CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the City of Sandringham (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said lands is hereby prohibited.
2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.
3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.
4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.
5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.
7. Schedule of land affected: All that piece of land commencing at the north-west corner of Edward-street and Bluff-road, proceeding northerly to intersection of Royal-avenue, westerly along Royal-avenue to Jennings-street, and southerly along Jennings-street to Harold-street; thence southerly along the prolongation of the eastern building line of Jennings-street to its intersection with Edward-street; thence easterly along the north building line of Edward-street to the commencing point.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 40,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Shire Hall, Rutherglen.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust, Shire Hall, Yea.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL, AND COMPRISING THE FORESHORE AND OTHER LAND.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved for public purposes in the City of Warrnambool pursuant to Order in Council of 13th December, 1948, as notified in the *Government Gazette* of 22nd December, 1948, and comprising the foreshore and other land, which are together hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves":—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the expression "The Committee" shall mean the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves.

2. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserves as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect the fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area.

3. No person shall camp on or use as a camp or for the purpose of camping any portion of the Reserves except on such portion or portions thereof as are specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose.

4. No person shall camp on or use a camping area or any camping lounge or convenience appurtenant to a camping area, except during the period covered by a permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer, and on the payment of such fees as are fixed by the Committee, and any such permission may be granted subject to conditions deemed reasonable by such Committee.

5. No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Reserves shall bring a caravan therein, nor shall any person sub-let a caravan therein.

6. No person shall camp or use a caravan within the Reserves for a period of more than 28 days at one time, unless with the special consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

7. Any person entering a structure, tent, or shelter, or parking a caravan in any camping area, shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

8. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected therein any structure, tent, or shelter, or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep

the site thus occupied in such camping area, in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage, on the site.

9. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate amount of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded, and the Committee or its authorized officer, at its or his discretion, may deduct and retain from any such proportionate amount a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

10. No person shall—

- (a) permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to enter upon the Reserves, except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose of accommodating animals;
- (b) break in any horse, or exercise any horse or other animal, within the Reserves;
- (c) destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, climb upon, or otherwise injure or damage, or jump over any fences, seats, buildings, or other erections, or use, displace, play with, injure, or destroy any life-saving appliance or signal bell provided by the Committee or by any life-saving club for use in the Reserves, unless such use or displacement shall be necessary for the purpose of saving the life of any person actually in danger;
- (d) cut, pluck, injure, or destroy any tree, shrub, marram grass, bush, plant, or flower growing on the Reserves;
- (e) dig, cut, or remove any turf, sod, loam, sand, gravel, shell-grit, or other substance in or on the Reserves;
- (f) engage or take part in any motor car or motor cycle racing on the Reserves, nor shall any person bring or place any motor car, motor cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or any other vehicle on the Reserves, except in a parking area which may be set apart by the Committee;
- (g) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed on the Reserves;
- (h) carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol, or firearm in or upon the Reserves, or throw or cause to be thrown any stones, sand, or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserves or the property thereon;
- (i) hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in the Reserves, or sell or let for hire any article, place, seat, or chair;
- (j) play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon, or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussion, or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserves, except with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on a site or sites approved by the Committee and defined by notice boards;
- (k) give out or distribute any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserves, or litter the Reserves by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers;
- (l) play cricket, football, hockey, handball, rounders, baseball, golf, tennis, or other athletic games or sports, except in portions of the Reserves set apart for such purposes, as provided herein-after;
- (m) deposit or cause to be deposited any paper, bottles, broken glass, fruit skins, food, or other litter or other refuse in or upon the Reserves, except in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee, or wilfully or negligently deposit or leave thereon any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substances or materials;
- (n) bring into the Reserves any dog for training or exercising or coursing, or for any purpose of sport, or suffer or cause any dog belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or remain in any part of the Reserves, unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or animal, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee;

