PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquire for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Corio has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Corio aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CORIO.

All that piece of land, having an area of 2 acres 0 roods 26 perches, commencing on the south side of a Government road at the north-west corner of Crown allotment 116, Parish of Yowang, County of Grant, bounded on the east by the said Crown allotment, being a line bearing south 6 deg. 16 min. west 524 links to the north bank of the right branch of Sutherland's Creek, on the south and west by the north and east banks of the right branch of the said creek bearing westerly and northerly to the intersection of the prolongation of the south side of the said Government road and the east bank of the right branch of the said creek, and on the north by the said prolongation, being a line bearing north 89 deg. 33 min. east 300 links to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

(2A) Of all lands in the Second Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—General Rates of Twenty pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

(3A) Of all lands in the Third Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—General Rates of Ten pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning the 1st day of July, 1949, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1950, and shall be payable on the 14th day of April, 1950, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Werrimull.

3. For making and levying such rates the value of the lands in the respective Waterworks Districts set out in the valuations made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, and adopted by the said Commission on the 3rd day of April, 1950, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands.

4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

Town and Country Planning Act 1944.

BOROUGH OF SWAN HILL.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Borough of Swan Hill (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

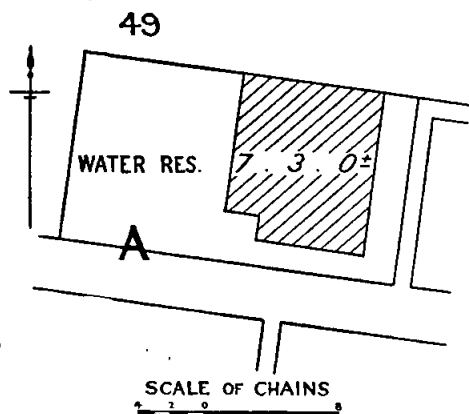

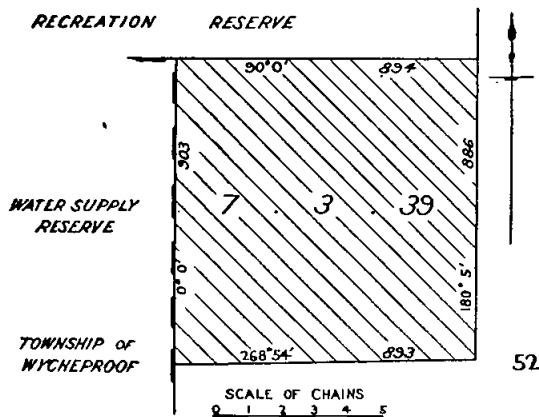

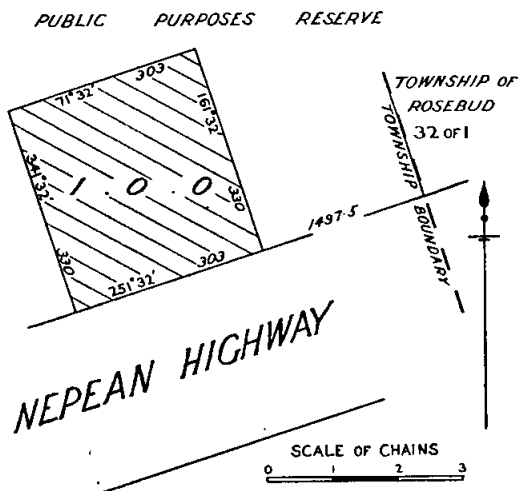

AMENDMENT OF BOOT TRADES REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth

hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Boot Trades Regulations."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by an appropriate industrial authority or agreement or by these Regulations, as the case may require.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

Clicking,
Stuff-cutting,
Making,
Finishing,

as carried on in the Bootmaking industry within the metropolitan district.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants may be Examined—Exemptions.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be as follows:—

(a) In the case of persons entering the said trades under the age of sixteen years, a term of five years.

(b) In the case of persons entering the said trades at the age of sixteen years, a term of four years.

(c) In the case of persons entering the said trades at or over the age of seventeen years, a term of three years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship—General Form.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2), with the following additions thereto:—

*Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.**EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.*

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required under the provisions of this paragraph to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month.

(c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

(c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.

(f) Provide the apprentice with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

(g) Not allow the apprentice to work overtime for more than one hour in any one week unless the prescribed number of journeymen enabling the employment of such apprentice be employed and working at the same time.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

(c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

That where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or

That where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission, the total period of time not served by an apprentice by reason of either this or the immediately preceding proviso shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

After paragraph 9 add the following:—

10. That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time prescribed to be paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the minimum rates of wages prescribed to be paid to journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the prescribed minimum rates of wages of the apprentice bear to the prescribed minimum rates of wages of such journeyman.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—
 First Year—
 1st six months—at the rate of 29s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 34s. 3d. per week.

Second Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 40s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 50s. 0d. per week.

Third Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 60s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 79s. 9d. per week.

Fourth Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 100s. 3d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week.

Fifth Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 126s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 129s. 9d. per week.

Sixth Year—

- At the rate of 157s. 0d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

First Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 29s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 34s. 3d. per week.

Second Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 40s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 50s. 0d. per week.

Third Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 60s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 79s. 9d. per week.

Fourth Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 100s. 3d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week.

Fifth Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 126s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 129s. 9d. per week.

(c) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

First Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 34s. 0d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 46s. 3d. per week.

Second Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 60s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 79s. 9d. per week.

Third Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 100s. 3d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week.

