Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

(a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation, or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the

Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same.

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 5th day of May, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 2nd November, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to maize and assigned to such Board the name of "The Maize Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, all maize shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable The Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such maize shall subject to and in accordance with provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM PLANNING SCHEME 1948.

NOTICE OF APPROVAL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, having taken into consideration a report of the Town and Country Planning Board to the Minister thereon, has approved a scheme submitted by the Council of the municipality of the City of Sandringham pursuant to the said Acts, entitled the City of Sandringham Planning Scheme 1948, with the modifications set out hereunder:—

1. For page 1 of the scheme, there shall be substituted:—
“This Planning Scheme may be cited as the City of Sandringham Planning Scheme 1948.”

2. In clause 2—

(a) The definitions of the following terms shall be omitted:—

- (i) “Kiosk.”
- (ii) “Warehouse.”

(b) For the definition of “map,” there shall be substituted—

“Map” means the map attached hereto and marked “Map referred to in the City of Sandringham Planning Scheme 1948—Planning Scheme Map No. 2.”

(c) For the definition of “public highway,” there shall be substituted—

“Public highway” means any street so proclaimed by the Governor in Council, and any street which is, under any provision of Division 10 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, deemed or declared to be dedicated to the public as a public highway.

3. In sub-clause (3) of clause 4, the words “or in the occupation of” shall be omitted.

4. At the end of clause 5, there shall be inserted the following sub-clause:—

“(2) New streets will comprise those indicated in the following Schedule:—

Location.	Width.
(a) Connecting Holloway-road and Spring-street ..	50 feet.
(b) Connecting D'arcy-avenue and Spring-street ..	50 feet.”

5. At the end of clause 6, there shall be inserted the following sub-clause:—

“(a) The several pieces of land specified in column 1 of the following Schedule are reserved for use for the respective purposes indicated in column 2 of the Schedule:—

6. In sub-clause (4) of clause 7, for the words “the reasonable fencing of the land,” there shall be substituted the words “fencing within the meaning of the Fences Act.”

7. Sub-clause (3) of clause 12 shall be omitted.

8. (a) In sub-clause (4) of clause 12, for the words “any government authority,” there shall be substituted the words “any public authority.”

(b) At the end of the said sub-clause (4), there shall be added the following: “Such notice shall not be effective until after a period of three months or such other period as the Minister may direct.”

9. In sub-clause (1) of clause 16, after the word “map,” there shall be inserted the following expression: “and that rectangular piece of land at the northern corner of Reserve-road and Spring-street having a frontage of 456 ft. 10 in. to Reserve-road and a depth of 325 feet.”

10. At the end of sub-clause (5) of clause 16, there shall be added the expression: “excepting that in respect of that piece of land being parts of lots 24 and 25 on plan of subdivision No. 6511 lodged in the Office of Titles, and being the land more particularly described in Conveyance Book 583, No. 297, a residence for the owner or a caretaker of such land shall be permitted while such land is used for purposes of a plant nursery.”

11. Sub-clause (7) of clause 16 shall be omitted.

12. In paragraph (c) of sub-clause (1) of clause 17—

(a) after the word “cemetery” there shall be inserted the words “but excluding therefrom that rectangular piece of land at the northern corner of Reserve-road and Spring-street having a frontage of 456 ft. 10 in. to Reserve-road and a depth of 325 feet.”

(b) for the words and figures “sixty-six (66) feet,” there shall be substituted the words and figures “ten (10) feet.”

“Every submission shall be made by the owner or occupier and shall be accompanied by a statement in the form of the Second Schedule attesting to the accuracy of the information contained in the submission, and declaring that such submission is in conformity with all the provisions of this scheme.”

15. In clause 32, for the words “of the Minister,” there shall be substituted the words “of the Governor in Council.”

16. In sub-clause (2) of clause 35, after the word “order,” there shall be inserted the words and figures “within a period of thirty (30) days of service of such order.”

17. For clause 36, there shall be substituted the following clause:—

“36. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Scheme or who fails to comply with any of those provisions shall be liable to such penalties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor in Council for such offence.”

18. At the end of clause 39 there shall be added the expression—“and credited to the City of Sandringham Planning Scheme 1948 Account.”

