Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.
WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

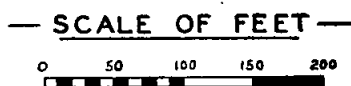
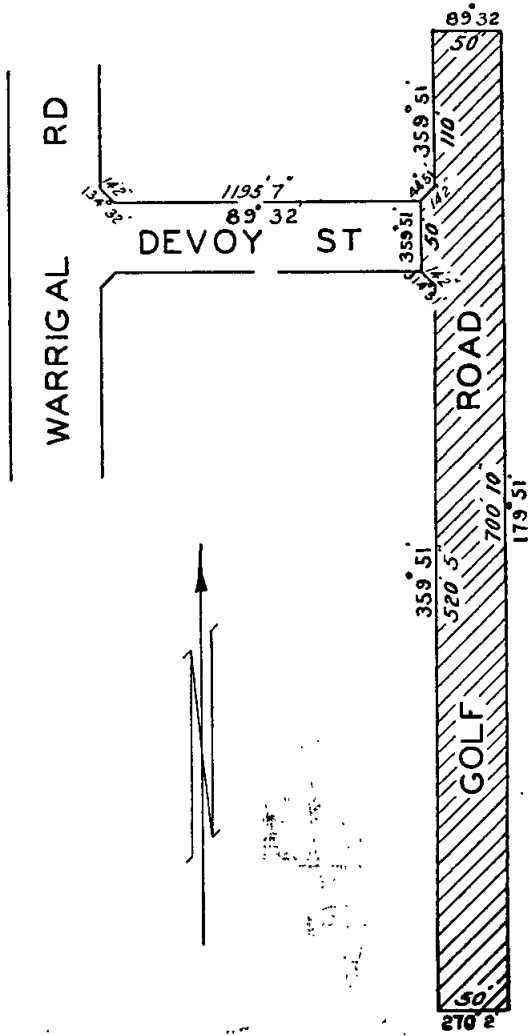
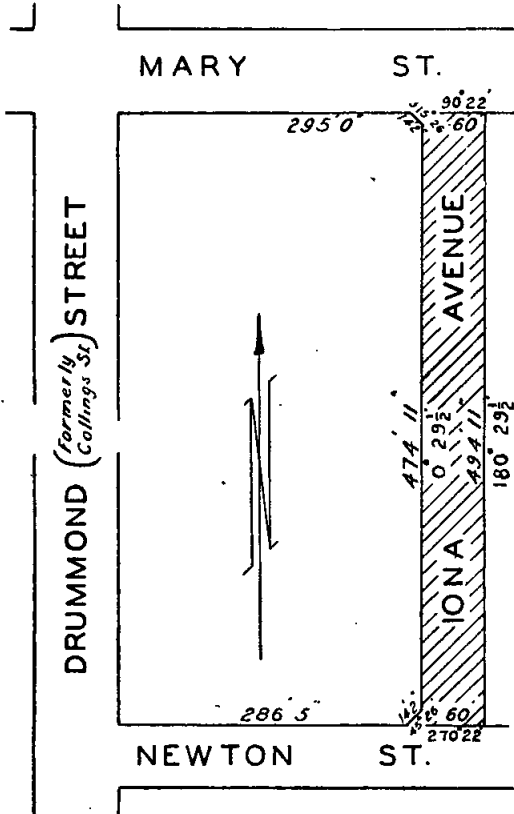

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And, whereas the Council of the City of Oakleigh has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved as streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all those pieces of land reserved as streets and being that part of Crown portion 44, Parish of Mulgrave, County of Bourke, known as Iona-avenue, and that part of Crown allotment 6, section 1, Parish of Mordialloc, County of Bourke, known as Golf-road, respectively, and indicated by hachure on the plans hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF TRAMMELS TRAWLS AND/OR DANISH SEINE NETS IN CERTAIN WATERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the 18th day of February, 1919, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th day of February, 1919, respecting trawling in bays, inlets, &c., and prohibit during the whole of each year the use of trammels trawls and/or Danish seine nets to be employed in fishing in any bay or inlet in Victoria or in any waters within a distance of three miles of any portion or point of the Victorian coast line.

Medical Act 1928.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Medical Act 1928* the Pharmacy Board of Victoria with the approval of the Governor in Council doth make the following Regulations, that is to say—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1948 and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Regulations 1930, 1931, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1939, 1944, and 1945 which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Pharmacy Regulations."

