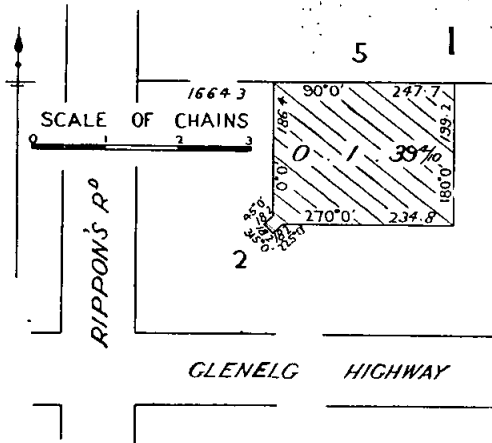

KIEWA WORKS PROTECTION REGULATIONS 1950.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by section 27 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1928* (No. 3776), as amended by any Act, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, make the following Regulations for or with respect to the protection of works and electric lines of the Commission and the prevention of any interference therewith, and generally for or with respect to the safety of persons and property, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Kiewa Works Protection Regulations 1950."

2. These Regulations shall come into force on the date on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. (a) In these Regulations the words—

"the Commission" mean the State Electricity Commission of Victoria;

"the said scheme" mean all works which are being or have been carried out at any time by the Commission, its agents, or contractors in the Kiewa Works Area, and all pipe lines, race lines, and other hydro-electric works constructed or being for the time being constructed at places outside the Kiewa Works Area for the purposes of the hydro-electric scheme and project referred to in section 8 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1948*;

"the Kiewa Works Area" mean the area enclosed within the following boundaries, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point being the intersection with the left bank of the West Kiewa river near Tawonga of a line being the continuation of the north boundary of the Government road abutting on the north boundary of Crown allotment 15A, Parish of Freeburgh, County of Bogong,

- (1) Bounded by a line running thence to the intersection of the north boundary of that Government road with the west boundary of Crown allotment 3 of section 4 in the said parish; and
- (2) By a line running thence 1 chain 50 links along the west boundary of said Crown allotment 3 of section 4 to the south-east corner of the said Government road; and
- (3) By a line running thence in said Crown allotment 3 of section 4, 3,400 links in a direction 89 deg. 45 min.; and
- (4) By a line running thence in the said Crown allotment 3, section 4, 359 deg. 45 min., 3,896 links; and
- (5) By a line running thence in said Crown allotment 3, section 4, 89 deg. 45 min., 1,600 links; and
- (6) By a line running thence across a Government road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 2 of section 4, Parish of Werमतong, in the said County; and
- (7) By the whole northern boundary of said Crown allotment 2 of section 4, Parish of Werमतong; and

- (8) By a line running from the north-east corner of said Crown allotment 2 of section 4, Parish of Werमतong, in a direct line to the highest point of Mt. Bogong; and
- (9) By a line from the said highest point of Mt. Bogong to the highest point of Mt. Nelse; and
- (10) By a line from the said highest point of Mt. Nelse to the highest point of Mt. Cope; and
- (11) By a line running from the highest point of Mt. Cope in the direction of the highest point of Mt. Hotham to the last point where that line intersects the left bank of the Cobungra river; and
- (12) By a line running thence due north to its nearest point of intersection with the left bank of the West Kiewa river; and
- (13) By the left bank of the West Kiewa river back to the point of commencement above mentioned.

“used for the said scheme” mean used for or being within the Kiewa Works Area and intended by the Commission or any contractor of the Commission to be used for either (i) purposes of or incidental to the said scheme, or (ii) purposes of or incidental to constructing any works or electric lines comprised in the said scheme;

“the Construction Engineer” mean the person who, under the Commission for the time being, is the senior administrative officer stationed in the Kiewa Works Area for the said scheme or his authorized deputy.

(b) References in these Regulations to rivers or other physical features are to the rivers and other physical features of which the general location is indicated in the plans annexed to the reports referred to in section 2 of the *State Electricity Commission (Extension of Undertaking) Act 1937* and section 8 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1948*.

4. These Regulations shall apply to and for the protection of—

- (a) all operations, works, stores, and electric lines of the Commission which are in course of construction or completed, and are comprised in or are for the purposes of or incidental to the construction, operation, conduct, carrying on, or maintenance of the said scheme; and
- (b) all property of the Commission or its contractors which is held for such purposes and is within the Kiewa Works Area.

5. The penalty, pecuniary or other—

- (a) set out at the foot of any clause of these Regulations or
- (b) separately set out at the foot of each sub-clause of a clause of these Regulations,

indicates that any contravention of the clause or of the sub-clause (as the case is), whether by act or omission, shall be an offence against these Regulations, punishable upon conviction by a penalty not exceeding the penalty mentioned.

