which has been given by the Council.
- 7. Every person who does or commits any act forbidden to be done by this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Forty shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and upon conviction thereof by a Court of Petty Sessions for a second offence shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BOROUGH OF WONTHAGGI.

By-Law No. 23.

A By-law of the Borough of Wonthaggi, made under the provisions of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 23, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, and providing for openings through any such standing places, for prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles in any street or road, or part thereof, specified in the By-law, and for regulating traffic and processions. traffic and processions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wonthaggi order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law and the Schedules thereto, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Council" shall mean the Council of the Borough of Wonthaggi.
 "Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor

Wonthaggi.

"Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car or other vehicle.

"Park" means to leave standing (whether unattended or not) any motor car or other vehicle.

"Limit of parking" where parking lines are painted on a street or road means within the adjacent lines indicating the space in which a motor car may be parked.

"Motor car" means a motor car, within the meaning of section 3 of the Motor Car Act 1928, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands may be fixed or appointed by the Council of any municipality under the powers conferred by any enactment, other than sub-section 1 (22) of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946.

"Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars appointed by the Council under any By-law.

"Parking lines" means the lines painted on streets or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor car, and to define the limit of space within which a motor car shall be parked.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district within the Township of Wonthaggi which is set out in the Schedules hereto.

3. By-laws Nos. 20 and 21 of the Borough of Wonthaggi are hereby repealed.

PART 1.

- 4. The streets, roads, and parts of streets and roads set out in the Schedules hereto, hereinafter called "the parking areas," shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars.
- 5. The method of parking in the several parking areas shall be as set out in column 2 of the Schedules hereto opposite the parking area described in column 1 of each of the said Schedules, and no person shall use or employ any other method of parking therein.
- 6. Every driver of a motor car shall, in any parking area, conform to the following requirements:-
 - (a) Comply with directions given by the Council's parking attendant in charge, if an attendant is present, or
 - (b) If no such attendant is present shall take up his position in the order of his arrival thereat and in such manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to a motor car already parked, and in such a manner as not to cause obstruction to a motor car parking or moving from the place occupied by it.
- 7. A driver of a motor car shall not cause, allow, or permit-
 - (a) A motor car to be parked or left standing in such a manner as to extend beyond the painted lines marking the limit of parking in any parking area:
 - (b) A trailer attached to a motor car to be parked in any area in which angle parking only is per-mitted;
 - (c) A motor car having a greater overall length than 20 feet to be parked in any area in which angle parking only is permitted, unless and only while delivery of goods is being made from such vehicle to premises in the vicinity;
 - (d) A motor car, with or without a trailer attached, to be parked in that part of the north side of Murray-street between Bass Highway (McKenzie-street) and McBride-avenue, which part is reserved for the parking of motor omnibuses;
 - (e) A motor car to be parked in any position which will obstruct ingress to and egress from any parking area;
 - (f) A motor car to be parked within 6 feet of any lines running across Graham-street and/or McBride-avenue, indicating and marked as indicating a pedestrian crossing;
 - (g) A motor car to be parked elsewhere in a street than in a parking area appointed under this By-law;
 - (h) A motor car to be parked in any position pro-hibited as set in Regulation 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944—(copy of clause 26 is set out at the foot of this By-law for the information of persons consulting this By-law):
 - (i) A motor car to remain stationary within 30 feet of any place indicated by notice either painted on the roadway or erected at such place in such manner as the Council may from time to time determine as being a bus stop.
- 8. A driver of a motor omnibus shall not cause, allow,
 - (a) An omnibus to remain at any place indicated as a bus stop, in accordance with clause 7 (i) hereof, for a greater period than twenty minutes on any occasion on which the area reserved is occupied by such omnibus;
 - (b) An omnibus to stop, whether for picking up or letting down passengers or otherwise, in any area in which angle parking only is permitted for vehicles other than those to which this clause refers, in any area other than those indicated, in accordance with clause 7 (i) hereof;
 - (c) An omnibus to remain stationary at any bus stop as hereinbefore described, except in such a manner as to be parallel to and as close to the gutter as possible, and so as to form one line of vehicles only.

The Council may, by Resolution, from time to time—

 (a) Discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any standing place for motor cars appointed under

any By-law; and

(b) may appoint or employ officers and attendants for any standing places so appointed, and remove any such officer or attendant.

10. No person, not being an officer or employee of the Council duly authorized to do so, shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or building or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building, for the purposes of or in connexion with this By-law.

11. No person, not being an officer or employee of or otherwise authorized by the Council, shall paint or affix any notice or sign relating to the parking of cars or other vehicles, or to the regulating of traffic, on any street or footway.

PART 2.-VEHICLES GENERALLY.

12. No person shall drive, ride, or otherwise propel, or cause to be propelled, any vehicle, including a bicycle, along that section of McBride-avenue between Watt-street and Edgar-street, except in a northerly direction on that section of the roadway to the west of the reserve for public gardens and in a southerly direction in that section of the roadway to the east of the reserve for public

PART 3.-PENALTY.

13. Any contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of such offence shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Column 1. Graham-street, both sides, between McKenzie-street and Billson-street

McBride-avenue, both sides, between Murray-street and Watt-street

Column 2

Angle parking at an angle of not more than 50 degrees and not less than 35 degrees to the line of the kerb or gutter, and in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding when on its proper side of the road, within 9 inches of the kerb or back of the gutter or within the limits of the parking lines painted on the roadway in approximate accordance with the above method of parking.

SECOND SCHEDULE.