Fourth Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 126s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 129s. 9d. per week.

(d) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of three years—

First Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 60s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 79s. 9d. per week.

Second Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 100s. 3d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 0d. per week.

Third Year—

- 1st six months—at the rate of 126s. 6d. per week.
 2nd six months—at the rate of 129s. 9d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

10. When an apprentice works under conditions for which, or at any time when, a journeyman employed at the aforesaid trades would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time, then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

Standard of and Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard of proficiency as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 80 per cent. of the possible marks allotted to such subjects at the annual examinations approved by the Commission, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

12. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall for the next succeeding year be paid the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trades.

For the purposes of this Regulation—

- (a) An employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.
- (b) "Journeymen" means male employees employed in the said trade receiving wages rates or earning at piece-work prices not less than the minimum hourly rate of wages prescribed for adult males.

Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.

14. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

15. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first and second years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the third year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission, shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each year of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.

16. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in all of the processes of any one of the trades set out hereunder, or in such of them as are included in one at least of the subdivisions of such trades (as the case may be):—

(a) Clicking—

Cutting pieces, stays and topbands; cutting linen and leather linings; cutting patent, hide and fabrics; cutting calf, chrome, and vegetable tanned leathers; cutting glace kid, and plain cutting; cutting coloured kids; fancy cutting—all classes. (An apprentice to clicking shall be employed on hand work for at least 20 per cent. of his working time.)

(b) Stuffcutting—

Subdivision 1.—Stamping soles, wetting leather, counting stuff, building heels, skiver, splitting machine, slugging, ranging and cutting offal, ranging, cutting insoles, throughs, cutters and toes, and cutting soles.

Subdivision 2.—Opening machine sewn channels, strip tacker, lip turner, moulding soles, feathering insoles and baffing insoles, channelling machines, fitting up stuff, preparing stuff for cement process, cutting insoles and cutting soles.

(c) Making—

(a) Heavy Work—

Subdivision 1.—Stuff laying by machine or by hand; heeling by machine or by hand, levelling machine, screwing machine and lasting machine.

Subdivision 2.—Making right through by hand.

(b) Machine Sewn—

Subdivision 1.—Tacking on insoles and putting in stiffeners and toes, pulling over by hand or machine, sole laying by hand or machine; lasting machines and pounder.

Subdivision 2.—Tacking on insoles and putting in stiffeners and toes, pulling over by hand or machine and operating any two of the following machines:—Consol laster, "Blake," and/or Lock stitcher, pounder, Ago press, roughing machine, fair stitcher and heeling machine.

Subdivision 3.—Making right through by hand.

(c) Pumps—

Subdivision 1.—Lay linings, tingle and trim, shanking and tacking on soles, first and second lasting and Wurt heeling.

Subdivision 2.—Lay linings, tingle and trim, shanking and tacking on soles, first and second lasting and pump sewer.

(d) Slippers—

Subdivision 1.—Cutting all classes of bottom stuff, and filling, preparing, ranging, heel building, channelling and splitting.

Subdivision 2.—Clicking by hand and machine—leather and fabrics.

Subdivision 3.—Clicking by hand and machine—leather and fabrics. Turning, blocking, ironing, and wood-heeling.

Subdivision 4.—Operating slipper turn sewing machine, "Blake" or other sole attaching machine, and turning, blocking, slugging, loose nailer and ironing.

Subdivision 5.—First and second lasting, turning, blocking, wood-heeling, ironing.

Subdivision 6.—Finishing, colouring edges and bottoms, edge and heel trimming, edge setting, scouring and sand-papery machines.

(e) Welts—

Subdivision 1.—Tacking on insoles and putting in stiffeners and toes, pulling up sides and seats by hand or machine, staple fastener, first trimming, pulling over by hand or machine, operating lasting machines and pounder.

Subdivision 2.—Inseam trimming, welt beating, solutioning and laying soles, shanking, feathering, opening channels, bottom levelling, loose nailer, rounder and welter.

Subdivision 3.—Inseam trimming, welt beating, solutioning and laying soles, shanking, feathering, opening channels, bottom levelling, loose nailer, stitcher and rounder.

Subdivision 4.—Inseam trimming, welt beating, solutioning and laying soles, shanking, feathering, opening channels, bottom levelling, loose nailer, welter and stitcher.

(f) Veldt Schoens—

Making right through and operating the following machines:—Upper assembler, Consol laster, pounder, upper stapler, stitcher, tacker and trimmer.

(g) Basket Shoes—

Lacing upper on to last and plaiting same to sole; attaching heel; trimming and ironing edge and scraping sole.

(h) Cement Process—

Subdivision 1.—Tacking on insoles and putting in stiffeners and toes, pulling over by hand or machine and operating any two of the following machines:—Lasting machine, pounder, cement press, roughing machine, and heeling machine.

Subdivision 2.—Slip-lasting process in all its making operations and such operations contained in subdivision 1 as are carried out in the factory.

(d) Finishing—

Subdivision 1.—Colouring heels and edges, brushing, padding, sand-papery, and breasting, and operating edge trimmer, heel trimmer, scourer and edge setter.

Subdivision 2.—Slip-lasting process in all its making operations and such operations contained in subdivision 1 as are carried out in the factory.

Subdivision 3.—Finishing right through by hand—

and the employer shall, by the best means in his power, teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, the apprentice in the said processes.

Payment of School Fees.

17. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him

for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice or applicant has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice as proof of such illness or accident.
