### NOTICE OF VARIATION OF DECLARATION OF CERTAIN SERVICES AS DECLARED SERVICES FOR THE PURPOSES OF PART II. OF THE "PRICES REGULATION ACT 1948."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby vary certain declarations heretofore made of the services set out in the Schedule annexed hereto as declared services for the purposes of Part II. of the said Act in the manner following, that is to say:—

Nothing in any such declarations shall apply to any such service when rendered in relation to and solely in connexion with a dwelling the erection of which was commenced on or after the 18th day of October, 1948.

### SCHEDULE.

Asphalting.  
Bricklaying.  
Carpentering.  
Excavating.  
Fencing.  
Floor laying and sanding and polishing of floors.  
Painting and paper-hanging.  
Paving.  
Plastering.  
Plumbing.  
Tiling (except roof tiling).  
The erection of dwellings.  
The installation of electrical wiring, fittings, and appliances.

**PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3.**  
**COTTON YARNS.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—*

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3.

*Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2912 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 3028 and 3340 made under Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

*Interpretation.*

3. (a) The maximum prices fixed by the provision of this Order include free delivery to the purchaser's store where such store and the seller's mill are both situated—

- (i) within the Melbourne metropolitan area, or
- (ii) the same proclaimed area,

as the case may be. In any other case, the maximum prices so fixed include delivery free on rail or free on board, as the case may be.

(b) Where any goods are delivered in a case, carton, cone or tube, the maximum prices fixed by the provision of this Order shall be subject to an increase by the cost to the seller of such container. Provided that where any such container is returned in good order and condition by the purchaser, the amount of such increase shall, in respect of any case, be refunded to the purchaser, or, in respect of any carton, cone or tube, 66½ per centum of such increase shall be so refundable.

(c) For the purposes of this Order—

- (i) "cost of raw cotton" shall not exceed such amount as may be determined by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner on the application in writing of the seller and until such determination is made shall not exceed in respect of each of the following types of yarn the amount shown opposite thereto:—

Knitting yarns	..	..	..	14½d.
Weaving yarns	..	..	..	14½d.
Cordage yarns	..	..	..	11¾d.

Tire cord yarns	..	..	..	17½d.

- (ii) "waste allowance" shall not exceed an amount per pound of raw cotton represented by the following percentages of the actual amount ascertained in accordance with sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph:—

Raw Cotton Used for.	Per cent.
(a) Production of knitting weaving and tire cord types of yarn	.. 16
or	
(b) Production of cordage types of yarn	.. 17½
or	
(c) Production of combed types of yarn	.. 30
or	
(d) Production of condensor types of yarn	10

- (iii) "costs of conversion" of any type and count of cotton yarn shall not exceed the margins in pence per pound of yarn specified in the schedules one to four of this Order in respect to such type and count.

*Maximum Prices—Single-ply Cotton Yarn.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum price per pound at which single-ply cotton yarn produced in Australia, on cheeses or cones, other than for weaving, of any type and count specified in the First Schedule to this Order, may be sold to be the sum of—

- (a) cost of raw cotton;
- (b) waste allowance;
- (c) costs of conversion as specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price per pound at which single-ply cotton yarn produced in Australia, on cheeses or cones, for weaving, of any count specified in the First Schedule to this Order, may be sold to be the price determined in accordance with paragraph four of this Order in relation to that type and count plus ¼d. per pound.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price per pound at which single-ply cotton yarn produced in Australia, not on cheeses or cones, of any type and count specified in the First Schedule to this Order, may be sold to be—

- (a) where such yarn is reeled into hanks for the manufacture of towels or for other purposes requiring the yarn to be in hank—the price determined in accordance with paragraph four of this Order in relation to that type and count plus 1d. per pound; or
- (b) in cases other than those set out in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph—the prices determined in accordance with paragraph four of this Order in relation to that type and count, less the winding margin specified in relation to that count in the Second Schedule to this Order.

*Maximum Prices—Other Than Single-ply Cotton Yarn.*

7. I fix and declare the maximum price per pound at which cotton yarn, produced in Australia, other than single-ply cotton yarn, of any type and count specified in the First Schedule to this Order, and other than tire cord yarn, may be sold to be the price determined in accordance with paragraphs four and five of this Order, plus the doubling and winding margin specified in relation to that count in the Third Schedule to this Order.

*Maximum Prices—Bleached Yarn.*

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price per pound at which bleached cotton yarn produced in Australia, of any type and count, may be sold to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of cotton yarn of that type and count by the foregoing provisions of this Order, plus—

- (a) ten per centum of such price;
- (b) 5d. per pound of yarn; and
- (c) the margin for winding as specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order.

*Maximum Prices—Dyed Yarns.*

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which dyed cotton yarn produced in Australia, of any type and count, may be sold to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of cotton yarn of that type and count by the foregoing provisions of this Order, plus—

- (a) the margin for winding as specified in the third column of the Second Schedule to this Order; and
- (b) (i) the amount per pound for the shade in question as specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order; or  
(ii) where the amount per pound for any shade is not specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order, the maximum allowance approved for such shade as at the 16th September, 1948, or where no such approval was in force at that date, such allowance as may be approved by the Commissioner in the particular case.

*Maximum Prices—Cotton Yarns Not Specified.*

10. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any type and count of cotton yarn, whether locally produced or imported, a maximum price for the sale of which is not fixed by this Order, may be sold by any person to be the maximum price fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person, for the sale of that cotton yarn.

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any cotton yarn specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

*Notification of Prices Fixed by Manufacturer.*

*Cotton Yarn.*

12. The selling prices fixed in accordance with the provisions of this Order for the types and counts of cotton yarn specified in the Order supported with details of the costs of raw cotton on which the selling prices have been calculated are to be notified in writing to the Prices Decontrol Commissioner within seven days of the fixation of these prices by the manufacturer of the yarn.