Provided that where the penalty is expressed to apply to a part only of the clause or sub-clause it shall apply to a contravention of that part only.

DAMAGING OR POSTING NOTICES ON WALLS PROHIBITED.

6. No person shall damage or disfigure, or without permission of the Construction Engineer, post or cause to be posted any notices or advertisements on the wall or walls of any buildings or on any other works of the Commission comprised in the said scheme or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: One pound.

NO PERSON TO BE ABOUT WORKING PLACES WITHOUT PERMIT.

7. No person shall be or remain in or about any enclosed area, working place, or electric machinery, or any tramway, railway, rope-way, or haulage system of the Commission or its contractors unless he is either engaged in the work there being carried out or has permission of the Secretary of the Commission or the Construction Engineer to be or remain there.

Penalty: Two pounds.

MATERIAL NOT TO BE REMOVED.

8. No person shall take, remove, or carry away any material or thing the property of the Commission used for the said scheme unless he has the authority of the Commission's officer who is responsible for its custody to do so, and no person shall convert or apply to his own or any other unauthorized use any such material or thing.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

ELECTRIC OR OTHER APPLIANCES NOT TO BE INTERFERED WITH.

9. No person shall, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, damage, interfere, or tamper with any electric fittings or appliances, or with water taps, valves, hydrants, or water supply, or fire-fighting plant, fittings, or other appliances comprised in the said works or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

FIREARMS NOT TO BE CARRIED OR DISCHARGED.

10. (a) The Construction Engineer may, by notice published in a newspaper circulating in Tawonga, declare areas in which shooting is for such period as is fixed by the notice prohibited, and no person shall at any time without the consent of the Construction Engineer have or discharge any firearm, gun, or explosive within any area within which shooting is declared by any such notice to be for the time being prohibited.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(b) Nothing in this Regulation shall permit any act which by virtue of the *Game Act 1928* or any order or proclamation made under that Act is an offence.

PERMITS—CONDITIONS: REVOCATION.

11. (a) Either the Construction Engineer or an officer of the Commission who has given any person consent or permission or authority to do any act which is by these Regulations forbidden, except if done with consent or permission or authority, may at any time by notifying the person to whom consent or permission or authority has been given, or to his agent engaged in doing the act, revoke such consent or permission or authority already given to do that act. Any act or default of such person or any one as his agent done or made after he or his agent has been so notified shall be deemed to have been done or made without the consent or the permission or authority required by these Regulations.

(b) If any permission given to any act referred to in these Regulations is limited to doing the act in a manner or in conditions or circumstances or at a time or times or between times or on a day or days or between days or with or by means of a vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams; thing or things, or at a place or places, or between points specified, described, or referred to in a writing signed by the Construction Engineer or other authorized officer of the Commission relating to the permission, it shall be an offence against these Regulations to do that act otherwise than in the manner, conditions, or circumstances or at the time or times, or between the times, or on the day or days, or between the days, or with or by means of any vehicle, obstruction, dam, or thing, or at any place other than that or those elsewhere than between the points respectively so specified, described, or referred to

Penalty: Five pounds.

(c) If any permission of the Construction Engineer or other authorized officer of the Commission given to any such act is given on or subject to a condition or term that it is not to be done in a manner or in conditions or circumstances, or at a time or times or between times, or on a day or days or between days, or with or by means of a vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams, thing or things, or at places or between points specified, described, or referred to in such a writing as aforesaid, it shall be an offence against these Regulations to do that act in the manner, conditions, or circumstances, or at the time or times or between the times, or on the day or days or between the days, or with or by means of the vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams, thing or things, or at the places or between the points respectively so specified, described, or referred to.

Penalty: Five pounds.

MOTOR TRAFFIC AND OTHER VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.

12. (a) No person shall drive or cause to be moved or to be placed any motor vehicle on any street or road within the Kiewa Works Area unless a written permit has been given to him signed by a duly authorized officer of the Commission purporting to authorize him to use the motor vehicle on such street or road.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(b) No person shall drive or cause to be moved or to be placed any motor vehicle on any street or road otherwise than in accordance with such conditions (if any) as are set out in the permit as given to him or in any way calculated to delay, obstruct, or interfere with any work being done by the Commission, by its servants, agents, or contractors on or near that road.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(c) Any person driving or being in charge of any vehicle on any such street or road shall promptly obey and observe any directions or requirements given to him by an officer of the Commission as to the moving or stopping or speed of travel of that vehicle, whether the directions or requirements be of a general or a particular matter or matters.

