DETERMINATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT.

IN THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT:

IN THE MATTER of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928-1941*,

AND

IN THE MATTER of a Determination of the Bricklayers Board made on the 27th May, 1948,

AND

IN THE MATTER of an Appeal against certain provisions of the said Determination.

Before the Industrial Appeals Court (Judge Dethridge, K. H. Boykett Esq., and J. V. Stout Esq.)

Monday the 27th day of September, 1948.

Having heard the above-mentioned Appeal, this Court Doth Order—

(1) That, in Parts I. and II., clause 2 (b) of the said Determination, the amount fixed by the Wages Board for classifications 3 (a) and 4 (a) be reduced by $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour, and that the amount fixed for classifications 3 (b), 4 (b), and 6, be reduced by $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour.

(2) That, in Parts I. and II., clause 2 (b) of the said Determination, the provision commencing with the words "Bricklayers employed laying cement blocks" and ending "plus 7d. per hour" be deleted, and that the following provision be substituted therefor:—

"Bricklayers employed laying cement blocks, other than cindercrete blocks for plugging purposes, shall be paid the rate prescribed for 'all other' bricklayers plus, where the blocks weigh over 12 lbs. and under 20 lbs., 3d. per hour, where the blocks weigh 20 lbs. or over and up to 40 lbs., 6d. per hour, and where the blocks weight over 40 lbs., 9d. per hour."

(3) That, with the exception of the foregoing provision as to cement blocks, the Determination of this Court shall operate as on and from the 22nd July, 1948, and the provision relating to cement blocks shall operate as on and from the 30th day of September, 1948.