- (o) carelessly, negligently, or wilfully injure, deface, or remove any seat, notice, or notice board, post, chair, railing, fence, barrier, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed in the Reserves, by or with the authority of the Committee;
- (p) brawl, fight, use indecent language, make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or act in any indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or sell, distribute, or exhibit any indecent or infamous book or picture, representation to the obstruction, annoyance, or danger of any person in the Reserves.
11. No person offending against decency in dress, language or conduct shall enter or remain in the Reserves.
12. No person shall bathe from the Reserves unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
13. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the children's playground on the Reserves, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon; provided nevertheless, that parents or other persons shall be at liberty to enter the children's playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
14. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident occurring from the use of the swings or any other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserves.
15. No male person other than a boy under the age of five (5) years shall enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of females, and no females shall enter in or use any playground, place, room, or building set apart for the use of males.
16. No person shall in any part of the Reserves obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserves, or obstruct, or neglect to obey the lawful direction of any authorized officer of the Committee. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language or creating or taking part in any disturbance in the Reserves, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom.
17. No person shall light a fire on the Reserves without the written consent of the Committee, except in fire-places specially provided therein by the Committee, or in suitable receptacles provided by the user at places set apart for campers and picnickers, and any person who lights a fire in the Reserves shall take precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control, nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly, or negligently light any fire, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being thereon.
18. All persons using the parking area set apart by the Committee for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle shall pay on demand such charge or fee as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee on notices placed in the parking area.
19. Every person or club using the bathing boxes, kiosk, and other buildings and conveniences provided for and erected on the Reserves may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee may from time to time determine, provided always that the moneys received in such fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves.
20. The Committee may set apart and may enclose certain parts of the Reserves for the holding of sports, athletic games, matches, fêtes, concerts, gymkhanas, entertainments, or other holiday amusements, and on not more than 26 days in any one year may fix and take a charge not exceeding three shillings (3s.) for the admission of every adult person to such enclosures on the days so set apart.
21. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, basketball, football, golf, hockey, or any other game or foot-racing in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such portions thereof set apart for that purpose, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.
22. No person shall enter upon any playground or oval in the Reserves while any game or sport is being played or conducted thereon unless such person is a player, competitor, or official connected with such game or sport.

23. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, athletic games, matches, fêtes, concerts, gymkhanas, entertainments, or other holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that all care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained to such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the costs of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

24. The Committee may at any time by notice set up prohibit the taking of any dog or dogs into any particular portion or portions of the Reserves except as hereinbefore provided, and any dog or dogs found therein shall be liable to be seized and destroyed by the Committee or its authorized officer, and the owner or any person having the custody of the dog or dogs so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall also make compensation for any damage done to the property of the Committee by such dog or dogs.

25. No person shall erect any bathing box, boatshed, or other structure on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted by the Committee subject to such conditions and payment of such fees as the Committee may deem to be reasonable, provided that no bathing box, boatshed, or other structure erected on the Reserves shall be used for residential purposes, or for any purpose other than that for which permission was granted by the Committee.

26. No person shall cause or allow any dog to enter any pond or water on the Reserves within the hours during which bathing is authorized therein.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulation in respect of the land in the Township of Stawell, Parish of Stawell, temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 20th June, 1905, and 18th January, 1949, as a site for Public Gardens and the additional purpose of Public Recreation and Tourist Camp, and known as the "Lake Reserve," at Stawell, in lieu of Regulation 15 made by the Board of Land and Works on 1st March, 1943, which is hereby rescinded.

REGULATION.

15. The fees payable to the Committee of Management for the right to camp in the camping area shall be—

- (a) For camping parties not exceeding six (6) persons—Two shillings per day, or Seven shillings and six pence per week.
- (b) For camping parties exceeding six (6) persons—6 to 12 persons, Three shillings per day, or Fifteen shillings per week; 12 to 18 persons, Four shillings per day, or Twenty shillings per week; more than 18 persons, Five shillings per day, or Twenty-five shillings per week.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

By-Law No. 141.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 141, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said city under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 1 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may construct a building of Class 1 occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 1 of Table 803 of the Regulations in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

TOWN OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

By-Law No. 39.

A By-law of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, made under the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf and numbered 39, for regulating and controlling the collection and removal of household refuse.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and the Local Government

Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Household refuse or garbage" shall mean all waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation of food.

"Wet refuse" shall mean any fluid waste matter, and water shall have the same meaning.

"Garden clippings" shall mean rose prunings, hedge clippings, and all like matter, and shall include flowers.

"Ashes" shall mean the residue of any combustible material after burning.