Penalty: Two pounds.

(d) No person shall use on any such street or road any vehicle for the purpose of plying for hire or carriage of persons, or goods for hire or reward unless he has been given a written permit signed by a duly authorized officer of the Commission purporting to authorize him to use that vehicle on that road for the respective purpose.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(e) No person shall drive any motor vehicle on any such street or road—

- (i) which does not comply with the requirements of the Motor Car Acts as to the nature, dimensions, equipment, tires, warning, or other safety signs or devices, number plates, registration label, and other means of identification of motor vehicles driven on public roads;
- (ii) in a negligent manner;
- (iii) without just cause or excuse on the right-hand side of the centre of the road;
- (iv) unless he is licensed to drive such motor vehicle on public roads, pursuant to the Motor Car Acts;
- (v) without just cause or excuse on the left side of a vehicle proceeding in the same direction;
- (vi) at a speed at any time exceeding 20 miles per hour;
- (vii) in a manner or at a speed which would be liable to endanger any other traffic which might be (even though in fact it is not) in the vicinity;
- (viii) so as to obstruct, impede, or interfere with operations or work of the Commission, its servants, agents, or contractors; or
- (ix) while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

RIDING, DRIVING, ETC.

(f) No person shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal, or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, motor cycle, motor car, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or water channel or gutter within the Kiewa Works Area save in each case upon and by or at some proper crossings which shall be provided for such purpose.

Penalty: Two pounds.

GAS PRODUCER UNITS.

(g) No person shall drive or cause to be moved or to be placed within the Kiewa Works Area any motor vehicle to which is attached a gas-producer unit during the period between the fifteenth day of November in each year and the fifteenth day of March in the following year, both days inclusive.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(h) No person shall at any time, without permission of the Construction Engineer, drive or cause to be moved or to be placed within the Kiewa Works Area any motor vehicle to which is attached a gas producer unit.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

PROTECTION OF ROADS.

13. (a) No person shall, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, place any obstruction across any road within the Kiewa Works Area or track used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(b) No person shall, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, wilfully or by culpable negligence, damage or obstruct any bridge or culvert or any other works of the Commission, whether road works or other works on, over, or under any such road or track, or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(c) No person shall, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, wilfully displace, take up, or make any alteration in the soil, pavement, or other material of any such road or track, or remove any scrapings thereof.

Penalty: Five pounds.

STREAMS OR DRAINS NOT TO BE DIVERTED OR OBSTRUCTED.

14. (a) No person shall, without the consent of the Secretary of the Commission, construct any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural water course, or otherwise obstruct in any way or divert any water away from or into any reservoir, tank, stream, or conduit comprised in the said scheme or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

(b) No person, without the written authority of the Construction Engineer, shall wilfully or negligently obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain comprised in the said scheme or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(c) No person, without the written authority of the Construction Engineer, shall interfere with, obstruct, damage, or pollute any pumps, machinery, reservoirs, mains, or other things pertaining to the Commission's water supply systems comprised in the said scheme or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

WATER NOT TO BE WASTED.

15. (a) No person having access to or taking water from the water supply system of the Commission used for the said scheme shall negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe, tap, or conduit.

Penalty: Five pounds.

WATER SUPPLY NOT TO BE POLLUTED.

16. No person shall bathe or wash, cleanse, or cause to be thrown therein any animal, whether dead or alive, or any rubbish or filthy stuff in the streams within areas adjacent to water supply works used for the said scheme, or within other areas which may from time to time be prescribed by the Commission as such that pollution of the waters in such streams would be calculated to impair the works of the Commission used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

NO BATHING IN DANGEROUS PLACES.

17. No person shall bathe in or enter any pool or water which has been indicated by notice, erected with the authority of the Commission, as not available or prohibited for bathing.

Penalty: Five pounds.

FIRES AND BURNING OFF.

18. (a) No person shall, within the Kiewa Works Area, wilfully or negligently light or cause to be lit any timber, scrub, undergrowth, grass, or other material likely to cause a spread of fire, or shall burn off any rubbish or grass not in a properly constructed and protected fireplace.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

(b) No person shall light or burn any bonfire, tar barrel, or fire-works within sixty yards of any building or works comprised in the said scheme or used for the said scheme.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

NO SMOKING OR NAKED LIGHTS IN PRESCRIBED AREAS.

19. No person shall, within the Kiewa Works Area, smoke or have, bring, make, or use any unprotected light or any fire in or in the vicinity of any store, magazine, stable, timber stack, or firewood dump, or in any other place where anything inflammable may be stored.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

NEGLIGENTLY SUFFERING CHIMNEY TO BE ON FIRE.

