AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes I, 2, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

#### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by Order made on the 10th day of January, 1950, in section 901 of the Local Government Acts, doth hereby provide for and allow the relaxation of the requirements of all regulations under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Acts and of all other regulations, joint regulations, or by-laws under those Acts so far as relates to pre-cut houses imported for the Victorian Railways Commissioners which are erected within a period of twelve months after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1949.

#### COLAC WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1950.

THE Colac Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Eleven pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Colac Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1950, and shall be payable on the 17th day of May, 1950, at the office of the said Trust.

Water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs, and to Government departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, showgrounds, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement at Six pence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 40,000 gallons per annum.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Eleven pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.







(a) own property in the municipality of Hawthorn and

(a) own property in the municipality of Hawthorn and

do not reside in the municipality;
(b) work in the municipality;

(c) attend schools in the municipality;
(d) are nominees of corporations for enrolment on the municipal rolls of the municipality.

All such other persons permitted to borrow books from the library under this clause shall furnish the Librarian with the prescribed form of guarantee signed by two ratepayers

with the prescribed form of guarantee signed by two ratepayers.

5. All books borrowed are to be returned within fourteen days, and all magazines borrowed are to be returned within seven days, and in case of loss or damage the borrower or his guarantor or guarantors shall replace the book or pay to the Council the value of the book, set, or series lost or damaged within one week of the date on which the loss or damage is notified to him. The Council shall be the sole judge of the value of any book, set, or series lost or of any damage done. any damage done.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clause, any borrower who does not return any book or magazine within the time specified in such clause 5 shall pay a fine in the case of borrowers in the adult section of the library of Three pence per day for each day a book or magazine is retained in excess of the period named, and in the case of borrowers in the junior section One penny per day for each day a book or magazine is retained in excess of the said period.

7. No borrower shall lend any book taken from the library or exchange any book with another borrower.

- 8. Any borrower ceasing to use the library shall return his membership card to the Librarian, and borrowers and their guarantors shall remain responsible for any book taken out in their names until the membership card shall have been consulted. have been cancelled.
- 9. Any borrower changing his residence shall forthwith
- notify the Librarian of such change.

  10. No person shall write in or upon or mark or fold down any leaf of any book or document or deface, mutilate, or in any manner injure the same.
- 11. Any borrower finding any book written on or mutilated shall report the fact to the Librarian.

12. The loan of any book shall not be renewed if such book be required by another borrower.

- 13. The Librarian is hereby empowered to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the library, or who is not entitled for any other reason to be entrusted with books.
- 14. Any person taking into the library books, magazines, and/or papers not belonging to the library, and/or any parcel or bag, must leave same at the attendant's desk until leaving the library.
- 15. Any person removing a book or books from the shelves for perusal shall leave such book or books on the library table for replacement in the shelves by the library attendants.
- 16. No person shall use any ink within the library, except by express permission of the Librarian.
- 17. No male person shall wear his hat within the library, except by express permission of the Librarian.

18. No person shall shift any article of furniture or any map, chart, or drawing placed in or hung upon the walls of the library or its precincts.

19. No dogs shall be taken into the library or its precincts, or any approach thereto.

20. No person shall take into the library building any bicycle or scooter or similar contrivance.

21. No person shall stand or place his feet upon any chair or table in the library.

22. No person shall smoke any tobacco or other substance or shall ignite any match or other article or thing within the library or its precincts, or any approach thereto.

23. No persons shall spit upon the floor or walls of the library, or upon any of the property of the Council therein.

24. No person shall remain or attempt to remain within the library after the appointed time for closing it.

25. No person shall enter or remain in the library who is not decently attired and cleanly in person in the opinion or judgment of the Librarian or the person for the time being in charge of the library.

26. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this Regulation may be forthwith removed from the library by the Librarian or the person for the time being in charge of the library or any officer of the Council, and such removal shall not prejudice or affect any proceedings against such person for so offending.

Prices Regulation Acts. PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 136. BREAD-SALES OUTSIDE METROPOLITAN AREA.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, Ernest William Ryan, Acting Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

### Citation.

- 1. This Order may be Cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 136.
  - Revocation.
- 2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1087 made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations and Prices Regulation Order No. 19 are hereby revoked.

### Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - Bread" includes white, brown, wholemeal, barley, rye or Vienna bread, whether or not containing fat or malt or sugar or milk or any product or by-product of malt or sugar or milk and whether or not made in accordance with the requirements of the Bakers and Millers Act 1928 and whether in the form of loaves or of rolls;
  - "Starch Reduced Bread" means starched reduced bread known and sold under the following trade descriptions or brands:—"Borina," "Bon Era," "Broadway," "Cenera," "Ceralia," "Conway," "Denera," "Dieteen," "Glyx," "Ceralia, "Conway, Denera, Dieteel, Glyx,
    "Golden Rayceri," "Maltine," "New Era," "New Way,"
    "New Process," "Nucera," "Nutrena," "Nutty Loaf,"
    "Nu Vitera," "Oslo," "Peerless," "Procera," "Progress,"
    "Promax," "Provena," "Provita," "Reform," "Semola,"
    "Tricerum," "Vita Loaf," "Vitin";
  - "By Wholesale" includes, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale by a retailer to a person to whom that retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of bread (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) totalling not less than 12 lb. of bread; and for the purposes of this definition Vienna bread shall be reckoned as 2 lb. for every 24-oz. loaf and bread rolls as weighing 2 oz. each;
  - "Booked Sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this clause;
  - "Cash Sale" means, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale where payment is made by the purchaser for the bread within 30 days of the date of delivery of that bread;
  - "Metropolitan Area" means the municipalities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Dandenong, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda and Williamstown.

### Maximum Prices.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread may be sold outside the metropolitan area to be—  $\,$ 
  - (a) in respect of sales by wholesale-
    - (i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;
    - (ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—
      - (aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves-1d.
      - (bb) In the case of 2-lb. loaves—id.
  - (b) in respect of sales by retail-
    - (i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;
    - (ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—
      - (aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves-4d.
      - (bb) in the case of 2-lb. loaves— $\frac{1}{2}d$ .;

provided that in respect of sales by retail where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser at the same time to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

# Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in Victoria outside the metropolitan area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

  - "By Wholesale" includes, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale by a retailer to a person to whom that retailer has on the day of sale sold a quantity of bread (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) totalling not less than 12 lb. of bread and for the purposes of this definition Vienna bread shall be reckoned as 2 lb. for every 24-oz. loaf and bread rolls as weighing 2 oz. each.

### 'Maximum Prices-Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by wholesale in the Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in that Schedule.

# Maximum Prices-Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in that Schedule, provided—

that where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser at the same time to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall, for the purpose of this Order, be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

### Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a Notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in the Metropolitan Area by any person to whom such Notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