2. Regulation 77 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by the Pharmacy Regulations 1936 is rescinded and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

"77. Every prescription of a legally-qualified medical practitioner, registered dentist or registered veterinary surgeon which is dispensed, compounded, or made up by a pharmaceutical chemist, or under the actual personal supervision of a registered pharmaceutical chemist by a bona fide assistant or apprentice of a registered pharmaceutical chemist, shall be recorded by such registered pharmaceutical chemist, assistant or apprentice, as follows:—

- (a) Except as provided in 77 (b) each prescription before delivery of the medicine to the purchaser or his agent shall be copied in full (including where practicable the prescriber's name into a book kept for the purpose (called the prescription book). The record of each prescription shall include an individual identifying number and/or letter, the name of the patient, and shall be dated with the day, the month and the year when the prescription was dispensed. Each record in the prescription book shall be signed or initialed by the actual dispenser.
- (b) Provided that it shall not be obligatory for prescriptions dispensed under the Commonwealth Pharmaceutical Benefits Act or for ex-servicemen or their dependants under agreement with the Repatriation Commission to be copied into a prescription book if such prescriptions are written on official printed forms in accordance with the requirements of the Pharmaceutical Benefits Act or the Repatriation Commission, that duplicate copies of such prescriptions are retained by the pharmaceutical chemist and filed by him in a manner approved by the Board and recorded in a daily work-book, that the original and duplicate of every such prescription is marked with the individual identifying number and/or letter recorded in the daily work-book, the date of dispensing, the name of the pharmacist, the address of the pharmacy at which the prescription was dispensed, and is initialed by the actual dispenser, and a record is made in such daily work-book of the date of dispensing, an identifying number and/or letter, the type of preparation dispensed and the initials of the actual dispenser, and that the duplicates of such prescriptions are filed in the pharmacy in such a manner as to be readily accessible for inspection.
- (c) A card system, loose-leaf system, or prescription-filing system used in conjunction with a daily work-book shall be deemed a prescription book if such system is of a type approved by the Board and the daily work-book includes the particulars set out in 77 (b).
- (d) Any prescription for a member of a registered friendly society written in the member's prescription book need not be recorded provided that an entry for that prescription is made in a daily work-book as in 77 (b) and also provided that such prescription is not a dangerous drug.
- (e) A record of all medicines extemporaneously dispensed shall be made as provided in 77 (a) or 77 (c).

- (f) In the case of repeated prescriptions including prescriptions of members of friendly societies, written in such members' prescription books, an entry in the prescription book or daily work-book including the date of dispensing, the patient's name, the identification number, type of preparation, and the actual dispenser's initials shall be a sufficient compliance with 77 (a) or 77 (c).
- (g) The records of prescriptions required herein to be kept must be retained in the establishment in which the prescriptions were dispensed by the proprietor or manager of such establishment or his successor for not less than two years.
- (h) Each prescription itself whether retained or not and including prescriptions written in a friendly society members' prescription book shall be stamped or endorsed indelibly with the identifying number, date of dispensing, and the address of the pharmacy in which it is dispensed in addition to the name of the proprietor of that pharmacy. Each prescription shall also be initialed by the actual dispenser.
- (i) All prescription records in a pharmacy shall be produced on the demand of an inspector of the Board or other person authorized, in writing, by the Board.
- (j) The bottle or package actually containing any medicine dispensed shall before delivery to the patient or his agent be clearly labelled and the label shall include—
 1. Name of proprietor or pharmacy, and
 2. Address of pharmacy where the medicine was dispensed.
 3. Title of preparation.
 4. Directions for use as given on the prescription.
 5. Name of patient.
 6. Identifying number of prescription record.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF TRAINEES FOR THE PURPOSE OF UNDERGOING A COURSE OF TRAINING IN FORESTRY AND GOVERNING THE ISSUE OF DIPLOMAS IN FORESTRY.