20. No person shall wilfully or negligently set or permit to be set on fire any chimney flue, smoke vent, or stove pipe in any premises occupied by him within the Kiewa Works Area.

Penalty: Two pounds.

FIRES IN CUBICLES OR TENTS PROHIBITED.

21. No person shall light or have any fire in any cubicle or tent within the Kiewa Works Area except in a fireplace or stove specifically approved by the Construction Engineer.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

STORAGE OF PETROL OR INFLAMMABLE MATERIAL.

22. (a) No person shall, within the Kiewa Works Area, install or allow to be installed without the specific permission of the Construction Engineer, any underground store for petrol or other inflammable liquid.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

(b) No person or persons shall bring, place, or keep, other than in one or more motor vehicles, any quantity of petrol or other inflammable liquid in excess of 44 gallons in any one garage or building within the Kiewa Works Area.

Penalty: Five pounds.

22. (c) No person shall bring, place, or keep any quantity of petrol or other inflammable liquid in excess of 4 gallons within a radius of 20 feet of any domicile or building within the Kiewa Works Area other than a garage.

Penalty: Five pounds.

FALSE ALARMS.

23. No person shall wilfully cause to be operated any alarm apparatus of the Commission whether it is operated by hand or electricity except on an occasion and for a purpose for which such apparatus was installed.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

RIDING, ETC., ON TRAMWAYS, ETC.

24. No person, without the authority of the Construction Engineer, shall at any time be or ride on or in any truck or other vehicle, motor, or otherwise tramway or haulage system, plant, or apparatus of the Commission unless it is necessary for him at that time to be or ride on the same truck or other vehicle in pursuance of his duty.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

HOUSES AND OTHER ACCOMMODATION.

25. No person shall occupy or remain in occupation of any house, cubicle, tent, or accommodation, or site for accommodation unless and except during the time for which it is allocated to him by the duly authorized officer of the Commission, and no person shall erect any tent or other structure on the Commission's property without the consent of the Construction Engineer.

Penalty: Ten shillings.

USE OF ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES AND APPARATUS.

26. No person shall in any cubicle of the Commission connect an electric radiator or stove to any electrical outlet other than a power point provided for same by the Commission, or have or connect to the Commission's supply any electrical apparatus the sale of which would be an infringement of the State Electricity Commission Acts.

Penalty: Five pounds.

CUBICLES, TENTS, AND CAMPS TO BE KEPT CLEAN.

27. Any person or persons occupying cubicles, tents, huts, or other buildings of the Commission in the areas set apart for the purposes of accommodation, shall keep such quarters at all times in a clean and sanitary condition, and no person shall use or permit to be used such cubicle, tent, hut, or building for any other purposes than a dwelling.

Penalty: Five pounds.

FURNITURE AND FITTINGS IN RECREATION ROOMS.

28. No person, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, shall remove from any building, room, or other place set aside for recreation purposes, any furniture or material provided as and by way of amenities being the property of the Commission.

Penalty: One pound.

STRETCHERS AND FITTINGS NOT TO BE REMOVED.

29. No person, without the permission of the Construction Engineer, shall remove from any cubicle, tent, or other place, any stretcher, fitting, or other material the property of the Commission.

Penalty: One pound.

ANIMALS IN CUBICLES, TENTS, CAMP AREAS.

30. No person shall keep a dog or other animal or bird in any cubicle, tent, or camp area without the consent of the Construction Engineer.

Penalty: Five pounds.

LIABILITY OF PERSONS ERECTING TENTS AND BUILDINGS TO REMOVE ON DEMAND.

31. If any person, not being a lessee of the Commission, erects or occupies any tent, building, or other structure upon the Kiewa Works Area shall not remove the same at his own expense within seven days after being ordered by the Construction Engineer so to do by notice in writing, given personally or to any apparent occupant of the tent, building, or other structure, or left fixed to the site in a conspicuous position, the Commission may if it is likely in the opinion of the Construction Engineer to interfere with any operations, works, or electric lines of the Commission, cause the tent, building, or other structure to be entered and removed forcibly and without compensation.

Any person who prevents or obstructs any officer or agent of the Commission endeavouring to enter or remove such tent, building, or other structure shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds.

WANDERING OR TRAVELLING STOCK PROHIBITED.

32. Horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other stock, being within the Kiewa Works Area without the authority of the Construction Engineer, may, without prior notice to their owner (if it is reasonably necessary for their safety or to ensure against their interfering with the Commission's or its contractors' works, operations, or stores), be removed at the owner's risk or destroyed by the Construction Engineer or any person acting with his authority.

