Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 107.

"HAWKINS," "UNITUS," "STROMBERG-CARLSON" PRESSURE COOKERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 107.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - "Wholesale Merchant" means a person who purchases any pressure cookers in a manufactured state and re-sells such pressure cookers by wholesale.
 - "Retail Trader" means a person who purchases any pressure cookers and sells such pressure cookers by retail.
 - "Hawkins," "Unitus" or "Stromberg-Carlson" pressure cooker" means a pressure cooker of the kind which at the date of this Order is customarily sold under the trade or descriptive name of "Hawkins," "Unitus," or "Stromberg-Carlson," as the case may be.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale Merchants.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which "Hawkins," "Unitus," or "Stromberg-Carlson" pressure cookers may be sold by a wholesale merchant to be prices set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail Traders.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which "Hawkins," "Unitus," or "Stromberg-Carlson" pressure cookers may be sold by a retail trader to be—

- (a) for sales within the Metropolitan Area, the prices set out in the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (b) for sales outside the Metropolitan Area, the prices set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, plus the cost of transport (if any) actually incurred and properly attributable to the conveying of these pressure cookers to the retailer's place of business.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

5. (1) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any pressure cookers the maximum price of which is fixed under this Order shall attach or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods and as to be properly associated with such goods.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which "Hawkins," "Unitus," or "Stromberg-Carlson" pressure cookers specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
