The Fisheries Acts. NETTING RESTRICTIONS IN CUNNINGHAME ARM AT LAKES ENTRANCE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the fifth day of October, 1942, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the seventh day of October, 1942, respecting netting in Cunninghame Arm at Lakes Entrance and prohibit during the whole of each year the use of all trammels trawls or other nets or engines whether fixed or unfixed to be used in fishing in the waters of such arm, eastward of an imaginary line running approximately north-north-west (magnetic) from the inner end of the eastern pier of the "Lakes Entrance" to the inner end of the pier at Bullock Island; provided that during the period from the first day of May in each year to the thirtieth day of November next following (both days inclusive) the use of seine or hauling nets not exceeding in length 400 fathoms each shall be permitted in such waters except during the period from ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday until sunrise on each Sunday following and within one hundred feet of any wharf, pier or jetty in such arm.

Marine Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the Marine Act 1928 and under all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

"That on and after the fifteenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steamships and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to and including 6,000 tons of the vessels burthen, shall be Three pence (3d.) per ton, and for every additional ton over 6,000 tons One penny farthing (1\frac{1}{2}\)d. calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, subject in any case to a minimum charge of Five pounds (\frac{1}{2}\)d.

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the twenty-fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION. By-law No. 4476.—Urban District Supplied with Water from the Coliban System of Waterworks.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:-

- 1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks, for the supply of water for domestic purposes:-

BY-LAW NO. 4477.—RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER-URBAN DISTRICTS AND URBAN DIVISIONS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the respective Urban Districts and Urban Divisions as set out hereunder:—

Lands or tenements situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of such amount in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands or tenements as is set down in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the Schedule hereto: Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually in respect of any such lands or tenements (other than land on which there is no building) shall be not less than the sum set down in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule, and in respect of any such lands or tenements on which there is no building shall be not less than the sum set down in column 4 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1949, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1950, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1949, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at the place set down in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- 3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to properties rated by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at the amount per 1,000 gallons set down in column 5 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule, would give an amount equal to that payable per annum in respect of the properties so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates.
- 4. For all water supplied per annum in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in clause 3 of this By-law the charge shall be one shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

5. For the supply of water by measure from the pipes of the Commission to lands and tenements within the respective Urban Districts and Urban Divisions as set out hereunder which are not liable to any rate made under any By-law of the Commission—

The charge to be paid for water so supplied shall, except in cases of special agreements with the Commission, be such amount per 1,000 gallons as is set down in column 5 opposite the name of such Urban District or Urban Division in column 1 of the schedule hereto: Provided that where any minimum annual charge has been fixed by the Commission, the quantity of water to be supplied for such minimum annual charge in each case shall, except in cases of special agreements with the Commission, be the quantity which, if charged for at the amount per 1,000 gallons set down in column 5 opposite the name of such Urban District or Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such quantity the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

- 6. The charges as set out in clause 5 of this By-law are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1949, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1950, and shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- 7. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water.



CONDITIONS AS TO SALE OF EXPLOSIVES.

W HEREAS by section 24 of the Explosives Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order prescribe the conditions to be inserted in general licences and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of explosives: And whereas by an Order made on the twenty-eighth day of November, 1932, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirtieth day of November, 1932, the Governor in Council prescribed the conditions to be inserted in general licences and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of explosives: And whereas it is again necessary to prescribe the conditions to be inserted in the aforesaid general licences and special licences: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Explosives Act 1928 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth make the following Order (that is to say):-

- 1. The aforesaid Order made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-eighth day of November, 1932, shall cease to have effect on and after the date of the making of this Order.
- 2. Wherever, in this Order, an explosive is distinguished as an authorized explosive or as belonging to a particular class or division of a class, reference is made to the definition or classification of explosives contained in Orders made by the Governor in Council under the provisions of section 53 of the Explosives Act 1928.

LICENCES TO KEEP AND SELL FIREWORKS.

