# DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1949.

### COAL AND COKE BOARD.

Clause 2 of Part 1 and clause 1 of Part 2 of the Determination published in Government Gazette No. 456 of the 30th May, 1949, shall be replaced by the following clauses:—

PART I.—Persons OTHER THAN those employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of burning, preparing, grading, or distributing charcoal in a form suitable for use in power-producing or heat-producing units; in the manufacture of explosives or in the manufacture, repair, or maintenance of gas masks or respirators.

NOTE.—The Board has determined, in accordance with Section 25 (1) of the Factories and Shops Act 1984, that the trade is so unskilled that no apprentices shall be taken in the trade.

- (b) Gas Producer Units.—The following provisions shall apply to drivers of gas producer units:—
   (i) Driver of a motor vehicle fitted and operated with a charcoal gas producer unit for each day or portion thereof upon which he is called upon to drive such vehicle, is. extra.
  - (ii) Such driver for each day or portion thereof upon which he is called upon to clean the hopper and/or final filter of such unit, ls. extra.
  - (iii) Suitable overalls and gloves shall be provided by employers for the employees mentioned in sub-clauses (i\_and (ii) hereof. (iv) Employers shall provide proper washing conveniences for such employees, and also hot water or some other efficient cleansing material.
- (c) WAR LOADINGS FOR CARTERS AND DRIVERS.—In addition to the weekly rates prescribed herein, war loadings shall be paid aa follows:-

Provided that any person driving a gas-producer unit shall be paid the appropriate extra rates hereinbefore provided, and shall not be entitled to war loadings.

PART 2.—Persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of burning, preparing, grinding, grading, or distributing charcoal, in a form suitable for use in power-producing or heat-producing units; in the manufacture of explosives or in the manufacture repair, or maintenance of gas masks or respirators.

  - (iii) Suitable overalls and gloves shall be provided by employers for the employees mentioned in sub-clauses (i) and
  - (iv) Employers shall provide proper washing conveniences for such employees and also hot water or some other efficient cleansing material.
- (c) WAR LOADINGS FOR CARTERS AND DRIVERS.—In addition to the weekly rates prescribed in clause (1) (a), war loadings shall be paid as follows:— -- Week

Provided that any person driving a gas-producer unit shall be paid the appropriate extra rates set out in sub-clause (b) and shall not be entitled to war loadings.

Clauses, other than clause 2 of Part 1 and clause 1 of Part 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