TREES, PLANTS, FLOWERS, OR SHRUBS NOT TO BE REMOVED, DAMAGED,
OR DESTROYED.

33. (a) No tree, plant, shrub, fern, or other vegetation on land of or occupied by the Commission within the Kiewa Works Area shall be cut down or removed without the permission of the Construction Engineer or express authority from the Forests Commission.

Penalty: Two pounds.

(b) No person, without the authority of the Construction Engineer, shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on any of the garden beds or borders in any park road or cultivated area of or occupied by the Commission or damage or destroy any plant or thing thereon.

Penalty: Two pounds.

GENERAL.

34. Any reference in these Regulations to the consent, authority, or permission of an officer of the Commission, means consent, authority, or permission, in writing, signed by such officer or by his deputy.

In any proceedings for any breach of these Regulations, a certificate purporting to be issued or written by or under the direction of the Commission and purporting to be signed by the Secretary of the Commission, and stating the absence of any consent, authority, or permission, proof of the absence of which is material in any such proceedings, shall be prima facie evidence of the absence of such consent, authority, or permission. It shall not be necessary for such certificate to specify any date or dates on which such consent, authority, or permission had not been given, but it shall be sufficient if the said certificate states that at no material time was any such consent, authority, or permission given.

35. (a) Nothing in these Regulations shall render unlawful an act which is reasonably necessary in and is done in the proper performance of a contractual obligation to the Commission or a statutory duty or is authorized by a statutory authority.

(b) Nothing in these Regulations shall render lawful any act or omission which is unlawful by virtue of any statute or other Regulations made under any statute.

REVOCATION.

36. The Regulations made on the twenty-sixth of August, 1940, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth of August, 1940, pursuant to the provisions of section 27 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1928* (No. 3776) and of other provisions of the State Electricity Commission Acts or any additions or amendments thereto or variations thereof, are hereby repealed.

And the Honorable Keith Dodgshun, His Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CLASSIFICATION OF EXPLOSIVES.

WHEREAS it is among other things enacted by section
53 of the *Explosives Act 1928* that the Governor in
Council may from time to time by order classify explosives:
And whereas by virtue of such provision and by an Order
in Council made on the 1st day of November, 1948, the
Governor in Council classified explosives: And whereas it
is again necessary to classify explosives pursuant to the
said provision: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor
of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the
Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the powers
conferred by section 53 of the said Act, doth by this Order
hereby classify explosives in the following manner (that
is to say):—

Explosives shall be divided into seven classes, as
follows:—

- Class 1.—Gunpowder.
- Class 2.—Nitrate Mixture.
- Class 3.—Nitro-Compound.
- Class 4.—Chlorate Mixture.
- Class 5.—Fulminate.
- Class 6.—Ammunition.
- Class 7.—Firework.

When an explosive falls within the description of more
than one of the classes hereinafter mentioned, it shall be
deemed to belong exclusively to the later or latest (as the
case may be) of such classes.

The following shall be the classification of explosives:—

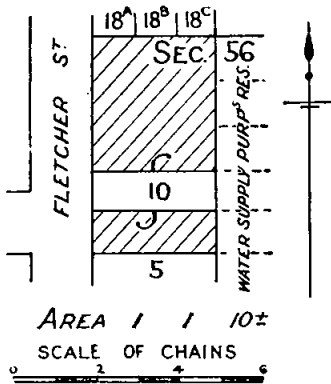

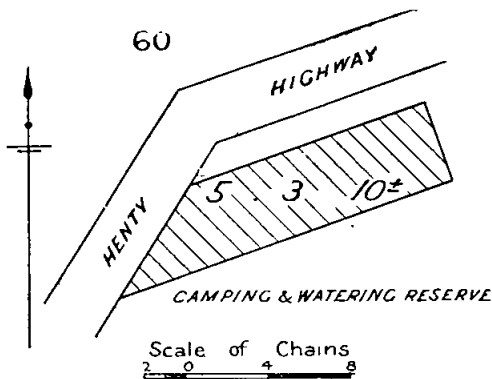

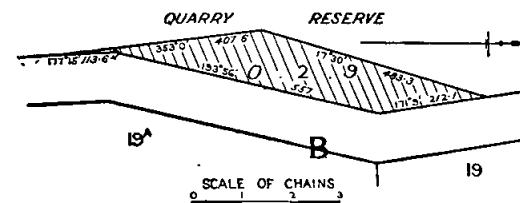