- 3. Every licence to keep and sell fireworks shall be issued subject to the following conditions which shall be inserted therein, that is to say:-
 - (a) The licence shall oe valid only for the person to whom the same is issued.
 - (b) The licence shall permit the licensee to keep and sell only Small Manufactured Fireworks-Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3, which comprise-
 - (i) Small manufactured fireworks, containing not more than 600 grains of composition in any one firework, and
 - (ii) Specially defined small fireworks, such as Throwdowns, Sparklers, and Amorces,
 - and shall not permit the licensee to keep and sell any other explosive.
 - (c) There shall not be on the premises at any one time an amount of fireworks exceeding the amount prescribed by the licence, and the maximum quantity of Small Manufactured Fireworks—Shop Goods, of Class 7. Division 3, that may be kept on any premises shall not exceed 400 lb. All fireworks in excess of 100 lb. in amount shall be kept in an isolated storeroom not accessible to the public.
 - (d) The words "Licensed to Sell Fireworks" shall be painted or affixed above the entrance to the premises.
 - (e) No fireworks shall be sold or delivered to any child under the age of thirteen years.
 - (f) All fireworks shall be stored in a suitable spark-proof receptacle exclusively kept for fireworks (for a quantity not exceeding 50 lb. a suitable receptacle is a japanned, galvanized, or tinned iron trunk or other similar container). The word "Fireworks" shall be painted conspicuously on the outside of the receptacle which shall

- be kept effectively closed and away from exits and out of the way of shop traffic and articles of an inflammable nature. Each receptacle and its surroundings shall be kept clean and free from dust or wrappings from fireworks.
- (g) Fireworks shall not be left out of the receptacle, and shall not be exposed on shelves, counters, or in shop windows. Provided that a small number not exceeding six of each variety of Small Manufactured Fireworks—Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3, may be kept for display purposes only in a spark-proof glass-covered receptacle.
- (h) Matches, including Bengal matches, shall not be kept with fireworks.
- (i) Any quantity of fireworks exceeding 1 lb. in weight when sold shall be in a substantial package, made and closed so as to protect the fireworks, and on the outside of such package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a securely attached label or mark, the word "Fireworks."
- (j) No fireworks shall be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in or upon any highway, street, road, public thoroughfare, or public place.
- (k) Every licensee and every person employed in and about the premises shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the fireworks therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work on such premises.

LICENCES TO KEEP AND SELL SAFETY CARTRIDGES.

- 4. Every licence to keep and sell safety cartridges shall be issued subject to the following conditions which shall be inserted therein, that is to say:—
 - (a) The licence shall be valid only for the person to whom the same is issued.
 - (b) The licence shall permit the licensee to keep and sell only safety cartridges, and shall not permit the licensee to keep and sell any other explosive.
 - (c) There shall not be on the premises at any one time, safety cartridges exceeding the quantity prescribed by the licence, and the maximum quantity of safety cartridges that may be kept on any premises shall not exceed that quantity containing a total weight of explosive not exceeding 2,400 lb.
 - (d) The words "Licensed to Sell Safety Cartridges" shall be painted or affixed above the entrance to the premises.
 - (e) No safety cartridges shall be sold or delivered to any person under the age of sixteen years.*
 - (f) Safety cartridges exceeding 5 lb. in amount shall be kept in packages in a cool and dry place and at a safe distance from any article of an inflammable nature.
 - (g) No safety cartridges shall be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in or upon any highway, street, road, public thoroughfare, or public place.
 - (h) Any quantity of safety cartridges exceeding 1 lb. in weight when sold shall be in a closed substantial package, and on the outside of such package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters by means of a securely attached label or mark the words "Safety Cartridges."
 - (i) Every licensee and every person employed in and about the premises shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work on such premises.

^{*} Note.—Under section 208 of *Police Offences Act* 1928, it is prescribed that pea-rifle or similar small-bore cartridges shall not be sold or delivered to any person under the age of eighteen years.

LICENCES TO KEEP AND SELL EXPLOSIVES.

