*Prices Regulation Act 1948.*

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 48.

CREAM—VICTORIA.

I IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 48.

*Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2787 made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

*Maximum Prices.*

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which cream may be sold by wholesale or retail in Victoria, including any cost of delivery to the purchaser, to be—

- (a) in respect of cream containing not less than 35 parts per centum of butter-fat—the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order; or
- (b) in respect of cream containing less than 35 parts per centum of butter-fat—the prices specified in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, less, in each case, 50 per centum thereof.

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which cream, specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph, may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 49.

## USED TYPEWRITERS.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 49.

*Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3070, issued under the National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

*Definitions.*

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
  - "typewriter in the rough" means any used typewriter other than a reconditioned typewriter or a remanufactured typewriter as defined in this paragraph;
  - "reconditioned typewriter" means in relation to the sale of a used typewriter, a used typewriter which at the time of such sale is cleaned, re-aligned, and adjusted with imperfect type and worn parts repaired or replaced;
  - "remanufactured typewriter" means in relation to the sale of a used typewriter, a used typewriter which at the time of such sale has been dismantled and re-assembled, cleaned, re-aligned and adjusted, with its main frame refinished and imperfect type and worn parts replaced by new type and parts;
  - "standard typewriter" means any used typewriter other than a standard portable typewriter or a stripped portable typewriter as defined in the paragraph;
  - "standard portable typewriter" means any used portable typewriter other than a stripped portable typewriter;
  - "stripped portable typewriter" means—
    - (i) a used three-keyboard portable typewriter;
    - (ii) a used portable typewriter known as either a junior or baby model; or
    - (iii) any used four-keyboard portable typewriter lacking any one of the following features:—
      - (a) two-coloured ribbon mechanism;
      - (b) back spacer;
      - (c) right and left margin stops;
      - (d) automatic ribbon reverse;
      - (e) ribbon mechanism that will take a standard  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch ribbon.

*Maximum Prices—Standard Typewriters.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any standard typewriter specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the price specified in that Schedule.

*Maximum Prices—Standard Portable Typewriters and Stripped Portable Typewriters.*

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any standard portable typewriter and any stripped portable typewriter specified in the Second Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the price specified in that Schedule.

*Maximum Prices—Additional Allowances.*

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order—
  - (a) where the platen length of any standard typewriter exceeds 18 inches the maximum price specified in the First Schedule to this Order for the sale of that typewriter shall be subject to an increase by an amount of £3;
  - (b) where any portable typewriter is a noiseless typewriter the maximum price specified in the Second Schedule to this Order for the sale of that typewriter shall be subject to an increase by an amount of £1 5s.

*Exhibition of Price Tickets.*

7. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale, other than by auction, any used typewriter, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach thereto a ticket or label setting forth his maximum selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed in relation to any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods, and as to be properly associated with such goods.

*Advertisements.*

8. (1) Any person who advertises a used typewriter for sale shall include in such advertisement the following particulars:—

- (a) the make and description of such used typewriter;
- (b) the name and address of the advertiser;
- (c) the price which he intends to accept for that used typewriter (hereinafter referred to as the selling price);
- (d) the maximum price fixed by or under the *Prices Regulation Act 1948* for the sale of that used typewriter.

(2) Such advertisement may be in the following form:—

.....(make, model, serial number).

.....(name and address of advertiser).

£.....(selling price). Maximum price under *Prices*

*Regulation Act 1948* £.....

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any used typewriter specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Prices Regulation Act 1948.

## PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 50.

## LAUNDERING CHARGES—VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 50.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2363, issued under the National Security (Prices) Regulations, is hereby revoked.

## Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Commercial laundry” means all articles specified in the First Schedule to this Order used in the carrying on of a business or profession, including, without limiting the generality thereof, the following:—Public schools, hospitals, hotels, hostels, guest-houses, hairdressers, cafes, doctors’ establishments, dentists, clinics, orphanages, canteens, banks, offices, public utilities, caterers.

“Damp wash service” means washing, where the rate charged is on a poundage basis and the laundry is returned damp.

“Domestic laundry” means all articles specified in the Second Schedule to this Order used other than in the carrying on of a business or profession.

“Press finish service” means washing and machine or press ironing.

“Thrift-T service” means all washing where the rate charged is on a poundage basis and the laundry other than wearing apparel is returned ironed.

*Maximum Rates.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the service of laundering may be supplied in Victoria to be—

- (a) for commercial laundry—the rates specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (b) for domestic laundry—the rates specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (c) for washing by weight (including damp wash service, thrift-T service and press finish service)—the rates specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

*Fixation of Maximum Rates by Notice.*

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any service of laundering specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person in Victoria to whom such notice is given to be such rate as fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

*Exhibition of Maximum Rates.*

6. Every person who supplies or offers to supply a laundering service shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the maximum rates fixed for the supply of such laundering service by that person by the provisions of this Order.