19. For clause 42 the following clause shall be substituted:—

“42. A notice or other document which the Council is required or authorized to serve under this Scheme shall be served—

- (a) by delivery of the same personally to the person required to be served or, if such person is absent from Victoria, to his agent;

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and *having the words "Tender for" written thereon*, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best conditions, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor any of the articles specified in the schedule in the event of emergency due to the war.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Mont Park District will include the Mental Hospitals, Janefield Colony, and the Sanatorium, Gresswell; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, and Sunbury Districts will include the Mental Hospitals, Gaols, and Police Gaols at those places; and the Castlemaine District will include the Reformatory Prison. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the Officer ordering the supply.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. Where practicable, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the*

Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

1. The rates tendered shall be deemed to cover all descriptions of goods and parcels, with the exception of school books from Education Department to Victorian Railways, Melbourne, office and school furniture, officers' furniture and effects, exhibits for show purposes, and such are not included in the contract.

2. No subletting shall be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and every person engaged in the cartage tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such labour conditions as are or may be determined by any Federal Arbitration Court award or any State Wages Board determination, and a copy of such labour conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. Accounts shall be rendered fortnightly, and shall be subject to any deductions for goods or parcels lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the contractor or for storage or demurrage charges which may accrue through delay or default by the contractor in taking delivery of the goods.

4. No claims for detention shall be entertained, but should the contractor be subjected to unreasonable delay, the cause of delay, if reported, shall be investigated.

5. The contractor must have an office connected by telephone, and within a radius of 6 miles of the Melbourne (Elizabeth-street) Post Office. SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

REGULATION No. 7.

Footpath Crossings.

A Regulation of the Shire of Dandenong, fixing the width, inclination, and depression of crossings, and materials of which same are to be constructed, made under the *Local Government Act 1946* by virtue of a By-law No. 94 of the above-named Shire, adopting the provisions of the Fifteenth Schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong do hereby order and direct—

1. That all previous Regulations for fixing the width, inclination, and depression of crossings, and materials of which same are to be constructed, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. That crossing over footways shall be flush with the footway for one-third of the width of the footway, and shall then fall with a gradual inclination to the invert of the channel, and from there continue towards the roadway on an upward gradient for a distance equal to the width of existing channel, and having the same inclination to the invert as the existing channel.

3. Crossings shall be constructed the full width of the gateway, but in no case less than 9 feet wide.

4. All crossings must be constructed of concrete or other approved material, 6 inches deep in the case of crossings to be used by commercial vehicles and 4 inches deep for other vehicles.

5. Concrete shall consist of one part of Portland cement (93 lb. to be taken as a measure for 1 cubic foot) to two parts by measure of clean sand and four parts of 1½-in. approved metal, free from dirt or other impurities. Concrete to be laid on 2 inches of sand or ashes.

6. Where required concrete shall be reinforced with mild steel bars, as approved by the Engineer.

7. Where kerbing has been cut away to permit the construction of a crossing, new return kerbing shall be constructed on each side of the crossing to the same specification as existing kerbing, or to an approved design in concrete. Kerbing shall be returned on a radius of not less than 36 inches and tapered so that top meets rising gradient of crossing in a manner least likely to cause inconvenience to pedestrians, and to the Engineer's approval.

8. Crossings shall be graded with metal or bitumenous metal (according to the construction of the existing road) from the outer edge of concrete to the crown of the road.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clauses, if, in the opinion of the Engineer, it is impracticable to grade a crossing from the footpath to the invert of the channel, he may require the person applying for permission to construct the crossing to supply him with a plan and specification of a reinforced concrete or pipe culvert, showing clearly the depth of the invert below the footpath at the fence line, below the top of the kerb, and below the crown of the road. Plan shall also show the longitudinal gradients and the proposed waterway. Should the Engineer consider the proposal satisfactory, he may approve of the culvert crossing, with or without alterations to the plans and specifications.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council the 7th day of March, 1949, and confirmed the 20th day of April, 1949.

SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 26, for—

1. Prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the area within the municipal district set forth in this By-law.

2. Regulating the use of streets, roads, and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in goods.

3. Prohibiting any street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in goods during particular hours from using any streets, roads, or public places within the area within the municipal district set forth in this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power thereunto it enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. This By-law, save as is otherwise expressed in any clause thereof, shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Township of Korumburra.

2. No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag, or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any public highway, road, street, footpath, footway, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding formed on private property, within the Township of Korumburra, but the prohibition herein contained shall not apply to fêtes, carnivals, or bazaars for charitable purposes or for assisting any church, Sunday school, religious organization, returned servicemen's or servicewomen's organization, boy scout or girl guide organization, or for the purpose of any hospital auxiliary, or for the purposes of any other organization, body, or society approved by the Council.