- 5. Every licence to keep and sell explosives shall be issued subject to the following conditions which shall be inserted therein, that is to say:—
 - (a) The licence shall be valid only for the person to whom the same is issued.
 - (b) The words "Licensed to Sell Explosives" shall be painted or affixed above the entrance to the premises.
 - (c) No fireworks shall be sold or delivered to any child under the age of thirteen years, and no other explosive shall be sold or delivered to any person under the age of sixteen years.*
 - (d) No explosives shall be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in or upon any highway, street, road, public thoroughfare, or public place.
 - (e) All explosives on the premises other than those of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) shall be kept only in the building or receptacle provided for the storage of the same: Provided that a small number not exceeding six of each variety of Small Manufactured Fireworks— Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3, may be kept for display purposes only in a spark-proof glass-covered receptacle.
 - (f) Every person selling nitro-compounds for blasting and detonators shall keep a record as prescribed by the Explosives Act 1928 of all sales of such explosives, and shall comply with the requirements of the Sale of Explosives Order made in pursuance of section 56 of the Explosives Act 1928.
 - (g) All explosives exceeding 1 lb. in weight when sold shall be in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other package made and closed so as to prevent the explosives from escaping, and on the outside of such package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a securely attached label or mark:—
 - (i) In the case of gunpowder, the word "Gunpowder";
 - (ii) In the case of ammunition of Class 6, Division 1, the name of the explosive;
 - (iii) In the case of fireworks of Class 7, Division 3, the word "Fireworks"; and
 - (iv) In the case of explosive other than gunpowder or fireworks of Class 7, Division 3, or ammunition of Class 6, Division 1, the word "Explosive", with the addition of the name of such explosive.
 - (h) All explosives exceeding 5 lb. in amount of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition), or of the 3rd Division of Class 7 (Firework), and all other explosives exceeding 1 lb. in amount, shall be kept in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other package made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping, and no package of gunpowder shall be opened unless the explosive therein is contained in inner packages or wrappers.
 - (i) No explosives except those specified in the licence shall be kept on any premises, and all explosives on the premises, except those of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition), shall be kept in one or other or both of the following modes, namely:—
 - Mode 1.—In a substantially constructed building or receptacle detached from a dwelling-house and at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place; provided that such building or receptacle is exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives, and is at a safe distance from any goods of an inflammable nature.

^{*} Note.—Under section 208 of Police Offences Act 1928, it is prescribed that pea-rifle or similar small-bore cartridges shall not be sold or delivered to any person under the age of eighteen years.

Mode 2.—In a substantial receptacle exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives and placed inside any building which is not itself qualified for the keeping of explosives in Mode 1. The receptacle shall be placed in a safe position, away from all goods of an inflammable nature, and so far as is practicable away from any portion of the premises accessible to the public. The receptacle (except where the amount of explosives authorized to be kept therein is less than 50 lb.) shall be on wheels so as to be readily removable in the event of a fire taking place.

(j) There shall not be on the premises at any one time an amount of any sort of explosive exceeding the amount prescribed by the licence, and the maximum quantities of the various explosives that may be kept on any premises shall be as follows:—

> Gunpowder and Small-arm nitro-compound,* in all ... 200 lb. or in lieu thereof Nitrate Mixture (Class 2) ... 100 lb. or Nitro-compounds for blasting (Class 3) 100 lb. or Explosive contained in ammunition of Class 6, Division 2 100 lb. or Manufactured Fireworks of Class 7, Division 2 or Small Manufactured 200 lb. Fireworks—Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3 400 lb. and, in addition Detonators 500 (number) Explosive contained in safety cartridges 500 lb. Percussion Caps ... 500,000 (number) . .

* Small-arm nitro-compound means nitro-compound adapted and intended exclusively for use in cartridges for small arms.

Provided that-

- (i) Authorized explosives not included in the foregoing may be kept on any premises in such quantities as may be prescribed by the licence, but in no case shall the quantity of explosive exceed the amount prescribed herein for an explosive of the same class and division.
- (ii) A maximum of 2,000 detonators or of 2,400 lb. of explosive contained in safety cartridges may be kept on the premises if, for every additional 100 detonators or 120 lb. of explosive contained in safety cartridges the other explosives (excepting percussion caps) be reduced in the following proportions:—
 - 20 lb. of Small Manufactured Fireworks
 —Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3;
 - or 10 lb. of Manufactured Fireworks of Class 7, Division 2;
 - or 10 lb. of Gunpowder or Small-arm nitrocompound;
 - or 5 lb. of Nitrate Mixture (Class 2);
 - or 5 lb. of Nitro-compounds for blasting (Class 3);
 - or 5 lb. of explosive contained in Ammunition of Class 6, Division 2.
- (iii) There shall not-be kept under Mode 2 more than 50 lb. in all of gunpowder and small arm nitro-compound, or in lieu thereof 50 lb. of Manufactured Fireworks of Class 7, Division 2, or 100 lb. of Small Manufactured Fireworks—Shop Goods, of Class 7, Division 3, or 25 lb. of nitro-compounds for blasting, and, in addition, 125 detonators, 50,000 percussion caps and safety cartridges containing not more than 500 lb. of explosive.