Clause 93—add—

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government (Private Street Construction) Act 1947*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that, owing to shortages in supplies of cement or other required materials, the works provided for in the scheme adopted by the Council of the City of Sandringham for the construction of Earlsfield-road, Hampton, being a private street within the municipal district of the said City, which works were commenced prior to the commencement of the said Act, cannot be satisfactorily executed in accordance with the specifications, maps, plans, sections, and elevations in the scheme pursuant to which the works were commenced, doth, by this Order, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, authorize the Council of the City of Sandringham to execute the works with the following variations of the said specifications, viz.:

In lieu of the clauses contained in the specifications commencing with that headed "Concrete Footpaths" and ending with that headed "Seal Coat," and in lieu of the clause headed "Curing," there shall be substituted:—
"Asphalt Footpaths.—Construct asphalt footpaths to sections shown on plan.

Formation.—The contractor shall excavate or fill the ground to bring the work to its permanent levels as shown on the sections. All stones, roots, stumps, service pipes, or other obstructions within 3 inches of the under side of the boxing for the asphalt shall be completely removed and the excavation made good with approved sand or loam, watered and rolled if ordered before asphalt is laid.

Spoil.—All surplus spoil, old asphalt, gravel, &c., from the excavations shall remain the property of the Council, and shall be tipped and spread at the Council's King-street Depot, or where directed within 1 mile of the work.

Eradication of Noxious Weeds.—Before any asphalt is placed for the footpaths, the whole of the bottom of the boxing shall be sprayed with an approved chlorate weed killer at the rate of one pound of weed killer to each thirty (30) square yards of boxing. The weed killer shall be mixed with water at the rate of one pound per gallon of water and applied with a pressure sprayer fitted with a flat fan spray at a pressure of 20 pounds per square inch.

Permanent Form Work.—Form work shall be of three by one inch (3 in. x 1 in.) hardwood, and shall remain permanently fixed as a plinth to the edges of the asphalt paving.

All forming shall be fixed rigid, true to line and grade, and shall be secured by nailing to three by one by twelve inch (3 in. x 1 in. x 12 in.) hardwood pegs driven at intervals of six feet. Form work must be approved by the City Engineer or his representative before asphalt is placed.

Asphalt Paving.—Over the areas shown on plans an asphalt pavement of three (3) inches finished thickness shall be laid on a prepared formation. The paving shall consist of a bituminous penetration base course and a pre-mixed bituminous surface course finished with a seal coat of bituminous emulsion.

Base Course.—The aggregate shall be basalt or other approved stone, properly screened free from chips, under or over gauge stone and dirt, and is to comply with the following grading tested with laboratory screens having circular openings.

Percentage passing sieve—

¾	..	100
¾	..	90 — 100
¾	..	35 — 55

A base course of ¾-in. screenings spread to a depth of 3 in., loose measurement, shall be laid on the prepared formation and rolled with an approved roller until consolidated.

When thoroughly consolidated the base course shall be penetrated with an application of bituminous emulsion sprayed with an approved mechanical sprayer at the rate of half a gallon per square yard of paving surface.

Immediately after penetration, the surface treated shall be lightly covered with clean ¾-in. toppings and rolled to a compact regular and smooth surface with an approved roller. Care must be taken not to apply toppings in a thick layer. (The quantity of toppings required for this operation is estimated at 1 cubic yard to 150 square yards of paving surface.)

Cold Laid Bituminous Surface Course.—Within twenty-four (24) hours of the completion of the base course or at such interval as may be directed, the contractor shall arrange to apply a pre-mixed bituminous macadam surface course as specified hereunder.

The material shall be spread to a depth of ¾ in., loose measurement, and shall be composed of stone material of the grading specified and cut back bitumen.

Aggregate.—The aggregate shall consist of approved broken stone obtained from clean, tough, durable igneous rock having a maximum percentage of wear by the Los Angeles Test of 20 per cent. It shall be properly screened free from under or over gauge stone and dirt. When tested with laboratory screens, square mesh, it shall comply with the following grading:—

Bitumen.—The bituminous binder shall be an approved brand of made-up cut-back bitumen suitable to the requirements of the work and the contractor shall give notice of brand and supplier before work is commenced.

