Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies
in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

ROBINVALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN URBAN DIVISION.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that; as on and from the date hereof that portion of the Robinvale Irrigation and

Water Supply District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and become an Urban Division for the purpose of the said Acts, and shall be known as Robinvale Urban Division.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Robinvale Urban Division.

Commencing at the north-western angle of lot 314 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 11065, being part of Crown allotment A, Parish of Bumbang, County of Karkaroc; thence southerly by the western boundary and south-easterly by the south-western boundary of that lot to the southern angle thereof; thence generally south-westerly by the southern boundary of Ronald-street and a line in continuation thereof to a point distant 15 chains south-westerly from the centre line of the Manangatang-Euston Railway; thence north-westerly by a line parallel to the said centre line to the left bank of the Murray River; thence generally easterly by that bank to a point distant 10 chains at right angles easterly from the centre line of the said railway; thence south-easterly by a line parallel to the said centre line a distance of approximately 25 chains to the northern boundary of a Government road; thence easterly by the last-mentioned road boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of said lot 314; thence southerly by a line to the point of commencement.

The boundaries set out and described in the foregoing Schedule are shown on a plan approved by the Governor in Council, and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.—(Corres. 1948/21115.)

- (d) if the member, with the consent of the Minister of Agriculture for the State in which he resides, travels by aircraft or motor vehicle—the amount of the fare for the aircraft journey, or as the case may be, motor car allowance at the rate prescribed for public servants in the State in which the member resides.

10. (1) The Ministers shall use all reasonable efforts to arrive at agreement between them as to the decisions to be made for carrying out this arrangement. Decisions by the Ministers.

(2) If the Ministers are unable to agree upon the selection of a person to hold any office on the Board each Minister shall nominate in writing the person whom he desires to be selected; and the person to be selected shall be chosen from the persons so nominated by drawing lots: Provided that, unless the Ministers in any particular case otherwise agree, the chairman of the Board and the representative of brewers and maltsters shall not both be persons nominated by one only of the Ministers; and for the purposes of this proviso the first chairman of the Board shall be deemed to have been nominated by the Minister of Agriculture of South Australia.

(3) If the Ministers are unable to agree on the question whether the office of a member is to be terminated pursuant to clause 6 of this arrangement the question shall be decided by the Public Service Commissioner or the Chairman of the Public Service Board (as the case may be) of the State in which that member resides.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement, or if it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied shall be computed by accounting a watering as being a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water one-half foot in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of all lands shall on and from the 1st day of July, 1948, be Twenty-eight shillings for each and every acre-foot of water supplied.

6. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of 1 acre to a depth of 1 foot.

7. Application for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other Officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

8. Charges for water supplied for irrigation under this By-law shall be payable on demand at the office of the Commission at Swan Hill. Should such payment not be made as specified, no further supply of water will be delivered without the special authority of the Commission.

9. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

10. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

11. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other Officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith, shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

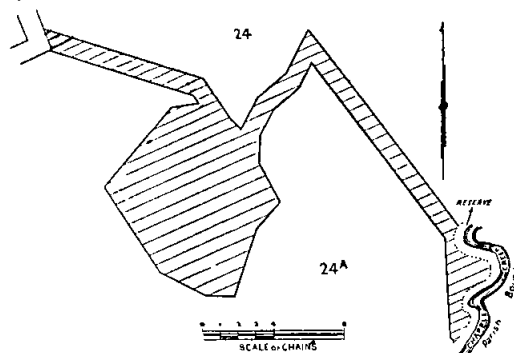

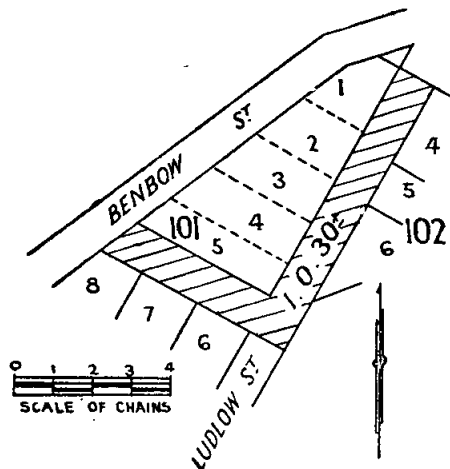

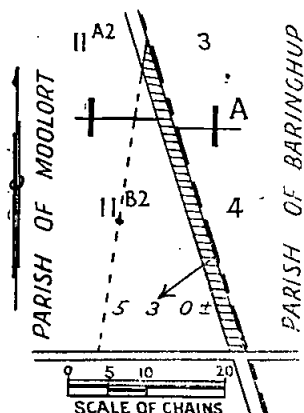

Amendments to By-law prescribing residential areas at Alphington (including Australian Paper Mills and portion of the Outer Circle Railway).

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* and particularly under and with reference to *Local Government Act*, 1946, sections 197-1-XXXVIII (a) and 228 and numbered 163, for altering and amending By-laws 74, 119, and 146 for prescribing residential areas.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. That additional sub-clauses be added to clause 3 of By-law 146 as follows:—

(c) All that area of land on the south side of Heidelberg-road comprising portion of the former Outer Circle Railway land extending southward on the east side of the Chandler Highway to the River Yarra.

(d) All that area of land on the south side of Heidelberg-road extending southward to the River Yarra and extending eastward from the Outer Circle Railway to Latrobe-avenue including the western 64 feet of lot 37, Lugton-street, but excluding the unmade portion of Fulham-road.

2. That where any areas of land included in the areas delineated in the preceding clause are included in areas prescribed as Residential Areas number 1 or 3 in By-laws 74 and 119, such areas shall be excised from the said Residential Areas Nos. 1 and 3.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in By-law 74 or its amendments, or this By-law—

- (a) The erection of any building within 10 feet of the Chandler Highway is hereby prohibited.

- (c) The erection of any building within 50 feet from Heidelberg-road from the existing laboratory near Fulham-road to Latrobe-avenue is hereby prohibited.

4. The use of the land delineated in the last preceding clause shall be restricted by the proprietors to providing entrances and parking areas and the provisions of lawns, the planting of shrubs and flowers, and for recreation purposes.