(k) If two or more classes of explosives be kept on the premises, they must be separated from each other by an intervening partition of such substance or character, or by such intervening space, as will effectually prevent explosion or fire in the one communicating with the other; detonators shall be kept in a separate receptacle placed at a safe distance from any other explosive; fireworks shall be kept in a separate receptacle placed at a safe distance from any other explosive.

Provided that---

- (i) Explosives of Class 1 (Gunpowder), Class 2 (Nitrate Mixture), Class 3 (Nitro-compound), and the following explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition), namely, Cordeau Bickford, Cordtex, and Detonating Fuse, as do not contain in the packages any exposed iron or steel, may be kept in the same building or receptacle without any intervening partition or space.
- (ii) Safety cartridges and other explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) may be kept in packages in a cool and dry place at a safe distance from any other explosive or article of an inflammable nature.
- (1) With respect to every such building or receptacle, the interior thereof, and the shelves and fittings therein, shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, brick, stone, or similar substance. Such interior, shelves, and fittings shall be kept free from grit and otherwise clean, and due precaution shall be taken to exclude water. The door or lid of such building or receptacle shall be provided with a substantial lock, and shall at all times, except when explosives are being placed in or removed therefrom, be kept locked and the key removed from the vicinity. The outside of such door or lid shall have painted thereon in plain and conspicuous characters the word "Explosives", "Detonators", or "Fireworks", as the case may be.
- (m) Every article of a highly inflammable nature, and every article liable to cause fire or explosion, shall be kept at a safe distance from all explosives, and from all buildings and receptacles containing the same.
- (n) Every licensee and every person employed in and about the premises shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the premises or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work on such premises.

And the Honorable William Watt Leggatt, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF LANCEFIELD, KNOWN AS THE "LANCEFIELD PARK RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is
given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management
of any Crown land which has been reserved under the
Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which
has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the
further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board
of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred
as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations
in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in
Council dated 1st August, 1870, as a site for purposes of
Public Recreation in the Parish of Lancefield, and known
as the "Lancefield Park Reserve," hereinafter referred to
as the "Reserve," in lieu of Regulations 1 and 8 of the
Regulations made by the said Board on 6th October, 1921,

- 1. - 8. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve unless with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police

Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such balliff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

 - 1. To remove or lop trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate, which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.
 - 2. To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and of any other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree, shrub, or hedge abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom, unless for a distance of 20 feet from the corner of such private property each part of such tree, shrub, or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, or hedge.

Where any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads is used contrary to the provisions of clause 1 hereof the Council of the said City of Brunswick at any time by notice in writing under the hand of an officer of the said city may require the owner or occupier of such private property within the time specified in such notice to lop all trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government hetore or after the commencement of the Local Government at 1946) growing contrary to clause 1 hereof on such private property where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on or are within 10 ft. of any such street or road in such manner that each part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges shall be kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges.
- 3. No person shall cause or permit a fence to remain on private property at a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. within 10 ft. of the junction of any streets or roads.
- 4. Where any fence within 10 ft. of the junction of any streets or roads exceeds 3 ft. 6 in. in height contrary to the provisions of clause 3 hereof, the Council of the City of Brunswick at any time by notice in writing under the hand of an officer of the said city may require the owner or occupier of the property upon which fence exists within the time specified in such notice to reduce the fence in height.

Should default be made by any owner or occupier in complying with any notice under this By-law within the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Council may by its engineer enter upon such private property so situate as aforesaid with a sufficient number of workmen and lop any trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being thereon which are not lopped as required by such notice and reduce any fence in height as required by such notice, and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council, and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

 6. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this
- 6. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which an offence against this by-law is continued after a conviction or order is imposed or made
- on or against such person by any court.

 7. In this By-law the word "corner" shall mean the point at which the building lines of any private property abutting on the streets or roads at the junction of which such private property is situate meet or if extended would meet, and the words "surface level" shall mean—
 - (a) where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.

