*Police Regulation Act 1946.*

POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION NO. 20 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1946*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

1. The Determination No. 1 of the Police Classification Board of the 13th November, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd November, 1946, as amended by Determinations Nos. 4, 8, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 17, and 19, is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By adding thereto the following:—

“ DIVISION VIII.

*Compensatory Allowances for Shift Work and Work Performed on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays.*

(1) Any member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant whose regular prescribed hours of duty include a continuous period of not less than six hours between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. shall be paid an allowance of 4d. per hour in addition to his ordinary salary for the whole of such regular prescribed hours of duty, but not exceeding eight hours.

(2) Any member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant performing duty on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, whose regular prescribed hours of duty include a continuous period of not less than six hours on such public holiday, shall be paid an allowance for the whole of such regular prescribed hours of duty, but not exceeding eight hours.

(3) Any member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant whose regular prescribed hours of duty include a continuous period of not less than six hours on a Saturday, shall be paid an allowance for the whole of such regular prescribed hours of duty, but not exceeding eight hours.

(4) The hourly rate of allowance for work falling within clauses (2) and (3) hereof shall be determined in accordance with the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly salary}}{\text{Fortnightly hours of duty}} \times 4.$$

(5) Any member of the Police Force not above the rank of Sergeant whose regular prescribed hours of duty include a continuous period of not less than six hours on a Sunday shall be paid an allowance for the whole of such regular prescribed hours of duty, but not exceeding eight hours.

(6) The hourly rate of allowance for work falling within clause (5) hereof shall be determined in accordance with the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly salary}}{\text{Fortnightly hours of duty}} \times \frac{1}{2}$$

(7) For the purposes of this Division the continuity of a period of six hours shall not be deemed to have been broken by a meal break not exceeding one hour provided the total time worked before and after such meal break shall be not less than six hours.

(8) For the purposes of clauses (4) and (6) hereof fortnightly salary shall exclude all allowances but shall include the amount of cost of living adjustment.

(9) Any payment to a member of the Police Force pursuant to clauses (3) or (5) hereof shall be in substitution for and not cumulative upon the shift allowance prescribed in clause (1) hereof.

(10) A member of the Police Force who, pursuant to his regular prescribed hours of duty works a continuous period of not less than six hours twice on any public holiday specified in clause (2) or on a Saturday or Sunday, shall be entitled to the payment of one allowance only under clauses (2), (3), and (5), but shall be entitled, if he complies with clause (1) hereof, to the shift allowance therein prescribed in addition to the allowance prescribed in clauses (2), (3), and (5)."

(b) By substituting for "Division VIII." the words "Division IX."

2. This Determination shall be deemed to have come into operation from the tenth day of July, 1949.

1. The Determination No. 1 of the Police Classification Board of the 13th November, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd November, 1946, as amended by Determinations Nos. 4, 8, 9, 10; 13, 14; 15, 17, 19, and 20 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In paragraph 3 of Division III. thereof, by deleting the words, "Sub-Officer in Charge" and inserting the word "Sub-Officers".

2. This Determination shall be deemed to have come into operation from the tenth day of July, 1949.
