APPOINTMENT OF A ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO CERTAIN MATTERS RELATING
TO THE BREAD INDUSTRY.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by an Order made on the 14th day of April, 1949, hereby appoint—

LEONARD EDWARD BISHOP STRETTON, Esquire,
a Judge of County Courts,

to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon the organization and practices of the bread industry in the State of Victoria and into the conditions affecting the cost of production and distribution of bread, having regard particularly to—

- (a) the effect of any such organization and/or practices upon the price and quality of bread ;
- (b) whether any such practices are disadvantageous to—
 - (i) any and what class of baker or shopkeeper ;
 - (ii) consumers ;
- (c) the effect upon the price and quality of bread of the recent decrease of hours of labour and of increases (if any) of the cost of manufacture and distribution of bread.