2. By-law No. 7 is hereby repealed.

3. (b) cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and deodorant when necessary;

(c) cause such receptacles to be maintained in good order and condition;

(d) cause all household refuse arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles;

(e) cause all household refuse arising from his premises to be effectively wrapped in newspaper or other like material before depositing in refuse receptacle;

(f) cause such receptacles to be continually covered save when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom;

(g) cause a separate receptacle to be provided for the deposit of ashes;

(h) cause such receptacles to be placed in the yard or garden of such premises close to the entrance from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such premises abut once a week on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse.

5. No person shall—

(a) deposit or cause to be deposited any wet refuse in a refuse receptacle or receptacle provided for the deposit of ashes;

(b) deposit or cause to be deposited any ashes in a refuse receptacle;

(c) deposit or cause to be deposited any garden clippings in a refuse receptacle or receptacle provided for the deposit of ashes.

6. No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any refuse, garbage, or garden refuse in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell.

9. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Ten shillings for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Ten shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

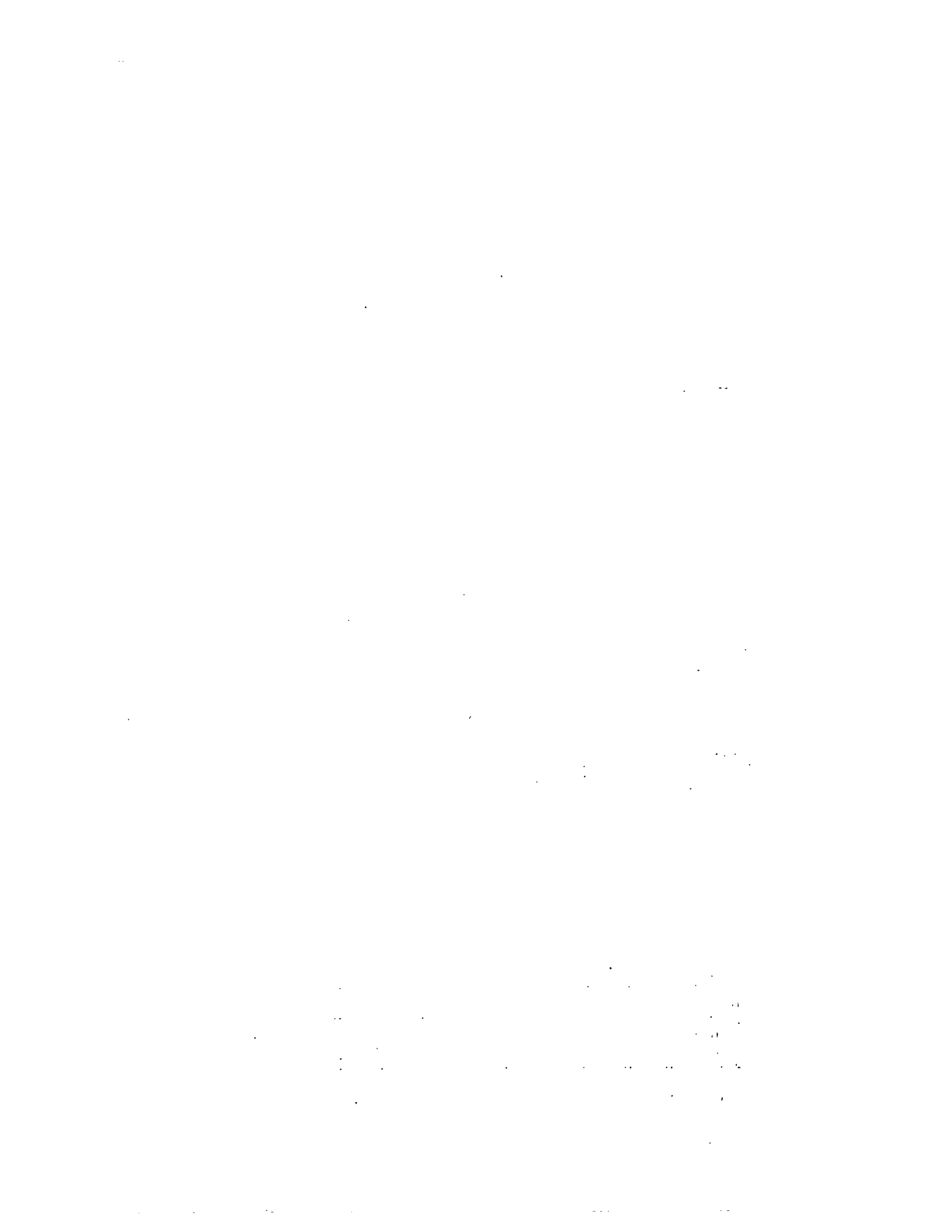

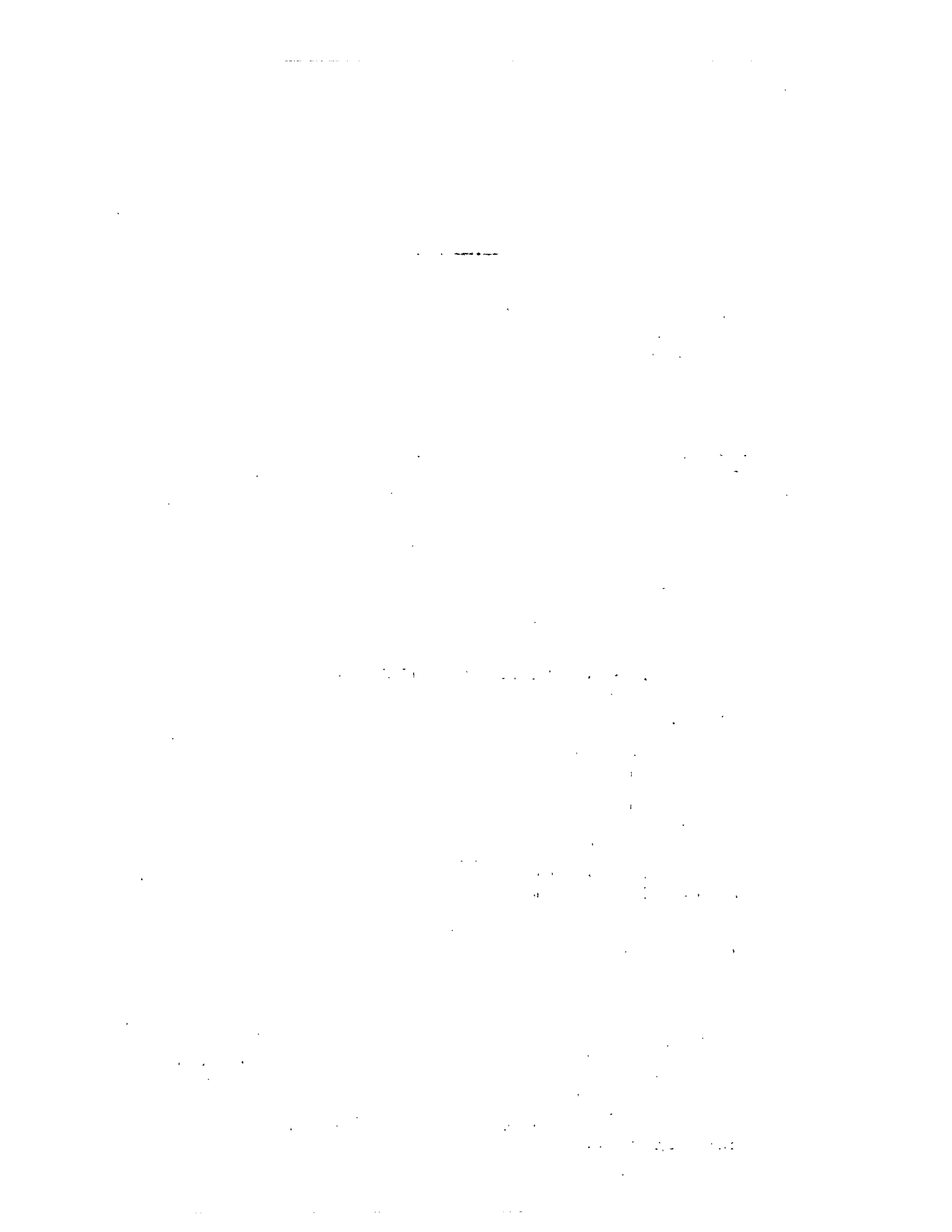

EXCEPTIONS AND MODIFICATIONS.