Mixer.—The bituminous macadam shall be mixed in an approved pug-mill or concrete mixer of at least ½ cubic yard capacity, until the materials have been thoroughly mixed and the aggregate uniformly coated. The City Engineer may order such period of mixing as he considers necessary. Every care must be taken to keep the mixer clean. The cut-back bitumen shall be heated in proper heaters to a temperature of 160°F. and immediately used. The amount of bituminous binder used shall be approximately 10 gallons per cubic yard of dry materials. The exact proportions may be varied by the City Engineer to suit aggregate supplied. Only sufficient material shall be placed in the heaters to do a day's work. Re-heated material shall not be used. The contractor shall take all necessary precautions and shall be liable for any loss or damage caused by fire. The mixer shall be located on the site of the works unless otherwise permitted by the City Engineer. Measurements of aggregate and binder may be by volume but the volume of the measuring vessels shall be calibrated by weight. If barrows are used for measuring aggregate, they shall be struck off after filling.

Placing.—The mixed material shall be placed on the prepared base course and raked to a uniform surface and grade. After raking, the whole surface of the spread materials shall be screeded off with a screed not less than six (6) feet in length, additional material being added where necessary. The depth of the pre-mixed material after screeding shall be ¾ in., loose measurement. Rolling shall then be carried out with an approved roller and the whole of the surface shall then be covered with stone grit at the rate of 1 cubic yard to 250 square yards of paving surface and then rolled again.

Seal Coat.—After being trafficked for a period of not less than one week, the whole of the paved surface shall be sealed with an application of bituminous emulsion sprayed with a mechanical sprayer at the rate of 0.167 of a gallon per square yard of paved surface and covered with clean stone grit at the rate of 1 cubic yard to 200 square yards and then lightly rolled.

AMENDMENT OF BREADMAKING AND BAKING TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say)—

1. Regulation 10 of the Bread Making and Baking Trade Regulations (No. 1) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as from the 18th day of December, 1948.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation the following Regulation shall be substituted:—

"10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trade in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows as from the 18th day of December, 1948, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trade shall be deemed to be amended accordingly—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—
1st six months—at the rate of 37s. 7d. per week.

2nd six months—at the rate of 38s. 5d. per week.

2nd year—
1st six months—at the rate of 41s. 3d. per week.

2nd six months—at the rate of 46s. 2d. per week.

3rd year—
1st six months—at the rate of 52s. 9d. per week.

2nd six months—at the rate of 52s. 5d. per week.

4th Year—
1st six months—at the rate of 72s. 10d. per week.

2nd six months—at the rate of 85s. 3d. per week.

5th year—
1st six months—at the rate of 100s. 5d. per week.

2nd six months—at the rate of 117s. 0d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—
1st six months—at the rate of 41s. 3d. per week.

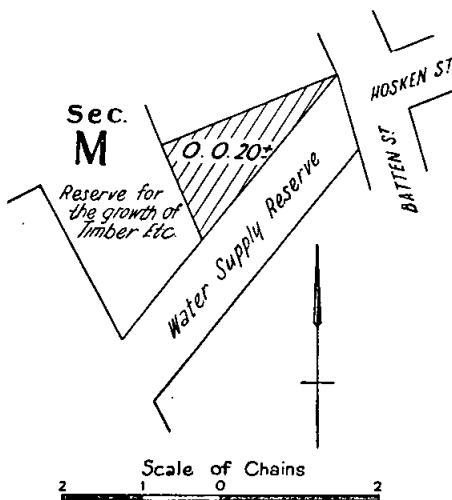

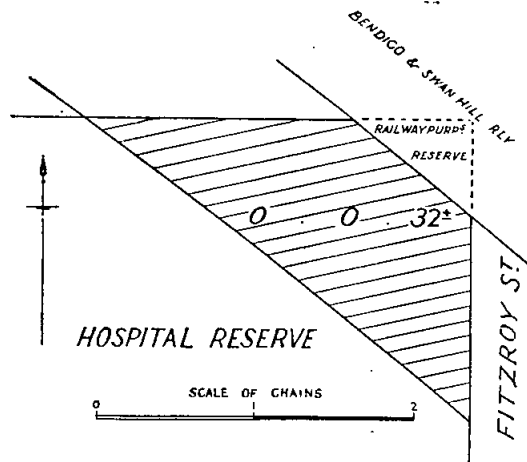

30 feet; thence easterly to a point on the east side of Dight-street; thence southerly along the east side of Dight-street to the north-eastern corner of the intersection of Dight-street and Vere-street; thence easterly along the north side of Vere-street to the north-western corner of the intersection of Vere-street and Hoddle-street; thence northerly along the west side of Hoddle-street to commencing point."