41. (a) The retail vendors of marketable commodities, goods, wares, and merchandise shall take up such positions during the continuance of the wholesale vegetable market and other times as the Market Inspector or any one or more of his assistants shall assign to them, and they shall pay as market dues a sum not exceeding 2s. 6d. for each time of occupying a standing on any Tuesday or Thursday, and a sum not exceeding 5s. for each time of occupying a standing on any Friday or Saturday.

(b) Each such standing shall not exceed 8½ feet of frontage.

 - (a) Regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous;
 - (b) fixing, subject to Part IV. of the Health Act 1928, the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal;
 - (c) providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district;
 (d) suppressing nuisances; and
 (e) generally for maintaining the goodwill and govern-

- ment of the municipality.
- 1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context

or subject matter:—
"City" means the City of Moorabbin.
"Council" means the Council of the City of Moorabbin.
"Domestic animal" means the ass, mule, cow, goat,

- sheep, dog, and cat.
 "Dwelling house" includes a sleep-out or tent.
 "Domestic bird" means turkey, goose, duck, fowl, squab, and pigeon.
- Property" includes any tenement or land in separate occupation or ownership.
- 2. By-law No. 49 of the City is hereby repealed.
- 3. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept any animal other than a horse or a domestic animal on any property without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
- 4. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept on any property more than two dogs or consent, in writing, of the Council. or five cats without the
- 5. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept on any property any horse or domestic animal, other than a dog or a cat, within a distance of 40 feet from the nearest point of any dwelling house.
- 6. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept any cow, goat, or horse, other than a horse used for trade purposes, on any property having an area of less than 1 acre.
- 7. (1) No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept any horse used for trade purposes on any property having an area of less than 1 acre without the consent in writing, of the Council.

- (2) Any person applying for such consent shall-
 - (a) Make application in writing to the Council; and
 - (b) in the application state-
 - (i) the trade purpose for which such horse is to be used;
 - (ii) the size, situation, and type of structure of the stable in which such horse will be stabled;
 - (iii) the area of the land appurtenant to the stable;
 - (iv) what material constitutes the stable floor and whether impervious or not;
 - (v) whether the stable is drained and con-nected to the sewerage system of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works;
 - (vi) the size, situation, and type of structure of any manure pit; and
 - (vii) what arrangements have been made for the removal of the stable manure from time to time.
- (3) The Council shall grant the application only if it is satisfied that adequate facilities exist for the proper stabling of such horse.
- 8. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept more than twenty-five domestic birds on any property without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
- 9. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept any domestic bird, other than in a run or yard securely fenced with fowl-proof fencing, or in a bird house made secure against escape of such bird.
- 10. Every person having, keeping, or allowing to be kept any domestic bird shall keep the run, yard, or house where such bird is kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state.
- 11. No person shall have, keep, or allow to be kept on any property any noisy animal or bird which shall be or cause a nuisance or annoyance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of such property.
- 12. This By-law shall have operation throughout the following parts of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin, that is to say:—

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills on the buildings, fences, seats, or trees, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, or flowers, or any improvements in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except where fireplaces are provided.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the authority of the Council of the Borough of Ringwood.
- 6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission of the said Council.
- 7. No person shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve any article, or refreshment, without the permission in writing of the said Council being first obtained.
- No person shall consume, sell, or offer for sale any alcoholic liquor in the Reserve.
- 8. No unauthorized person shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or plants.
- 9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.
- 10. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve, except as provided in Regulation (9), and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 11. No persons shall assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for purposes of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character without the permission in writing of the said Council first being obtained.
- 12. No person shall perform in any band of music or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the said Council first being obtained.
- 13. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve without permission being granted by the Council.
- 14. No person shall ride any bicycle, horse, or drive any vehicle over or through the Reserve without the permission of the said Council first being obtained.
- 15. No unauthorized person shall remove from the Reserve any soil, sand, or other material.
- 16. No person shall deposit any rubbish in the Reserve nor leave therein any bottles, orange peel, cast-off clothes, or other litter, except in receptacles provided.
- 17. No club shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like game in the Reserve without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations and, who, after he has been warned by an authorized officer of the Council or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such officer or constable and taken before some jusice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
