POLICE REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ACT 1948.

Date of Coming into Operation.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the Police Regulation (Amendment) Act 1948 (No. 5359), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the twelfth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, as the day on which the said Police Regulation (Amendment) Act 1948 shall come into operation.

Duties.—Under the direction of the Divisional Engineer, to supervise the work of the Rivers and Streams Branch, to organize and carry out field investigation with regard to the maintenance and improvement of rivers and streams, including river surveys, to plan in detail and supervise the preparation of drawings and estimates for, and to supervise works of river improvement, and to advise municipal councils and other public bodies regarding river improvement matters.

Qualifications.—A Degree in Civil Engineering or recognized equivalent, and preferably qualifications as an Engineer of Water Supply. To have had at least five years' general engineering experience, preferably in hydraulic engineering and river improvement works, including work in the field, and to have had experience in a responsible executive position. To possess administrative ability and experience in conducting negotiations and conferences with responsible bodies.

Conservation Officer, Class "C," Soil Conservation Board, Department of Premier. (Two vacancies.)

Duties.—(a) To assist the Senior Conservation Officer in the direction of soil conservation on private and public lands throughout the State. To advise land owners and assist in the carrying out of soil conservation measures. To select suitable areas for demonstration purposes and advise on remedial works to be adopted.

(b) To undertake research in soil conservation and the adaptation of measures used in other countries to Victorian conditions.