3. No street hawker or itinerant trader dealing in goods shall, between the hours of Eight o'clock in the forenoon and Six o'clock in the afternoon, use any street, road, or public place within the area of the Township of Korumburra which is bounded on the north by the south-eastern railway, on the west by King-street, on the south by Victoria-street, and on the east by Bridge-street, and during the same hours shall not use that part of Mine-road extending from Bridge-street to the Korumburra and Outtrim railway.

4. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader.

5. Clause 2 shall not prevent any person from delivering any goods to any place or residence in any street in the said Township of Korumburra, provided that such goods have been previously ordered to be delivered by the occupier of such place or residence.

6. Any person who is guilty of any act or default in contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, in the case of a first offence to a penalty of not less than £2 and not exceeding £20, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not less than £5 and not exceeding £20.

7. This By-law shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

CEMENT—VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 51.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 32 is hereby revoked.

Maximum Prices—Sales of Cement Manufactured by Goliath Portland Cement Co. Ltd.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement manufactured by Goliath Portland Cement Co. Ltd. may be sold in Victoria to be—

(a) in respect of sales for delivery c.i.f. Melbourne—

- (i) per ton, £6 3s. 6d.,
- (ii) per bag, 5s. 9½d.;

(b) in respect of sales other than for delivery c.i.f. Melbourne—the price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of the cement for delivery c.i.f. Melbourne, plus an amount equal to the current freight which would be payable for the transport of that cement by rail from Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne, to the railway station nearest to the point of delivery of that cement.

Maximum Prices—Other Sales.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement other than cement manufactured by Goliath Portland Cement Co. Ltd. may be sold in Victoria to be—

(a) in respect of sales for delivery f.o.r. Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne—

- (i) per ton, £5 10s. 3d.,
- (ii) per bag, 5s. 3½d.;

- (b) in respect of sales other than for delivery f.o.r. Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne, the price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that cement for delivery f.o.r. Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne, plus an amount equal to the current freight which would be payable for the transport of that cement by rail from Spencer-street Railway Station, Melbourne, to the railway station nearest to the point of delivery of that cement.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which cement specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

LIQUORS.

Ale, Beer, Lager, Stout, Porter, and any Mixtures thereof; or any Mixtures thereof with Aerated Waters.

Melbourne Metropolitan Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner for the State of Victoria, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 52.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1962, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 2109 and 2961 and made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Liquor or Liquors” means and includes ale, beer, lager, stout, porter, and any mixtures thereof; or any mixtures thereof with aerated waters.

“Melbourne Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Oz.” means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be.

“4 oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 4 oz. or more but less than 7 oz.

“7 oz. glass” or “Long glass” means any glass or similar container containing 7 oz. or more but less than 11 oz.

“11 oz. pot” means any glass or similar container containing not less than 11 oz.

“Reputed Pint” means 13 oz.

“Reputed Quart” means 26 oz.

“Nip” means 6½ oz.

“Demi-nip” means 4½ oz.

Liquors Specified in the Schedule.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold by retail in the Melbourne Metropolitan Area to be the prices specified therein.

Liquors in Schedules—Quantities not Specified.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold in quantities other than those specified in the said Schedules to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such liquors specified in the said Schedules or if there is no smaller quantity specified then such price—calculated to the nearest downward half-penny—as is in the same proportion to the maximum price fixed for the next higher quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

Sales in Dining-Room or Lounge.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold by any person in any dining-room or lounge on licensed premises in the Melbourne Metropolitan Area to be the prices specified in such Schedules plus an amount equal to the difference between such dining-room or lounge prices respectively lawfully charged by that person on 16th September, 1948, for any such liquors and the bar prices lawfully charged by that person for such liquors on such date. Provided that if in the case of any sale, by reason of the absence of records the difference between such dining-room or lounge prices and the bar prices at the 16th September, 1948, cannot be ascertained, the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply and such sale shall be deemed to have been made in the bar.

Non-Listed Liquors.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind of liquor (together with any container supplied therewith) for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be sold by any person in the Melbourne Metropolitan Area to be an amount computed at the rate of one half-penny for each fluid ounce of such liquor.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any liquor specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Price List.

9. Every person who sells or holds for sale by retail any liquors, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining-rooms, and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such liquors.