NOTE.—Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Determination contained or prescribed—

- (a) The provisions of clauses 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 21, 22, 23, 24, and 25 of this Determination shall not apply to or in respect of the employment of an employee ordinarily employed by the employer upon maintenance in or in connexion with a mixed enterprise but in lieu thereof the employer shall be bound to observe towards any such employee the provisions of any award, determination or agreement applicable to the majority of the other persons employed by him in such a mixed enterprise. The employer shall nevertheless be bound to apply to and in respect of such an employee the provisions of the other clauses not specifically in this sub-clause mentioned of this Determination.
- (b) The provisions of clauses 9, 15, and 21 shall not apply to or in respect of the employment of an employee in or in connexion with a carpentry or joinery shop or a carpentry or joinery mill.
- (c) (i) Where an employee, employed in an employer's shop, works by direction of his employer on a building, fixing therein or thereon material made in such shop, he shall be paid for such work as for shop work and in addition shall be paid (to the nearest 1d.) a proportionate amount of the disabilities allowance set out in Section A—Weekly Employees clause 31, for building construction work, for the time so employed.

- (ii) Where a maintenance carpenter or joiner is employed on building construction work, as herein defined, he shall be paid for such work as for work on a mixed enterprise and in addition shall be paid (to the nearest 1d.) a proportionate amount of the disabilities allowance set out in Section A—Weekly Employees clause 31, for building construction work for the time so employed; for the purposes of this sub-clause a maintenance carpenter or joiner shall be regarded as employed on building construction when he is required to and does work on the site in connection with the erection or demolition of a building exceeding 250 square feet in floor area; or the repair, maintenance, renovation or ornamentation of buildings or structures which are not directly concerned with the activities of the establishment in which, or the employer by whom, he is employed. In the event of any dispute arising out of this sub-clause it shall be referred to the Wages Board.

JUNIOR LABOUR.

Part I.—Unapprenticed.

27. (a) The proportion of unapprenticed junior employees to journeymen employed by any employer shall not exceed one to four on building construction work performed on site and one to six on work performed in shops or joinery mills: Provided nevertheless that an employer who employs two adult employees may employ one unapprenticed junior employee.

(b) Unapprenticed junior employees shall be paid the same wages as are prescribed in sub-clause (f) of Part II. of this clause and they shall also be paid the special rates prescribed in clause 3 of this Determination according to the exigencies of their employment.

(c) The provisions of clauses 2 to 25 (both inclusive) of this Determination shall be applicable to and in respect of the employment of unapprenticed junior employees.

(d) No unapprenticed junior employee shall be permitted or required by his employer to attend winches, sling timber or work power-driven machinery.

Part II.—Apprenticed.

(Except those covered by the Apprenticeship Commission.)

(a) All apprenticed junior employees shall be indentured for five years in accordance with the form of indenture prescribed by the Wages Board: Provided that a period of probation of three months shall be allowed to each such junior employee, which shall be reckoned as part of the period of his apprenticeship should he at the commencement thereof, or during, or at the termination thereof become indentured as aforesaid.

(b) All documents of indentures and transfers thereof shall be lodged with the Secretary of the Wages Board.

(c) (i) The proportion of apprenticed junior employees to journeymen employed in shops or joinery mills shall not exceed two to three or a fraction of three after any full multiple of three. The calculation of the proportion shall be based, when it is proposed to take an apprentice, upon the aggregate numbers of employees on full-time employment with the employer for the preceding six months. If an employer is actually working in the trade he shall count as a journeyman.

(ii) The proportion of apprenticed junior employees to journeymen employed elsewhere than in shops or joinery mills shall be in accordance with the proportion as prescribed by the Apprenticeship Commission for such apprentices as come within the jurisdiction of such Commission.

(d) If an employer is unable to fulfil his obligations to an apprentice, the apprentice shall be entitled to complete his term of apprenticeship with another employer, who may take and employ him as such an apprentice and for that purpose the apprentice shall, if required so to do, sign a deed of apprenticeship to such other employer.

(e) No employer shall be entitled to take an apprentice unless he has been in business for at least one year: Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to the case of an employer or an apprentice in a joinery mill.
